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From the 2017 FIFA U-17 World Cup in India, 18 teenagers are now representing their countries at the 2026 FIFA World Cup

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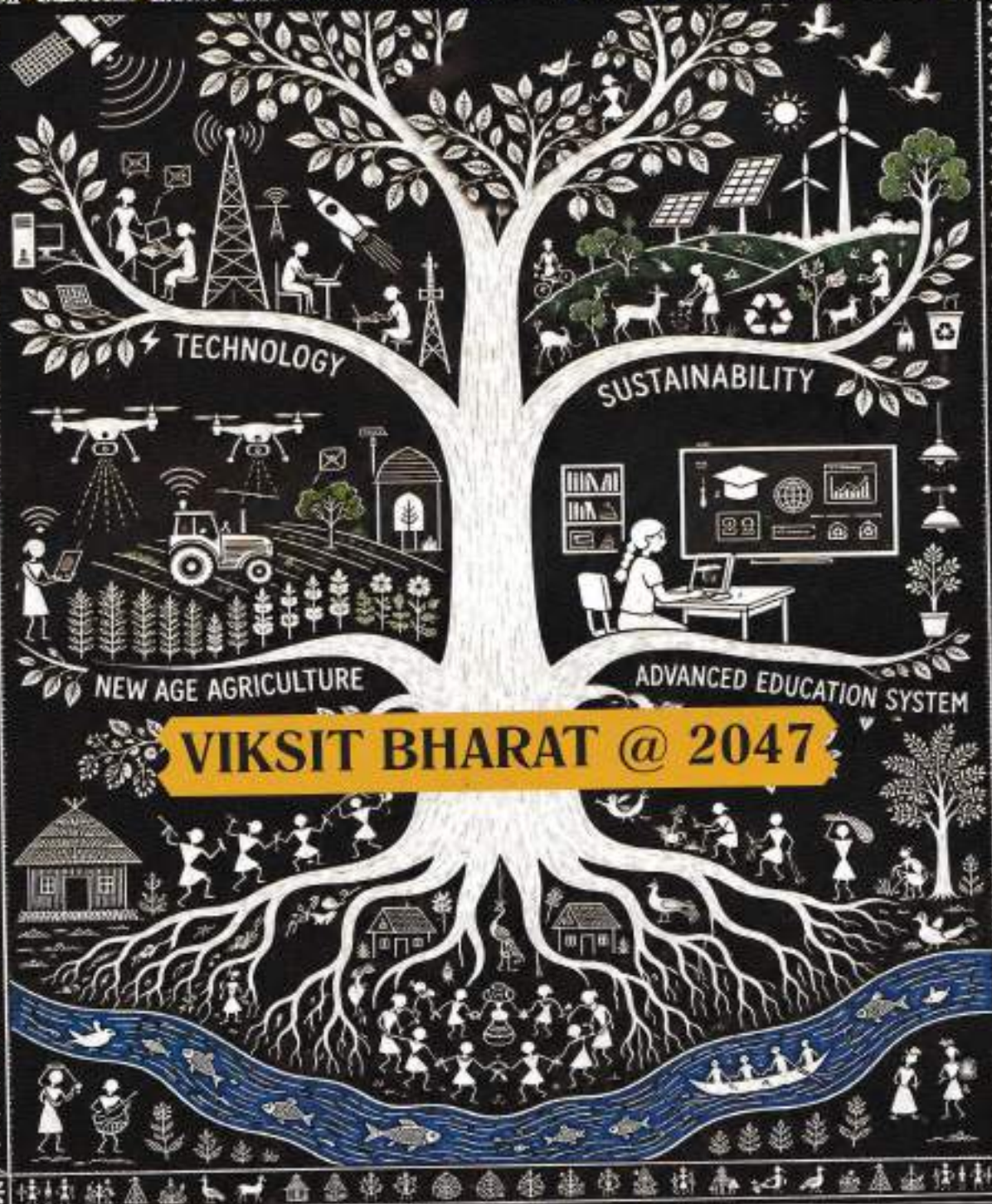
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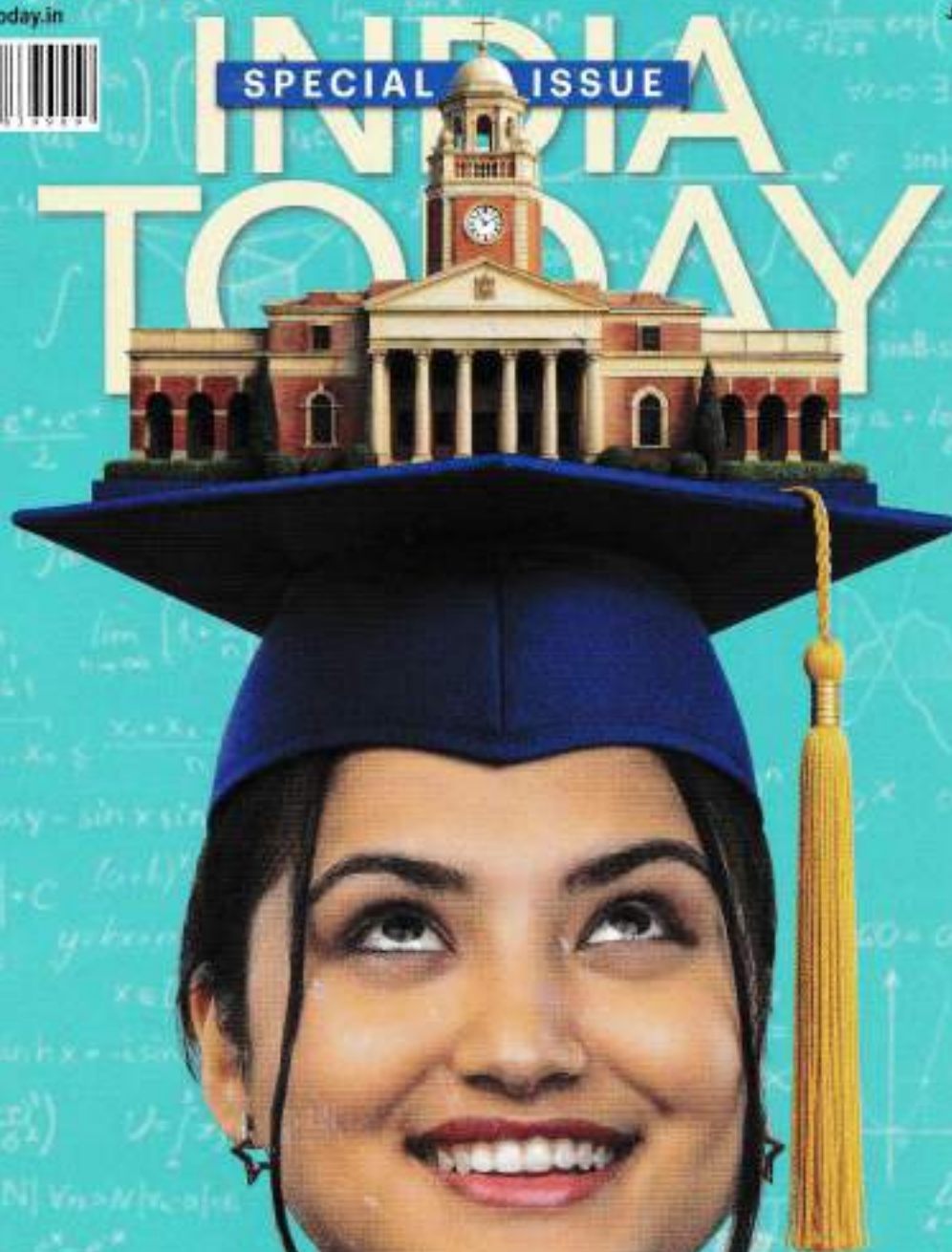
