'Flowering Cactus' by Subodh Gupta

Bihar, a land reborn from its shadows—once called the 'wild west of India'—now stands resilient, much like the cactus that roots itself deep in the hardest soil. The cactus becomes a mirror to the spirit of this place: enduring, protective, and quietly radiant.

In the cactus, warmth and endurance grow side by side. It tells the story of Bihar—not of defeat, but of transformation; not of desolation, but of a beauty that survives.

The artwork was installed in Patna in 2012 during the centennial celebration of Bihar.

ABOUT THE ARTIST

Subodh Gupta is a contemporary artist from Bihar now based in New Delhi. Trained as a painter, he went on to experiment with a variety of media. Gupta is known to work with ubiquitous objects such as mass-produced steel utensils. The ordinary items are combined and transformed into sculptures that reflect the social and political economies of Gupta's homeland, while acknowledging multiple references from the history of modern art.
