The 76th University Council meeting of the University of Kashmir which was held on 20.10.2016 and wherein the issue of adoption of set of drafts statutes governing the Two Year B.Ed. programme through DDE in the University of Kashmir was discussed vide item No. 15 and the Resolution is as under:

1.15.2 Resolved that the adoption of set of draft Statutes governing 2 Years B.Ed. programme through Directorate of Distance Education, University of Jammu, be approved.

1.15.3 Resolved further that the resolution shall also be applicable to Jammu University.

As per the above resolution, the Director, DDE submitted the proposal for the start of Two Year B,Ed. Programme through distance mode in the Directorate of Distance Education, University of Jammu. The same was placed before the Standing Committee of the Academic Council held on 01.02.2018 and the Standing Committee vide resolution of item No.5 resolved that –

"the commencement of the Two Year B.Ed. Programme through Distance mode by the Directorate of Distance Education, University of Jammu, Jammu, be endorsed in the light of the Resolution of the 76th University Council of the University of Kashmir for the in-service teachers of the State of Jammu and Kashmir as under:

i) those serving as full time teachers in recognized schools (Primary, Secondary, Higher Secondary levels) within the territorial jurisdiction of the University of Jammu;

&

ii) having a minimum of 2 years teaching experience at the time of submission of the application form for admission.

FURTHER RESOLVED that the admission process by the DDE shall be started only after all preparations are made in the matter with regard to the Course scheme, self learning material and fulfillment of any other academic requirements, etc.

This is also as per the 83rd meeting of the University Council of the University of Jammu, wherein the Hon'ble Minister for Education stressed upon the need for both the Universities to take up the task of training the school teachers of the State through the distance mode B.Ed. Programme on the lines of Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU)."

The 84th University Council at its meeting held on 10.04.2018 while considering the item No. 84.19 w.r.t. the commencement of the Two Year B.Ed. Programme through Distance mode by the Directorate of Distance Education, University of Jammu, Jammu proposed from the Academic Session 2018-19 resolved as under:

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Agenda: Academic Council

- (a) the commencement of the Two Year B.Ed. Programme through Distance mode by the Directorate of Distance Education, University of Jammu, Jammu proposed from the Academic Session 2018-19, be approved.
- (b) Further resolved that there should be no compromise with regard to the quality and standards of such courses.

In view of the above, the issue w.r.t. syllabi and courses of study of the said course was discussed in the Board of Studies in Teacher Education on 24.07.2018 under the Chairmanship of Vice-Chancellor wherein it emerged that 4 members namely Prof. Renu Nanda, Prof. Mubarak Singh, Prof. Rajive Rattan and Dr. Madhu Singh of BOS in Teacher Education are opposed to the introduction of Two Year B.Ed. Programme through distance mode in the Directorate of Distance Education, University of Jammu from the Academic Session 2018-19 for the in-service teachers. However, they agreed if the programme is introduced for in-service Government teachers only. Whereas, Prof. Darshana Sharma, Director, DDE and Dean, Faculty of Education observed that it is not in the purview of Board of Studies. The course has not been started yet due to plea of the Convener, Board of Studies as well as all faculty members of the Department of Education that Statutes and Scheme is not in accordance with University Statutes, NCTE norms.

Keeping in view the above, the issue was deliberated on 29.08.2018 in the Office Chamber of the Vice-Chancellor wherein it was resolved that the various issues pertaining to the commencement of the B.Ed. Programme in the DDE be resolved by the Convener, BOS in Teacher Education/the Nodal Department i.e. the Department of Education so that the course under reference can be commenced from the current Academic Session 2018-19. This is to be done within a week's time by the concerned Convener.

The Convener, BOS in Teacher Education/Head, Department of Education was requested, vide letter No. F.Acd./I/18/9166-9168 dated 04.09.2018, to take further necessary action keeping in view the above decision.

In pursuance to the above, the Head, Department of Education convened a meeting of the Departmental Affairs Committee on 05.09.2018 and discussed the proposal of the Director, DDE who has mooted to deliver the B.Ed. through Distance mode which is not in consonance of the NCTE guidelines wherein it is clearly mentioned that candidates who have completed a NCTE recognized Teacher Education programme through 'face to face' mode are eligible to be the students of B.Ed. (ODL). The members of the DAC was suggested to the Directorate of Distance Education to withdraw the proposal of delivering the B.Ed. through the distance mode as it would violate one of the NCTE important norm & standards that the first teacher education program to be through 'face to face mode'. The minutes of the meeting are placed as Annexure 'A'.

The matter was also placed in the meeting of Board of Studies in Teacher Education held on 10.09.2018 wherein the commencement of B.Ed. programme through DDE, University of Jammu for the session 2018-20 was discussed in detail and all the members gave their inputs which include that in case the B.Ed. programme has to commence from Directorate of Distance Education (DDE) University of Jammu, NCTE norms need to be withdrawn. The minutes of the meeting are placed as Annexure 'B'.

The Dean, Faculty of Education has recorded her remarks on the above said minutes of the Board of Studies in Teacher Education which read as under:

"I don't agree with the content of item No.6, the State of Jammu and Kashmir is beyond the purview of NCTE Act. The Resolution No. 84.19 of the 84th Meeting of University Council of the University of Jammu be implemented. The DDE has made all preparations to start B.Ed. Programme w.e.f. Academic Session 2018."

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Agenda: Academic Council

The above facts reveal that the start of B.Ed. Programme through Distance Mode has become a controversial matter, the main cause is due to NCTE Act/Regulations which has been adopted by the University of Jammu and accordingly the Two Year B.Ed. Programme has been introduced in the University as per the said regulations.

Beside above, the Under Secretary, NCTE, New Delhi vide communication No. F.62-4/2015/NCTE/N&S/Pt/8159 dated 08.12.2015 (Annexure 'C') addressed to the Vice-Chancellor, University of Kashmir, J&K in reference to his letter regarding relaxation sought in NCTE norms & standards for B.Ed. (ODL) programme being offered by the DDE, University of Kashmir under clause 12 of NCTE Regulation, 2014 wherein stated that the NCTE has been set up under the NCTE Act 1993 for planned and coordinated development of teacher education system throughout the country. However, in terms of Section 1(2) of the NCTE Act, the State of Jammu & Kashmir is beyond the purview of the NCTE Act. As such, any teacher training course conducted by an institution in the State of J&K is therefore not required/eligible to apply to the concerned Regional Committee for grant of recognition for offering teacher training courses. It has also stated that as per NCTE communication No. 49-21/2005/NCTE(N&S) dated 31.05.2018 regarding the validity of degrees in teacher education obtained from the State of J&K, it has been communicated the following:

- a) Persons who have obtained degrees from institutions recognized by the Govt. of J&K/UGC would be eligible for employment in Central Govt. and other States; and
- b) As the NCTE Act does not cover the issue of admission in institutions for higher qualifications, the eligibility of persons with degrees from institutions in J&K will not be governed by the provisions of the NCTE Act but the relevant laws/rules/regulations of the respective States/Universities.
- c) A diploma or certificate in teacher education awarded by an institution/university in the State of Jammu & Kashmir is also valid for employment in other parts of the country subject to the provisions of the Act. In other words such certificates/diplomas will also have to be treated on the same footing as a degree awarded by such institutions.

Since, the NCTE Act 1993 is not enacted in the State of J&K hence, NCTE has no locus-standi to grant relaxation under clause 12 of NCTE Regulations, 2014 to Kashmir University. However, as far as the issue of diploma/degree awarded by the Teacher Education Institutions of Kashmir is concerned the same has been already clarified by the NCTE vide letter dated 31.05.2007 and 29.06.2007.

As the Two Year B.Ed. Programme in DDE has not started yet due to contradictory decisions/views of the faculty of the Department of Education as well as the DDE as reflected above, in order to resolve the issue, the matter is submitted to the Academic Council for deliberations and further directions/guidance in the matter.

The meeting was specially convened to discuss the one item agenda regarding the commencement of B.Ed programme through the DDE University of Jammu.

Commencement of B.Ed. Programme in DDE, University of Jammu

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All the members discussed the possibility of the above said B.Ed programme through DDE. In this context the Convener apprised the members of the background of initiating the BEd program through the Distance mode by the Directorate of Distance Education. The members were apprised of the need of the meeting and as such every member was requested to express one's own view point. The meeting was briefed about the two programs of the teacher education i.e B.Ed & M.Ed being run by University of Jammu. The curriculum of both programs i.e B.Ed & M.Ed was revamped in 2015 as per the recommendations of Justice Verma Commission(JVC) & NCTE guidelines. By framing the Curriculum in 2015, the Department adhered to NCTE regulations as per the directions of the University Authorities and no dilution was made in this direction. So, the University of Jammu is following all the conditions & the Qualifications of NCTE except in the matter of the eligibility conditions of the students .

In the present context the meeting discussed the proposal of The Director, Directorate of Distance Education who has mooted to deliver the B.Ed through Distance mode which is not in

consonance of the NCTE guidelines wherein it is clearly mentioned on page no 146 clause 4.2(ii) that "candidates who have completed a NCTE recognized Teacher Education programme through "face to face" mode are eligible to be the students of B.Ed (ODL)"

Moreover the resolution of the 84th meeting of University Council held on 10th April 2018 which approved the commencement of two years B.Ed. programme through Distance mode by Directorate of Distance Education from the Academic Session 2018-19 and also resolved in it that there should be no compromise with respect to the quality and standards of such courses (copy enclosed-Annexure-I). So the nodal department expressed its dismay over DDE for compromising the standards & the quality of teacher education by mooting the proposal of B.Ed through the distance mode.

The members also looked into the eligibility conditions for the B.Ed program (distance mode) offered by Kurukshetra University (quoted in the meeting held in the office chamber of Worthy Vice-Chancellor on 29th August, 2018 by DDE faculty), on pg 49 of prospectus 2018-19 of DDE Kurukshetra University (Copy enclosed-Annexure-II) which are clearly in consonance with the NCTE regulations but the DDE ,University of Jammu is not following the same.

In this regard all the members had a threadbare discussion on the eligibility criteria as well as the curriculum programme implementation and assessment of the said programme in the light of NCTE regulations (copy attched-Annexure-III) which clearly indicate that the curriculum to be offered through face to face mode for the said programme will be the curriculum of the ODL mode. Some of the members also raised the issues related to quality of preparation of the study material, regarding the Copy rights as well as plagiarism both in the preparation and publication of the study material which were endorsed by the other members. In this context the members also expressed their concern with respect to the quality of self instructional material for the said programme as it needs the approval of Distance Education Bureau (DEB) indicated on pg 147 of the Gazette of India (December 01, 2014- Annexure-III).

The members present also referred to the two meetings of the Board of Studies in Education on 6th and 11th of December, 2017 where in out of 6 members, 4 were NOT in favour of the commencement of the proposed B.Ed. programme through DDE University of Jammu on the analogy of Directorate of distance Education, University of Kashmir. This issue was again

discussed in a special meeting held in Vice-Chancellor Chamber of Prof. R. D. Sharma, the then Vice-chancellor of the University of Jammu on 23rd of August, 2018, where in out of 5 members, 4 members disagreed to the commencement of the said programme.

The meeting concluded with the thanks to the chair and with a suggestion to the Directorate of Distance Education to withdraw the proposal of delivering the B.Ed through the distance mode as it would violate one of the NCTE important norm & standards that the first teacher education program to be through 'face to face mode' which the Kurukeshtra University is following in letter & spirit.

In the meeting of the Appellate Committee for the B.Ed. Courses in Non-Govt. Colleges affiliated Colleges of the University of Jammu, the matter pertaining to refund of fee was deliberated in detail and need was felt to re-examine the cases of refund of fee in the University Departments keeping in view of the MHRD document and the UGC notification (October 2018) published on 02.11.2018 regarding Refund of Fees and Non Retention of original certificates by Institutions (UGC notification is placed as Annexure). A Committee was constituted under the Convenership of Dean Academic Affairs vide order No. F.Acd./I/18/10733-42 dated 30.10.02018 to devise a uniform policy w.r.t. the refund of fees in case a student withdraws his admission from the programme in the University of Jammu.

The Committee met on 14.11.2018 and after threadbare discussion, the following was resolved as under:

- i) All the cases of Remittance and Refund of fees shall be entertained with 02.11.2018 as cut off date i.e. the date of issuance of notification regarding Refund of Fees and Non retention of original certificates published by the UGC.
- ii) The refund shall be as per the formula detailed in the UGC notification (October 2018) published on 02.11.2018.
- iii) The last date for the admission shall be reckoned as the last date notified in admission notifications issued by the University.
- iv) The above said notification shall be uploaded on the University website and shall be included in the Admission Brochure published by the University and instructions shall be issued to the affiliated Colleges to abide by the said notification.

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It was desired that the matter needs to be relooked. The Committee again met on 07.12.2018 and after threadbare discussion, the following was resolved:

- i) The cases of refund of fee for the Academic Session 2016-17 and 2017-18 shall be considered by the duly constituted Committee on case to case basis.
- ii) The last date of admission shall be the date of admission as permitted to the Appellants in the meeting of the Appellate Committee.

Refund of Fees and Non-Retention of Original Certificates

1. Introduction:

October, 2018

The Commission has notified University Grants Commission (Grievance Redressal) Regulations, 2012 on redressal of multifarious grievances of students. But given the sheer volume of the complaints regarding non-refund of fees and retention of original certificates by Higher Educational Institutions (HEI), the Commission felt the need to notify elaborate instructions so as to curb such malpractices and decided to issue appropriate instructions in the form of this Notification to all universities and other HEIs under the purview of

2. Objective:

To prohibit coercive and profiteering institutional practices in the matters related to refund of fees in case of withdrawal from the programme and retention of original certificates at the time of and / or after admission.

In exercise of powers conferred by Section 12 (d) read with Section 12(j) of the UGC Act, 1956, the UGC issues this Notification for adoption of standard operating procedures in the matters related to refund of fees in the event of student's withdrawal from the program and non-retention of certificates at the

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Application and Enforcement

3.1. The instructions contained in this Notification shall be in supersession to its earlier Public Notice dated 23.04.2007 and its Notification dated 16th December, 2016. It shall be applicable to Undergraduate, Postgraduate and Research Programs run by universities included under Section 2 (f) of UGC Act, together with all colleges under their affiliating domain and institutions declared as deemed to be universities under Section 3 of the UGC Act.

3.2 The provisions contained in this Notification shall come into force with immediate effect and shall have regulatory force on extant as well as future grievances over issues and matters covered herein.

4. Specific provisions for Mandatory compliance by HEIs:

The Commission herewith lays down specific provisions and consequent mandatory compliance on the issues related to:

(1) Refund of fees by the institution concerned in the event of the withdrawal from the programme by a student; and

(2) Verification and non-retention of academic and personal certificates of student;

For any complaint in respect of (1) & (2) above, the grievance redressal mechanism as prescribed under UGC (Grievance Redressal) Regulations, 2012, shall be followed.

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4.1 Refund of Fees

4.1.1 No HEI shall make it mandatory for applicants to purchase the institutional prospectus at any time during the course of the programme of study. Purchasing prospectus shall be the personal choice of the applicant and he/she shall have rights to decide against it in case he/she wishes to access the information from the institutional website. As laid down in the Right to Information Act, 2005, and reiterated in the UGC Guidelines on Students' Entitlement, all HEIs shall disclose on their website and prospectus information regarding the status of the institution, its affiliation, accreditation

status, physical assets and amenities, course-wise sanctioned intake of students, various types of fees payable for different programmes, total fees payable for an entire programme, last date of admission, details of faculty, members of governing bodies and minutes of the meetings of bodies like Academic/Executive Council, sources of income, the financial situation and any other information about its functioning, necessary for an applicant to make a fully informed choice.

4.1.2 HEIs shall charge fees in advance only for the semester/year in which a student is to engage in academic activities. Collecting advance fees for the entire programme of study or for more than one semester/year in which a student is enrolled is strictly prohibited.

4.1.3 If a student chooses to withdraw from the programme of study in which he/she is enrolled, the institution concerned shall follow the following five-tier system for the refund of fees* remitted by the student.

S. No	Percentage of Refund of fees*	Point of time when notice of withdrawal of admission is received in the HEI
(1)	100%	15 days or more before the formally-notified last date of admission
(2)	90%	Less than 15 days before the formally-notified last date of admission
(3)	80%	15 days or less after the formally- notified last date of admission
(4)	50%	30 days or less, but more than 15 days, after formally-notified last date of admission
(5)	00%	More than 30 days after formally- notified last date of admission

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4.1.4 In case of (1) in the table above, the HEI concerned shall deduct an amount not more than 5% of the fees paid by the student, subject to a maximum of Rs. 5,000/- as processing charges from the refundable amount.

4.1.5 Fees shall be refunded by all HEIs to an eligible student within fifteen days from the date of receiving a written application from him/her in this regard.

4.2 Verification and Non-retention of Students' Academic and Personal

4.2.1 No HEI shall insist upon a student to submit the original academic and personal certificates, like, mark-sheets, school leaving certificates and other such documents, at the time of submitting admission form, but the submission of self-attested copies thereof shall be mandatory.

4.2.2 HEIs shall physically verify the originals at the time of admission of the student in his/her presence and return them immediately after satisfying themselves about their authenticity, keeping the attested copies for their record.

4.2.3 The self-attested certificates of students shall be held valid and authentic by institution concerned and/or the affiliating university for all purposes and administrative requirements and should there be a need for physical verification at any time during the course of the programme of study, such verification shall be undertaken and the original certificates thus used for verification shall be returned immediately to the student concerned.

4.2.4 Taking the certificates into institutional custody under any circumstance or pretext is strictly prohibited.

4.2.5 In case of any suspicion over the authenticity or genuineness of a certificate, reference may be made to university or the Board which issued the certificate to the student and the admission be subjected to the authentication, but original certificate shall not be retained by the HEI under any circumstance.

<u>4.3 Grievance Redressal Mechanism (GRM)</u>

4.3.1 All HELS shall mandatorily have a "Grievatice Redressal Mechanism" (GRM) as mandated by UGC (Grievance Redressal) Regulations, 2012, as amended from time to time, to address and effectively resolve complaints, representations and grievances related to any of the issues mentioned in this Notification.

4.3.2 The GRM shall be available on HE1 website.

4.3.3 HEIs shall ensure that all grievances received are addressed as deemed fit within 30 days.

5. Punitive Actions by Commission against defaulting HEIs

The Commission, in respect of any HEI which contravenes or fails to comply with the provisions of this Notification, shall proceed to take one or more of the following actions, namely:-

- (a) withdrawal of declaration of fitness to receive grants under Section 12B of the UGC Act, 1956;
- (b) withholding any grant allocated to the HEI;
- (c) declaring the HEI ineligible for consideration for any assistance under any of the general or special assistance programs of the Commission;
- (d) informing the general public, including potential candidates for admission, through a notice displayed prominently in the newspapers or other suitable media and posted on the website of the Commission, about the non-compliance by the HEI concerned;
- (e) recommend to the affiliating university for withdrawal of affiliation, in case of a college / institute;

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(h) taking such other action within its powers as the Commission may deem fit.

