### NOTE:

In the meeting of the Vice-Chancellor's Forum held on 04.07.2017 at the University of Kashmir wherein an item w.r.t. Status of CBCS, Credit Transfer among Universities of the Region was discussed and all members unanimously expressed the necessity of credits transfer amongst sister Universities to help students of the state earn a specified number of credits at the University of his choice without any hassles. This would help the students to utilize their vacations and other similar lean periods effectively.

All the members resolved to bring in necessary amendments in their respective statutes/regulations to facilitate credit transfer without delay.

In view of the above, a Committee was constituted to frame Statutes and modalities for transfer of credits from the different Universities other than the University of Jammu under the Convenership of Dean Academic Affairs vide order No. F.Acd./I/17/9612-21 dated 11.09.2017.

As per the recommendations of the Committee at its meeting held on 19.09.2017, a Sub-Committee was constituted to frame the guidelines for transfer of credits from amongst the different Universities of the J&K State other than the University of Jammu. The draft Statutes and Modalities for transfer of credits prepared by the Sub-Committee were placed in the meetings of the Committee on 28.11.2017 & 30.11.2017 and the same was finalized.

#### STATUTES/SCHEME REGARDING TRANSFER OF CREDITS

1. PREAMBLE: The Government of India has set a goal of increasing the enrollment ratio GER to about 30% by 2020 and to 32% by 2021. The 12th Plan adopted a holistic approach to the issues of expansion, equity and excellence so that expansion was not just about accommodating ever larger numbers of students, but in also providing diverse choices of subjects, levels and institutions while ensuring minimum standards of academic quality and providing the opportunity to pursue higher education to all sections of society, particularly the disadvantaged. The Choice-based Credit System (CBCS) has several unique features: Enhanced learning opportunities, ability to match students' scholastic needs and aspirations, inter-institution transferability of students (following the completion of a semester), part-completion of an academic programme in the institution of enrolment and part-completion in a specialized (and recognized) institution, improvement in educational quality and excellence, flexibility for working students to complete the programme over an extended period of time, standardization and comparability of educational programme across the country, etc (RUSA, 2013).

The proposed Transfer of Credit Policy as would be applicable for the University of Jammu is as follows:

#### 2. DEFINITION

- 1. The University: University of Jammu.
- 2. Recognized/Accredited Institution: Institutions that the University will consider routinely for transfer of credit.
- 3. Transferable Courses: Courses in respect of which credits are earned at any recognized /accredited institution, including the Directorate of Distance Education(DDE)/off site campuses and affiliated colleges of University of Jammu.
- 4. Transfer of Credit: "Transfer" as used here refers to the movement of students from one college, university or recognized educational institution to another and to the process by which credits representing educational experiences, courses, degrees or credentials that are awarded by an education provider are accepted or not accepted by a receiving institution.

#### POLICY

The University shall grant credit for courses that are equivalent to its courses completed during the course of the programme at the University of Jammu or at any institution that is recognized/ accredited.

#### REGULATIONS

#### 4.1 For all Programmes(UG and PG Level)

1. Institutional Recognition: The University or the College in India should be recognized by a recognizing body (like the AICTE or the University Grants Commission (UGC) or as applicable).

2. General Education Requirements - The courses that are transferred from one University College should be compulsory to complete the degree and similar in nature.

3. Specializations- The specializations being offered by the transferring and receiving institutions should be similar.

- **4.** Case to Case basis: All such application for transfer of credits shall be taken up on case to case basis.
- 5. Parity Determining Authority: For the University of Jammu, The Dean Academic Affairs will be Parity Determining Authority and for the Colleges the Convener/s concerned will be the authority for determination of parity and grant of permission thereto.

#### 4.2 Specifications for the PG Programs: Transfer of credits will only be considered in case

- 1. Basic Eligibility Conditions are Fulfilled: The admission in the programmes of the University of Jammu takes place through JUET/CAT/MAT/any other recognized entrance test as applicable. There are some basic eligibility conditions for earning a degree in any of the subjects. There needs to be parity in such conditions among the transferring and receiving institution.
- 2. Seats are Available: All the Departments of the University are offering a fixed number of seats in a particular session. Transfer will only be possible if any seat is vacant/available at the time of receipt of application.
- 3. Parity of Credits is Ensured: As CBCS/Credit System is applicable in the University and affiliated colleges of the University of Jammu, the parity of credits has to be worked out between the transferring institutions for the Core, Foundation, Elective and Open Elective Courses etc.
- 4. There is Uniformity in Syllabi: The syllabi of the two transferring and receiving institutions should be uniform to the extent of at least 75%. This uniformity will be determined by the Departmental Affairs Committee, on the receipt of Application along with syllabi through the transferring institution. The final decision shall lie with the Dean Academic Affairs, University of Jammu.
- 5. Courses being offered by the Offsite Campuses/DDE/Affiliated Colleges have parity in terms of Syllabi, Credits and Marks i.e., the syllabi being offered and the parity of credits and marks have to be there, if the transfer is required.

#### 4.3 Specifications for the UG Programs: Transfer of credits will only be considered in case

- 1. Basic Eligibility Conditions are fulfilled: There are some basic eligibility conditions for earning a degree in any of the subjects. There needs to be parity in such conditions among the transferring and receiving institution.
- 2. Seats are Available: All the affiliated colleges/DDE of the University are offering a fixed number of seats in a particular stream/session. Transfer will only be possible if any seat is vacant at the time of receipt of application.
- 3. Parity of Credits is Ensured: As the CBCS/Credit System is applicable in the affiliated colleges/DDE of the University of Jammu, the parity of credits has to be worked out between the transferring institutions for Core, Foundation, Elective and Open Elective Courses etc.
- **4. There is Uniformity in Syllabi:** The syllabi of the two transferring and receiving institutions should be uniform to the extent of at least 75%. This uniformity will be determined by the concerned committee on the receipt of Application along with syllabi through the transferring institution. The final decision shall lie with the Convener/s concerned.

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- 4.4 General Specifications: The University shall allow students who wish to take a course either, core or elective or as applicable, at another institution or to the University of Jammu and its affiliated Colleges, to apply for credits in those courses provided that following conditions are met.
  - > An official transcript and description of the course(s) must be submitted with the written request.
  - > Transfer of Credits can only be awarded once an official transcript is submitted to the University from the institution that originally granted the course credit. This evaluation shall be incomplete if the student is in the process of completing his/her coursework elsewhere. The final evaluation shall be made upon the receipt of official transcript showing grades and credits.
  - > On the submission of his/her application to the University, a student should submit the syllabi (including other relevant documents related to the course, if available) of all the transferable courses that she/he completed in other institutions along with the transcript form the host institution, to the Dean Academic Affairs for final approval of credits earned.
  - ➤ In case of core courses, the transferable course will be equated with an existing course of the University through an evaluation process wherein the subject matter of the transferable course shall be submitted to the Departmental/Admission Committee of the concerned Department/college through the concerned Dean/Convener/s concerned for expert opinion. If the opinion of the Committee is not favorable, the course shall not be transferred.
  - > Transferable courses shall have to be completed at UGC/AICTE recognized/accredited institutions and shall have to be similar in nomenclature (title/syllabi of the course), Weightage (Number of Credits) and subject content to the courses taught at this University.
  - > No credit will be granted towards a degree for distance programmes or for the courses offered by the offsite campuses of another institution unless those credits are approved as equivalent by the institution where he/she is seeking admission.
  - A minimum of fifty percent credits of the total required to earn a degree must be completed at this University or an affiliated college to satisfy residency requirements for the degree programme.
  - A maximum of fifty percent credits of the total (as required to earn a degree of this University) from UGC/AICTE recognized/accredited institutions may be transferred to a student's program.
  - > The MOOC/ONLINE courses completed elsewhere from any recognized agency during the course of the programme at the University of Jammu shall be considered for transfer. Credits earned by a student from any institution prior to the admission to the programme at the University shall not be accepted for transfer.
  - > The student's entire transfer record, from all institutions, will be posted on the transcript and reflected in the transfer GPA or as the case may be.
  - Any students found violating the University's transfer credit policy with respect to any transferable course shall lose credits of all transferable courses.
  - A student who wishes to repeat a course at the University, where transfer of credits has been allowed; the credit and grade for the courses completed at the University will be reflected in the University grade point average, and any credit previously accepted in transfer for the course will then be revoked.
  - > All requirements for transfer of credits for the courses shall have to be completed within the stipulated time period of the degree programme.

- > The students who intend to join any other institution for obtaining credits, shall seek prior permission from the HoD/Principal of the concerned Department/College for the same.
- > For the students who wish to transfer credits earned from the University of Jammu to other Universities/Institutes shall be facilitated by the University of Jammu by being provided relevant Transcript(s)/Performance Cards as desired by receiving University/Institute.

## 4.5 The Documents to be submitted through the University/College for applicants seeking transfer are:

- Class 10th, 12th and BA/B.Sc/B.Com/etc( if and as applicable) Mark sheets and Migration certificate duly attested/self attested.
- Mark sheet of the Class last attended duly authenticated by the Competent Authority.
- Any other certification course undertaken, with the number of hours required in that, and the laboratory work if any along with credits earned information.
- Reason for transfer of credit, the performance during the course of study and other personal details.
- Application alongwith requisite Fee amounting to Rs.3000/- (Rupees Three Thousand only) or as notified by the University from time to time in addition to other applicable fees.

#### ITEM New 07

(a) To confirm the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor in having authorized the extension of Wi-Fi facility to the PG students residing in the Hostels (Boys & Girls) of the Main Campus by charging a fee of Rs.1800/- (Rs.150/- per month) annually from each student user including M.Phil./Ph.D research scholars.

