#### UNIVERSITY OF JAMMU



University of Jammu is recognised as one of the premier institutions of the country and is accredited as A<sup>++</sup> by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council of India (NAAC). It ranked 50<sup>th</sup> in University category under NIRF-2024. It came into existence vide Kashmir and Jammu Universities Act 1969 following bifurcation of the erstwhile University of Jammu and Kashmir by an ordinance promulgated by the Governor on September 5, 1969 and was subsequently adopted as an Act of the State Legislature.

Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor of the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir is the Chancellor of the

University. Apart from its Main and Old Campus in Jammu, the University of Jammu also has eleven Offsite Campuses, out of which seven campuses located at Bhaderwah, Kathua, Kishtwar, Poonch, Ramnagar, Reasi and Udhampur are functional. Teaching-learning and research are being carried out by 43 departments and one hundred sixty three Govt. /Private affiliated Colleges.

The main campus of the University of Jammu is situated at Bahu Wali Rakh with an area of 118.78 acres and houses the Teaching Departments, Centres, Directorate of Sports and Physical Education, UGC-HRDC, Research Studies Wing, Administration Block, Examination Wing, College Development Council, Department of Students Welfare, Directorate of Distance Education, Dhanvantri Library, Publication Cell, Computer Centre, Health Centre, Guest House, Post Office, J&K Bank, Gymnasium, Hostels, Cafeteria and Canteens, Residential Quarters and many other facilities.

The old campus of the University of Jammu located at a distance of 4 km from the main campus and is spreadover 10.5 acres and currently houses a hostel for boys and residential quarters for teaching and non-teaching employees. The University is truly treading the path of growth which is reflected in the developments overthe past more than fifty years.

Introduction of new courses, establishment of new campuses, increase in the number of affiliated colleges, use of information Communication Technology (ICT), impetus to research, collaborations and infrastructural developments are the initiatives taken by the University of Jammu in the recent years.



#### 3.1 ORDER OF ADMISSION

Subject to fulfillment of eligibility criteria and other conditions as prescribed for a programme of study, admission in a Govt. Degree Colleges/University of Jammu Main/Offsite Campuses/Affiliated Colleges shall first be given to a candidate who;

(A)

i. has passed in the qualifying examination from the recognised Board of School Education falling within the territorial jurisdiction of the universities of Jammu.

OR

ii. is a permanent resident/domicile of the territorial jurisdiction of the University of Jammu but has passed in the qualifying examination or an equivalent examination from a recognised Board of other States/UT.

OR

iii. is an employee of the Central or a State Government or a Public Undertaking or any other organization recognised for the purpose by the Syndicate, posted within the territorial jurisdiction of the University of Jammu or son/daughter/spouse of such an employee;

OR

- iv. is not permanent resident/domicile of the territorial jurisdiction of the University of Jammu, but has passed qualifying examination (10+2 pattern) with not less than 60% marks from a recognized Board falling outside the territorial Jurisdiction of the University of Jammu subject to the condition that the number of seats under this category shall not exceed 30% of the total number of seats available in a programme of study.
- (B)

  After making admission of students falling under (A) if seats in any Programme of study remain vacant these shall be open to such other candidates who have passed in the qualifying examination from any recognised Board of School Education provided they have applied in time and are otherwise eligible.

#### Note:

To be a benerficiary for reservation, the candidate must be permanent resident/domicile of J&K UT, expected when applying under categories 10(a),10(b) i.e Sports/Culture & Literary activities and 11(a), 11(b) i.e. NCC/National Service Scheme,Bharat Scouts & Guides for which he/she must have passed the qualifying examination from any recognised board within Jammu Division

#### i. General Jammu (70%)

The seat allocation will be based on merit score (Marks/Points awarded to such a candidate for the activities plus CUET Score).

#### 5. SELECTION CRITERIA FOR ACHIEVEMENT CATEGORIES

PROVIDED also, that where candidates have obtained equal composite score, the tie shall be resolved by reference to their achievement merit in the respective activity determined as per Statute. Higher achievement merit shall determined priority in admission.

#### **NOTE**

- (i) A candidate applying for consideration under the achievement categories mentioned above must accumulate an achievement score of at least 8 (eight) points/marks.