Provided that no action shall be taken by the Commission under this Notification unless the HEI has been given an adequate opportunity of being heard.

To consider the matter w.r.t. the temporary suspension of admission to PGDMSM, PGDAF and PGDBRM w.c.f. 2019-2020 session.

NOTE:

The department of Commerce restarted one year Post Graduate Diploma in Marketing and Sales Management (PGDMSM) on self financing basis w.e.f.2014-2015. During the same session 2014-2015, two more diplomas namely, Post Graduate Diploma in Accounting and Finance (PGDAF) and Post Graduate Diploma in Banking and Risk Management (PGDBRM) in collaboration with Nation Stock Exchange (NSE), Delhi are also introduced on self financing basis. Internal faculty, NET-JRF scholars and Project fellows are engaged to conduct classes for these diploma programmes. In the DRC/DAC meeting held on 9.10.2018 and 1.11.2018, the members after threadbare deliberations, decided to temporary suspend admission to aforesaid three Post Graduate Diploma Programmes w.e.f.2019-2020 session due to the following reasons:

1. Over the period of time, admissions to the P.G diplomas Programmes have been declining as evident from the table 1.

Further, it has been noticed that students admitted to these programmes are more inclined towards competitive examinations rather than attending classes on regular basis. As a result, the attendance in the classes is becoming thin ranging from 2-3 students. With such low strength, a congenial classroom environment is not created apart from sub optimal utilization of resources.

2. The eligibility for admission to these diploma programmes is graduation in any discipline, students from non Commerce background find it difficult to cope with the prescribed syllabi. As a result, pass percentage in Commerce/ Finance related papers is very low. The students clearing online paper/s conducted by National Stock Exchange is also 2-3 students per year.

 Till date, majority papers are taught by JRF/Project fellows, most of them have been absorbed in Govt. services and have become part time scholars. With limited internal faculty/guest faculty, it has become uneconomical to offer these programmes on self financing basis.

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4. At M.com semester III, the dept. from the session i.e. 2019-20 is offering three specialized streams namely, HRM, Marketing and Finance and Accounting. With existing limited classrooms, it is not possible to run these diploma programmes.

Keeping in view the above factors, the matter is submitted for consideration.

TTEM No.: 15

To consider the matter w.r.t. the inclusion of children of Para Military Porces and State Police Personnel in the Category of Defence Service Personnel including Ex Servicemen and their children who are permanent residents of the State and have had a satisfactory service record as per SRO-294 of the state of J&K (2%).

NOTE:

For admission to the various Academic Programmes of the University of Jammu/ Offsite Campuses/ Affiliated Colleges the seats are reserved for the various categories. At present 2% seats are reserved for the Defence personnel including Ex-Servicemen and their children who are permanent residents of the State and have had a satisfactory service record.

It was decided in the meeting of the Academic Council held on 23-11-2017 vide Resolution No. 3.14.2 that the children of the personnel of the paramilitary forces/ the children of the State Police Personnel who are permanent residents of the State be also included in this reservation of 2% as above.

The decision of the Academic Council with regard to the inclusion of the children of the personnel of the Paramilitary forces/ the children of the State Police Personnel who are permanent residents of the State to be also included in this reservation of 2% was placed before the University Syndicate in its meeting held on 17-03-2018 wherein vide Item No. 113.07, it was resolved that "the matter be re-examined strictly in accordance with the SRO-294 of the State of Jammu & Kashmir".

The matter under reference was again put up in the meeting of the Campus Deans held on May 18, 2018. The Campus Deans deliberated upon the matter at length and constituted a Sub-Committee of the following to re-examine the matter under reference strictly in accordance with SRO-294 of the State of J&K:

- 1) Dean Faculty of Life Sciences
- 2) Dean Faculty of Law
- 3) Director, Law School
- 4) Head, Department of Computer Science & IT

To consider the issue of conversion of post of Professor into two posts of Assistant Professors resolved vide resolution No.83.32 in the 83rd University Council at its meeting held on 24.10.2017.

NOTE: .

A table item was placed before the 83rd University Council at its meeting held on 24.10.2017 (Annexure-I) to consider the conversion of Positions of Professors lying vacant in different departments of the University into two positions of Assistant professors. The University Council at its meeting held on 24.10.2017 resolved as under:-

- (a) That the post of Professor shall be converted into two (02) posts of Assistant Professors provided such post of Professor has not been filled even after having advertised four times.
- (b) That one of the two such posts of Assistant Professor thus created shall be given to the Department in lieu of the conversion of the post of Professor. The other post of Assistant Professor created and left after being given to the Department shall be given to the Offsite Campus where the relevant programme is being offered and in case there is no such programme, then it shall be allotted to any other Department/ Offsite Campus, where there is not even a single faculty member available or allotted to a new programme being offered in the Main/ Offsite Campus.

Action in this regard was taken by the University and the order stands issued vide No. Adm/TW/C&R/18/1221-70 dated 16.08.2018 for information of all concerned (Amexure-II). However, in response, President JUTA raised some objection on the policy of conversion of post of Professor into two posts of Assistant Professors (Annexure-III) and as desired the matter was placed before the Campus Deans at its meeting held on 01.11.2018 wherein following has been resolved:-

"that the concerned DAC of a Department be allowed to decide the conversion of the position of Professor lying vacant in a department into two positions of Assistant Professors if the same is to the Academic advantage of a department and helps in the smooth functioning of that department. Further the converted position of a Professor into two Assistant Professors shall be retained and will be for the parent department only and shall not be transferred or passed on to any Offsite Campus etc. However, the conversion of the post of the Professor into two Assistant Professors shall not be a policy issue of the University".

In view of the request of President JUTA and the recommendations of the Campus Deans, the matter is submitted before the Academic Council for re-consideration.

To consider the conversion of positions of Professors lying vacant in different Departments of the University into two positions of Assistant Professors.

Note:-

There are many positions of Professors lying vacant in the different Departments in the main Campus of the University of Jammu as on date. The University has advertised these positions of the Professors number of times but every time the response was either very poor or the applicants did not fulfill the minimum eligibility criteria required for the direct recruitment of Professors as prescribed by the UGC. Even after seven years since the UGC notified the revised "UGC Regulation on Minimum Qualifications for appointment of teachers and other academic staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education 2010" on 30.06.2010, the University could manage to fill only one position of Professor in the Department of Botany under direct recruitment despite issuing repeated advertisements.

In the above context, it is submitted that at present the positions are not being sanctioned by the State Government for the University of Jammu including for its offsite campuses on the grounds that the State Government had already granted financial autonomy to the Universities in light of the cabinet decision No.167/13/2015 dated 02.12.2015 as notified by the Finance Department vide Government order No.237.F of 2015 dated 04.12.2015. The University has now been time and again being advised by the State Govt. to create new positions out of its internal resources only.

As per one of the Regulations of the said notification, the University is required to generate and retain funding from sources other than the government and allocate it independently.

In this connection, it is submitted that the financial implications involved on salary of one position of Professor and one post of Assistant Professor has been depicted in the following table, which clearly shows that one position of Professor can be easily converted to two positions of Assistant Professors and there are in fact savings on salary account:

Further, pursuant to the University Council Resolution No.82.32 as passed at its meeting held on 22.04.2017, it was resolved that:-

In view of the above, it is proposed that the positions of Professors which could not be filled up inspite of having advertised the same atleast three times due to the poor response and unavailability of even a single eligible candidate be considered for conversion into two positions of Assistant Professors each. Pertinent to mention here that it will not hamper the career progression of the teachers as the Career Advancement Scheme prescribed by the UGC is already available for them.

Out of the positions proposed to be converted, one post of Assistant Professor each in lieu of conversion of one post of Professor shall be given to the concerned Department(s) from where the post(s) of Professor (s) is/are being considered for conversion. The rest of positions of Assistant Professors shall be kept in Common Pool of the University out of which one position of Assistant Professor each shall be considered to be allotted to the Offsite Campuses/Upcoming Department(s) where not even a single permanent faculty is available/any other new course being started in the Main Campus/Offsite Campuses of the University.

Hence the matter is submitted before the University Council for kind consideration.

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In order to review the working of NSS Campus Units in the University of Jammu a Committee under the Chairpersonship of Prof. Neeru Sharma was constituted by the Vice-Chancellor, University of Jammu vide order No. NSS/CCU/JU/189/1653-57 dated 14.11.2018. The office of the Chairman NSS Campus Units confuses with the Chairman NSS, University of Jammu due to the same title, besides the fee sent by the departments on the Campus is received by the office of the Programme Coordinator, NSS and it goes on accumulating without being judiciously used by the benefit of the NSS volunteers through Campus Units. Hence, the Committee constituted was to recommend the alternative nomenclature of the office of the Chairman NSS Campus Units, distribution of NSS units among the faculties, term/tenure of the designated chairman NSS Campus Units, distribution of funds, eligibility conditions of designated chairman NSS Campus Units and NSS POs on the Campus and other related issues for the smooth functioning of NSS on the University Campus. The Committee, has recommended the Regulation governing the Campus NSS activities (Annexure-'A').

Hence, the same are submitted for the approval of the Academic Council.

NSS CAMPUS UNITS, UNIVERSITY OF JAMMU

1. INTRODUCTION

National Service Scheme popularly known as NSS was launched in Mahatma Gandhi Centenary year 1969 and aimed to developing student's personality through community service. The overall objective of National Service is education. This objective is attained through the service to the community. National Service Scheme (NSS) is a permanent Youth Program under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India and funded by Government of India through the state government

2. OBJECTIVES

The overall objective of NSS is Personality Development through the community service.

The broad objectives of NSS are to:

- Understand the community in which they work.
- Understand themselves in relation to their community.

• Identify the needs and problems of the community and involve them in problem solving process.

- Develop among them a sense of social and civic responsibility.
- •Utilize their knowledge in finding practical solution to individual and community problems.
- Develop competence required for group-living and sharing of responsibilities.
- Gain skills in mobilizing community participation.
- Acquire leadership qualities and democratic attitude.
- Develop capacity to meet emergencies and natural disasters.
- Practice national integration and social harmony.

3. MOTTO

The motto or watchword of the NSS is "Not me but you". It underlines that the welfare of an individual is ultimately dependent on the welfare of society on the whole. This expresses the essence of democratic living and upholds the need of selfless service and appreciation of the other man's point of view and also consideration for fellow human beings.

4. SYMBOL

The symbol of the National Service Scheme has been based on the **Giant Rath** Wheel of the world famous Konark Sun Temple of Orissa, India. These giant wheels of the Sun Temple portray the cycles of creation, preservation and release and signify the movement in life across time and space. The design of the symbol, a simplified form of the Sun Chariot wheel primarily depicts movement. The wheel signifies the progressive cycle of life. It stands for continuity as well as change and implies the continuous striving of NSS for social transformation and enlistment.

5. BADGE

The NSS symbol is embossed on the NSS badge. The NSS volunteers wear it while undertaking any Program or community service. The Konark wheel in the symbol has eight bars, which represent the 24 hours of the day. Hence, the badge reminds the wearer

to be in readiness for the service of the nation round the clock i.e. for 24 hours. The Red Colour in the badge indicates that the NSS volunteers are full of young blood i.e. lively, active, energetic and full of high spirit. The Navy Blue Colour indicates the cosmos of which the NSS is a tiny part, ready to contribute its share for the welfare of the mankind.

6. NSS DAY

NSS was formally launched on 24th September 1969, the birth Centenary year of Father of Nation. Therefore, 24th September is celebrated every year as NSS Day with appropriate Program and activities. In order to undertake the NSS activities on the University campus the following regulations are recommended:

REGULATIONS GOVERNING CAMPUS NSS ACTIVITIES IN THE UNIVERSITY OF JAMMU

1. There shall be a Campus NSS Committee (CNC) in the University to promote NSS activities of the University Teaching Departments, DDE and Offsite Campuses of the University of Jammu.

2. The Campus NSS Committee shall organize, control, manage and supervise, either directly or through various sub committees, interdepartmental activities, competitions and other events, as are under the mandate of NSS, for the students belonging to University Teaching Departments, DDE and Offsite Campuses of the University of Jammu.

3. The Campus NSS Committee shall have the following members:

- Convener, nominated by the Vice Chancellor i.
 - Four teachers in charge or NSS Programme Officers(POs), from the University ii. Departments, DDE and Offsite Campuses
 - Two Ex NSS POs iii.
 - Two students from the University of Departments, DDE or Offsite Campuses holding iv. excellent record in NSS and
 - Member Secretary. ν.

4. Convener, Campus NSS Committee:

- The Convener shall be nominated by the Vice Chancellor from among the University i. Professors.
- He/She should have interest in youth and community activities or should have served ii. as NSS Programme Coordinator/ NSS Programme Officer.
- In case the Convener is a former NSS Programme Coordinator/ NSS Programme iii. Officer, he/she shall be nominated only after a gap of three years after his/ her last tenure as Programme Coordinator/ Programme Officer.
 - He/ She should maintain accounts of the office with the help of the office of the iv. Programme Coordinator, NSS, University of Jammu.

5. Programme Officer:

- Four NSS POs shall be nominated by the Convener, Campus NSS Committee i.
- He/ She should be a member of the teaching faculty of the University of Jammu ii.

- He/ She should not be a teacher in the Physical Education or NCC Officer. iii.
- He/ She should have a zeal for Social Service Activities or should have been a iv. volunteer of NSS during student life.
- He/ She should an organizer, educator, coordinator, supervisor, administrator and ν. a good public relation person.

6. Ex NSS POs:

- Two former NSS POs shall be nominated by the Convener, Campus NSS i. Committee, to work as members of the Campus NSS Committee.
- They should have worked as NSS POs in the University Departments, DDE or Off ii. site Campuses of the University of Jammu.

7. Student Member:

- Two student member shall be nominated by the Convener, Campus NSS i. Committee
- The student member should be a regular student of the University of Jammu and ii. be a NSS volunteer at the PG Level.
- Having worked as a volunteer he/ she should have rendered distinguished service. iii.
- He/ She should have earned 120 hours of NSS Service and Vice Chancellors iv. Certificate at the Post Graduate Level.

8. Members Secretary:

The Convener, Campus NSS Committee shall nominate the Member Secretary i. from amongst the four NSS Pos.

9. Distribution of Units of NSS in the University of Jammu:

- There shall be four NSS Units in the University of Jammu, as follows: i.
 - Unit I: Departments of Faculty of Social Sciences and Arts
 - Unit II: Departments of Faculty of Sciences, Life Sciences and Education Unit III: Departments of Faculty of Law, The Business Studies and The Law School

Unit IV: Directorate of Distance Education.

There shall be a minimum of 100 NSS volunteers allotted to each unit. ii.

10. Tenure of Office of the Members Campus NSS Committee:

- The members of the Committee shall hold the office for a specified term as mentioned in the following sub clauses:
- The Convener shall hold the office for a period of three years.
- i. The POs shall hold the office for a period of three years. ii.
- The Ex-POs shall be the members of the committee for a period of three years. iii.
- The student members shall hold the office for a period of one year. They should iv.
- be on the rolls of the University during this period.

v. The tenure of Member Secretary shall be for a period of One year after which another PO shall be nominated by the Convener on rotational basis as Member Secretary.

11. Duties of the Convener, CNC:

- i. The Convener, CNC, shall preside over the meetings of the Campus NSS Committee.
- ii. It shall be the duty of the Convener, CNC to see that the provisions of these regulations are faithfully observed.
- iii. The Convener CNC shall have the power to convene the meetings of the CNC as and when he/she deems necessary.
- iv. The orders issued for the appointment of Pos must be got approved from the Vice Chancellor who is the Chairman, NSS, University of Jammu.
- v. The Convener shall inform the CNC about the programme and initiatives taken by the NSS on the Campus.
- vi. The Campus Units shall collaborate with the government agencies at the state and central level to take initiatives involving students for the generating awareness or as entrusted by the University of Jammu.
- vii. The Convener should get the proposals approved by the local advisory committee.

12. Meetings:

i.

i.

- i. The meetings of the CNC shall be convened by the Convener CNC by giving an adequate notice to the members.
- ii. The Member Secretary shall note the minutes
- iii. The CNC shall meet once in the beginning of the semester or whenever required by the Convener.

13. Quorum of the meetings:

i. The quorum of the meetings of the CNC shall be two thirds of the members.

14. The Resolution of the meetings:

The matters pertaining to the functioning of Campus NSS Units shall be resolved in the CNC meetings.

15. Duties and Functions of the CNC:

- The CNC shall have the power to take any action, proceedings and decisions, to pass resolutions necessary to promote NSS activities on the Campus, DDE and Offsite Campuses of the University of Jammu.
- ii. The CNC shall discharge the following functions:
 - a. To prepare a Calendar of activities for the ongoing semester
 - b. To allot units to the POs
 - c. Allotment and Utilization of funds for the activities
 - d. To initiate enrollment drives to motivate and increase the volunteer base.



- e. Work in the villages approved under Digital India, the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan and other flagship programmes started by the Government of India and also realize the mandate of the NSS through service in these villages.
- f. To discuss any other item with the permission of the chair.
- g. PO, NSS shall undertake the activities at the field/ ground level an submit report to the Convener.

16. CNC Finances:

- i. To meet the expenditure for promoting the NSS activities, 100% of the funds realized by the University Departments, DDE and Offsite Campuses on account of 'NSS Fee' shall be transferred to the account of Convener CNC by the University Departments, DDE and Offsite Campuses.
- ii. These funds shall be maintained separately in 'Fee Fund Account' and spent as per the existing rules and regulations of the University of Jammu.
- iii. Expenditure:

The expenditure out of the CNC Fund shall be incurred in the manner and on the items specified below:

- a. To plan and organize NSS Camps/ Special Camps, National Days, Community Outreach Activities, Workshops and other such activities as mandated under the NSS
- b. Contingency charges
- c. Honorarium, TA/DA etc. to the Resource Persons
- d. Honorarium of the POs.
- e. Refreshments
- iv. Financial Powers of the Convener:
 - a. Same as otherwise, the Convener shall be competent to accord sanction for expenditure and shall have the powers to issue cheques or other forms of transactions as per the University Norms.
 - b. The accounts are to be audited on annual basis and utilization certificate has to be submitted to the Programme Coordinator, NSS.
 - c. No bills should be pending more than one month.

v. Honorarium for the Convener and the PO:

a. The honorarium for the POs as prescribed by the NSS manual of the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports from time to time.

17. Local Advisory Committee:

- 1. Convener CNC
 - 2. To be nominated by the Vice Chancellor

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- 3. To be nominated by the Vice Chancellor
- 4. Dean Students Welfare
- 5. Director Sports, JU
- 6. Provost Hostels Boys

18. Office of the Convener CNC:

There should be an office space for the smooth conduct of the functions of the Campus NSS Units. There should be a provision for the Secretarial staff and Office attendant so that the activities and accounts of the office of the Convener, Campus NSS Committee are carried out/ maintained in a smooth manner and youth engagement takes a meaningful shape in the University of Jammu.