(b) To consider the recommendation of the Internet and Networking Committee w.r.t. reduction in charging of fee for Wi-Fi facility from Rs.1800/- to Rs.1000/- annually from P.G. student residing in the Hostels (Boys & Girls) of the Main Campus of the University of Jammu.

#### NOTE:

(a) The demand of the students regarding the extension of Wi-Fi facility to the students of the University was deliberated by the duly constituted Committee on 15.05.20017 and 29.05.2017 under the Convenership of Prof. Vibhakar Mansotra, Director, Centre for IT Enabled Services & Management, University of Jammu and after threadbare deliberations, keeping in view the genuine demand of the students community, the members were of the opinion that the Wi-Fi facility must be extended to the campus students. A copy of minutes is placed as Annexure-I.

The extension of the Wi-Fi facility to the students shall be done in two phases, Initially the Centre has completed all the necessary requirements in the existing Girls and Boys Hostels and all the hostels have been made Wi-Fi enabled and the facility shall be extended to the PG students of the hostels immediately.

As per the decision of the Committee every student including M.Phil/Ph.D shall have to pay an annual internet fee of Rs.1800 (Rs.150 per month) for meeting partial day to day support services and maintenance of the network Equipments.

In view of the above, a notification, in anticipation of the approval of the Competent Bodies, has been issued vide No. F.Acd./I/18/355-414 dated 09.04.2018 (Annexure-II).

(b) Among other issues, the representation of the students of the University of Jammu for providing free Wi-Fi connection, was deliberated in the meetings of the Internet and Networking Committee on 24.04.2018 and 10.05.2018 wherein it was discussed that the University has issued an order vide No. F.Acd./I/18/355-414 dated 09.04.2018 for extension of Wi-Fi connection to the PG students with an annual internet fee of Rs.1800/- and also discussed various aspects of the issue vis-à-vis the existing infrastructure and various pros and cons including the recurring maintenance cost of the internet. It was noted that with the present setup including some equipment in the networking control room and various other places, it is not so easy, to extend this facility to the entire student community, the earlier committee has recommended to extend this facility to the PG students also. It was observed that there is huge recurring cost associated with the maintenance of Hardware, Software and day to day

requirements and the equipment lying in the control room has reached end to life and requires huge investment in its maintenance. The bandwidth presently available is also not sufficient to cope up the burden of additional large number of users and thus the existing bandwidth is required to supplement with additional bandwidth for which the investment has to be made.

It was further deliberated on the demand of students seeking free W-Fi connection and observed that such a demand is not at all justified and genuine as the free internet facility already exists in all the Department and Hostels as a Central Facility. Any student can use this central facility in his/her Department. Moreover, the central library of the University also has a central internet facility which can also be used by the students as per their convenience. However, the students are demanding Wi-Fi connection on their own devices which cannot be provided free of cost, as a huge cost is involved in the maintenance of the network and other devices including user management. Moreover, once the Wi-Fi connection is allowed to the students on their own devices, the no. of Wi-Fi users in the University are going to increase more than double and lot of maintenance shall be required to manage the users. After deliberations on the annual recurring cost incurred on the maintenance of the Campus Network and Internet services, a rough estimate was worked out and it was noted that the University has to spend around 90.0 lacs annually as recurring expenses on the upkeep and maintenance of internet services. The detail of the recurring expenditure is placed as Annexure-III.

Keeping in view the huge cost involved in the maintenance of Campus Network, Hardware, Software and user Management as well the requirements of additional manpower for the purpose, the members are of the view that there is no justification to provide free W-Fi connections to the students, however, the University can consider the reduction in the internet fee as already notified vide order No. F.Acd./I/18/355-414 dated 09.04.2018. After deliberations the members reviewed the internet fee to be charged from the Scholars and Students and decided that instead of annual fee of Rs.1800/-, the University may charge Rs.1000/- and resolved as:

"the order of the University No. F.Acd./I/18/355-414 dated 09.04.2018 with regard to extension of Wi-Fi facility to the student (including Scholars) of the campus be modified and an internet fee of Rs.1000/instead of Rs.1800/- be charged annually. Further this internet fee shall be paid by each student (including Research Scholars) in the concerned Department/ Centre at the time of admission. Each Department/Centre shall in turn send the entire internet fee, so collected from the students along with list of students and scholars admitted in the Department, to the Director, Centre for IT. A formal order in this regard may be issued through the Dean Academic Affairs the teaching Heads of the all to communicated Departments/Centres."

Hence, the matter at (a) is reported for confirmation and (b) is submitted for consideration.

## ITEM: To discuss the issue of Extension of Wi-Fi connectivity to the P.G students of the University.

At the outset the convener welcomed the members and apprised them that the existing Wi-Fi facility in the Campus is limited to the Teachers, Officers, Non-teaching Staff and Research Scholars. It was further apprised that now the student community of the University is also demanding Wi-Fi facility for their academic purpose. Students have represented for their Wi-Fi demand to the Hon'ble Vice -Chancellor through various representations dated 07/10/16 and 17/03/17. These students have also personally met and apprised the Vice-Chancellor about the importance and the genuine need of this facility.

The members deliberated on the issue and observed that in today's era internet plays a pivotal role in the academic as well as overall development of the society in general and the student community in particular. The members felt that Wi-Fi facility is a basic requirement of the day and must be provided to the student community to the extent possible. It was further pointed out that the Govt. of India has already Launched the Digital India Programme with the vision to transform India into a Digitally Empowered Society & knowledge economy and is making all efforts to ensure presence of ICT in every nook and corner of the country. The ministry of HRD is all set to provide free Wi-Fi to all the central Universities in the country in order to influence the potential of ICT in teaching learning process. The members, therefore, opined that Wi-Fi facility shall definitely add to the academics of the students community as there is huge repository of academic online resources which can be explored and used by the entire academic community including Students for enhancing their knowledge information.

However, the members also observed that the present infrastructure is quite old and needs upgradation/ replacement. The members discussed various aspects of the issue vis a vis the existing infrastructure and various pros and cons. It was observed that with the present setup, including equipment in the networking control room and various other places, it is not possible to extend this facility to the entire student community in the campus. It was further observed that presently the equipment lying in the control room has reached end of life and cannot sustain additional burden. The members also desired that the information in this regard particularly about the security and other policies adopted by the neighboring Universities, if any, be obtained and examined. Accordingly the information from the neighboring Universities like Punjab University. Chandigarh, and University of Kashmir was sought, telephonically, by the Director IT, regarding the Wi-Fi facility to the students community in their campuses. During the conversation with the Concerned persons in these institutions it was learnt that Wi-Fi facility has been extended to the student community by these institutions with various checks and measures (Policies).

Finally, the members deliberated that the extension of such facility to such a huge number requires good Infrastructure in terms of Manpower. Hardware and Software for Security Policies and user Management. It was also observed that once such a facility is extended to all the students in the campus, the management of the users shall be a great challenge before for the people of the Centre for ITESM involved in the maintenance and management. Hence it was felt that some officials of the IT- centre should make a visit to one of the neighboring Universities for detailed assessment of the various types of requirements, functionalities and management of such a huge

Therefore, after threadbare deliberations, keeping in view the genuine demand of the students community, the members were of the opinion that the Wi-Fi facility must be extended to the campus students. However, for extension of this Wi-Fi facility to all the students it shall be necessary to upgrade and enhance the existing infrastructure along with upgradation of the internet bandwidth. Therefore, the members were of the view that the following arrangements are required to be put in place before the Wi-Fi facility is extended to the student community. Hence keeping in mind the need and requirement of Wi-Fi for the student community and also the necessity of Enhancement and upgradation of the IT-Infrastructure, the members made the following A)

- The Wi-Fi facility may be extended to the student community of the campus.
- To meet day to day maintenance and support service every student, including M.Phil./Ph.D. research scholars, shall have to pay an annual internet fee of Rs
- The internet fee shall be paid by the student in the concerned Department /
- Each Dept./Centre shall in turn send the entire internet fee, so collected from each student, to the Director, Centre for IT for meeting day to day maintenance and other expenses.
- After the expiry of one year the student shall renew the Wi-Fi connection after seeking proper admission in the respective department in the subsequent year.
- A formal order in this regard may be issued through the competent authority

  - e) The 10% rider be qualified with the condition that minimum of 25 copies in the subject are there in 10% calculation.

#### NOTE:

It is submitted that the matter w.r.t. the variation in the original and the re-evaluation awards in the Under Graduate classes was placed before the Standing Committee of the Academic Council at its meeting held on 04.10.2017 wherein it was discussed that

"The matter referred to by a group of Conveners deliberated in a meeting held on 03.10.2017 was briefed to the worthy members by the chair. The matter pertains to the abnormal variation observed in the original marks and re-evaluation marks of the UG 1st Semester CBCS Re-evaluation result being compiled for declaration. Though the number of such copies, where such a variation is observed is less as compared to total number of copies, still the academic sanctity has to be maintained and up held for which the following decisions be endorsed:

- a) A committee be constituted to look deeply into and frame wide ranging guidelines to be implemented in evaluation of copies.
- b) In present and similar cases if the subject wise re-evaluation awards are more than 100% in variation for 10% of the total copies in that subject, a third evaluation be followed and the average of the nearest of the two of the three evaluations be awarded. In cases where the difference is equal in all the three evaluations, average of the three be awarded.
- c) The seriousness of evaluation be thoroughly discussed in respective Board of Studies and all evaluators be duly sensitized by the Conveners in this regard.
- d) The evaluation be made mandatory for atleast 300 copies in a academic year for all the faculty members and the letter to this effect be issued by the Registrar to all the Principals of the

- affiliated Colleges with a copy to the Director Colleges, Higher Education and Commissioner/Secretary, Higher Education.
- e) Incase of contractual faculty in Colleges/University, the above mandatory limit of 300 copies shall also be binding and in the absence of the same they shall not be eligible for appointment as contractual faculty in the following year.

In view of the above resolution, a notification w.r.t. (b), (d) and (e), in anticipation of the approval of the Competent Bodies, has been issued vide No. F.Acd./I/17/11022-11122 dated 10.10.2017 (Annexure-I) and a Committee w.r.t. (a) has been constituted vide order No. F.Acd./I/17/11448-458 dated 18.10.2018 (Annexure-II).

The action taken w.r.t. above notification was placed in the Academic Council at its meeting held on 23.11.2017 wherein it was resolved vide resolution No. 3.8.2 resolved that –

"the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor in having authorized the following, i.e.:

- a) in the present and similar cases of Under Graduate Courses, where the subject wise re-evaluation awards are almost 100% or more in variation for 10% of the total copies in that subject, a third evaluation be followed and the average of the nearest of the two of the three evaluations be awarded. #### NOTE:

It is submitted that the relevant Statute of the set of Statutes governing the MCA is Course speaks like thus-

"A candidate shall be admitted to MCA course in first, third, & fifth semester, as the case may be. The admission to the first semester will be governed by the relevant preceding statutes. The admission to third (fifth) semester shall be open to only those candidates who secured pass marks in at least half of the number of courses including practical of first (third) semester in the University examination and in the internal assessment in all courses of second (fourth) semester. The candidates shall be enrolled in second, fourth and sixth semester provided they secure pass marks in internal assessment in all the courses of respective preceding semester and who are otherwise found eligible under the statutes.

In any case, the candidate has to clear all the courses of MCA during the maximum period of three years to be calculated from the date he/she was scheduled to appear for the first time in the semester examination or the date he/she appeared first in the semester examination, as the case may be. Unless otherwise provided, he will have to appear in the course or a course according to the syllabus prescribed by the University for the semester examination in which he appears. Provided that the candidate, who fails to qualify all the semester examinations in full within the prescribed time, may be allowed to avail of one more chance to qualify the backlog courses at the immediate next session after the expiry of statutory period.

In such cases, the marks obtained in sessional assessment in the course concerned shall be carried forward.

Provided that a candidate who fails to clear semester examination within the stipulated number of chances, may if he/she so desires, apply to the Vice-Chancellor for grant of one MERCY CHANCE with in a period of five years from the session he/she first appeared in the semester examination. If he/she again fails, he/she shall have to appear in the examination in the failed courses/substituted courses to fill up academic deficiencies as determined by the Convener, Board of studies. He/she shall not be required to earn fresh eligibility to appear in such semester examinations including practical. He/she will have to appear according to the syllabus and courses of study in vogue. In all such cases, the marks shall be raised proportionately in lieu of internal assessment. This provision shall also be applicable to other candidates appearing privately.

Notwithstanding anything contained above, a candidate who fails in the internal assessment even after availing of the chance under the provision of relevant statute or does not avail the chance under the said provision to be

assessed again in internal assessment and has passed in the courses of all this semester examination except in the internal assessment in any courses(s) shall be allowed in the examination of the said coursess) at the subsequent examination of that semester when held by the University, as a private candidate according to the syllabi and course of study in vogue in all such cases the marks of said courses(s) shall be raised proportionately in lieu of the internal assessment.

A candidate namely Amit Sawhney S/o K.L. Sawhney bearing Roll No.146-MCA-11 who had availed all the chances due to him including Mercy chance, submitted an application with the request that one final chance be granted to him to appear in Course No. 310 of MCA Semester 3rd in order to enable him to clear his backlog.

To report the action taken by the University with regard to letter received from UGC regarding Categorization of University under UGC {Categorization of Universities (only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy} Regulations, 2018.

#### NOTE:

March William

The University Grants Commission in the month of March 2018 sought information from Universities with regard to NAAC grading, ranking under National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) and information about the composite nature of the University i.e its teaching departments, affiliated colleges, distance education and off site campuses. University of Jammu submitted the complete information to UGC on 9th March 2018.

The UGC then released a list of sixty-two [62] higher educational institutes comprising of central universities, state universities, private universities and eight colleges to which it has granted full autonomy, based on the standard of excellence maintained by these institutes.

The University of Jammu is among the 12 state universities of the country and the only University of the State which has been recognized by the UGC under its new initiative of granting graded autonomy.

In this regard, a letter no. F.91-3/2018 (SU-I/II) was received from UGC regarding Categorization of University under UGC {Categorization of Universities (only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy) Regulations, 2018 (Copy enclosed as Annexure-I) informing the University of Jammu of it being graded as Category-I University and being eligible for benefits under Clause 4 (Dimensions of Autonomy for Category-I Universities). Copy of Clause 4 regulations enclosed as Annexure-II.

Further, the UGC sought the following information from the University:

1. An acknowledgement in writing that University of Jammu shall strictly comply with all the regulations as mentioned in the provisions (Clause 4) of UGC

Regulations 2018.

2. University of Jammu shall intimate the commission about its changed status as per Clause 6 of the UGC Regulations 2018 (copy enclosed) i.e. the Universities under Category 1 and II shall continue to be in their respective categories as long as they maintain parameters related to accreditation score or international ranking and university has to intimate the UGC its changed status within Thirty

3. The benefits being implemented from the new academic session.

Accordingly, a compliance/acknowledgement has been submitted to UGC (copy enclosed as Annexure-III).

In order to implement the benefits, a letter has been issued to all the heads of the departments requesting them to discuss and take up the matter in their DACs and prepare an action plan which shall form part of the Action Taken Report of the implementation of the benefits linked to Category-I University to be sent to UGC for information after the commencement of the new academic session.

Sir,

As you are aware, UGC is mandated to determine, promote and maintain the standards of higher education in the country. UGC is constantly striving to create an enabling environment whereby higher educational institutions in the country can become institution of global excellence. UGC is also aware that global excellence can be achieved by extending autonomy to better performing institutions for promoting and institutionalizing excellence in higher education.

In order to grant autonomy to the better performing institutions, UGC has notified UGC [Categorization of Universities (only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy] Regulations, 2018 on 12th February, 2018 in the Gazette of India.

The proposal received from **University of Jammu** under the above UGC Regulations has been examined, processed and considered by the Commission in its 530th meeting held on 20.03.2018. **The Commission has decided to grade the University of Jammu as Category-I University as per the provisions of the above UGC Regulations.** The University shall now be eligible for all the benefits as stipulated under Clause 4 (Dimensions of Autonomy for Category-I Universities) of the above mentioned UGC Regulations.

However, the University shall inform the UGC about the benefits being implemented from the new academic session. In light of this, the university should acknowledge in writing that it shall strictly comply with all the regulations as mentioned in the provisions (Clause 4) of the University Grants Commission (Categorization of Universities (only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy) Regulations, 2018.

It is further informed that the university shall intimate the Commission about its changed status as per Clause 6 of the said regulations.

## UNIVERSITY GRANTS COMMISSION [CATEGORISATION OF UNIVERSITIES (ONLY) FOR GRANT OF GRADED AUTONOMY] REGULATIONS, 2018

F. No. 1-8-2017(CPP-II).—The following is published for general information:—

#### Preamble

Whereas University Grants Commission (UGC) is mandated to determine, promote and maintain the standards of higher education in higher educational institutions (HEIs);

Whereas, UGC recognizes the need to create an enabling environment whereby HEIs can become institution of global excellence;

Whereas, UGC recognizes that autonomy is pivotal to promoting and institutionalizing excellence in higher education and that the regulatory framework needs to facilitate better performing institutions towards excellence in higher education.

Therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (j) of Section 12 read with clause (g) of subsection (1) of Section 26 of the University Grants Commission Act. 1956, the University Grants Commission hereby makes the following regulations:-

#### 1. Short title, application and commencement -

- (1) These regulations shall be called the University Grants Commission (Categorization of Universities (only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy) Regulations, 2018.
- (2) They shall apply to all universities established or incorporated by or under a Central Act, a Provincial Act, or a State Act and any Institution Deemed to be University under Section 3 of UGC Act, 1956.
- (3) They shall come into force from the date of their notification in the Official Gazette of India.

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#### 2. Definitions-

In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

- (a) "Accreditation" means the process of quality control in higher education, whereby, as a result of evaluation or assessment or by any other scientific method followed by recognized accreditation agencies, an HEI or programme(s) conducted therein is recognised as conforming to benchmarked parameters of academic quality:
- (b) "Assessment" means the process involved in ascertaining or verifying the capabilities of an HEI in terms of its physical infrastructure, human resources (including faculty), administration, course curricula, admission and student evaluation procedures and governance structure prior to the commencement of its academic programmes;
- (c) "Commission" means the University Grants Commission as defined in the University Grants Commission Act, 1956;
- (d) "CGPA" means cumulative grade point average grading system as followed by NAAC or any other Assessment and Accreditation Agencies (AAA) recognized by the Commission under relevant UGC regulations, while granting accreditation;
- (e) "National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC)" means the body established by the Commission to assess and accredit HEIs in the country;
- (f) "Open & Distance Learning" mode means a mode of providing flexible learning opportunities by overcoming separation of teacher and learner using a variety of media, including print, electronic, online and occasional interactive face-to-face meetings with the presence of an HEI or Learner Support Services to deliver teaching-learning experiences, including practical or work experiences;
- (g) "Times Higher Education/QS Rankings" means annual publication of university rankings by Times Higher Education (THE) magazine and by Quacquarelli Symonds (QS);
- (h) "University" means University established or incorporated by or under a Central Act, a Provincial Act or a State Act, and includes an institution deemed to be university;

Words and expressions used and not defined in these regulations but defined in the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 and not consistent with these regulations shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them in that Act.

#### 3. Framework for Categorization of Universities for Grant of Graded Autonomy

The Commission shall categorize Universities into following three categories i.e. Category-I, Category-II and Category-III based on the parameters laid down in sub-clauses (i), (ii) and (iii) and as notified by the Commission through detailed guidelines from time to time.