- **19.** The CNC should have Local Fund Committee and Purchase Committee for observing the codal formalities while undertaking any financial transactions.
- 20. In case of any conflict or confusion the NSS Manual shall be the guiding document.

To consider the cancellation of the admission of the Under Graduate student(s) of the affiliated Degree Colleges of the University of Jammu.

NOTE:

It is submitted that with the introduction of Choice Based Credit System at Under Graduate level, the office of the Controller of Examinations is regularly receiving requests for cancellation of admission from the reappear/failure students of Under Graduate Courses of the University affiliated Degree Colleges with a view to seek admission afresh in another College or stream.

It is pertinent to mention here that under the existing University Statutes, there is no provision for cancellation of admission of a student admitted under the Choice Based Credit System. However, keeping the career of a student into consideration the cancellation of his/her admission be allowed after observing the following formalities:

- (i) A student can apply to the University for cancellation of his/her admission by submitting a written request in the office of the Controller of Examinations at the commencement of the Odd Semester.
- (ii) No student who has joined a course in a University affiliated Degree College shall be admitted to the same course in the same college or another during the same course unless:
 - a) He/She has obtained "No Objection Certificate" from the Principal of the College from where he/she intends to cancel the admission.
 - b) The "No Objection Certificate" issued by the College Principal shall clearly indicate that he/she has paid Tuition fee for the period the student remained on the rolls of the College concerned.
 - c) The application for cancellation of admission submitted by a candidate must be accompanied with a fee of Rs.300/-, without which the application shall not be entertained.
 - d) The admission shall be cancelled in all the courses of study in which he/she has previously studied in that College.
- (iii) After cancellation of his/her admission if the mind of a student changes for revival of his/her admission in that particular institution within the prescribed period he/she can apply for revival of admission, subject to availability of seat by submitting a fee of Rs.180/- in the University Chest after producing "No Objection Certificate" from the College Principal concerned.

To consider change in Headship/Directorship in respect of teaching Departments/Directorates/Schools of University of Jammu where:

- i. When a new Professor is appointed/ promoted, he/she be given the charge of headship for the usual term immediately from the date he/she joins as Professor in the said Department/ Directorate/School, if the incumbent HOD has held the position beyond the usual term.
- Ii. Where there is one Professor/No Professor, the rotation of Headship shall be amongst Associate Professors till a new Professor joins the Department, if the incumbent HOD has held the position beyond the usual term.

NOTE:

In order to maintain the spirit of rotational headship in teaching Departments where new Professor/Associate Professor is appointed/ promoted, so that he/she can be given the charge of headship for the usual term immediately from the date he/she joins as Professor or Associate Professor in the said Department/Directorate, if the headship has not changed for the consecutive terms; an item to this effect was placed before the Standing Committee of the Academic Council of the University at its meeting held on 01.02.2018. The Academic Council resolved that:

"the matter w.r.t. the rotation of Headship/Directorship in respect of teaching Departments/Directorates/Schools of University where a Professor/Associate Professor of the respective Department/ Directorate/School is holding the said position beyond his/her usual first term, in such an eventuality when another faculty member gets selected as Professor/Associate Professor, the latter be allowed to take over the Headship/Directorship after his/her becoming the Professor/Associate Professor, be endorsed."

The matter was placed before the University Syndicate and the Syndicate resolved that:

"the rotation of Headship/Directorship in respect of teaching Departments/Directorates/Schools of University of Jammu where a Professor/Associate Professor of the respective Department/ Directorate/School is holding the said position beyond the usual term in the event of appointment/promotion of a Professor/Associate Professor, be endorsed"

The matter was placed before the University Council. The University Council vide resolution No.84.20 (Annexure-I) passed at its 84th Council meeting held on 10.04.2018 resolved that:

"the rotation of Headship/Directorship in respect of teaching Departments/Directorates/Schools of University of Jammu where a Professor/Associate Professor of the respective Department/ Directorate/School is holding the said position beyond the usual term in the event of appointment/promotion of a Professor/Associate Professor, be approved."

Pursuant to the aforesaid resolution passed by the University Council, procedurally an order/notification to this effect is required to be issued by the University. However, in view of the concerns raised by President, JUTA, it was desired that before issuance of order/notification to this effect, comments of President, JUTA be sought in the matter under reference.

Accordingly, the President, JUTA was requested vide letter No.Adm/TW/18/993-96 dated 18.07.2018 (Annexure-II) to give his valuable comments with regard to the resolution No.84.20 passed by the University Council at its 84th Council meeting held on 10.04.2018 in view of the concerns raised by him.

In response, the President, JUTA vide his letter No.JUTA/17-19/TW-01 dated 03.08.2018 (Annexure-III) intimated that keeping in view the genesis and purpose of the item, Jammu University Teachers Association is of the opinion that the following interpretation fits well in the essence of the resolution:

- 1. Rotation of Headship/Directorship in respect of teaching Departments be among the Professors except in cases where there is one Professor or no Professor and in these cases the Headship can go to the Senior most Associate Professor.
- 2. To be uniform, the chain of rotation may not be prefixed in the sense that if a Professor is heading the Department for more than one term of three years and in between a person joins as Professor, the Headship/Directorship may pass onto him/her.
- 3. If there is no Professor in the Department/School of the University of Jammu, the Headship/Directorship may rotate among Associate Professors till a Professor joins the Department and this would initiate a new chain of rotation as described at point 1 above.
- 4. The date of implementation of this resolution may be from the date of its notification by the University.

The above opinion of the Jammu University Teachers Association was placed before the Campus Deans. The Campus Deans at their meeting held on 01.11.2018, deliberated upon the issue at length and endorsed the same.

Therefore, in order to maintain the spirit of rotational headship in respect of teaching Departments/ Directorates/Schools of University of Jammu, the existing resolution No. 84.20 passed by the University Council at its 84th Council meeting held on 10.04.2018 shall be replaced with the proposed resolution after concurrence of the University Council.

On the rotation of Headship/Directorship in respect of teaching Departments/Directorates/ Schools of the University of Jammu after thread bare discussions/deliberations keeping in view the genesis and purpose of the Item under reference above, JUTA is of the opinion that the following interpretation fits well in the essence of the resolution:

- 1. Rotation of Headship/Directorship in respect of teaching Departments be among the Professors except in cases where there is one professor or no professor and in these cases the Headship can go to the senior most Associate Professor.
- 2. To be uniform, the chain of rotation may not be prefixed in the sense that if a Professor is heading the Department for more than one term of three years and in between a person joins as Professor, the Headship/Directorship may pass onto to him/her.
- 3. If there is no Professor in the Department /School of the University of Jammu, the Headship/Directorship may rotate among Associate Professors till a Professor joins the Department and this would initiate a new chain of rotation as described at 1 above.



To consider the matter w.r.t. to reduce the fee of self-financing course 'Remote Sensing & GIS'.

NOTE:

The office of the Dean Academic Affairs received a letter No.PGD/RS & GIS/19/3490-91 dated January 4, 2019 from Prof. A.S. Jasrotia, Head, Department of Remote Sensing & GIS, University of Jammu, Jammu wherein he has sought reduction of fee for Self-financing course Remote Sensing & GIS.

The Head, Department of Remote Sensing & GIS has stated that the fee of the Course be reduced from Rs 2.42 lakh to Rs 1.00 lakh (0.25 lakh per semester) for the Academic Session 2019-20 as the department has been facing difficulties in filling the intake capacity due to higher fee structure.

Keeping in view the difficulty faced by the Department of Remote Sensing & GIS to fill up the intake capacity in the Department of Remote Sensing & GIS for the Academic Session 2018-19, wherein only four admissions had been made and the Order for one-time exception to run the course had also been given to the Department; it is proposed to reduce the fee of the Self-financing course from the existing Rs 2.42 lakh to Rs 1 lakh (0.25 lakh per semester) as proposed by the Head, Department of Remote Sensing & GIS, in anticipation of the approval of the various bodies.

As such, the matter is being placed for consideration of the Academic Council.

NOTE



Arch. Degree Course for the present batches as has been the case earlier till the course is finally handed over to the Cluster University, Jammu.

Item No. 2: To consider the amendment in Statute 2.4 (a) of the Statutes Governing M.D/M.S Course as per the Kashmir University Council Resolution No. 78.5 dated 24.10:2017

Resolved that the Amended Statute as has been adopted in University of Kashmir Council vide No. 78.5 dated 24/10/2017, the same may be got re-vetted by the Dean Faculty of Medical Sciences, University of Jammu before its adoption in the University of Jammu.

Item No. 3: To consider the matter w.r.t. amendment of Act of Kashmir and Jammu Universities Act, 1969 in terms of Order No. F.Acd./II/17/14592-791 dated 04.01.2017 regarding the term of the Convener, Board of Studies and Head/Director.

The issue was deliberated and during the course of discussion, it emerged that the matter of coterminous Headship and Convener-ship, and the subsequent issuance of the Ordinance in the matter needs to be deliberated in the Committee comprising Senior Academicians of the University before placing the same before the appropriate Bodies of the University, in the event of any change/ modification.

नई शिक्षा प्रणाली राष्ट्रभाषा और भारतीय भाषाओं के विकास में बाधक

भारत की सर्वोच्च प्ररीक्षा I.A.S.-I.P.S. की परीक्षा में तो हिंदी माध्यम से छात्र सर्वोच्च स्थान प्राप्त कर रहे हैं। विदेशों में भी हिंदी 175 विश्वविद्यालयों में पढ़ाई जा रही है। वहीं हमारे अपने देश के विश्वविद्यालयों में सत्र 2015–16 से चयन आधारित क्रेडिट पाठ्यक्रम (सी.बी.सी.एस.) लागू कर दिया गया है। इसमें भारत की पहचान-राष्ट्रभाषा हिंदी का ही गला घोंटा गया है तथा उससे भारतीय भाषाओं को मरणासन्न अवस्था में पहुँचा दिया गया है। यह दुर्दशा का कार्य पिछली सरकारों द्वारा शुरू किया गया था, जिसे वर्तमान सरकार में बैठे वस्ष्ठि आई ए.एस. अधिकारी आगे बढ़ा रहे हैं, जबकि प्रधानमंत्री बनने पर श्री नरेन्द्र मोदी जी ने सफ़्द्रभाषा हिन्दी के जत्थान और समी जगह अनिवार्य रूप से हिन्दी प्रयोग करने की घोषणा की थी। सी.बी.एस.एस. में हिंदी की दुर्दशा के विषय में कुछ महत्त्वपूर्ण बिंदु इस प्रकार है-

- सभी पाठ्यक्रमों (बी.ए.बी.कॉम., बी.एस.सी., (ऑनर्स)) में हिंदी को यैकल्पिक बना दिया गया है। पहले बी.ए. (प्रास) में हिंदी सीन वर्ष पढ़ाई जाती थी तथा बी.कॉम सहित सभी ऑनर्स में हिंदी वर्ष भर अनिवार्य रूप से पढ़ाई जाती थी, जबकि अब अंग्रेजी पढ़ाई जाएगी। आधुनिक भारतीय भाषा के अंतर्गत एक विकल्प रूप में, केवल एक सेमेस्टर के लिए रह गई हे। परोक्ष रूप से अग्रेजी आनेवाय हो गई है और हिन्दी वेकल्पिक।
- भारत की राजभाषा–राष्ट्रभाषा हिंदी है, इसलिए अभी तक–अनिवार्य हिन्दी पाठ्यक्रम (CTH) के रूप में एक प्रश्नप्रत्र उन सभी भारतीय विद्यार्थियों के लिए 2 सेमेस्टर पढ़ना अनिवार्य था, जिन्होंने 8वीं कक्षा के बाद हिंदी नहीं पढ़ी हो। सी.बी.सी.एस. में इसका कोई उल्लेख नहीं है और वह भी समाप्त हो गया।

इससे स्पष्ट है कि यह हिंदी विरोधियों तथा अंग्रेजी समर्थक प्रशासनिक अधिकारियों का गहरा षड्यंत्र है। इससे न केवल बड़ी संख्या में विद्यार्थी भारत की राजभाषा एवं राष्ट्रभाषा हिन्दी जो भारत की आत्मा और अस्मिता की पहचान है, से दूर हो गए साथ ही अन्य प्रदेशों की भारतीय भाषाओं से भी दूर हो गए, अपितु सैकड़ों तदर्थ एवं स्थायी हिंदी प्राध्यापक भी बेरोजगार होते जा रहे हैं।

आज 2 वर्ष के अनुभव के आधार पर आवश्यकता है कि केंद्रीय विश्वविद्यालयों में पढ़ने वाले प्रत्येक विद्यार्थी (बी.एस.सी., बी.कॉम, बी.ए. प्रोग्राम/ऑनर्स) के लिए एक वर्ष (दो सेमेस्टर) हिंदी का अध्ययन अनिवार्य कराया। जहाँ सम्पूर्ण विश्व के 167 विश्वविद्यालयों में हिन्दी का अध्ययन और अध्यापन हो रहा है वहीं भारत के विश्वविद्यालयों से हिन्दी को समाप्त करने की योजना बन रही है।

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इसके साथ-साथ केन्द्रीय माध्यमिक शिक्षा बोर्ड से सम्बन्धित सम्पूर्ण देश के उच्चतर विद्यालयों 🕅 🦼 ् अपनी ज विद्यालयी शिक्षा के क्षेत्र में जो भारतीय भाषाओं विशेष रूप से हिन्दी, संस्कृत, पंजाबी, बंगला, मराठी, 🗸 गुजराती, तमिल, तेलगू, उर्दू, मलयालम् को समाप्त कर केवल अंग्रेजी का प्रभुत्व बढ़ाया जा रहा है। पब्लिक स्कूलों द्वारा योजनाबद्ध तरीके से हिन्दी को पीछे किया जा रहा है तथा विदेशी भाषा जोड़ी जा रही है। भारत सरकार ने राष्ट्रीय एकता हेतु और भारतीय भाषाओं के समन्वय के लिये 1968 में 'त्रिमाषा सूत्र' विद्यालयी शिक्षा में निर्धारित किया। जिसमें (1) भारतीय भाषा / मातृभाषा (2) राष्ट्रभाषा हिन्दी (3) कोई भी अन्य भाषा अंग्रेजी, संस्कृत, फ्रेंच, जर्मन, जापानी। उसके पीछे मुख्य उद्देश्य था उत्तर भारतीय किसी दक्षिण की या दूसरी भारतीय मामा का अध्ययन करे और दक्षिण भारतीय उत्तर की भाषाओं का अध्ययन करे।

यही सब कुछ सोच समझ कर 'क' वर्ग राज्यों के लिये सरकार ने संसद में 1972 में विद्यालयी अधिनियम 1973 बनाया और उसके नियम 9 अनुसार कक्षा 9–10 तक त्रिमाषा सूत्र (तीन भाषाये) पढ़ाना अनिवार्य किया। अनेक वर्षों तक सभी सी.से. स्कूलों में तीन भाषायें पढ़ाई जाती रही। परन्तु अब पब्लिक स्कूलों में अंग्रेजी माषा अनिवार्य और दूसरी माषा के रूप में विदेशी माषा तक पहानी शुरू कर दी है जो हिन्दी के साथ मारतीय भाषाओं के प्रति अन्याय है।

इसी भाषा के प्रश्न को लेकर भारत की प्रशासनिक सेवा परीक्षाओं में हिन्दी का प्रश्न पत्र जोड़ने के लिये हिन्दी प्रमियों और छात्रों ने 5 वर्ष तक यू.पी.एस.सी. पर धरना रखकर आई. ए.एस. की परीक्षा में हिन्दी का प्रश्न पत्र जुड़वाया था।

देश को स्वतंत्र हुए 71 वर्ष होने जा रहे हैं और भारतीय संविधान को लागू हुए 69 वर्ष होने जा रहे हैं, परन्तु राष्ट्रभाषा हिन्दी आज भी रानी की दासी बनी हुई है। भारत के संविधान के सन्नहवें अध्याय में 'देव' नागरी लिपि में हिन्दी' को भारतीय संघ की राजमाषा घोषिल किया गया हैं। संविधान के प्रथम अनुच्छेद में 'इंडिया' शब्द पहले है और 'भारत' शब्द उसके बाद | यानी अंगरेजी नाम पहले और हिन्दी नाम बाद में। इस तरह अंग्रेजी मामा का जो वर्चस्व कायम किया गया, वह अभी तक बरकरार है।

आज से ठीक 69 वर्ष मूर्व 14 सितम्बर, 1949 के दिन संविधान सभा द्वारा हिन्दी को भारत संघ की राजभाषा के रुप में मान्यता दी गई थी। संविधान के निर्माताओं ने सोचा था कि अंग्रेजी का प्रयोग धीरे-धीरे कम करके भारतीय भाषाओं और हिन्दी का प्रयोग होने लगेगा क्योंकि अंग्रेजी देश को दो हिस्सें में बॉटती है। एक तो ऐसा वर्ग है जो अपने को आम जनता से अलग कर अंग्रेजी मयत होने के कारण स्वय को खास कहता है। दूसरा हिन्दी प्रेमी आम जनता है। हिन्दी प्राष्ट्रीय चेतना, राष्ट्रीय सम्मान और सम्ट्रीय एकता का माध्यम है। हिन्दी भाषा का साहित्य अत्यन्त ही समुद्ध है। हिन्दी में कबीर, सूर, तुलसीदास, रहीम, रसखान जयशंकर प्रसाद, महादेवी वर्मा, मैथिलीशरण गुप्त, सोहन लाल द्विवेदी, श्री हजारी प्रसाद द्विवेदी, श्री प्रेमचन्द, पं, मदन मोहन मालवीय, डॉ. रघुवीर तथा श्री पुरुषोत्तम टण्डन आदि अनेक कवियों और लेखकों की परम्परा रही है। मारत की मारती, यामी राजभाषा हिंदी अपनी गरिमा के कारण केवल भारत में ही नहीं, अपितु विश्व के अनेक देशों के महाविद्यालयों में गौरवपूर्ण स्थान या चुकी है। किसी भी देश के लिए यह औरव की बात होती है कि उसकी भाषा या भाषाओं का अध्ययन विदेशियों द्वारा उच्च स्तर पर तथा व्यापक रूप से हो और अंतर्राष्ट्रीय जगत में भी उन्हें प्रतिष्ठा प्राप्त हो।

विदेशों में हिंदी के लोकप्रिय होने का मुख्य कारण हैं मारतीय दर्शन, साहित्य, सभ्यता और संस्कृति कृवपूर्वज्ञव Fra'

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श्रीगों की रुचि। दूसरों कारण यह है कि भारतीय गए, वे अपने साथ हिंदी ले गये और वर्षों बाद भी Terest बी-दर-पीढ़ी हिंदी को अपनी और अपनी सांस्कृतिक अस्मिता का आधार बनाए रहे। प्रवासी भारतीयों PIO को अपनी जड़ों से जुड़े रहने की इच्छा के कारण हिंदी का अध्ययन विश्व में लगातार बढ़ता गया। चीन, Per जापान, थाईलैंड आदि एशियाई देशों में बौद्ध धर्म के प्रचार – प्रसार के कारण भी हिंदी की लोकप्रियता

ने विश्व में एक बृहत् स्वरूप धारण किया। रुस, चेकोस्लोवासिया, पोलैण्ड, यूगोस्लाविया, हंगरी आदि देशों के लगभग 175 विश्वविद्यालयों में हिंदी-अध्यापन का कार्य लगभग पूरी तरह से स्थानीय हिन्दी-प्राध्यापकों द्वारा संचारित किया गया जाता है।

भारत को समझने की दृष्टि से संसार के 108 विद्या-केन्द्रों में हिन्दी का अध्ययन होता है। अमेरिका में 33 विश्वविद्यालयों में हिन्दी का अध्ययन होता है। यह अध्ययन मुख्यतः हिन्दी-व्याकरण तथा व्यवहार की भाषा के अध्ययन के रूप में होता है। अमेरिका के प्रसिद्ध विद्वान सैमुअल कैलाग ने हिन्दी का प्रथम व्याकरण 1875 में लिखा था और इसका प्रकाशन 1876 में इलाहाबाद में हुआ।

अतः आवश्यकता है केंद्रीय विश्वविद्यालयों में पढ़ने वाले प्रत्येक विद्यार्थी (बी.एस.सी., बी.कॉम, बी.ए. प्रोग्राम / ऑनर्स) के लिए एक वर्ष (दो सेमेस्टर) हिंदी या भारतीय भाषा का अध्ययन करना अनिवार्य कराया जाय तथा सी.से. स्कूलों में त्रिभाषा सूत्र अनिवार्य हो। हिन्दी या भारतीय भाषा का जहाँ सम्पूर्ण विश्व के 175 विश्वविद्यालयों में अध्ययन और अध्यापन हो रहा है वहीं भारत से राष्ट्रभाषा-राजभाषा समाप्त करने की योजना बन रही है। उनको समाप्त करने के लिये हम सभी भारतीयों का सजग होकर इस सरकार को यही स्थिति से अवगत कराना पड़ेगा नहीं तो हम सभी अपनी भाषाओं के साथ साथ

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संस्कृति से भी दूर हो जाएंगे।

NOTE:

The fee structure for the B.Tech programmes as proposed by the Coordinator UIET, University Institute of Engineering & Technology (UIET), University of Jammu was placed before the Advisory committee of the UIET at its meeting held on 15-05-2018 and after thorough deliberations, the fee structure was approved by the Advisory Committee. A copy of fee structure is placed as **Annexure-I**.