#### (i) Category-I University:

University shall be in Category-I if

- a. It has been accredited by NAAC with a score of 3.51 or above; or
- b. It has received a corresponding accreditation grade/score from a reputed accreditation agency empanelled by the UGC; or
- It has been ranked among top 500 of reputed world rankings, such as Times Higher Education or OS.

#### (ii) Category-II University:

University shall be in Category-II if

- a. It has been accredited by NAAC with a score of 3.26 and above, upto 3.50; or
- b. It has received a corresponding accreditation grade/score from a reputed accreditation agency empanelled by the UGC:

#### (iii) Category-III University:

University shall be in Category-III if it does not come either under Category-II.

### 4. Dimensions of Autonomy for Category-I Universities

- 4.1 Universities shall be automatically deemed to be under section 12B of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 and no inspections by the Commission shall be required for the same.
- 4.2 Universities may start a new course/programme/department/school/centre in part of its existing academic framework without approval of the UGC, provided no demand for fund is made from the government on account of starting the new course/programme/department/school/centre. Degree programs shall be consistent with the approved nomenclature of the UGC. Diploma and certificate courses approved by its Statutory Authorities or Statutory Regulatory Authorities wherever required, may be started in new and innovative areas that are relevant to local, national or international needs, with information to the UGC:

Provided that for Government owned Deemed to be Universities, approval shall be taken from the Government if funding is sought from the Government for starting a new course/programme/department/school in self-financing mode.

- 4.3 Universities may open constituent units/off-campus centres within its geographical jurisdiction, without the approval of the UGC, provided it is able to arrange both recurring and non-recurring revenue sources and does not need any assistance for the same from the UGC or the Government.
- 4.4 Universities may start skill courses, consistent with the National Skills Qualification Framework, without approval of the UGC, provided no demand for fund is made from the government on account of starting the new courses. Degree programmes shall be consistent with the approved nomenclature of UGC. Diploma and certificate courses approved by its Statutory Authorities or Statutory Regulatory Authorities wherever required, may be started in new and innovative areas that are relevant to local, national or international needs, with information to the UGC.
- 4.5 Universities may open research parks, incubation centres, university society linkage centres, in self-financing mode, either on its own or in partnership with private partners, without approval of Commission. However, in all such arrangements, the ownership of all immovable property and that component of movable property procured through the resources of the Institution shall remain with the University.
- Universities, subject to the Rules, Regulations and Guidelines of Government of India, may hire, without approval of the Commission, foreign faculty having taught at any institution appearing in top five hundred of any of the world renowned ranking frameworks, such as the Times Higher Education World University Rankings or the QS Rankings, upto twenty percent over and above of their total sanctioned faculty strength. Universities will have the freedom to hire foreign faculty on "tenure/contract" basis as per the terms and conditions approved by their Governing Council/Statutory bodies.
- 4.7 Universities shall be free to admit foreign students on merit, subject to a maximum of twenty percent, over and above of the strength of their approved domestic students. Universities would be free to fix and charge fees from foreign students without any restriction.
- 4.8 Universities, while following the pay scales as laid down by the Commission, shall build in an incentive structure to attract talented faculty, with the condition that the incentive structure shall have to be paid from their own revenue sources and not from Commission or Government funds. Such incentive structure shall be strictly merit based with clear defined, transparent and objective criteria and shall not be universal. It must necessarily be approved by both the Academic Council and the Finance Committee of the Institution, apart from Statutory Bodies like Senate/Syndicate/Executive Council, as the case may be. The Commission shall be informed of the incentive structure within thirty days of approval by the statutory bodies of the Institution.
- 4.9 Universities may engage in academic collaborations with foreign educational institutions, as per the UGC (Promotion and Maintenance of Standards of Academic Collaboration between Indian and Foreign Educational Institutions) Regulations, 2016, without approval of the Commission with foreign institutions in top 500 of Times Higher Education World University Rankings or QS Rankings or top 200 of discipline specific ranking in Times Higher Education World University Rankings or QS Rankings.

- 4.10 Universities may offer courses in the Open and Distance Learning mode, without approval of the Commission, provided it satisfies all the conditions laid down under UGC (Open and Distance Learning) Regulations, 2017 and amendments from time to time.
- 4.11 Universities shall be exempted from annual monitoring of their off-campus centre(s) and / or the study centre(s), as stipulated under Section 3.3 of the UGC (Establishment of and Maintenance of Standards in Private Universities) Regulations. 2003 as amended /modified from time to time, except when there is substantive evidence of their not meeting basic minimum criteria or of irregularities or malpractices.
- 4.12 In case there is any external review required by the Commission under any statute or executive order, then it would be sufficient that the institution sends a report to the Commission in a prescribed review format.

## 5. Dimensions of Autonomy for Category-II Universities

- 5.1 Universities may start a new course/programme department/school/centre in disciplines that form a part of its existing academic framework without approval of the UGC, provided no demand for fund is made from the government on account of starting the new course/programme/department/school/centre. Degree programs shall be consistent with the approved nomenclature of the UGC. Diploma and certificate courses approved by its Statutory Authorities or Statutory Regulatory Authorities wherever required, may be started in new and innovative areas that are relevant to local, national or international needs, with information to the UGC:
  - Provided that for Government owned Deemed to be Universities, approval shall be taken from the Government if funding is sought from the Government for starting a new course/programme/department/school in self-financing mode.
- While according permission of starting off campus centers by Institutions Deemed to be Universities, no inspection of the Commission shall be required. This concession shall be subjected to opening two off-campus centres in every five years and as stipulated in the UGC (Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2016 and amendments, if any, from time to time.
- Universities may start skill courses, consistent with the National Skills Qualification Framework, without approval of the UGC, provided no demand for fund is made from the government on account of starting the new courses. Degree programmes shall be consistent with the approved nomenclature of UGC. Diploma and certificate courses approved by its Statutory Authorities or Statutory Regulatory Authorities wherever required, may be started in new and innovative areas that are relevant to local, national or international needs, with information to the UGC.
- Universities, subject to the Rules, Regulations and Guidelines of the Government of India, may hire, without approval of the Commission, foreign faculty having taught at any institution appearing in top five hundred of any of the world renowned ranking frameworks, such as the Times Higher Education World University Rankings or the QS Rankings, upto twenty percent over and above of their total sanctioned faculty strength. Universities will have the freedom to hire foreign faculty on tenure/contract" basis as per the terms and conditions approved by their Governing Council/Statutory bodies.
- Universities, while following the pay scales as laid down by the Commission, shall build in an incentive structure to attract talented faculty, with the condition that the incentive structure shall have to be paid from their own revenue sources and not from Commission or Government funds. Such incentive structure shall be strictly merit based with clear defined, transparent and objective criteria and should not be universal. It must necessarily be approved by both the Academic Council and the Finance Committee of the Institution, apart from Statutory Bodies like Senate/Syndicate/Executive Council, as the case may be. The Commission shall be informed of the incentive structure within thirty days of approval by the statutory bodies of the Institution.
- Universities shall be free to admit foreign students on merit subject to a maximum of twenty percent, over and above of the strength of their approved domestic students. Universities would be free to fix and charge fees from foreign students without any restriction.
- Universities may offer courses in the Open and Distance Learning mode, with approval of the Commission, provided it satisfies all the conditions laid down under UGC Open and Distance Learning) Regulations, 2017 and amendments from time to time.

- 5.8 In case there is any external review required by the Commission under any statute or executive order, than the review can be done by the institution itself through external peer review mechanism wherein the per team members shall be chosen by the institution themselves from representatives of Category-I Universities, and the review report shall be sent to the commission after completion of the review.
- Change in Category of Universities for non-maintenance of accreditation score or ranking as defined in Clause 3.
- Universities under Category-I and Category-II shall continue to be in their respective categories as long as they maintain the required parameters related to accreditation score or international ranking as defined in Clause 3, as the case may be, for that category.
- 6.2 It shall be incumbent upon university to intimate the Commission its changed status within thirty days of such a change.
- 6.3 If university fails to maintain status in a category and moves down to a lower category, it shall not be entitled to enjoy any privileges already accorded to it from the day of such downgrading:

Provided that any kind of initiatives taken under the privileges associated with erstwhile higher status shall be permitted to continue till their approved duration / logical conclusion, provided that the activity / action initiated has been communicated previously to the UGC:

Provided further that if such university regains back its earlier higher status, the privileges of that higher category shall be restored from the day the status is changed.

- 7. Procedure for Categorization of Universities
- 7.1 The Commission shall fix dates (at least two times in a year, preferably 1st of June and 1st of December) by which an institution shall submit a request in prescribed format for categorization under these Regulations. The dates so fixed shall be notified at least six months in advance.
- 7.2 All such applications shall be scrutinized by the Commission and orders on Categorization shall be passed within thirty days from the last date specified for the receipt of such applications. During this period, the Commission shall also place such application on its website.
- 8. Change in parameters/requirements, if any, for eligibility under category-I or category-II of Universities.

Whenever there is a change in the categorization parameters as detailed in Regulation (3) above, it shall be notified by the UGC separately.

9. Graded Autonomy Regulations vis-à-vis other Regulations

The provisions mentioned in the clause 4 and 5 of the Regulations i.e. dimensions of autonomy for Category-I Universities and Category-II Universities respectively, shall prevail in case of any inconsistent/conflicting provisions in the other UGC Regulations.

10. Removal of Difficulties

UGC reserves the right to remove difficulty/difficulties in the course of implementation of these Regulations in consultation with the Government of India /Ministry of Human Resource Development.