Subsequently, various students of the UIET had represented for reduction of Campus Development fund. The Advisory committee deliberated the above issue and after thorough deliberation and keeping in view the pattern followed by the other neighbouring institutions, the committee recommended that a total of Rs 30,000/- be charged from each student of the B. Tech. programme towards Campus development charges, out of which Rs. 15,000/- will be charged at the time of the admission in the Semester 1st (First year) and Rs. 5000/- each subsequently in the 2nd, 3rd & 4th years of the course (a copy of the minutes is placed as Annexure-II). Accordingly, the fee has been charged as per the above and the copy of the detailed fee structure is placed as Annexure-III.



In continuation to the resolution of the Advisory committee held on 20th July 2018, the committee met again in the office of the Rector Kathua Campus and had the following observations after perusal of the estimates presented before the committee by the Rector. The perusal of the records indicated that there is a requirement of more than (estimated amount) of Rs 3 Crore during the current financial year 2018-19 (Annexure enclosed) out of which a grant of only Rs 1.02 Crore has been allocated by the University of Jammu and there is a deficit of more han 2 crores to meet the proposed expenditure for various infrastructure of the B. Tech Programme at Kathua Campus Janglote.

However after thorough deliberations and keeping in view the patterns followed by the other neighbouring institutions, the committee recommended that a total fees of Rs 80,000/- be charged from each student of the B.Tech. Programme towards Campus development harges. Out of which 15,000/- will be charged at the time of admission in the Semester 1st (First rear) and Rs 5000/- each subsequently in the 2^{nd} , 3^{rd} and 4^{th} years of the course.

Further the options may be given to the students of current session and onwards o pay the entire amount of Rs 30,000/- one time at the time of their admission (First year.) and o other installment in any of the subsequent year.

Construction Section 2017-18 under centrally sponsored Rashtriya Uchchattar Sides and 2017-18 under centrally sponsored Rashtriya Uchchattar Sides a Abhiyan (RUSA) Scheme as constituent college of the University of addressing the critical gaps in the spanal distribution of Higher Education Institution across the state.

Subsequently notification for B.Tech programme of UIET was issued after obtaining approval from the Vice Chancellor on 17/07/2017 for starting B.Tech in two streams of engineering i.e. i) Civil Engineering (C.E.) and ii) Computer Science and Engineering (C.S.E.).

Lie students of the first batch in the disciplines of (1) Civil Engineering (C. E.) and (ii) Computer Science and Engineering (C.S.E) admitted during the academic session 2017-18 were imparted instructions as per the courses of syllabi of Bachelor of Engineering notified by the University of Jammu as the first year comprises general theory courses and laboratories. Their maininations were also held with the students of Bachelor of Engineering programme of the University of Jammu.

The 83st University Council held on 24.10.2017 confirmed vide item no 93.07 the action taken "w.r.t introduction of Bachelor of Engineering in the UIET Janglote, Kathen (Constituent College of the University of Jammu)".

An Advisory committee meeting of the UIET was held on 15.05.2018 where this matter was discussed with regard to the syllabi of the courses of the enrolled students of B.Tech in (f) Civil Engineering (C.E.) and (ii) Computer Science Engineering (C.S.E.) for the IIIrd and IV⁴ semesters.

After thorough deliberations, the committee resolved that the syllabi and courses for semester 1st to 1^{wh} for the B.Tech. Programme of UET in the disciplines of (i) Civil Engineering (C.E.) and (ii) Complete Science Engineering (C.S.E.) be kept same as being taught to students of Bachelor of Engineering. 2.4 The admission to 1st Semester of 4-year B.E. Course shall normally be made on or before the 8th of August each year and that the academic programme of the students shall commence on 16^{sh} of August or from the next working day if 16^{sh} August happens to be a holiday.

2.5 The Vice-Chancellor may in exceptional case on the recommendation of the Principal permit late admission to a candidate on payment of a late fee as may be prescribed by the University from time to time within the period of 30 calendar days from the date of classification.

2.6 Any student studying in an Engineering Institution affiliated to a recognized University, on the recommendation of Dean, Faculty of Engineering be allowed to migrate by the Vice-Chancellor, to the University of Jammu on fulfilment of the requirements prescribed hereunder:-

i) Not more than one student in each discipline shall be allowed migration in an academic year. Provided there is a prior approval of the State Government for such additional quota of seats.

ii) The migration shall be allowed to a student who has been admitted through a State or National level Entrance Test or a

test conducted by any agency approved by the State Govt. for this purpose.

iii) The migration shall be permitted in 3^{er} Semester only. The equivalence of courses

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2.2 Depending upon the number of vacancies approved by the State Government Authorities from time to time. Diploma Holders with a minimum of 60% marks in the aggregate in any branch of Engineering from any State Board of Technical Education recognised by the All India Council for Technical Education (A.I.C.T.E) shall also be eligible for admission directly to the 3^{sc} semester of the 4-years B.E. Degree Course only based on the Common Entrance Test to be conducted by the University of Jammu. The total number of seats under this category shall be10% of the total sanctioned strength (branch wise) in that year. These seats shall be however, over and above the sanctioned strength.

To consider the matter w.r.t. number of seats under Management Quota and mode of filling the seats in Non Govt. Colleges affiliated to the University of Jammu.

NOTE:

A meeting of committee constituted vide order No. CDC/2018/5562-71 dated 13/03/2018 was convened to deliberate on the issue regarding number of seats and mode of filling up the seats of Management Quota on 16th January 2019 at 2:30 p.m. The Committee deliberated on the matter in detail and following was resolved.

- i) The number of seats under Management quota in private affiliated colleges shall be 15% of the sanctioned intake or 10 seats whichever is lower. These seats under management quota shall be over and above the sanctioned intake.
- ii) The fee charged for admissions under Management quota in private affiliated Colleges shall be at par with the admissions fee charged for admission of candidates under regular mode. No additional fee, whatsoever, shall be charged from the candidates admitted under Management Quota.
- iii) There shall be separate admission committee for the admission under Management Quota seats and shall comprise the following members.
 - 1. Principal/Director of the concerned College
 - 2. Two senior faculty members of the concerned College to be nominated by chairman
 - 3. A representative of the concerned nodal department (not below the rank of Associate Prof.) to be nominated by Director CDC and
 - 4. A nominee of the Director, CDC(not below the rank of Assistant Registrar)
 - 5. The above committee shall be served by the concerned College.
 - iv) The candidates/s admitted under the Management Quota in private affiliated colleges shall be admitted by following a fair and transparent procedure and the Eligibility/Mode of Admission i.e. entrance Test/GD/PI/Academic Merit etc shall be the same as applicable for other/General/OM/admission in the College/Course.
 - v) The Colleges shall be allowed to fill the Management Quota seats even if open seats remain unfilled.
 - vi) i-v above shall not be applicable for the Courses/colleges for which the admissions are made by the BOPEE/any Agency other than the University of Jammu.

Hence, the resolutions recorded by the committee are submitted before the Academic Council for consideration.

To consider the matter w.r.t. the enhancement of 10% of the fee structure of the Master of Business Administration (MBA) and Master of Business Administration (Hotel and Tourism Management (MBA-HT) for the Academic Session 2019-20 in pursuance of the 78th University Council Resolution No.78.15 dated 13.04.2015.

NOTE:

The Director, The Business School, University of Jammu has submitted a proposal with respect to the enhancement of the existing fees to the tune of 10% (for all the components) for the Academic Session 2019-20 as per the 78th University Council Resolution No.78.15 dated 13.04.2015

Pertinent to mention here that pursuant to the 78th University Council Resolution 3.15.2 dated 13.04.2015, the fee structure of the MBA Course run by the Business School, University of Jammu has also to be applicable for the MBA (HT) course in the School of Hospitality and Tourism Management, University of Jammu from the Academic Session 2014-15.

The proposal was deliberated in a meeting of Director, The Business School and Director, SHTM under the Chairmanship of the Dean Academic Affairs on 18.12.2018 and after threadbare discussion, the Director, SHTM informed that the SHTM recommends the enhancement of 10% of the fee only for the University components notified from time to time.

However, it was decided that the enhancement of the existing fee to the tune of 10% as recommended by the Director. The Business School including the University as well as the Departmental components be agreed to as per practice.

The Record Note of the meeting and the proposed fee structure as submitted by the Director, The Business School is placed as **Annexure-I & II**.

Hence, the matter is submitted for consideration.

Item No. 1: To deliberate upon the matter regarding the implementation of reservation for the economically weaker sections (1.WSs) for admissions to the various programmes offered in the University of Jammu as per UGC communication No. FNO.12-4/2019-U1 dated 17.01.2019 and also as published in the Gazette of India dated 12.01.2019.

In accordance with the provisions of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act 2019, and the reference of Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment vide OM.No.20013/01/2018-BC-II dated 17th January 2019, enabling provision of reservation for the Economically Weaker Section (EWSs) who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes, it has been decided to provide reservation in admission to educational institutions subject to maximum of 10% of the total seats in each category.

Under the said provisions, the University of Jammu proposes to incorporate the following modifications in its admissions from the Academic Session 2019-20 onwards:

- There shall be a reservation in all the programmes/courses offered by the University for the Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) of society, who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Socially and Economically Backward Classes etc.
- The reservation would be in addition to the existing reservations and subject to a
 maximum of 10% of the prescribed in-take capacity in each programme/course.
- 3. These seats (FWSs) shall not be convertible i.e. If the seat's under this category remains vacant in any programme, it shall not be converted to Open or any other category.
- 4. The definition of economically weaker sections shall be such as may be notified by the State from time to time on the basis of family income and other indicators of economic disadvantage.

The aforesaid is recommended to be reflected in the JUET Admission Brochure-2019 and also the University Website accordingly.

To consider:

- a) Making MOOCs through UGC SWAYAM mandatory; and
- b) The number of credits to be earned through SWAYAM courses at the Post Graduate and the Undergraduate level and including them in the final mark sheet.

NOTE:

The Academic Council, at its meeting held on 23/41/2017 through resolution no. 3.33.2 approved the adoption of MOOCs through SWAYAM in the University of Jammu. This was further ratified by the University in the University Council dated 10/4/2018 vide Resolution no. 84.16.

The University, keeping in view the directions being received from UGC from time to time, has already introduced SWAYAM courses in various programmes. Since it was being introduced for the first time, these courses were kept optional for the students.

However, to fully institutionalize the process and to implement these courses, there is a need to make the SWAYAM courses mandatory at both UG and PG levels, so that in the upcoming session i.e. 2019-20, all students of the University and its affiliated colleges enrol for the same. These courses are proposed to be over and above the already allotted credits to a programme. Further, in order to provide an interdisciplinary approach, the student will be free to opt for any course from any faculty/stream. All PG students will have to undertake the SWAYAM course in the 1st/2nd or 3rd semester and UG students can opt for these courses till the 5th Semester. It is proposed, based on deliberations of various committees, that a PG student shall have to earn minimum of 2 and maximum of 4 credits. A UG student shall have to earn atleast 2 credits. This scheme shall however be reviewed from time to time. The final credits, thus earned by the students shall be reflected in the final mark sheet.

Hence, the matter is submitted for consideration.

To consider adoption of Statutes/Scheme/Syllabl Governing the Bachelor of Vocation Programme (B.Voc.).

In pursuance of approval grained by All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) vide communication No.North-West/2018/1-3518938654 dated oq-April-2018 in favour of Model Institute of Engineering & Technology (MIET) Not Bhahval, Jammu, to start three year (6 somester) Bachelors of Vocation Program (B.Voc.) in Software Development, No Objection Certificate was insued in favour the college vide lefter No. CDC/16/243 dated 12.04.2018 subject to fulfillment of all the statutory requirements and conditions as laid down in the guidelines of All India Council of Technical Education as prescribed under Statutes Governing Affiliation of Colleges and other Institutions of the University. The Assistant Registrar (Academic) was also requested vide this office letter No. CDC/2018/5207-08 dated 07.12.2018 to initiate the process for formulation of Statute/Scheme/Syllabi.

Accordingly the draft Statutes/Scheme/Syllabi governing the Bachelor of Vocation Programme (B.Voc.) were placed before the Board of Stadies in Computer Science held on 9th January, 2019 and the same stands approved and recommended by the BOS of MCA. Draft Statutes/Scheme/Syllabi are annexed herewith at appearsre 'A'.

Recommendations of the Board of Studies in Computer Science are submitted for consideration of Academic Council.

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DRAFT STATUTES GOVERNING THE BACHELOR OF VOCATION PROGRAMME

B.Voc.

1. INTRODUCTION

There shall be a Bachelors of Vocation programme, hereinafter referred to as B.Voc. to be initially started at Model Institute of Engineering and Technology, Kot Bhalwal, Jammu, hereinafter referred to as "college".

2. DURATION

- 2.1 The course for the degree of B Voc. shall be spread over a period of three years comprising semesters I, II, III, IV, V and VI. The maximum period of completion of the programme including dissertation work shall not exceed six academic years. The programme of instruction will consist of Core courses, Labs and Qualification Packs as per the model curriculum prescribed by the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE).
- 2.2 In any case the candidate has to clear all the courses of B.Voc. within a maximum period of six years to be calculated from the date he/she is admitted to the B.Voc. program.
- 2.3 The academic calendar will be same as for the B.E courses run in University of Jammu

3. ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS & ADMISSION CRITERIA

3.1 The candidate applying for admission to B.Voc. programme must be:

i) 10+2 qualified with minimum 50% of the marks or equivalent CGPA.

- 3.3 Admissions shall be based on the basis of percentage obtained in the qualifying examination and performance in the interview conducted by a duly constituted admissions committee by the college with representatives from the University of Jammu.
- 3.4 In case of a tie between candidates in the merit list, the decision for admission shall be taken by the college admission committee duly constituted by the head of the institution on the basis of other academic credentials. The decision of the committee shall be final and binding on the candidate.
- 3.5 A candidate whose result in the qualifying examination is not available at the time of application can be considered for admission to B.Voc. only if he/she furnishes documentary evidence in support of his/her having passed the qualifying examination in full on or before 31st of July, or such other date as may be approved by the Dean Academic Affairs, University of Jammu; failing which his/her candidature shall

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automatically stand cancelled and the seat thus becoming available shall be filled in accordance with the merit.

4 NUMBER OF SEATS

Total number of seats, in B.Voc. shall be as per approval from the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), the statutory body governing technical education in the country. Fifteen percent (15%) management quota for private colleges shall be applicable as per norms in vogue for other programs as per the University of Jammu,

... 5. DISTRIBUTION OF SEATS

Allotment of seats shall be governed in the following manner:

Total Seats: 50 (or as approved by AICTE)

Open Merit seats: 42

Management Quota Seats: 8

Reserved categories: Reservation shall not be applicable to private colleges as per the norms of the University of Jammu in vogue governing reservations in private colleges.

6. ADMISSION PROCESS

- 6.1 The college admission committee shall look after all admission arrangements including issue of admission notice, receipt of application forms, conduct of interviews, preparation of merit list, display of the lists of selected candidates, etc. on the notice board of the department and/or website of the department/college.
- 6.2 Admission of all candidates to B.Voc. shall be made by the Admission Committee of the department constituted by the Head of the Institution. The Admission Committee shall consist of:
 - a) Director of the college
 - b) Head of the Department
 - c) Three senior teachers of the Department nominated by the Director in consultation with the Head of the Department
 - d) Nominee from the University of Jammu

Majority of the members shall form the quorum for the meetings.

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6.3 Applications for admission to B.Voc. shall be invited through notification published in at least one local newspaper as approved by the competent authorities. Application forms

shall be available for sale in the office of the college during such period as may be notified by the college, keeping in view the statutory provisions.

6.4 Every candidate seeking admissions to B.Voc. shall be required to pay such application fee (Non-refundable) as may be determined by the college. Remittance of all fees shall be made through Bank Draft/digital payments.

6.5 Application form prescribed by the college, complete in all respects, and accompanied with the attested photocopies of the certificates specified there in must reach college, within the dates notified by the Department for the purpose

6.6 At the time of admission the candidate has to submit the provisional certificate in original or affidavit if the gap between the last qualifying examination and the date of admission is more than one year.

Names of candidates selected for admission shall be notified from time to time on the Notice Board of the Department or the website. The candidates, in their own interest, are advised to keep in touch with the Department and comply with instructions issued by the Head of the Department from time to time, through Admission Notices. The selection may be cancelled, and no complaint shall be entertained in case of non-compliance of instruction(s) through such Admission Notices.

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6.8 Under no circumstances, seats lying vacant after the last prescribed date for completion of admission shall be filled by the college admission Committee. All vacant seats are required to be referred to the Appellate committee of the University of Jammu for final decision. This will be applicable to all categories including Open category.

Admission Re and other charges payable by each student shall be such as approved by the competent authority/University of Jammu from time to time.

6.10 Notwithstanding anything contained above, a candidate, who has any grievance regarding application of Statutes governing admission, shall have the right to file an appeal in the prescribed Performa on payment of fee prescribed for this purpose latest by the 2nd of September each year or such other date as may be notified by the University of Jammu for the purpose. Such an appeal may be considered by the Appellate Committee based on its merit. It shall be obligatory for the appealing candidate to appear in person before the Appellate committee. The decision of the Appleate Committee shall be final and binding.

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The Admission Committee with approval of the Director shall have authority to refuse or cancel admission of a candidate who either:

i. fails to produce any requisite certificate in original within the time prescribed; or

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- ii. suppresses/conceals any relevant information, provides information in his/her application which is found incorrect or produces a certificate which is not genuine; or
- iii. fails to pay the fees and other charges within the time prescribed.
- 6.12 No certificate/document/affidavit or its attested photocopy shall be accepted after the expiry of the date prescribed for submission of Application Forms for admission with late fee.

7. Syllabus

7.1 It will be a 6-semester course. In each semester, there will be two components of study viz. General Education Component and Skill Component.

7.2 Subjects of General Education will be taught in the institute whereas subjects under Skill Component will be covered by Skill Knowledge Provider (SKP)/Training Provider approved by NSDC or Govt Agency and empaneled by the University of Jammu.

7.3 Curriculum for education and skill components, as given by the AICTE, will be followed.

8. Assessment

8.1 For the education component, university will conduct examination as is being done for other courses.

8.2 SKP/Training Provider, as approved by the University of Jammu, will do assessment for the skill competency and submit skill credits of the students to the institute.

8.3 Institute will submit these skill credits to the university.

8.4 University will compile both the education credits and vocational skill credits and declare the result.

8.5 Credit calculation and certification will be done as per SAMVAY (Skill Assessment Matrix for Vocational Courses) issued by Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India.

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9. Pass Percentage

9.1 Minimum marks required for the theory subjects and sessionals will be 40%.

9.2 Sessional marks in theory papers shall be given as per the following weightage:

- i). One class test 40%
- ii). Class assignments 40%
- iii). Class attendance 20%

Students attending more than 90% classes will be given full credits. However, those whose attendance is less than 90%, the credits will get reduced as under:

Attendance Credit Points

i). Below 75%	Zero
ii). From 75% to 85%	60%
iii).From 85% to 90%	80%

9.3 Weightage of sessional marks in the laboratory course shall be based on the following distribution:

i). Lab Work	- 50%
ii). Vivo-voce Test	- 30%
iii). Attendance	- 20%

10. Certification

10.1 On successful completion of course, students will be given degree of B.Voc. However, in case they leave half way then they are given certificates as under:-

Diploma	- After successful completion of one year
Advance Diploma	- After successful completion of two years

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Passing Criteria

The minimum number of marks required to pass each theory paper and practical paper from Semester-I to VI shall be 40% (separately in the internal assessment and the university examination).

The minimum number of marks required to pass qualification pack* (On Job Training during each semester) is 70% per National Occupational Standard (NoS)

*Each qualification pack is supposed to meet a certain minimum number of NoS

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The candidate must pass the B.Voc program within six years of the initial admission to the first semester of the course as a regular candidate.

ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT

The minimum attendance requirement for a regular student to appear in a Semester Examination is 75% of the total number of lectures and seminars (as per syllabus) conducted in the semester. The Head of the Department may condone shortage in attendance of a student in a semester up to five attendances in each course. - Chairperson Dr. Kuldeep Sharma, Dean, Faculty of Life Sciences, University of Jammu, Chairman-IEC GMCJ stressed on two important points and directed to Member Secretary to adopt in future meeting of IEC :
 - A) Forum of IEC should encourage the clinical research for one and all and should become an important academic forum.
 - B) The minutes of previous meeting should always be tabled in every subsequent IEC meeting. However he along with all other members approved the previous minutes of meetings

- Total 144 studies were provisionally approved while 27 studies were asked to make necessary modification on recommendation of IEC members and subsequently the status shall be changed to provisionally approved provided they could furnish the valid reason and justification while denying the recommendation or submit the fresh proposal accepting the modification.
- Dr. Annil Mahajan, Prof and HOD Medicine, Physician IEC GMCJ requested the chairman and principal Dean GMCJ to take up the matter already resolved in previous IEC meeting, regarding allotment of their topic in first 6 months of post graduation by research scholar. The assurance was given by Principal/Dean and chairman IEC that they will actively intervene in this matter with competent authority.
- It was appraised by member secretary to all the members and chairman IEC that tendency has been seen by some of the research scholars undertaking independent clinical studies to submit multiple research proposals at a time. The point raised by the member secretary that it is not feasible and possible to take multiple studies at a time and complete the same within 6 months time span that is valid time of approval. It was resolved by IEC members and chairperson that under independent category, no research scholar should be permitted in more than 2 studies at a time henceforth further such investigators be identified and communicated for the choice of two studies in case they have proposed more than two research proposals.
 - It was also observed that many research proposals demand affiliation with other departments and hence it was stressed by the IEC that respective guide and investigator should be encouraged to make relevant choices accordingly.

To consider the qualification for admission to P.G. Diploma in Bioinformatics (One Year) under UGC Innovative Program.

NOTE:

The UGC had sanctioned P.G. Diploma in Bioinformatics after Post Graduation (one year) under Innovative Programme at the School of Biotechnology, University of Jammu for a period of five (05) years i.e. 01.04.2013 to 31.03.2018 vide letter No. F.14-11/2013 (Inno / ASIST) dated: 30-03-2013.

As per the program scheme approved by the University, the eligibility for admission to P.G. Diploma in Bioinformatics is Post-graduate in any branch of Life Science & Allied areas / Chemistry / Computer Science and the student has to pass the entrance test to be conducted by the School. However later as per the directions of the competent authority, the admission to the program was made on the basis of JUET. During the last five years the school has experienced that the response of the students for the said program is not very good. The main reason to our understanding is its eligibility which needs to be modified. Since the period of this course with UGC has completed on 31.03.2018 therefore, it is proposed that the eligibility for admission to P.G. Diploma in Bioinformatics be made as "Graduate in any branch of science". The admission will be made on the basis of Jammu University Entrance Test (JUET)/ Entrance test conducted by the School. This will definitely help in getting good number of students for this program.

Hence, the matter is submitted through Departmental Affairs Committee (DAC) to the Academic Council.

To consider the adoption of Statutes/Scheme/Syllabi Governing the Post-Graduate Engineering Programmes (Master of Technology-M.Tech).

NOTE:

In pursuance of approval granted by All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) vide communication No. North-West/1-3512935634/2018/ EOA dated 04-April-2018 in favour of Model Institute of Engineering & Technology (MIET) Kot Bhalwal, Jammu, to commence M.Tech Computer Engineering Programme, the inspection of the college was conducted by the committee constituted vide order No. CDC/2018/2763-71 dated 26.07.2018 on 10th August, 2018. After recording the following observations, the committee recommended grant of affiliation to the M.Tech. Computer Engineering from the Academic Session 2019-20 with an intake of 18 seats:

- > The college is required to recruit separate faculty for the proposed M.Tech. Computer Engineering Programme. The college should recruit senior faculty i.e. Professor & Associate Professor for the programme.
- > The college is advised to approach the requisite offices in the University so that Statutes, Scheme and syllabi of the course is notified in time.
- The college is advised to approach the Fee Fixation committee/Dept. of Higher education for notification of the fee for the course.

The aforesaid recommendations met the approval of the Competent Authority and accordingly affiliation was granted in favour of the college vide this office letter No. CDC/2018/3482-83 dated 30.08.2018. A copy of the letter dated 30.08.2018 is enclosed herewith as annexure 'A'.

The Dean Faculty of Engineering was also requested vide this office letter No. CDC/2018/3452-55 dated 28.08.2018 to expedite the finalization of the Statutes, Scheme and syllabi for the said course so that the same can be commenced from the Academic Session 2019-20 and a copy of the same was endorsed to the Assistant Registrar (Academic Affairs) for similar action. A copy of the letter dated 28.08.2018 is annexed herewith as annexure 'B'.

Accordingly, the concerned section placed draft Statutes, Scheme & Syllabi of M.Tech. in Computer Engineering before the Board of Studies in Faculty of Engineering which was held in the committee room of GCET on 24.01.2019 at 10.00 a.m. and the same stands approved and recommended by the BOS of Computer Engineering. Draft Statutes are annexed herewith at annexure 'C'.

STATUTES GOVERNING THE POST-GRADUATE ENGINEERING PROGRAMMES (MASTER OF TECHNOLOGY - M. Tech)

1. INTRODUCTION

There shall be a Master of Technology programme in relevant branch of Engineering and Technology hereinafter referred to as M.Tech, in Affiliated Colleges of the University of Jammu under the ambit of the Faculty of Engineering.

2. DURATION

- 2.1 The course for the degree of M.Tech programme shall be spread over a period of two years comprising semesters I, II, III and IV. The maximum period of completion of the programme including dissertation work shall not exceed four academic years. The programme of instruction will consist of Core courses, Elective courses and Dissertation work.
- 2.2 In any case the candidate has to clear all the prescribed courses of M.Tech within a maximum period of four years to be calculated from the date he/she is admitted to the M. Tech program.

3. ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS & ADMISSION CRITERIA

The candidate applying for admission to M.Tech programme must be either: i) B.E/B.Tech (in relevant branch of engineering and technology) with 50% of the marks or equivalent CGPA.

ii) MCA/M.Sc (Computer Science/IT/Electronics/Mathematics/Statistics/Physics) in case of M.Tech in Computer Science and Engineering, Electronics and Communication Engineering and allied domains, with 50% of the marks or equivalent CGPA.

All the above-mentioned degrees should be from Colleges/Universities recognized by UGC/AICTE. A relaxation of 5% in marks in the qualifying examination shall be given to the candidates belonging to the categories of Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) as mentioned in Statue-5. This relaxation shall not be applicable to private affiliated colleges.

3.2 All the candidates seeking admission to M.Tech should have a valid GATE score. The GATE score of three years will be valid. The admission shall be strictly based on the score obtained in GATE.

In the absence of having adequate number of candidates with valid GATE score, the University of Jammu shall conduct its own written/online test for admission to the said programme. Admission shall be based strictly on the merit obtained in the entrance test. In case two or more candidate score the same score in written entrance test, their inter-semerit shall be determined on the basis of percentage of marks in the qualifying examination. In case of a tie even at the qualifying examination, the decision for

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admission shall be taken by the admission committee headed by Dean Engineering, University of Jammu on the basis of other academic credentials. The decision of the committee shall be final and binding on the candidate.

- 3.5 A candidate appearing in the final year of the qualifying examination in April/May of immediately preceding academic session can also apply for admission to **M.Tech** only if he/she furnishes documentary evidence in support of his/her having passed the qualifying examination in full on or before 31st of July, or such other date as may be approved by the Dean Academic Affairs, University of Jammu; failing which his/her candidature shall automatically stand cancelled and the seat thus becoming available shall be filled in accordance with the merit.
- 3.6. The candidate should be a permanent resident of J&K state.

4 NUMBER OF SEATS

Open Merit Seats: Total number of seats, including the categories, in M.Tech in all the Engineering Institutions Affiliated to University of Jammu shall be as per approval from the All India Council for Technical Education AICTE (the statutory body governing technical education in the country), State Govt. and University of Jammu.

Implementation of reservation rules is advised to be implemented as per J&K, Reservation rules of 2005 notified under SRO 294.

Fifteen percent (15%) management quota for private colleges shall be applicable as per norms in vogue for other PG programs.

The total of open merit and reserved category or management seats should not exceed the total sanctioned intake in any case.

Note: Reservation shall not be applicable to private colleges as per norms in vogue.

5. ENTRANCE TEST

The entrance test, if required, shall be designed and conducted by the University of Jammu. However, all the pre-conduct work of the Entrance Examination such as receipt of online application form, counseling of candidates, issuance of admit cards of Entrance Examination, to the candidates, date of test, model test paper, syllabus and other details shall be notified and managed by the University of Jammu.

ADMISSION PROCESS

The University of Jammu shall issue notifications published in print and digital media calling for applications for admission to the M.Tech program, specifying the eligibility conditions etc.

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- 6.2 Application form prescribed by the University of Jammu complete in all respects, and accompanied with the attested photocopies of the certificates specified there in must reach the University of Jammu within the dates notified for the purpose.
- 6.3 Every candidate seeking admissions to **M.Tech.** shall be required to pay application fee (Non-refundable) as may be determined by the University from time to time. Remittance of all fees shall be made through Bank Draft/digital payments.
- 6.4 An applicant, who seeks admission under reserved categories as mentioned in statute 4, must attach with Application Form an attested photocopy of the appropriate certificate issued by the competent authority and an affidavit (Annexure) from first class magistrate, failing which is candidature under the reserved category shall not be considered. The certificate of being beneficiary under the categories reserved is advised to be implemented as per J&K, Reservation rules of 2005 notified under SRO 294 It shall not be considered if it is not in conformity with the latest order, issued for the purpose, by the J&K State Government. Applicants to private affiliated colleges are not required to submit category-related certificates.
- 6.5 The allotment of seats shall be made by the Admissions Committee constituted by the University of Jammu on the basis of valid GATE scores obtained by the applicant candidates. Valid GATE scores of three years (current year and 2 preceding years) shall be used to resolve and determine inter se merit of candidates having same GATE score; following criterion will be used in the stated order of preference:

i) Candidates having valid GATE score in second preceding year will be given preference over candidate having score of first preceding year and current year. Similarly GATE score obtained in first preceding year will be given preference over score in the current year of admission.

ii) If years of GATE score are also same then the candidate with more experience will be given preference.

iii) In highly unlikely event of equality of their experience i.e. same duration of experience the candidate who was born earlier as compared to other candidates with the will be given preference.

The committee may hold up to two rounds of counseling to admit GATE qualified candidates.

6.6 For the remaining seats, the allotment shall be made by the Admissions Committee constituted by the University of Jammu on the basis of the rank list published based on score in the University of Jammu Entrance Test and availability of seats. The admission shall be on the basis of counseling and the committee shall hold up to two rounds of counseling and thereafter allot admission to candidates, to all available seats in various affiliated degree colleges.

6.7 During counseling, the candidate is required to appear in person along with relevant documents.

6.8 In case some seats are still left vacant, the case shall be referred to Dean Academics, University of Jammu for filling the vacant seats.

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- 6.9 At the time of admission the candidate has to submit the provisional certificate in original or affidavit if the gap between the last qualifying examination and the date of admission is more than one year.
- 6.10 Names of candidates selected for admission shall be notified from time to time on the Notice Board or the specified website by the University of Jammu. The selection may be cancelled, and no complaint shall be entertained in case of non-compliance of instruction(s) through such Admission Notices..
- 6.11 Admission fee and other charges payable by each student shall be such as approved by the competent authority/University of Jammu from time to time.
- 6.12 Notwithstanding anything contained above, a candidate, who has any grievance regarding application of Statutes governing admission, shall have the right to file an appeal in the prescribed Performa on payment of fee prescribed for this purpose by the date as may be notified by the University of Jammu for the purpose. Such an appeal may be considered by the Appellate Committee based on its merit. It shall be obligatory for the appealing candidate to appear in person before the Appellate committee. The decision of the Appellate Committee shall be final and binding.
- 6.13 The Admission Committee constituted by the University of Jammu shall have authority to refuse or cancel admission of a candidate who either:
 - i. fails to produce any requisite certificate in original within the time prescribed; or
 - ii. suppresses/conceals any relevant information, provides information in his/her application which is found incorrect or produces a certificate which is not genuine; or
 - iii. fails to pay the fees and other charges within the time prescribed.
- 6.14 No certificate/document/affidavit or its attested photocopy shall be accepted after the expiry of the date prescribed for submission of Application Forms for admission with late fee.

7. MINIMUM ATTENDANCE

- 7.1 Regular examination of each semester shall be open to a candidate who fulfils the statutory conditions and his/her name is recommended by the Principal of the concerned College to the Controller of Examination.
- 7.2 However, the Controller of Examinations or Officer Incharge will issue Roll No./Permission Slip/Admit Card to those candidates only in favour of whom a certificate is received from the concerned Head of the Institution that the candidate has completed not less than 75% of the total lectures delivered in that semester and she/he has maintained discipline in the college.
- 7.3 Any candidate securing less than 75% attendance in 50% or more courses shall be barred from appearing in the examinations for all subjects in that semester.
- 7.4 Any candidate securing less than 75% attendance in any particular subject shall be barred from appearing in the examination for that particular subject in that semester.
- 7.5 The Principal of the concerned college shall be competent to condone shortage on genuine grounds up to 15% of the total number of class attendance in the course in each semester. The students whose attendance falls short by more than 15% or whose deficiency is not condoned by the Principal shall not be permitted to appear in the examination and shall

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have to enroll himself/herself as a regular student of the college in the subsequent year in the semester in which she/he has failed to fulfill the attendance requirement.

8. SCHEME FOR EXAMINATIONS

- 8.1 The examination for various Semesters consisting of written papers and sessionals shall be held.
- 8.2 The medium of instructions as well as examination for the Degree shall be English.
- 8.3 During the course of one academic year examination for theory papers for all the semesters i.e. one to 4 shall be held twice a year one during December/January and once during May/June each year as per academic calendar.

9. PASS PERCENTAGE

- 9.1 The minimum marks required to pass in each theory course examination of any semester shall be 40% in theory examination and sessionals separately; provided that a candidate who appears in all the courses of a semester and fails in only one course (Theory part only) by not more than 3% of the maximum marks allotted to that course shall be deemed to have passed the examination. Provided also that this concession shall not be granted in the sessionals and to a candidate who passes the theory courses of examination of a semester in parts.
- 9.2 A candidate shall be declared to have passed in a particular course, if he/she has secured 40% marks in theory and 40% marks in sessionals separately. If a candidate has secured 40% marks in theory but has failed in sessionals shall be declared to have failed in sessionals only and if a candidate has secured 40% marks in sessionals but have failed in theory shall be declared to have failed in theory only. The pass marks secured by the candidates in theory and sessionals shall be carried forward. The failure candidates will be allowed to appear in the subsequent examination/s of that course as and when is/are held.
- 9.3 A candidate shall be declared to have failed in a laboratory course if he/she secures less than 40% in a particular laboratory course. Such a candidate can clear the backlog only when such a laboratory course examination will be available.
- 9.4 The evaluation of Sessionals marks in the theory papers of all the semesters shall be based on the following distribution:

i)	Mid-Term Test	40%
ii)	Class Assignments/Seminar	40%
iii)	Continuous in-class evaluation	20%

One mid-term test shall be held in each course. However, if a candidate is unable to appear in the mid-term test conducted because of the genuine reasons may be given one more chance by the Head of the Institution on the request of the candidate.