It was discussed that under the scheme of the Choice Based Credit System, Core course is the major part of a Dogri Language and it is necessary to opt Dogri Literature as a Core course at Under Graduate Level. So in order to encourage and upgrade the Dogri language, it was resolved that the Dogri Literature be introduced as a Core subject at Under Graduate Level in the Colleges and the same be placed in the ensuing meeting of the Academic Council.

Hence, the matter is submitted for consideration.

**FTEM No.: 19** 

To consider the proposal for introduction of self supporting Master's Degree Programme in Education in the Directorate of Distance Education University of Jammu, Jammu.

#### NOTE:

M.A. Education is an innovative programme which provides the learners a wider and more comprehensive understanding of education as a field of knowledge and can accommodate a wide variety of their learning needs. A large number of students are approaching the Directorate to seek admission to M.A. Education Programme through distance mode as the sanctioned seats in regular programme in the Department of Education is only 50.

It is pertinent to mention here that the Broad Based Advisory Committee of the Directorate of Distance Education in its meeting held on 12-09-2017 vide resolution No.5 has resolved to start new courses reflecting changing requirement of the society. The recommendation stands approved by the Academic Council vide resolution No3.10.2 dated: 23-11-2017

In this context a proposal for introduction of self financing M.A. Education Programme through distance mode in Directorate of Distance Education, University of Jammu is given as Annexure-I for consideration and approval of the Academic Council.

# A PROPOSAL FOR INTRODUCTION OF SELF SUPPORTING M.A. EDUCATION PROGRAMME THROUGH DISTANCE EDUCATION MODE IN DIRECTORATE OF DISTANCE EDUCATION,

#### UNIVERSITY OF JAMMU

Distance education is the most rapidly developing an alternative mode of learning provided by educational institutions, both in the developing and developed countries. It applies the new and learner-centered pedagogical modules of learning. At present, it is playing an increasingly important role in dissemination of knowledge. Distance learning aims at diversifying and proliferating educational opportunities far beyond the close confines of a classroom, making them available to all those who aspire and endeavor for education but are unable to do so due to constraints of time, place and money. It is far more flexible, open and less costly mode of education. It is based on the philosophy that anything, which can be learnt in the regular classroom, can equally be learnt through distance education mode.

The Jammu & Kashmir State is extremely mountainous and geographically remote. It is difficult for the students of these areas to pursue their higher education because of economic and social backwardness. It is felt that distance mode of education can cater to the needs, especially of the socially and economically weaker and underprivileged sections of society living in remote and inaccessible hilly areas of J&K State and also of those who cannot seek admission to institutions of higher education/University P.G. departments because of limited number of seats.

'Education' as a field of knowledge is growing day by day. Knowledge in Education is as diverse as education itself. It evolves not only from the operational dimensions of education but also from theoretical and conceptual articulations with the perspective of other disciplines.

M.A. Education is an innovative programme, which would provide the learners a wider and more comprehensive understanding of education as a field of knowledge and would accommodate a wide variety of their learning needs. Needs may range from understanding the concept of education to knowing how knowledge gets generated in the area of education and to acquire higher levels of specialization in specific aspects of education. The courses of the programme represent a

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comprehensive and distinctly educational knowledge, which is both disciplinary and technical professional. Moreover, the programme would equip the learners' adequately with the necessary competencies to participate effectively in educational actions in different areas of education and to engage in knowledge generation in education.

## Need and Significance of starting M.A. Education Programme through Directorate of Distance Education:

- 1. Data for the last five year reveal that the P.G. department of education is receiving every year about hundreds of application forms for M.A. Education Programme. The sanctioned seats for M.A. Education Programme are only 50. This way a large number of applicants desirous of seeking knowledge in the subject are deprived of this opportunity. Moreover, the University of Jammu does not allow candidates to appear as private candidates in M.A Education programme. As such it is advisable to start M.A. in Education through distance education mode in the interest of those who remain deprived of the opportunity to get admitted as regular students in the P.G. Department of Education.
- 2. It is true that Distance Education Programmes offered by DDE, University of Jammu are accessible to Students belonging to rural and geographically remote areas of Jammu region. If M.A Programme in Education is started, rural students more in number will be benefitted. Furthermore, the M.A. Education Programme through distance mode shall also be beneficial for girls and housewives who can't avail of the opportunity of regular mode of education because of one reason or the other.
- 3. Education as a course is opted by the maximum number of students at the under graduate level because a) It is easy to understand b) Its syllabi is closely interwoven with Sociology, Psychology and Philosophy.
- 4. The existing strength of teachers in 'Education' subject at the DDE comprises one Professor, one Senior Assistant Professor and one Assistant Professor. The faculty of Education in the DDE has been successfully running B.Ed and M.Ed Programme besides Education as a course at the under graduate level. Hence there will be no technical glitch in offering M.A Education Programme.

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5. The directorate is already offering education as elective subject at undergraduate level. The B.A Programme in the Directorate was started in the year 1976 and education as one of the subjects at undergraduate level is being offered for the last about four decades. The directorate has thus acquired the expertise in imparting education through distance mode in this subject.

6. The University of Jammu has well established P.G. Department of Education (established in1977) with commendable achievements. The department can take the responsibility for ensuring academic standards of M.A Education Programme to be started through Distance Education mode.

7. The curriculum offered in the department of Education is very comprehensive and rich and it has produced a number of NET / JRF Scholars. A number of students after completing M.A. Education Programme are selected as teachers in schools and teacher educators in colleges of education and Assistant Professors in Degree Colleges of the state.

8. The directorate fulfills the conditions (specified below) as laid down by the UGC for staring P.G. Programmes through distance education:-


a). Correspondence courses at the P.G. level should be started only in those Universities, which have experience of running undergraduate correspondence courses for at least three years. The undergraduate correspondence Programme should be fully consolidated in accordance with the guidelines before correspondence courses offered at the Post graduate level.

**b**.)Correspondence courses at the post graduate level should be started only in which the University has well established postgraduate departments noted for their high standards.

#### Career Opportunities:

A Post graduate course in Education prepares students for jobs in fields ranging from academics to research. Generally, the students qualified in M.A Education can get employment opportunities in the following fields.

- a). University and College Teachers.
- b) Teacher Educators in Colleges of Education.



- c) Lecturers at 10+2 level.
- d) Counselors in Schools and Hospitals.
- e) Civil Society Organizations.(NGOs)
- f) Research Institutes.

#### Objectives of Starting M.A. Education programme

The main objectives of starting M.A. Education Programme through the directorate of distance education can be summarized as follows:

- a) To provide an alternative cost-effective non-formal channel to the desirous candidates who are otherwise not able to get admission in the regular M.A. Education Programme of the University.
- b) To provide second chance to those who had to discontinue or could not join regular programme in the University owing to social, economic and other constraints.
- c) To democratize higher education by providing access to population, in particular the disadvantaged groups such as those living in remote & rural area, including women, working people and adults who wish to acquire Master's Degree in Education.

#### Organization:

The Directorate shall organize M.A. Education Programme with such teaching and non-teaching staff as may be required to administer the programme. The Post Graduate Department of Education can also be requested to assist the Directorate in the organization of Programme. The services of the resource persons from other Universities will be utilized in academic aspects of the Programme such as preparation of the study material, multimedia course content; visiting lectures, etc.

A senior Professor from the faculty of Education of the directorate shall act as Coordinator of the programme who will be paid Rs. 1000/- per month for acting as a coordinator in addition to her existing duties.

#### Non Teaching Staff:

One junior assistant-cum typist and one peon shall be required who will be appointed on contractual basis with same terms and conditions for the contractual employee of the University of Jammu.

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- a) Jurisdiction: Any person residing within the territorial jurisdiction of University of Jammu will be entitled to enroll himself/herself for the programme provided he/she is otherwise eligible.
- b) Eligibility: The following candidates are eligible to seek admission in the M.A Education Programme to be offered by the Directorate of Distance Education, University of Jammu.
  - A candidate having passed Bachelor's Degree with Education as a subject.
  - A graduate in any discipline with 55% marks.
  - Preference will be given to the candidate who has passed Bachelor Degree examination with education as an elective/additional subject.
- c) Duration of the Programme: The duration of the Programme shall be of two years i.e. four semesters.
- d) Courses of study: The syllabi and courses of study shall be the same as are prescribed and taught in the regular M.A. Education Programme of P.G. Department of Education, University of Jammu, Jammu.
- e) Admission: Admission to the Programme shall be made on the dates as are prescribed for the other P.G Programmes of the directorate of distance education with the approval of Dean Academic Affairs / Vice-Chancellor. Selection of the Candidate shall be made strictly on the basis of their academic merit.

No. of Seats: The number of seats in the Programme in a given academic year shall be 30 (Thirty)

Method of Instruction: Method of instruction in the programme will be given as under:

a) Study Material: Study Materials form the backbone of any distance education programme. The quality and suitability of self learning print material, not only enhances the students' learning but also determines the academic credibility of distance education. Gradually audio-video material will be prepared and made available to the distance learners. Syllabus of each course will be divided into a suitable number of lessons by a subject expert committee constituted by the Director DDE for preparation of study material. Study material of the programme will be got prepared on SLM format. The study materials will be got written from the panel of course writers suggested by the Subject Committee

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duly approved by the competent authority. The study material will be delivered to the students at the time of admission. In conformity with the practice of distance education system, the printed material will be got reviewed and revised from time to time.

- programme of 20 working days in each semester for enrolled students in the M.A. Education Programme. Attending personal contact Programme will be compulsory for the students. Each student enrolled in the programme shall have to obtain at least 75 % attendance of the total lectures delivered in each course in each PCP. The Director DDE, University of Jammu, shall have the authority to condone shortage up to 5 lectures in aggregate to all the courses in the concerned semester to the best advantage of the students. During the PCP the students can discuss their difficulties and academic problems with the resource persons and with faculty members of the directorate. Personal contact Programme of the candidates shall be conducted at Jammu only.
- c) Practicum: Practicum is an essential practical component of the M.A. Education Programme. The Practicum will comprise certain academic activities/components to be performed by each students studying in the IV semester. These activities include mastery of skills in teaching, preparation of teaching aids, Practice of teaching, internship, preparation and presentation of transparencies and power point slides, supervision of lessons, writing school report, final teaching and action research.
- d) Internal Assessment: The Internal Assessment shall carry 40 marks in each course. The Components of Internal assessment shall be the same as in vogue in the regular mode M.A. Education Programme of the University of Jammu.

**Examination and Award of Degree**: Examination will be conducted at the end of each semester by the Controller of Examinations of the University of Jammu as in the case of regular students. The successful students will be awarded the degree as is awarded to the regular students of the P.G Department of Education of the University. **Duties of the Coordinator:** The Coordinator of M.A Education shall perform the following duties.

- a) To supervise and coordinate academic work of the programme.
- b) To ensure that enrollment is completed.
- c) To get the study material prepared in accordance with the syllabus prescribed for the programme by the University and get that delivered to the students.
- d) To plan the holding of Personal contact Programme classes, make arrangements for resource persons, frame the time table, organization of instructional work of the Programme and draw allowances for the purpose of PCPs and maintenance of attendance record of the students.
- e) To take up instructional work in Personal contact Programme at least one period a day.
- f) To arrange evaluation of assignment and maintain internal assessment record of candidates and to ensure its safe custody.
- g) To plan holding and organization of Internship and Internal Practice Teaching component, arrangement of supervisors in schools for Practice Teaching Programme and to maintain assessment record of Internship and Practice Teaching.
- h) To forward the Internal assessment Awards of the candidates to the Controller of Examinations.
- i) To provide academic and informative support to the enrolled students.
- j) To supervise the books of the Programme in the Library and to ensure provision of adequate number of text books and reference books of the Programme in the Library.
- k) To perform such duties as are assigned under statutes of the University and other academic, administrative work as may be assigned to him/her by the Director of the Directorate from time to time.

Duties of a Teacher: Duties of a teacher in the Programme shall be:

- a) Organization and supervision of internship teaching during, Personal contact Programme providing academic guidance to the students and such other teaching work as may be assigned by the Coordinator/Director of the Directorate.
- b) To take up instructional work in Personal Contact Programme.
- c) In case a teacher is required to take classes on Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays in the personal contact programme he will be permitted to avail himself/herself of compensatory leave.
- d) Checking of Students' assignment.
- e) Maintenance of record of work done, maintenance of Internal Assessment record of the students and timely submission of such record to the Coordinator.
- f) To perform such duties as are assigned under statutes of the University and other academic, administrative work as may be assigned to him/her by the Director of the Directorate from time to time.

**Remuneration:** Remuneration on account of lesson writing, proof reading, PCP classes, Evaluation of Assignments shall be paid at the rates which shall be approved by the competent authority of the University from time to time for the said course.

#### Introduction:

The proposal to create Jammu University alumni association is driven by desire of many alumni to contribute to development of Jammu University and affiliated institutions to deliver higher standard of education in the region. Universities around the world are reducing their dependence on government funding, by taping private funding. The private funding also helps University to maintain its autonomy by being less dependent on government funding. Alumni associations are widely used as a source of secondary funding around the world.

Alumni also felt the need to remain associated with the institution, which played big role in shaping their careers and life. In this era of busy work life, alumni association will provide ex-students another platform to meet their social and business networking needs.

#### Structure of the Association

The alumni association to be register at Jammu in the state of Jammu and Kashmir as Jammu University Alumni Association Trust. Please refer appendix 2 for reasons to registering association as trust. To be formally named as Jammu University Alumni Association (JUAA). About the association, organizational structure and bylaws are described below.

# Jammu University Alumni Association (JUAA)

#### **About Us:**

Association of students graduated from Jammu University and its affiliated educational institutions.

#### **Our Mission:**

To act as secondary source of funding for Jammu University to build infrastructure, support research and offer financial aid to students. To provide members a platform to achieve their career goals, pursue social and business networking and means to contribute to wellbeing society.

#### **Primary Objectives:**

- 1. To establish, develop, maintain and grant aid in cash or in kind to University of Jammu and affiliated institutions in region of Jammu to build infrastructure to facilitate better student life and higher learning,
- 2. To establish, develop, maintain and grant aid in cash or in kind to University of Jammu and affiliated institutions in region of Jammu to support research in all fields of education through research grants.
- 3. To establish, develop, maintain and grant aid in cash or in kind to University of Jammu and affiliated institutions in region of Jammu to offer financial aid to students without any discrimination on the bases of caste, disability or sex.
- 4. To promote and support, members to achieve their career goals by maintain lesion with industry throughout India.
- 5. To provide members with networking opportunities to achieve social and business goals through social and charity events.

#### Selection of trustees:

Minimum of seven volunteers are required to be founding members. Three biggest contributors could be appointed as life time trustees. The other four members will be appointed for 1 to 3 years in staggered term to maintain continuity of culture and trust objectives. The trustee should be:

- · Graduate from Jammu University or its affiliated institutes.
- Willing to make financial and labor capital contribution.

- Not affiliated to any political entity.
- Age above 50 years.

# **Organizational Structure**

#### **Board of Trustees: Seven members**

Minimum 3 life long and 4 serving, 3 year term.

#### **Investment committee: Five members**

3 from board of trustee

2 from Department of Business University of Jammu

Objective: Selecting securities as per Investment policy statement (IPS) of the trust.

# Membership committee: Five members

- 1 from board of trustee
- 4 Volunteers minimum term 2 year.

Objective: Grow membership and seek donations.

#### Funding committee: Seven members

- 2 from board of trustee
- 2 from University of Jammu
- 3 Volunteers minimum term 2 year.

Objective: Selecting projects to fund as outlined in Objectives.

#### Staff:

- 1 Full time Director
- 1 Full time Staff

Auditor and solicitor

#### Selection of Auditors and Solicitors:

Selection of Auditors and Solicitors to be performed by board of trustees for three years. To avoid conflict of interest, any auditors or solicitor associated with any current trustees cannot be hired. Auditors will be responsible for publishing financial statements annually along with list of new members and all donors for the given year.

The first Solicitors will be responsible for registration of the Trust. Currently Amarjeet Singh And Co and Sandeep Singh advocate has agreed to volunteer as auditors and solicitors respectively. Both are based in Jammu city.

#### Agreement with University:

This will be the only documents, which will govern relationship of alumni association with University. The following issues will be addressed in the agreement.

- Only this Jammu university alumni association to be recognized by University ever.
- Proved physical space in University premises to be used as association office.
- Members to have access to University facilities Gym, Pool, Library etc.
- Allow association to sell merchandise on the University premises.
- Collect membership fee and transfer to trust.
- Designate two members to Funding/grant committee.
- Any other issue that get recognized before trust registration.
- Affiliated Alumni associations (Department associations)
  - 1) Not allowed to collect donations.
  - 2) Association board to be approved by board of trustees.
  - 3) Can request funding through assigned member of funding grant committee
  - 4) Adhere to all bylaws of the trust.
- All funding requirements to come through funding/grant committee.

• Agreement to be in force for the life of the Trust.

#### Source of Funding:

The Trust will maintain two type of primary funds.

- A. Capital Account: Any money in this account cannot be used for operations/funding, only returns (Interest, Dividends, and net capital gains) from this account can be transferred to operational account.
- B. Operational Account: Money in this account will be used to fund the grants approved by funding committee after meeting the association expenditures.

  Access cash at the end of the year could be transferred to Capital account at the discretion of board of trustees.

The initial contribution from trustees will go into Capital account.

There after there are two sources of funding.

- Membership fee: Membership fee to be decided in first meeting of the trustees. Current proposal is for ₹1000. Membership fee will be deposited in Capital account.
- II. Donations: If not specified (Donor can designate amount for Capital account) all donations to go to Operational account. Other profits from sale of merchandise and excess cash from events organized by association to be deposited in Operational account.

#### **Use of Funds:**

The funds will be used to meet requirements proposed by Jammu University and members.

- A. University Proposals: Only proposals coming through funding committee will be considered. The priority will be as follows.
  - a. Infrastructure needs.
  - b. Research grants: Only for equipment or long term assets

- c. Financial aid
- B. Members Proposals: Only proposals coming through funding committee will be considered. The priority will be as follows.
  - a. Events or seminars with are cash positive.
  - b. Career events
  - c. Social events.

The members proposal funding should not exceed 20% of the total funding. The rule applies in long run. Trust is not expected to fund any substantial amount till capital account is large enough to produce substantial earning. The expected first funding/grant will be in fifth year or beyond.

#### **Financial Projections**

Assuming the founding trustees contribute ₹20,00,000 and 500 new members join the association in first year. Trust will have initial capital of ₹25,00,000. Interest rate of 7.5% on Capital account and 4.0% on Operational account will earn interest of ₹1,91,000. Assuming donation in first year of ₹1,00,000. The total of ₹2,91,000 will be accumulated in Operational account. This amount is not meaningful to support any University project, but is enough to organize one get-together (Cash neutral or positive) and one career fair. As membership grows and earning from the capital account accumulates Trust can fund up to ₹10,00,000 in fifth year. Please review the attached appendix 1

#### Conclusion.



The Trust will operate independent of University. The affairs of university, staff and various departments will not be able to influence stated goals of Trust. Trust will



#### Appendix 2

#### Alumni organization structure as Trust or Society?

After doing a substantial research on the topic, I have reached conclusion that we should structure it as Trust.

The followings are some of my observations.