- 9.5 The evaluation of Sessional marks in the laboratory courses shall be based on the following distribution.
 - a) Lab. Work (Continuous Assessment)
 - c) Viva-voce test

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- 9.6 There shall be Dissertation-I in third semester of 6 credits and Dissertation-II in fourth semester of 16 credits. Dissertation-II shall be evaluated by an external examiner duly appointed by the University of Jammu. The External examiner and internal examiner shall be paid an honorarium as approved by the University. The viva-voce examination shall be conducted by a committee of three examiners comprising:
 - a. External Examiner
 - b. Head of Department
 - c. Dissertation Supervisor

9.7 Assessment of courses relating to Seminars/Project work/Dissertation shall be based on:

a) ⁻	Viva-Voce	30%
b)	Presentation	30%
c)	Report	40%

The Dissertation report shall be submitted in a format approved by the concerned department/University of Jammu.

10. DETERMINATION OF DISTINCTION / DIVISION

The successful candidates of the M.Tech Degree shall be classified in the following divisions:

i)	First Division with Distinction	75% marks or above provided the

ii)	First Division	60% marks or more			
iii)	Second Division	50% marks or more but less than 60%			
iv)	Pass Class	40% marks or more but less than 50%			

11. PROMOTION TO NEXT SEMESTER AND AWARD OF DEGREE

- 11.1 Promotion from one semester to another semester i.e from 1st to 2nd semester, 2nd semester to 3rd semester and so on shall be automatic.
- 11.2 A candidate who has been enrolled for the M.Tech Course shall be admitted to the M.Tech Degree only when she/he has been declared successful in the examination of all the semesters in accordance with the above Statutes.
- 11.3 Transcript of marks for all the four semesters shall be given in a composite form on payment of such a fee as prescribed from time to time to a student who has completed the M.Tech Degree Course and has been declared successful in the Semester examination in conformity with above Statutes.
- 11.4 The rates of fee payable for admission to the examination of the 2 years M.Tech Course and rates of the remuneration for the various assignments shall be such as may be prescribed by the statutory fee fixation authority from time to time.

12. AUTHORITY TO INTERPRET STATUTES

12.1 All legal disputes related to the M. Tech programme shall be subject to the jurisdiction of Courts at Jammu

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12.2 Interpretation, if any shall be determined by, the Vice-Chancellor, University of Jammu in consultation with the Dean, Faculty of Engineering and the decision taken shall be final and binding on all concerned.







NOTE:

The Secretary, Maharshi Sandipani Rashtriya Vedavidya Pratishthan (MSRVVP), Ujjain (M.P.) vide letter No.1-8/2007/(A&F)/MSRVVP/ Recognitions/405 dated 12.12.2018 requested for Recognition of the two courses i.e. "Veda Bhushan & Veda Vibhushan" for admission in Graduate Courses in Veda/Sanskrit/Indology/ Languages /allied subjects. He has stated that:-

- 1) Maharshi Sandipani Rashtriya Vedavidya Pratishthan (MSRVVP), Ujjain is the only Central Government Institution in India dedicated to the preservation and propagation of oral tradition of Vedas. More than 90 Veda Pathashalas and 290 Guru Shishya Parampara Units are being provided with financial assistance by MSRVVP and nearly 8000 students from all over India are studying in the course of Veda Bhushan & Veda Vibhushan in these Pathashalas/GSP Units.
- 2) MSRVVP is an autonomous body of the Ministry of Human Resource Development and functioning under the Department of Higher Education. Hon'ble Minister of HRD is the Chairman of MSRVVP. It is established in the year 1987 as a registered Society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 with the objectives to preserve, propagate, conserve and develop the oral tradition of Vedas through Pathashalas, Guru-Shishya Parampar Units and other means and institutions and promotion of Vedic research.
- 3) MSRVVP has been implementing the following two sub-Schemes under the main scheme of Financial Assistance for the promotion of Indian Languages operated by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India:
 - (i) Financial Assistance to Vedic Institutions/Veda Pathashalas
 - (ii) Financial Assistance to Guru Shishya Parampara (GSP) Units-for Preservation of Oral Tradition of Vedas
- 4) MSRVVP provides admission to 'Veda Bhushan' course to those students who have passed 5th standard in formal schooling or have certificate of proficiency equivalent to 5th Standard and after 5 years of Saswara Veda Adhyayan and pass, admission in 'Veda Vibhushan' is given. These courses involve total 10 years (5 years in conventional education system + 5 years in Vedic education) and 12 years (5yrs +7 yrs) of studies respectively in the Oral Tradition of Vedas and academic achievements are on par with 10th and 12th std of formal education system and are comparable for pursuing higher education in core domain (details as per ANNEXURE).

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The Secretary has further requested for a notification in recognition of Veda Vibhushan as an entry qualification for Graduation Courses in Veda/Sanskrit/Indology/Languages/allied subjects by the University indicating Veda Vibhushan as one of the recognized entry qualifications for admission in B.A. (Sanskrit), B.A. (Hons. in Sanskrit), B.A. (Arts.), Shastri (B.A.) in various shastras, Shastri (Hons. in shastras/Vedas/Vedangas/Indology/Languages/allied subjects), Shastri (hons. in Veda/Veda Bhashyas etc.), B.A./B.Sc. in Yoga and other courses like B.Voc/B.P.Ed. etc.

It is pertinent to mention here that the matter was sent to the Convener, Board of Studies in Sanskrit for his considered opinion and he has opined as under:-

"Veda Vibhushan can be recognized as a entry point for Graduate Courses in Ved/Sanskrit/Indology/Languages/allied subjects by such steps we can save our Vedic traditions."

Hence the matter is submitted for consideration.

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As per the rules, admission to "Veda Bhushan" is given to the students who have passed 5^{th} std in formal schooling or have certificate of proficiency equivalent to 5^{th} Standard and after 5 years of Saswara Veda Adhyayan and a pass, admission in "Veda Vibhushana" is given. These courses involve total 10 years (5 years in conventional education system + 5 years in Vedic education) and 12 years (5 yrs + 7 yrs) of studies respectively in the Oral Tradition of Vedas and academic achievements are on par with 10^{th} and 12^{th} std of formal education system and are comparable for pursuing higher education in core domain. In the syllabus of these courses, though main emphasis is on Veda, other subjects like Sanskrit, English, Mathematics, Social science, environmental studies and Yoga are also included for making the students well-trained not only in Veda but also wellconversant in other modern subjects, which essential for all-round development of personality.

The syllabus of the "Veda Bhushan" & "Veda Vibhushan" is prepared by the Academic Committee of MSRVVP consisting of eminent academicians of Vedas and modern subjects nominated by Governing Council. Academic Committee is an approved committee of the Governing Council of Pratishthan. The Governing Council is the highest authority of the MSRVVP and is chaired by the Hon'ble Minister of HRD, Govt of India.

However, these Vedic students face difficulties in getting admission in various colleges and modern universities, recognized by the UGC for pursuing higher studies in core domain/Sanskrit/Vedas/Indology/Languages/allied subjects. Many Sanskrit Universities have already given recognition to "Veda Bhushan" as entry qualification for Prak-Shastri admission (+2) and "Veda Vibhushan" as entry qualification for a 3 years' degree course.

A notification in recognition of "Veda Vibhushan as an entry qualification for Graduate Courses in Veda/Sanskrit/Indology/Languages/allied subjects from your esteemed university will be highly motivating for pursuing the study of Vedas through Oral tradition, which is fast depleting.

In view of this, it is requested that your honorable self may kindly take suitable appropriate action to grant recognition by issuing a notification indicating "Veda Vibhushan" as one of the recognised entry qualifications for admission in B.A. (Sanskrit), B.A. (Hons. in Sanskrit), B.A. (Arts), Shastri (B.A.) in various shastras, Shastri (Hons. in shastras/Vedas/Vedangas/ Indology/Languages/allied.subjects), Shastri (Hons. in Veda/Veda Bhashyas etc.), BA./B.Sc. in Yoga and other courses like B. Voc/B.P.Ed. etc.

I hope your blessings and goodwill for the cause of Veda will go a long way in alleviating the hardships of the Veda students of MSRVVP in pursuing graduate/higher studies in various Indian Universities in Veda/Sanskrit/Indology/Languages/allied subjects.

A copy of the complete syllabus of Veda Bhushan & Veda Vibhushan courses of MSRVVP are enclosed for your ready reference and necessary action for recognition as entry qualifications for admission in Graduate Courses along with the copy of the notification issued by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, and other universities for ready reference.

To consider creation of Posts (Teaching and Non-Teaching) for the University Institute of Engineering & Technology, Janglote, Kathua.

NOTE:

The University Institute of Engineering and Technology (UIET), Jangalote, Kathua was established in the year 2017-18 vide Govt. order No. GS-15(Estab. Govt. Coll.) KU/2017/2851 dated 14th June 2017, No. 589-HE of 2017 dated 10-10-2017 and No. 687-HE of 2017 dated 12-12-2017 with six disciplines. Further as per letter issued by the Higher Education Department, of Jammu vide No.HE/Coll/Engg/Uni/116/2016 dated Government 12.05.2017, the University Institute of Engineering and Technology is to be run as the Constituent College of the University and further as per resolution vide 82.41 passed in 82nd meeting of the University Council held on 22.04.2017, wherein the University Institute of Engineering and Technology at Kathua Campus of the University was approved as a Constituent College of the University, within the Academic and the Administrative control of the University as is the case with the other Teaching Departments of the University.

The two programmes viz-a-viz Computer Science & Information Technology and Civil Engineering are at present being offered in the premises of the Academic Block of the Kathua Campus of the University of Jammu, at Jangalote, Kathua.

For the smooth functioning of the Academic programme (class/ laboratory work) sufficient manpower is needed in terms of both Teaching and Non-teaching staff. In view of the above, it is requested to consider creation of positions (68 posts) for the University Institute of Engineering & Technology, Janglote, Kathua (details as per Annexure-I) for successfully fulfilling its mandate of providing quality technical education to the students as envisioned at the time of its establishment.

To consider the matter regarding implementation of Resolution No. 84.33 passed in the 84th University Council held on 10.04.2018 for engagement of superannuated teachers' up to age of 70 years as per Regulation of All India Council for Technical Education in other Non-Govt. Professional colleges.

NOTE:

The matter w.r.t. request of the Chairman-cum-Managing Trustee, Institute of Management Sciences, Gurha Brahmana (Patoli), Jammu for engagement of superannuated teachers upto the age of 70 years as per Regulation of All India Council for Technical Education, was placed in the 84th meeting of University Council held on 10.04.2018 and the University Council vide Resolution No. 84.33 resolved that -

"the request of Chairman-cum-Managing Trustee, Institute of Management Sciences, Gurha Brahmana (Patoli), Akhnoor Road, Jammu for engagement of superannuated teachers upto the age of 70 years, as per Regulation of All India Council for Technical Education be approved."

There are number of professional colleges affiliated to the University of Jammu offering different courses. Each course has its respective regulatory body as under:

The aforesaid regulatory bodies mention the **age of superannuation of teachers in the non-government affiliated colleges as 70 years**, as have been mentioned in the Regulations of Medical Council of India and Indian Nursing Council. The copies of the same are placed as **Annexure-I & II**.

It also needs to be mentioned here that Statute 22.4 (ii) of the Statutes Governing Affiliation of Colleges and Other Institutions, Chapter-IV of University Calendar Vol.-I has given the age of superannuation of teacher in non-govt. affiliated colleges which reads as under:

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ii) The age of superannuation of teachers in the non-government affiliated colleges shall be as prescribed by the University/UGC from time to time.

Provided that the Management may engage superannuated employees on contractual basis up to the age of <u>sixty-seven</u> years only. However, the number of such superannuated teachers shall, in no case, exceed 30% of total Teaching Staff strength of the College.

However, the aforesaid provision doesn't extend to professional colleges governed by the regulations of their respective regulatory bodies. The University Council Resolution No. 84.33 covered only one college and could not be extended to all Professional colleges in view of the fact that the resolution was not generalized for all Professional colleges. However, all regulatory bodies specify the engagement of superannuated teacher on contractual basis up to the age of 70.

The matter was placed before the Standing Committee of the Academic Council at its meeting held on 07.02.2019 and the Standing Committee vide Resolution of Item No. 5 resolved that –

"the matter w.r.t. the engagement of superannuated teachers upto the age of 70 years in all Non-Govt. Professional Colleges affiliated to the University of Jammu on the analogy of 84th University Council Resolution No. 84.33 dated 10.04.2018, which reads as under:

"Resolved that the request of Chairman-cum-Managing Trustee, Institute of Management Sciences, Gurha Brahmana (Patoli), Akhnoor Road, Jammu, for engagement of superannuated teachers upto the age of 70 years, as per Resolution of All India Council for Technical Education."

be endorsed for placing the same in the ensuing meeting of the Academic Council."

Hence, the matter is submitted for consideration.

MEDICAL COUNCIL OF INDIA

Minimum Qualifications for Teachers in Medical Institutions Regulations, 1998 (AMENDED UPTO 8th JUNE, 2017)



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<u>SCHEDULE – I</u>

Every appointing authority before making an appointment to a teaching post in medical college or institution shall observe the following norms:

1.

All Medical teachers must possess a basic University or equivalent qualification included in any one of the Schedules to the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (102 of 1956). They must also be registered in a State Medical Register or Indian Medical Register.

The Clause 1A as under is included in terms of Notification published on 16.03.2005 in Gazette of India.

1A. "The maximum age limit upto which a person can be appointed or granted extension or re-employed in service against the posts of Teachers or Dean or Principal or Director, as the case may be, which are required to be filled up as per the norms of the Medical Council of India in any Medical College or Teaching Institution for imparting Graduate and Post-Graduate medical education, shall be 65 years."

The clause '1A' was inserted after paragraph 1, vide notification dated 16.3.2005. The last words of the paragraph i.e. "shall be 65 years.", shall be amended as under, in terms of notification dated 17.09.2010.

"shall be 70 years."

In the departments of Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, Pharmacology and 2. Microbiology, non-medical teachers may be appointed to the extent of 30% of the total number of the posts in the department. A non-medical approved medical M.Sc. qualification shall be a sufficient qualification for appointment as Lecturer in the subject concerned but for promotion to higher teaching post a candidate must possess the Ph.D. degree in the subject. The Heads of these departments must possess recognized basic university medical degree qualification or equivalent qualification. However, in the department of Biochemistry, non-medical teachers may be appointed to the extent of 50% of the total number of posts in the department. In case of the paucity of teachers in non-clinical departments relaxation upto the Head of the Department may be given by the appointing authority to the nonmedical persons if suitable medical teacher in the particular non-clinical speciality is not available for the said appointment. However, such relaxation will be made only with the prior approval of the Medical Council of India. A non-medial person cannot be appointed as Director or Principal or Dean or Medical Superintendent. In the departments of Community Medicine and Pharmacology, Lecturers in Statistics and Pharmacological Chemistry shall possess M.Sc. qualification in that particular subject from a recognized University.

In the above clause the words "The Heads of these departments must posses recognized basic university medical degree qualification or equivalent qualification" shall be substituted with the following as amended in terms of Notification published on 24.07.2009 in Gazette of India.

"Heads of the departments of pre and para clinical subjects must possess recognized basic University degree qualification i.e. MBBS or equivalent qualification".

For example the admission criteria has been enhanced for ANM, i.e., from 10^{40} to 12^{40} standard from 2012-2013 academic year and for General Nursing and Midwifery (GNM) the Admission criteria will be 10+2 with science with minimum 40% marks.

While implementing nursing programme these regulation may be implemented otherwise INC will not be able to recognize the institution/ course run by your School/College

From next year onwards the validity will be linked with the Website that is for the institution does not submit application form as desired their names will not be put on website.

To consider award of internal assessment marks to the private students of B.Ed. (two year) programme for the academic sessions 2015-17 & 2016-18.

NOTE:

The private students of B.Ed.(Two year programme) for the session/s 2015-17 & 2016-18, who had passed in the theory subject/s but were fail in internal assessment/s, were pressing hard to declare their result by awarding internal assessment marks in proportionate to the marks obtained by them in theory papers.

The University of Jammu has adopted two year semester system in B.Ed. course w.e.f the year 2015 vide notification No. F. Acd./ I/ 15/ 3964-4163 dated 08.06.2015. As per Statutes & Scheme for Two Years B.Ed. course, the guidelines for PG Semester System are applicable to the B.Ed. candidates. Relevant portion of Statute 4(II)(B) is reproduced as under:

".....However, University guidelines for PG Semester System shall be applicable to the B.Ed. candidates as well for awarding of the internals in proportionate to the mark obtained in the theory examination for the reappear or private candidates".

So far as statutes governing Master's Degree Programme (Semester System) are concerned, it is statute 22 which deals with such type of contingencies. Relevant proviso II and non-obstante clause of statute 22 of the aforesaid statutes is reproduced below:-

"Provided that the candidate who, having failed to secure minimum pass marks in the internal assessment of course/s, appears in the University examination in that course/s as a regular student and secures pass marks, be shown in the marks certificate to have failed only in the internal assessment part of that course/s. Such a candidate shall be subsequently afforded at least one chance to be assessed again in the internal assessment by the concerned Department, provided the Head of the department certifies that facilities for repeating the course are available in the Department. The result of such a candidate shall be assessed on the basis of pass marks already obtained by him in the University examination and fresh internal assessment earned by him and the same be declared alongwith the result of other candidates of the subsequent examination.

Notwithstanding, anything contained above, a candidate who fails in the internal assessment even after availing of the chance mentioned above or does not avail of the chance under the said provision to be assessed again in internal assessment and has passed in the courses of the all semester examinations except in the internal assessment in any course(s) shall be allowed to appear in the examination of the said course(s) at the subsequent examination of that semester when held by the University, as a private candidate according to the syllabi and

courses of study in vogue. In all such cases, the marks of the said course(s) shall be raised proportionately in view of internal assessment."

It is submitted that the above statute was being followed in respect of B.Ed. course of one year duration but with the introduction of two year B.Ed. course where minimum pass percentage is 40% separately in Theory and in Internal Assessment i.e. 24 marks out of 60 in Theory and 16 marks out of 40 in Internal Assessment, this statue becomes inapplicable.

In order to resolve the issue, a committee was constituted vide order No. F.Acd./I/18/10018-10023 dated 01.10.2018. The committee held its meetings on 30.10.2018 and 19.11.2018 and resolved that:-

"The private student(s) of the B.Ed. (two year course) shall be awarded marks in the Internal Assessment as proportional percentage on the basis of marks obtained in theory paper. This shall be considered only for the Academic Session 2015-17 & 2016-18.

It was further resolved that only one time exception shall be given to the students of the above mentioned Academic Session".

A copy of the minutes of the meeting is attached herewith as **Annexure-I**.

The recommendations made by the Committee are placed before the Academic Council for consideration and approval.

To consider the matter regarding the implementation of reservation for the Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) for admission to the various programmes offered in the University of Jammu as per the MHRD communication No. F.No.81-1/2019 (UI) dated 18.01.2019 and the Gazette of India dated 12.01.2019.