- 1. The trust is easy to create and maintain. Does not require to hold election or required meetings.
- 2. It will controlled by few core people, helps to continue the cause. New trustees and experts can be added to the board easily. Without any politicking or political interference.
- 3. Trust can act as Society (organizing alumni meets, dinners etc), the things which society is meant to do.
- 4. Society gives the members to achieve their aspirations by taking part in elections and taking up leadership positions. Trust can achieve that by offering leadership positions in various committees of the trust.

#### Few drawbacks of trust are:

- 1. It is controlled by one person. (**Legal opinion required**). How a Setter can transfer few powers to founding trustees or management.
- 2. Upon death of Settler, it's impossible to change the objectives of the trust. To overcome this (Legal opinion required) an alternative trust has to be maintained. Upon death of Settler, all assets to be transfer to alternative trust (Legal opinion required), Whose Settler is alive, and it became primary trust, and another alternative trust is created to maintain continuity.

# Constitution Of University of Jammu Alumni Association (UJAA)

# University of Jammu Alumni Association (Draft Constitution)

Section- 1

#### Name

The name of the Association shall be "UNIVERSITY OF JAMMU ALUMNI ASSOCIATION "(hereinafter referred to as "UJAA") and that of University of Jammu(herein after referred to as JU). The Association shall be registered under the provision of Jammu & Kashmir Societies Registration Act, 1998.

Section -II

#### Scope

University shall mean

- 2.1 University of Jammu (established in 1969 by an Act of the State Legislature)
- 2.2 Constituent College and Offsite Campuses

Section-III

#### **Patron**

3.1 Vice Chancellor of JU shall be Patron of UJAA

3.2 Dean Students Welfare, JU shall be the Ex-Officio President of the UJAA.

Section -IV

#### Vision

The vision of UJAA shall be in consonance with the vision of JU that:

- 4.1 Constantly responds to changing social realities through the creation and application of knowledge.
- 4.2 Contributes towards a pupil centered and just society that nurtures innovation, protects dignity and ensures equality.
- 4.3 Aims at holistic development of students to face the challenges of globalized world.

Section -V

#### Office

The office of the UJAA shall be situated at Main Campus, University of Jammu.

Section -VI

### Aims & Objectives

The UJAA shall be a non-profit making Society with the following aims & objectives:

6.1 To promote close relationship between UJAA and the JU

6.2 To conduct seminars, conferences, workshops, endowment lectures and other academicactivities in collaboration with respective Departments and also to maintain liaison with JU faculty, non-teaching staff and students.

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- 6.3 To uphold the democratic and inclusive traditions of JU centered around themes that deepen our understanding and appreciation of the the Statutes of JU.
- 6.4 To provide opportunities for community service and to act as good will ambassadors of JU within India and abroad.
- To provide academic and professional interaction and networking among UJAA and endeavour to create career opportunities for the JU student community.
- 6.6 To conduct Annual Alumni Day celebrations.
- 6.7 To create and establish Alumni endowments for granting scholarships, stipends, prizes and medals to the students showing high proficiency in higher education in country and abroad.
- To collect funds by subscriptions, contributions and donations from members, nonmembers, Governments, Universities and other institutions and philanthropists for furtherance of the above objectives.

Section VII

#### Membership

The Membership of UJAA shall be open to those:

- 7.1 Who are Degreeholders of the JU and who have deposited requisite membership fee.
- 7.2 who qualify for the membership of UJAA, **under** 7.1of the constitution may register themselves, with the office of UJAA, by filling up a registration form (either personally or electronically) and by making a payment of Rs. 3000 as life Membership Fee. The Non-Resident members living outside India shall pay U\$\$-100 as life Membership FeeHowever, membership fee shall be subject to change from time to time as approved by the Executive Committee and General Body.
- 7.3 The Secretary shall scrutinize the relevant information and then approve the membership.
- 7.4 A registry and/or an electronic database of members shall be kept at the registered office of the association.
- 7.5 The Executive Committee of UJAA may terminate the membership of any individual in case Mental Disability, or Criminal Conviction.
- 7.6 In case a member is found to work against the interest(s) of UJAA or is found involved in serious misbehaviour, he/she may be suspended by the Executive Committee of UJAA, after serving him/her Show Cause Notice, providing opportunity to explain his/her conduct. This would be subject to further consideration of the next General Body meeting which may decide to revoke the suspension or expel him/her from the EC or the primary membership of UJAA for a period specified by the GBM.

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#### Section VIII

#### General Body:

- 8.1 The General Body, consisting of all the bonafide members of UJAA, shall be the supreme body of the UJAA and shall meet atleast once in a year at main campus of JU.
- 8.2 At least 30 days' notice shall be given for holding the Annual GeneralBody Meeting. The Secretary's report and the audited statement of accounts of the preceding financial year shall be circulated and posted on the UJAA's website at least sevendays prior to the date of Annual General Body Meeting.

Section IX

#### **Composition of Executive Committee (EC)**

- 9.1 The management of UJAA shall be vested in an Executive Committee.
- 9.2 The Dean Students Welfare shall be the Ex-Officio President of the UJAA.
- 9.3 The Associate Dean Students Welfare shall be the Ex-Officio Secretary of the UJAA
- 9.4 The Assistant Dean Students Welfare shall be the Ex-Officio Treasurer of the UJAA
- 9.5 The Dean Placement and President, Jammu University Teaching Association (JUTA) shall be the Ex-Officio members of the EC
- 9.6 The Following Office bearers of the UJAA shall be elected by the General Body for two years
  - (a) Vice President (One) (b) Joint Secretary (One)(c) Publicity Secretary (one)
  - (d) Executive Members (Three)
- 9.7 The three of the executive members shall be elected by the General Body and the rest three to be nominated by the Patron of UJAA.

Section X

#### Meetings

The EC shall hold a meeting every six months. Date/day and time of EC meetingshall be decided by the President taking into consideration the convenience of all the executive committee members. The President shall preside over and conduct all the meetings, as the

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Chairperson and shall have the power of a casting vote. Quorum for the EC meetingshall be a minimum of seven (0.7) EC members as defined in **Section IX**.

Section XI

#### Vacancies

In case of a vacancy arising in the EC, the same may be filled

- 11.1 Bynomination by Patron, UJAAin case the remaining period of the EC is less than 6 months;
- 11.2 By election, in case the remaining period of EC is 6 months or more.

**Section XII** 

#### **Functions of Office Bearers**

- 12.1 President- shall be the Head of EC and shall be the chairperson of all the GB meetings.
- 12.2 Vice-President- shall act as Chairperson of the UJAA in the absence of President.
- 12.3 Secretary-shall be custodian of all assets of the UJAA. He shall call themeetings, fix the agenda and on the behest shall act as moderator during the meetings. The Associate Dean, Students Welfare shall be the Ex-Officio Secretary of UJAA and in the absence Assistant. Dean (SW) shall act as Secretary.
- 12.4 Joint-Secretary-shall look into the membership drive for enrolling alumni and keeptheir portal and details readily available. He shall also record minutes of every meeting andassist secretary in discharging his duties.

#### 12.5 Publicity Secretary

Shall be responsible for giving wide publicity to the formation of UJAA and provide wide coverage in both print and electronic media.

#### 12.6 Treasurer

The Assistant. Dean Students Welfare shall be the Ex-officio Treasurer of UJAA. In case there is more than one Assistant. Dean Students Welfare, nominate who should be the Treasurer of UJAA.

He/sheshall collect, issue receipt for all monetary transactions, maintain completerecords and make a balance sheet at the end of each financial year. He shall also get the account of the 'UJAA' audited by Chartered Accountant decided by EC and shall place it in GB for approval.

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Section XIII

#### **Election Procedure**

#### 13.1 Secret Ballot

The election shall be held through secret ballot. The general body shallelect, at its annual meeting the members mentioned at 9.6 of Section IX.

#### 13.2 Presiding officer (Non-member)

Shall be appointed by the EC for the purpose of theconduct of the elections. The list of the eligible nominees for the various posts shall beclearly communicated on theassociation's website immediately after the last date fornominations and the updated list after the last date for withdrawals.

#### 13.3 Term of Office Bearers

The office bearers and members of the ECshall be elected for aperiod of two years. Members are eligible for re-election, but can serve as EC membersfor a maximum of two terms, consecutively, after which they need to have a break, of at leastone term, before being eligible to stand for elections again.

Section XIV

#### 14. General Quorum for Passing Resolutions

- Quorum for an AGM: Should be minimum of 33 percent of registered members. 14.1
- Amendment Quorum: No new rules shall be made nor shall any of the rules herein 14.2 contained be amended, altered orrescinded except with the consent of three-fourth of the members present at a General Bodymeeting of the Association However, there shall be no alteration/change in the section IX of the UJAA constitution

Section XV

#### 15. Control of funds

- Funds and its Management: To raise funds for the management of UJAAon such terms 15.1 and conditions as may be determined from time to time by the Executive Committee. Money received from membership fees, donations and other sources shall constitute the income of the UJAA. The financial powers shall be with the Executive Committee. The EC may authorize the President and the |Treasurer to operate accounts kept at New University Campus branch of J&K Bank
- Expenditures and its Management: Expenditures shall be generally within the budget 15.2 approved by the General Body of the association. The Treasurer shall maintain an account of all income and expenditure of the funds of the UJAA.

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15.3 Auditing Procedure: The executive committee shall at least once a year (January to December) submit the accounts together with a general statement of the same and all necessary vouchers for audit, to a personappointed as auditor by JU.

Section XVI

#### Miscellaneous

- 16.1 In case of different interpretations of a rule, interpretation given by the Patron of the UJAAshall be final.
- Resignation if submitted by any member in writing is to be forwarded to the executive committee for its consideration and taking appropriate action.
- 16.3 If the association needs to be dissolved, it shall be as per the provision under the provision of Jammu & Kashmir Societies Registration Act, 1998.
- 16.4All disputes arising with regard the membership, expenditure, audit, and accounts shall be entertained and resolved by the EC of the UJAA. In the event of specific representation against the executive committee itself, the matter will be resolved through an arbitration committee comprising of the three persons nominated by the Patron of UJAA.

Section XVII

#### 17. UJAA Logo and Website

Information relating to the activities of UJAA, including membership details, shall be made available online on UJAA website. UJAA website shall be linked to the official JU website and it shall have its own logo with JU insignia scripted on it. No other body or agency shall, without due authorization from JU shall use JU alumni insignia.

#### 7. Left Over Seats:

maintaining, developing and improving the standards of instruction in any programme of study or for starting a new programme of study in a teaching department of the University, the Vice Chancellor on the recommendation of the admission committee of the department concerned and the Dean Academic Affairs, may sanction self-finance seats for such programme of study additionally to meet societal obligations. The number of such seats may not ordinarily exceed 15% of the seats determined for the programmes as per Statute 4. These seats shall be supernumerary and thus, shall not count towards determining the quantum of reservation specified at Statute 6 for the various categories. # **EXPLANATION:**

a) Merit of a candidate who has passed B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./B.B.A./B.C.A/Honours course examination (General, 10+2+3 pattern) from any other University shall also be calculated in the manner prescribed above.

b) Merit of a candidate who has passed the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./B.B.A./B.C.A/

Honours course examination (Honours, 10+2+3 pattern) shall also be No Change determined by reducing/raising the marks secured by a candidate to the base of 2100 marks as under:

- 1. Total marks allotted in all the papers at the Honours examination to be reduced/raised to the level of 1650 marks, &
- 2. Marks in the concerned subject (i.e. to which admission is sought) to be reduced/raised to the level of 450 marks.
- Merit of a candidate seeking admission on the basis of having passed in an additional subject after having passed the qualifying degree examination, shall also be determined in the manner prescribed above i.e. aggregate marks secured in the qualifying degree examination and those in the additional subject, reduced/raised to the base of 1650 and 450 marks. respectively.
- d) Merit of a candidate having passed the qualifying degree examination not with the subject to which admission is being sought at the post-graduate level, but with an allied subject, shall be determined on the basis of aggregate marks secured in the qualifying examination.
- e) The tie between candidates seeking admission shall be resolved by reference to the aggregate marks in first Degree i.e. B.A/B.Sc./B.Com/BBA/BCA etc examination & if, the tie still persists, to their marks in the Part- III of the Qualifying Examination & if the tie still persists, then to their higher marks in Part II of the said Examination. Higher marks in the said examination shall determine priority in Admission.
- Merit of the candidate who has passed class 12th under 10+2 pattern from any recognized course.

Selection Criteria For Achievement Categories. **(B)** 

Merit of the candidates applying under reserved categories of Sports/Cultural & Literary, and NCC/NSS/ Bharat Scouts and Guides activities as specified at Statute 6 shall be determined on the basis of (i) marks/points awarded to such a candidate for these activities, plus (ii) one-fourth (1/4) of the composite merit (75% of the qualifying examination + 25% of JUET Score). The composite score thus calculated, shall form the basis of admission, PROVIDED that the candidate seeking admission unless covered under Statute 13 has not been admitted to any programme of study in the University in an earlier session under the aforesaid reserved categories. PROVIDED also, that where candidates have obtained equal composite score, the tie shall be resolved by reference to their achievement merit in the respective activity determined as per Statute. Higher achievement merit shall determined priority in admission.

#### ORDER OF ADMISSION:

Subject to fulfillment of eligibility criteria and other conditions prescribed for a course of study, admission in a teaching department of the University shall first be given to a candidate who;

(A)

- has passed/appeared in the qualifying examination from the University of Jammu;
- (ii) is a permanent resident of the territorial jurisdiction of the University but has passed/appeared in the qualifying examination or an equivalent examination from a University other than the University of Jammu:
- (iii) is an employee of the Central or a State Government or a Public Undertaking or any other organisation recognised for the purpose by the Syndicate, posted within the territorial jurisdiction of the University or son/daughter/spouse of such an employee;
- (iv) is not permanent resident of the territorial jurisdiction of the University of Jammu, but has passed/appeared in B.A./ B.Sc./ B.Com./ B.B.A/ B.C.A.(General or Honours examination, 10+2+3 pattern) with not less than 60% marks from a University other than the University of Jammu, subject to the condition that the number of seats under this category shall not exceed 10% of the total number of seats available in a programme of study.
- (B) After making admission of students falling under Statute 14(A) if seats in any course of study remain vacant these shall be open to such other candidates as have passed/appeared in the qualifying examination from any recognised University/Board of School Education provided they have applied in time and are otherwise eligible.

- 15. Unless otherwise provided for in these Statutes, a person after having passed/appeared in the B.A/B.Sc./B.Com./B.B.A / B.C.A. 19. Each candidate who is granted admission shall not take up any employment or engage in any business or profession so long as he/she is on the rolls of the University. Any student who takes up an employment or engages in business or profession in violation of the Statutes, his/her name shall be struck off from the rolls of the teaching department of the University.

20. The Admission Committee concerned, with the approval of the Dean Academic Affairs, shall have the authority to refuse or cancel admission of a candidate/student who:

- (i) either fails to produce the requisite certificate in original within the time prescribed or provides information in his/her application form which is found incorrect or produces a certificate which is not genuine.
- (ii) in the opinion of the Admission Committee, has taken up employment or a vocation which is likely to interfere with his/her studies in the University.
- (iii) fails to pay the fees and deposits including Hostel fees and deposits, within the time prescribed by the Warden of the Hostel concerned.

21. The Head of the Department shall be competent to cancel admission of a student enrolled for a programme of study in the department if the student remains absent without permission of the Head of the Department concerned for a period of 15 days continuously and/or does not attend less than 50% of the total lectures delivered in the Semester concerned, PROVIDED that before cancellation of admission, the concerned Head of the Department will provide an opportunity to such a candidate to explain within 07 days why action be not taken against him/her.

#### CONTINUED ENROLMENT:

22. A regular student who after having passed all the prescribed courses of I and II or III and IV or V and VI Semester examinations of Master Degree discontinues his/her study for good and sufficient reasons to the satisfaction of the Head of the Department concerned, may be considered for admission to III or V Semester of the course, as the case may be, PROVIDED that not more than

one year has elapsed after his/her having passed the II or IV or VI Semester examination in the concerned programme of study. Such a break shall be allowed only once during a programme of study. PROVIDED further that such a student will have to opt courses which are prescribed for the session to which admission is being sought unless it leads to repetition of any course(s) of the Programme of study.

23. If as a result of re-evaluation, a candidate passes in the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./BBA/BCA Part-III/Semester VI examination / class 12th under 10+2 examination, he/she shall be considered for admission in a Teaching Department only if seat/s is/are available and the merit of such a candidate is higher than that of the candidate who is at the top of the waiting list of the concerned teaching department.

## PERMISSION FOR PRACTICALS TO PRIVATE CANDIDATES:

29. A Science Department may accord permission to members of the Laboratory Staff of the University, and such Teachers who hold at least 5 years of teaching experience in a school recognized by the J&K government, to perform the required number of practicals to earn eligibility for appearing in the Master's Degree Examination as a Private Candidate. Required teaching experience certificate issued/ endorsed by the Director, School Education, Jammu will have to be enclosed with the application form.

This permission may be granted to one candidate each year on the basis of merit. This facility will not encroach upon the number of seats meant for open merit category. If any seat falls vacant after the last date of admission, that may also be used for granting similar permission to the other beneficiaries in the above category and the Scientific Staff of the Indian Institute of Integrative Medicine, Jammu (Erstwhile Regional Research Laboratory, Jammu) in accordance with the Statute provided that such a permission shall not be granted after one week of the close of admission.

# 2. SUBJECTS/ PROGRAMME TO BE OFFERED TO FOREIGN STUDENTS

#### **COURSES OFFERED:**

ADMISSION OF ALL THE INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS WILL BE DONE THROUGH PROPER CHANNEL AS PER THE BELOW REFERRED GUIDELINES:

Applications for admission to various programmes of study in the teaching departments of the University shall be received within fourteen (14) days from the date of the issue of notification of admission by the University. Application forms prescribed by the University, COMPLETE IN ALL RESPECTS, must be submitted to the designated Office ON OR BEFORE THE LAST DATE prescribed by the University for the purpose as per the notification.

The competent authority, may authorize late entertainment of an application form for admission to a programme of study up to a maximum of five (5) days after the last date prescribed by the University for Receipt of application forms, on payment of requisite late fee. Such applications shall be treated at par with those received in time for purposes of admission.

#### 3. UNIVERSITY PROFILE

## 4. STATUTES FOR ADMISSIONS

- **a).** Eligibility: The students having qualification recognized as equivalent by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) are eligible for admission to various academic programme in the University as per the following norms:
- A candidate shall have completed 18 years of age on or before 31st December each year;
- ii. Students having studied and passed the qualifying examination from an

Institution located in foreign country shall only be considered. This will include the student studying in school and / or college situated in foreign country, even if the concerned school / college is affiliated to any Board of secondary Higher Secondary education or a University in India. However, wards of NRI / PIO / FN, who are studying for the qualifying examination in school / college located in India, are not eligible for admission under this category.

**b). Seats:** Maximum 5 % (as Supernumerary seats) of the sanctioned intake capacity of the various programme of the University shall be offered to the Foreign Students. After getting provisional admission, the student should get the student visa and complete all other formalities.

The student then report for final admission fills up the admission form and pay the requisite fee within in the stipulated period of time permissible as per the schedule notified by the University every year. The student should undergo the medical examination & also required to appear for the English language proficiency test. The final admission shall be given after successfully completion of the required formalities. The international students will have to pay the fees in INR. Following fees are applicable to secure provisional admission.