NOTE:

The matter regarding the implementation of reservation for the Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) for admission to the various programmes offered in the University of Jammu as per the MHRD communication No. F.No.81-1/2019 (CU) dated 18.01.2019 (Annexure-I) and the Gazette of India dated 12.01.2019 (Annexure-II), was placed before the Campus Deans in their meeting held on 06.02.2019 and it was resolved that –

"a.Sub-Committee of the following be constituted for framing the guidelines/norms w.r.t. the implementation of 10% reservation to the Economically Weaker Sections of the General Category in the University of Jammu as communicated by the UGC and the State Govt.:

- 1. Prof. Naresh Padha Convener
- 2. Prof. Neetu Andotra
- 3. Prof. Vivek Gupta
- 4. Prof. Rahul Gupta
- 5. Prof. Arvind Jasrotia
- 6. Dy. Director, DIQA

The Sub-Committee shall submit the guidelines within three working days for further deliberations by the Campus Deans and placing the same in the ensuing meeting of the Academic Council."

The Sub-Committee at its meeting held on 07.02.2019 deliberated in accordance with the provision of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act 2019 and the reference of Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment vide OM No. 20013/01/2018-BC-II dated 17th January 2019, enabling provision of reservation for the Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservation for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes, it has been decided to provide reservation in admission to educational institutions subject to maximum of 10% of the total seats in each category.

Under the said provisions, the University of Jammu proposes to incorporate the following modifications in its admission from the Academic Session 2019-20 onwards:

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1. There shall be a reservation in all the programmes/courses offered by the University for the Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) of society, who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservation for the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Socially and Economically Backward Classes etc.

- 2. The reservation would be in addition to the existing reservation and subject to a maximum of 10% of the prescribed in-take capacity in each programme/course.
- 3. These seats (EWSs) shall not be convertible i.e. if the seat/s under this category remains vacant in any programme, it shall not be converted to Open or any other Category.
- 4. The definition of Economically Weaker Sections shall be such as may be notified by the State from time to time on the basis of family income and other indicators of economic disadvantage.

The aforesaid is recommended to be reflected in the JUET Admission Brochure-2019 and also on the University Website accordingly.

The matter was placed before the Standing Committee of the Academic Council at its meeting held on 07.02.2019 and the Standing Committee vide Resolution of Item No. 7 resolved that –

"the recommendations of the Sub-Committee as constituted in the meeting of the Campus Deans held on 06.02.2019 w.r.t. the implementation of the 10% Reservation to the Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) in the various Courses/Programmes offered by the University of Jammu from the Academic Session 2019-20, be endorsed for placing the same in the ensuing meeting of the Academic Council."

Subject: Reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) for admission In Central Educational Institutions.

In accordance with the provisions of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act 2019, and the reference of Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment vide OM No. 20013/01/2018-BC-II dated 17th January 2019, enabling provision of reservation for the Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes, it has been decided to provide reservation in admission to educational institutions subject to a maximum of ten per cent of the total seats in each category. This would not apply to the minority educational institutions referred to in clause (1) of Article 30 of the Constitution of India.

2. The provision of reservations to the Economically Weaker Sections shall be in accordance with the directions contained in the OM No. 20013/01/2018-BC-II dated 17th January 2019 of the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment and shall be subject to the following:

- a) The reservations shall be provided to EWSs for admission in Central Educational Institutions, (as defined in clause (d) of section (2) of The Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006) from the academic year 2019-20 onwards.
- b) The above reservation would not be applicable to the 8 institutions of excellence, research institutions, institutions of national & strategic importance as specified in the Schedule to The Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006, as amended from time to time, and appended to this OM, and to the minority educational institutions referred to in clause (1) of article 30 of the Constitution.
- c) Every Central Educational Institution shall, with the prior approval of the appropriate authority (as defined in clause (c) of section 2 of The Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006), increase the number of seats over and above its annual permitted strength in each branch of

study or faculty so that the number of seats available, excluding those reserved for the persons belonging to the EWSs, is not less than the number of such seats available, in each category, for the academic session immediately preceding the date of the coming into force of this O.M.

d) Where, on a representation by any Central Educational Institution, the appropriate authority is satisfied that for reasons of financial, physical or academic limitations or in order to maintain the standards of education, the annual permitted strength in any branch of study or faculty of such institution cannot be increased for the academic session following the commencement of this Act, it may permit such institution to increase the annual permitted strength over a maximum period of two years beginning with the academic session following the commencement of this Act; and then, the extent of reservation for the Economically Weaker Sections shall be limited for that academic session in such manner that the number of seats made available to the Economically Weaker Sections for each academic session shall not reduce the number and the percentage of reservations provided for SC/ST/OBC categories.

e) The scheme for implementing the reservation for the EWS shall be displayed on the website of the institution as soon as possible, but no later than 31st March 2019.

The Chairman UGC, Chairman AICTE and Chairperson NCTE and the Bureau Heads of the Department of Higher Education in the Ministry of Human Resource Development responsible for management of the Institutions of National Importance are requested to ensure immediate compliance of this OM.

THE CONSTITUTION (ONE HUNDRED AND THIRD AMENDMENT) ACT, 2019

[12th January, 2019.]

An Act further to amend the Constitution of India.

Bis it enacted by Parliament in the Sixty-ninth Year of the Republic of India as follows:----

1. (1) This Act may be called the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019.

(2) It shall come into force on such date as the Central Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, appoint.

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(6) Nothing in this article or sub-clause (g) of clause (1) of article 19 or clause (2) of article 29 shall prevent the State from making,—

(a) any special provision for the advancement of any economically weaker sections of citizens other than the classes mentioned in clauses (4) and (5); and

(b) any special provision for the advancement of any economically weaker sections of citizens other than the classes mentioned in clauses (4) and (5) in so

The item with regard to the following was placed before the University Council at its meeting held on 23.10.2015:

the adoption of National Council for Teacher Education (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulations, 2014, notified by the National Council for Teacher Education vide Notification No. F.51-1/2014-NCTE(N&S) dated 28th November, 2014 pertaining to the existing Teacher Education Programmes of the University.

The University Council vide item No.79.16 resolved that -

"the adoption of National Council for Teacher Education (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulations, 2014, notified by the National Council for Teacher Education vide Notification No. F.51-1/2014-NCTE(N&S) dated 28th November, 2014 pertaining to the existing Teacher Education Programmes of the University, be confirmed.

RESOLVED further that such regulations be incorporated appropriately in the relevant Statutes/Regulations of the University and the modifications so made, in the Statute be placed in the next meeting of the University Council for approval."

In view of the above resolution, the Dean, Faculty of Education, HoD, Education and Director, Sports Education were requested vide letter No. F.Acd./I/16/5491-97 dated 21.01.2016 to take further necessary action w.r.t. incorporation of NCTE regulations appropriately in the relevant Statutes/Regulations of the B.Ed., M.Ed., B.P.Ed. and M.P.Ed. Courses.

The Dean, Faculty of Education vide letter No. PGD/Edu/16/638 dated 23.02.2016 informed that the Statutes/Regulations of the B.Ed., M.Ed., B.P.Ed. and M.P.Ed. Courses are prepared as per NCTE regulations and approved by the Competent Body and already notified by the Academic Section.

The Head, Department of Education vide letter No. PGD/EDU/17/17 dated 11.04.2017 sent the revised Statutes and Syllabus of B.Ed. & M.Ed. (CBCS & Non-CBCS) after reviewing by the Board of Studies in Teacher Education at its meeting held on 18.10.2016 and recommended the necessary amendments in the Statutes. The revised Statutes and Syllabi of the Two Year B.Ed. programme and the Two Year M.Ed. programme (CBCS & Non CBCS) were placed before the Academic Council at its meeting held on 26.05.2017 and the Academic Council vide Resolution No. 3.4.2 resolved that -

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"the matter be revisited by a Committee under the Convenership of the Dean Academic Affairs comprising the Campus Deans, HoD Education, Prof. Mubarak Singh, Director DDE and the Director CDC. The existing and the proposed Statutes be submitted by the Convener/HoD, Education in consultation with the concerned Dean and the proposed changes be marked bold for the convenience of discussion in the matter by the Committee."

In pursuance of above resolution, a Committee was constituted vide order No. F.Acd./I/17/4951-68 dated 22.06.2017 and the Head, Department of Education were requested, vide letter No. F.Acd./I/17/4022-24 dated 13.06.2017, to prepare the document as per the above resolution and send the same to the Academic Section for placing in the above Committee.

The HOD, Education vide letter No. PGD/Edu/18/897-903 dated 23.02.2018 has stated that in pursuance of University Council Resolution No. 79.16 dated 23.10.2015, the CDC constituted a Committee under the Convenership of Dean, Faculty of Education vide order No. CDC/2017/1973-79 dated 01.08.2017 to incorporate the necessary Statutes and Regulations of NCTE in the existing Statutes/Regulations of Education Programme of the University and the details of the proposed changes were discussed several times in the meeting held in the CDC and the same will be communicated to the Academic Section by the Committee for further course of action.

The Dean, Faculty of Education vide note No. DDE/SPA/18/3087 dated 25.05.2018 has submitted the draft Statutes & Scheme for the Two Year B.Ed. Programme and Two Year M.Ed. Programme after thorough discussion in the several meetings of the Committee and incorporated necessary Statutes/regulations of the NCTE in the existing Statutes/Regulations of the Teacher Education Programmes of the University.

Beside above, the Head, Department of Education vide letter No. PGD/Edu/18/1494 dated 21.08.2018 sent the Statutes of M.Ed. (CBCS) and M.Ed. (Non CBCS) with proposed amendments for further necessary action.

The office has two different sets of Statutes of same programmes, the matter was placed in the meeting of Board of Studies in Teacher Education held on 10.09.2018 and the Board of Studies vide Item No.2, resolved that –

"the DAA office would be requested about different versions of the Statutes of B.Ed. and M.Ed. may be referred back to the Board of Studies in Teacher Education so that only one set of Statutes could be finalized and can be tabled as an agenda in the ensuing meeting of the Academic Council of the University of Jammu."

The Dean, Faculty of Education has recorded her remarks on the above said minutes of the Board of Studies in Teacher Education which read as under:

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"with regard to item No.2, I have to say that a Committee was constituted vide order No. CDC/2017/1973-79 dated 01.08.2017 to incorporate the necessary Statutes and Regulations of NCTE in the existing Statutes/Regulations of Education Programmes of the University. There is no need to refer back the draft Statutes to BOS in Tr. Education which have been prepared by the duly constituted Committee and already submitted to the Vice-Chancellor vide No. DDE/SPA/18/3087 dated 25.05.2018."

The minutes of the Board of Studies in Teacher Education dated 10.09.2018 is placed as Annexure-I.

In view of the above facts and circumstances, as per the above referred resolution of the Board of Studies in Teacher Education held on 10.09.2018, the different versions of the Statutes of B.Ed. and M.Ed. were referred to the Board of Studies so that only one set of Statutes could be finalized. The Board of Studies in Teacher Education at its meeting held on 07.01.2019 while considering the matter of amended statutes of B.Ed., the members were briefed about two sets of statutes available in the University and need to evolve single set of comprehensive statutes of B.Ed. The members thoroughly discussed and deliberated upon all the issues related to B.Ed. statutes and the necessary amendments were moved in respect of the Internship programme in 3rd and 4th semester of B.Ed. The necessary changes in the components of the Teaching Practice of 4th semester were also introduced and approved. The necessary amendments were also moved and accepted in context of the qualifications of the teaching faculty. Likewise changes in the Project work were introduced in term of experimental learning which were approved by DAC.

Further the members took up the M.Ed. statutes in respect of CBCS and Non CBCS and the necessary amendments and changes brought in to it were discussed and after deliberations, the necessary changes were incorporated.

The minutes of the Board of Studies in Teacher Education dated 07.01.2019 are placed as Annexure-II, the Statutes & Scheme for the Two Year B.Ed. Course is placed as Annexure-III, Statutes & Scheme for the Two Year M.Ed. Programme (CBCS) is placed as Annexure-IV and Statutes & Scheme for the Two Year M.Ed. The Examination is a continuous process and the formative and summative techniques would be used to complete the process of examinations. The Semester End or the term end examination would be held in the following components

a. Theory Papers

b. Teaching Practice cum Internship.

5.I Theory examination.

The Theory comprises of the Core subjects and the Content cum Methodology papers irrespective of the weight age of the credits for it. The theory examination will be held as per the University Date-sheet at the designated centers and students need to write the examination as per rules and regulations of the University. The Unit-IV in all the theory subjects deal with the sessional work which is to be a part of internship. The Sessional work shall constitute the content for theory examination as well as for the internship. But for the theory examination. the entire sessional work is also to figure for the written theoretical examination. Candidates will require a minimal of 40% marks for passing the theory examination.

5.11 Internship cum Teaching Practice Examination

It is continuous assessment of the student teacher performance in the classroom and outside the classrooms. In the school internship, 4 weeks are to be devoted to school based related activities and 16 weeks are to be devoted to practice teaching and the other activities of the school like all the routine work of the full teacher. The trainees are expected to work as full time teachers during this period. The internship taken up in schools would be fully recorded in the form of Reflective Journal (RJ). The Reflective Journal is to be a compendium of all the activities of the student teacher which he/she would perform/enact in the classroom in the practicing school/on a field trip/performing any community service etc. In case of the non sufficient time in completing the internship , the internship activities including the teaching practice may be taken up in the Inter semester break. RJ is to be properly recorded and preserved by the student teacher. All the activities performed need to be authenticated by the Principal and the Teacher In charge of the Group/ individual student. All the activities performed during the Internship program from Semester 1 to Semester IV would be documented in the Reflective Journal. The Activities which can't be documented in writing must be photographed through timed videography (CD/DVD evidence to be appended). 6. SCHEME OF EVALUATION

6.1A Theory External Evaluation

The evaluation of the student teachers would be done continuously throughout stay in the college. The theory papers would be evaluated out of 60 marks through external evaluators as per the guidelines and value points set forth.

6.1 B. Internal Assessment

Internal assessment marks are 40. The 5 marks are to be awarded for the attendance percentage which student teacher has earned in proportion to the number of the classes attended for each subject. The attendance record is to be maintained on daily basis and the Academic Coordination Committee should observe its objectivity as well as malpractices be notified. The other 5 marks are to objectively awarded on the basis of the observations which a teacher educator would do for each student as per procedure. Besides to it, 20 marks are meant for the Internals. The internals includes test/ tests and the Tutorial/ seminar/on spot questions etc. It is based upon 1mark answer, which is to be written as a very short answer. The test activity can be held twice in one semester with 5 marks each. The teacher educator will maintain the feedback exhibiting the performance. There is chance to improve upon the score.

The other 10 marks will constitute the activity of semester/tutorial/on spot question etc. activity (involving student teachers application of knowledge and learning of the curriculum). Both of the activities are to be constructed objectively and should be in accordance of the syllabus in hand. The record properly documented is to be shown to each student by the college, if asked, by the ACC for the Inspection purposes or by the student teacher. The proper justification of its value points is to be done very clearly.

6.I.C Internship cum Teaching Practice

a. Internship cum teaching Practice at the end of every semester, is to be evaluated on the value

points. At the end of the IVth semester, the internship of all the four semesters is to be reflected through Reflective Journal. The Unit-IV in all the subjects for the theory deal with the sessional work which also constitutes internship.

b. The subjects offered by the students at the graduation and post graduation levels will form the basis for the selection of both teaching subject course at B,Ed level.

c. The teaching Practice will take place in two semesters (3rd &4th) for the two subjects selected by the student teacher in the IInd Semester. The teacher In charge / teacher Educator would observe the lesson on the Five point scale (Very Satisfactory, Satisfactory, Average, Needs Amendments, Re-teaching)

The Teacher In charge is to be reasonably satisfied of the performance of the trainee before inducting the trainee for on spot lesson delivery.

IV. The teacher In charge shall document the change reflected in the trainee on the attainment of the pedagogical skill from the time of the initiation into the classroom to on spot delivery of the lesson.

V. The Teacher In charge is /are to ensure the veracity of the content to be delivered as well as the optimal performance of the trainee.

VI. Likewise in the Fourth Semester ,the trainee would deliver teaching practice(A component in the school Internship) 40 lessons for the two subjects each and 20 lessons (10 on spot lesson + 8 observations + 2 criticism lessons) is to be delivered separately in each of the

two subjects selected) for Standards VI to IX of the recognized elementary / secondary/ higher secondary schools. The trainee would showcase all the practical work(all components of the school Internship) through the Reflective Journal as suggested above.

VII. The Teacher In-charge would profusely document in the RJ the evidence and the quantity of change in the teaching style and the methods used, as witnessed in every trainee under his / her mentor ship since the last two sessions (since 3rd semester to 4th semester). The examination for the degree of B. Ed. shall consist of division of marks, credit and allotment of time to each component of syllabus as shown in Table No.1

Credits

The term 'Credit' refers to the weightage given to a course, usually in relation to the instructional hours assigned to it. For the Foundational Courses and teaching courses, four hours theory course per week is given four credits and two hours theory course per week is given two credits. The total minimum credits, required for completing a B.Ed. programme is 90credits. The details of credits for individual components and individual courses are given in the schema given above in the table No I.

Observe 30 directed lessons (15 in first semester and 15 in second semesters) as per the schedule to be given by other candidates/ peers and demonstration lessons by the teachers of the institution for honing the self-skills in teaching. The Teacher In charge is to be reasonably satisfied of the performance of the trainee before inducting the trainee for on spot lesson delivery.

Duties & Responsibilities of the External Examiner:

Every student teacher has to have 200 working days in the entire course work spread in four semesters. The percentage of attendance earned by the student teacher will be awarded in set procedure which as follows:

Above 95% and above = 5

Less than 95 and above 90% = 4

Less than 90% and above 85% = 3

Less than 85% and equal or above to 80% = 2

10. External Examination / Observation

The entire internship done in a semester is to be evaluated through a committee of senior faculty of college mediated by the two External Examiners from the University / college/ other University.

The External Examiners are to be the person of the discipline of education and has a minimum of 10 years experience of teaching in B.Ed / M.Ed / MA(Education). The college faculty should have a minimum of 4 years of teaching experience in the college. The focus is to award the student objectively and as per the value points. The External examiners will be paid TA/DA and the remuneration as per the University rules.

11. Experimental School

Every College of Education must have an attached school which would serve the needs of the student teachers pursuing degree in B.Ed.

12. Practicing Schools

Every College of Education must have minimum 15 identified practicing schools. The list of these schools should be submitted to office of Convener /Dean Faculty of Education. The student teachers should have practice teaching of 20 weeks in these identified schools.

13. Qualifications of Faculty and Staff

13.1 Principal: The Principal should possess the

The Teacher In-charge would profusely document in the RJ the evidence and the quantity of change in the teaching style and the methods used, as witnessed in every trainee under his / her mentor ship since the last two sessions (since 3rd semester to 4th semester).

The examination for the degree of B. Ed. shall consist of division of marks, credit and allotment of time to each component of syllabus as shown in Table No.1

Credits

The term 'Credit' refers to the weightage given to a course, usually in relation to the instructional hours assigned to it. For the Foundational Courses and teaching courses, four hours theory course per week is given four credits and two hours theory course per week is given two credits. The details of credits for individual components and individual courses are given in the schema given above in the table No I.

9. External Examiners

The Vice Chancellor by the powers vested in him would appoint Two External Examiners for the Semester end evaluation of the components (Internship/Project work/Teaching Practice /Internal Assessment) undertaken in the Semester as well as to be the members of ACC.

- (ii) Notifications No. F.Acd/I/17/11022-11122 dated 10.10.2017 and Notification No. F.Acd./I/18/1391-1450 dated 03.05.2018 prescribing 2nd re-evaluation of answer scripts of under-graduate courses.

NOTE:

An item, being item No. 114.07 with regard to admission of the students to the Under-Graduate courses under the Choice Based Credit System after the declaration of re-evaluation result was placed before the Standing Committee of the Academic Council held on 07.02.2019 and Standing Committee, inter alia, resolved that:

"The matter be referred back to the Controller of Examinations for re-drafting the item in consonance with the existing Statutes and the same is requested to be submitted to the Academic Section upto Feb. 12, 2019 for approval by the Vice-Chancellor so that the same be placed in the ensuing meeting of the Academic Council.

A copy of letter No. F.Acd/I/19/13426 3427 dated 08.02.2019 is enclosed as Annexure I.

In this regard it is submitted that an item was placed before the Academic Council at its meeting held on 23.11.2017 and the Academic Council vide Resolution on item No. 3.3.2 resolved that:-

- (a) The decision with regard to the admission of students declared eligible after re-evaluation result be taken on case to case basis and the existing Statutes be not deviated.
- (b) The Statute of re-evaluation as recommended for modification be considered to the extent that after the declaration of any Under Graduate result, 10 days be given to the students to apply for Photostat copy of the answer scripts under University Statutes by depositing the requisite prescribed fee. After the answer script/s is/are received by the candidate, he/she shall apply for re-evaluation within 10 days with normal fee and thereafter with late fee presently in vogue. The candidate/s who will not take the Photostat copy of the answer script shall not be eligible to apply for re-evaluation.

The above Resolution of the Academic Council was placed before the Syndicate at its meeting held on 20.10.2018 and the Syndicate vide its resolution on item No. 114.07 resolved that:-

"the matter be endorsed with the slight modification as given below in the decision taken vide point (a) & (b) in Academic Council held on 23.11.2017:

(a) Students who are declared eligible after re-evaluation shall be considered for admission.

(b) The Statute of re-evaluation as recommended for modification be considered to the extent that after the declaration of any Under Graduate result, 10 days be given to the students to apply for Photostat copy of the answer scripts under University Statutes by depositing the requisite prescribed fee. After the answer script/s is/are received by the candidate, he/she shall apply for reevaluation within 10 days with normal fee and thereafter with late fee presently in vogue. The candidate/s who will not take the Photostat copy of the answer script shall also be eligible to apply for re-evaluation".

A careful examination of the above resolution reveals that it is not in consonance with the existing statute, inasmuch as, dates of admission of students alongwith academic calendar are clearly mentioned in the statutes governing Three Year B.A/B.Sc./B.Sc. Home Science/B.Com (General)/BBA/BCA/B.Com. Honours/B.A. English Honours Programmes under the Choice Based Credit System. Cases of such candidates who will acquire eligibility for admission to the Under-Graduate courses after re-evaluation shall be considered by the University on case to case basis because as per the law declared in catena of decisions by the Constitutional Courts, no admission can be granted after mid-term session. It may be mentioned here that Reevaluation is a concession i.e. a legal right and not a fundamental right, as such, candidates becoming eligible for admission after re-evaluation have no right to seek admission after the cut off dates fixed for the purpose.

It may also be mentioned here that Statute 9 of the Re-evaluation statute provides that Re-evaluation will be done by an independent examiner. The score obtained in re-evaluation shall be final. However, the University has issued notification No.F.Acd./I/17/11022-11122 dated 10.10.2017, which reads as under:

- (a) In present and similar cases of Under-Graduate Courses where the subject-wise re-evaluation awards are almost 100% or more in variation for 10% of the total copies in that subject, a third evaluation shall be followed and the average of the nearest of the two of the three evaluations shall be awarded. In cases where the difference is equal in all the three evaluations, average of the three shall be awarded.
- (b) The evaluation shall be made mandatory for at least 300 copies in a academic year for all the faculty members.
- (c) The limit of 300 copies shall also be mandatory for contractual faculty of the Colleges/University and in the absence of the same they shall not be eligible for appointment as contractual faculty in the following year.

The aforesaid notification, however, stands partially modified vide notification No. F. Acd./I/18/1391-1450 dated 03.05.2018 authorizing that:

- (i) 3rd re-evaluation shall not be taken up for those candidates whose status is unchanged from fail in 1st re-evaluation; and
- (ii) 10% rider shall be qualified with the condition that minimum of 25 copies in that subject are there in 10% calculation.

Copies of both these notifications are enclosed herewith as Annexure II & III.

Both these notifications attract substantive statutes of re-evaluation i.e. Statutes 9(a)(i) which unequivocally states that "**Re-evaluation will be done by an independent examiner. The score obtained in re-evaluation shall be final**" and Statute 18 which says that "... the result of re-evaluation whether favourable or unfavourable shall be binding on the candidate". These statutes are binding not only for the students but also for the University. Therefore, 2^{nd} re-evaluation promulgated under these notifications is a clear deviation from the existing statutes.

It may be mentioned here that the University undertakes re-evaluation on the request of an examinee on payment of prescribed fee. After re-evaluation of answer scripts, processing the answer script *suo moto* for further evaluation i.e. 2nd Re-evaluation is in violation of Statutes 9(a)(i) and 18 which are mandatory in nature.

In view of above, it is proposed that the Academic Council may – (i) revisit Resolution of the Syndicate passed on item No. 114.07 at its meeting held on 20.10.2018 and allow considering the cases of candidates becoming eligible for admission after re-evaluation on case to case basis and (ii) consider withdrawing notification No. F.Acd./I/17/11022-11122 dated 10.10.2017 and No.F. Acd./I/18/1391-1450 dated 03.05.2018 which prescribe 2^{nd} re-evaluation, being in contravention of existing re-evaluation statutes highlighted above.

To consider the application of Ms. Juhie Mohan, Department of Sociology registered under the supervision of Prof. Abha Chauhan.

NOTE:

Ms. Juhie Mohan was registered for Ph.D in Sociology under Prof. Abha Chauhan w.e.f 09.05.2012 as a whole-time research scholar. She joined as Radio Jockey (R.J) in Reliance Broadcast Network Limited w.e.f 15.07.2013. The candidate applied for conversion from whole-time to part-time and the case was placed in the BORS in Social Science meeting held on 18.11.2014 alongwith the cases of other two candidates Ms. Asha Rani & Ms. Usha Sharma who joined the job in Govt. Sector (as Social worker in GMC Jammu) and their cases were approved by the BORS except that of Ms. Juhie Mohan (as the case of Ms. Juhie Mohan was not covered under statute 8 of the statutes governing Ph.D course). The case of Ms. Juhie Mohan was also discussed in reference to the letter received from the DRS No. RA/15/11400-402, dated 15.12.2015 mentioning the resolution of the Campus Deans Meeting held on 03.11.2015 according to which conversion of the Ph.D Status of the Ms. Juhie Mohan from whole time to part time was not allowed 'under the statutes in vogue'. An application alongwith a copy of a letter from the then Assistant Registrar (R&A) No. RA/RTI/15/2616 dated 30.07.2015 was submitted by Ms. Juhie Mohan on 23.12.2015.

Ms. Juhie Mohan filed a Writ petition titled "Juhie Mohan Vs. University of Jammu and Ors." Vide OWP No. 859/2016 & MP No. 1/2016 in the High Court of Jammu & Kashmir at Jammu. On 03.06.2016, the High Court passed an interim Order -

Meanwhile, subject to objections from the other side and till next date before the Bench, respondent No. 2 is directed to reconsider the claim of the petitioner afresh on the same analogy as has been done in the case of similarly situated persons for change of Ph.D status of the petitioner from whole time to part time, during the notice perios, if there is no legal impediment.

Note – Respondents No. 2 is the Board of Research Studies (BORS), through Vice-Chancellor, University of Jammu, Jammu.

In pursuance of the interim order of the Hon'ble High Court dated 04.06.2016, a special meeting of the Board of Research Studies was convened on 02.11.2016 at 11:00 A.M. in the office chambers of the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, University of Jammu.

The BORS after threadbare discussions, resolved that earlier decision of BORS held on 18.11.2014 vide Item No. 12 and Resolution of the Campus Deans in their meeting held on 03.11.2015 be upheld as per the rule position under Statute 8 (a) (iv) of the Statutes governing Ph.D Degree.

The said writ petition has been disposed of by the Hon'ble High Court on 26.07.2017 with the following direction:-

"9. In the light of the position as noted above, the decision on Agenda Item No.12 dated 18th November, 2014 qua the petitioner and the decision of the Dean Research Studies dated 08.11.2016 is held to be legally unsustainable being in derogation of the Statutes applicable. Accordingly, the decision on Agenda Item no. 12 dated 18th November, 2014 qua the petitioner and decision of Dean Research Studies dated 08.11.2016 are quashed. The respondent are directed to pass fresh orders in accordance with the observations made above and on the same reasoning on the basis of which the case of the other two Ph.D whole time scholars i.e Ms. Usha Sharma and Ms. Asha Rani was considered. Needful be done within a period of six month from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order."

In compliance to the Hon'ble High Court's Direction, the case of the petitioner was placed before the Campus Deans in its meeting held on 23.08.2017.

After revisiting the whole case the fresh order was passed and case was again rejected.

The case was placed before Board of Research Studies in Social Sciences at its meeting held on 11.02.2019 and it was resolved that the same be deliberated in the meeting of all Heads of the Department of the faculty of Social Science under the convenership of Dean Research Studies.

The said committee met on 14.02.2019 and resolved as under:

"that the order passed by the Hon'ble High Court about the case of Ms. Juhie Mohan, Ph.D Scholar of Department of Sociology for conversion from whole time to part time as requested by the candidate be adhered to as a special case. The matter be referred to the Academic Council for further action."

Hence, the matter is submitted for consideration.

Every research proposal shall be submitted after scanning it for plagiarism and obtaining certificate from Dhanvantri Library. The research proposals not complying shall not be considered for funding.

IB PAPER PRESENTATION AT NATIONAL/INTERNATIONAL (WITHIN INDIA) CONFERENCE / SEMINAR / WORKSHOP

- IB.1 The request for the partial funding to meet the expenditure to attend the conference/workshop/seminar (within India) should be submitted (Form-I) at least ONE MONTH before the actual date of the event.
- IB.2 Partial funding shall be provided to meet travel and local hospitality of the teaching faculty member/s invited to national/international (within India) conference/seminar, workshop to present lead / session/ keynote paper or chair the technical session. The young faculty member/s (Assistant and Associate Professors) shall be given preference.
- IB.3 Partial funding shall be provided to meet travel (train only) and local hospitality of subject expert invited by the Department/Centre/Campus to deliver specialized lecture in the interest of the development of research. The DAC shall recommend the name of subject expert along with his/her curriculum vitae and proper justification for the consideration of partial funding.
- IB.4 Partial funding shall be provided to meet travel/ registration fee to attend international/ national conference/ symposium/ workshop (within India) by bonafide research scholars pursuing Ph.D. and whose abstract has been accepted for presentation and are not receiving fellowship/scholarship from any national/ state funding agency.
- IB.4 The TA/DA shall be paid as per the entitlement and financial norms of the University of Jammu.

II. FINANCIAL RESOURCES

- II.1 The University of Jammu shall earmark a substantial grant from out of the RUSA/State Grants that shall serve as seed money to institute the fund.
- II.2 The overhead grant deducted by the Grant Section of the University from out of the

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grants of various research projects sponsored by national/state funding agencies shall be credited to fund to be utilized for the said purpose.

- III.1 The research project proposal shall be submitted by the Principal Investigator by submitting Project Submission Form (Form-II) completed in all form to the office of Dean, Research Studies.
- III.2 The research proposals should be recommended and forwarded through the office of concerned HoD / Director/ Rector along with the minutes of DRC. The DRC should hold an in house power point presentation of the research proposal to suggest improvements, if any, to the PI/Co-PI before forwarding the same.
- III.3 The DRC shall certify that the concerned department/ centre/ campus would provide the basic minimum infrastructure facilities (including space, water, electricity, laboratory, library facility, etc.) to PI/Co-PI. In case of request for extra space by PI/Co-PI, the concerned HoD/Director/Rector must state if it is possible to provide or not.
- III.4 The research proposal submitted by PI/Co-PI should be cleared by concerned DRC of the Department/Centre/Campus within <u>FIVE WORKING DAYS</u> (from the date of submission of project proposal) and transmitted further to the office of Dean, Research Studies.
- III.5 The PI/Co-PI shall not demand for any teaching posts (Professor/Associate Professor/Assistant Professor), research/technical/ menial staff (Research Associates/ Research Assistants, JRF,SRF, Post-Doctoral, technical assistants, field assistants, laboratory assistants, laboratory bearers, helpers, etc.) in the research proposal.

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IV SANCTION OF THE RESEARCH PROJECTS

- IV.1 The office of Dean, Research Studies shall scrutinize all research project proposals within FIFTEEN WORKING DAYS of the last date of the receipt of proposals.
- IV.2 The research proposals shall be scrutinized by Central Research Project Scrutiny Committee (CRPSC) that shall comprise Dean, Research Studies (Convenor), Dean of Concerned Faculty, Head / Convenor of concerned Department/ Centre/ Campus, One senior member of teaching faculty (preferably a Professor) of concerned department and One Associate Professor of the concerned department (by rotation). If necessary, the PI/Co-PI shall be co-opted (only for his/her particular research project proposal).
- IV.3 The office of Dean, Research Studies shall issue the sanction letter giving details of the grant sanctioned with break-up under various budget heads to the PI/Co-PI with information to concerned HoD/Director/Rector and Finance Section within <u>ONE</u> MONTH (30 days) of the recommendation by CRPSC.
- IV.4 The office of Finance Wing shall release first installment of research fund to the tune of 50% of the total grant sanctioned to PI/Co-PI within <u>TEN DAYS</u> from the date of receipt of sanction letter from the office of Dean, Research Studies.
- IV.5 The PI/Co-PI shall, on the release of the first installment of grant, immediately (within <u>TWO DAYS</u> of the release of grant) submit the Project Initiation Form (Form –III) to the office of Dean, Research Studies and Finance Section. The date mentioned in the Project Initiation Form shall be treated as actual date for the initiation of the said project and shall be treated final.
- IV.6 The CRPSC shall be the final authority to decide about the number of research projects to be sanctioned subject to the availability of funds and quality of the project proposal/s.

V PROJECT MONITORING

- V.1 The research project shall be monitored by the Departmental Research Project Monitoring Committee (DRPMC) every six months of the commencement of the research project.
- V.2 The DRPMC shall comprise of Dean of concerned faculty (Convener), Head of the concerned department, one senior professor of the concerned department, one senior professor (by rotation).

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- V.3 The PI/Co-PI shall submit six monthly project progress report (Form-IV) to the office of concerned HoD, within ONE WEEK (07 days) of the completion of six month.
- V.4 The DRPMC shall hold the six monthly presentation (power point) in the concerned department within next SEVEN DAYS of the submission of the report. The PI/Co-PI shall make a PPT presentation of at least ONE HOUR (60 minutes) before the DPRMC.
- V.5 The presentation shall be open for all members of faculty, research scholars and students. The concerned HoD shall notify the date, time and venue of presentation beforehand to the office of Dean, Research Studies and send invitation to other departments of the concerned faculty in advance.
- V.6 Each member of DRPMC shall submit his/her remarks on the progress of the research project separately to the concerned Dean of the Faculty in a sealed cover. The suggestions, if any, for improvement of the research work shall be communicated to concerned HoD with a copy to PI/Co-PI by the concerned Dean within FOUR DAYS of the power point presentation.
- V.7 The concerned Dean shall submit his overall comments alongwith the comments of other members of DRPMC to the office of Dean, Research Studies within FOUR DAYS of the presentation.
- V.8 The office of Dean, Research Studies holds the right to withdraw grant-in-aid to PI/Co-PI at any stage of the research project, in case the PI/Co-PI research work is not found satisfactory and/or any unethical practices are noticed.

VI OPERATION OF PROJECTS

- VI. 1 All purchases shall be supervised and handled by DPC of concerned department/campus/ centre. The PI/Co-PI shall be co-opted member of DPC for the purpose of purchase under the project. All purchases shall be in accordance to the financial code laid down by University of Jammu from time to time. The copy of same can be requested from JR(Finance).
 - VI.2 The period spent by the PI/ Co-PI on field work or collaborative work in another Laboratory relating to research work of the project (in India) should be treated on duty (provided this does not affect the teaching obligation) and will need the approval of the Vice Chancellor and on recommendation by the concerned Head of Department and Dean, Academic Affairs.

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- VI.3 The PI/Co-PI shall submit the statement of expenditure and utilization certificate (copy of which can be requested from the office of Finance) of the project at the close of each financial year to the Finance Branch without fail as per the deadlines prescribed by Finance Section from time to time. A copy of the same should be sent to the office of Dean, Research Studies and concerned HoD.
- VI. 4 Cost of advertisements in newspaper/s for procurement of minor equipments shall be met out of budget head "Contingency". The re-appropriation of grant under various budgetary heads can be made in consultation with the Finance Section with intimation to Dean, Research Studies and concerned HoD.
- VI.5 Expenses to meet local and domestic travel (other than field), registration fee towards participation of PI, Co-PI in Conferences/Symposia are permissible. Visits to other laboratories (in India) for discussions in collaborative research-work is subject to prior approval of DAA and VC.
- VI.6 Expenses to meet filing of Indian or USA or global patents or PCTs as per rules in consultation with Finance Office and after getting prior approval of Vice Chancellor.
- VI.7 Life membership or annual membership of the academic societies related to the activities of the project is not reimbursable.
- Note: In view of the exigencies that may arise during the work in the project, which are not covered under the above provisions, the PI/Co-PI may in consultation with finance Officer and with prior approval of Vice Chancellor, meet such expenditure as may be necessary for the smooth functioning of the Project.

VII MAINTAINENCE OF STOCK REGISTERS

- VII. 1 Each project should have separate stock register for assets, accession, consumable and nonconsumable articles.
- VII.2 Separate account should be opened for each article purchase on separate page with full particulars unless the transactions in respect of articles are small in number, in which case a page may be utilized for recording receipt and issue for more than one article provided the accounts in respect of different articles are not mixed up on that page.
- VII.3 All entries in the stock book should be initiated by the Project-in-charge.

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- VII.4 Physical verification of stock should be conducted at least once in a year by the concerned HoD; the result thereof should be reported to the Finance Officer.
- VII.5 Equipments purchased specifically for each project will be the property of the University on the termination of the project.

VIII CLOSURE OF THE RESEARCH PROJECT

Closure of the project should be done within three months of the completion of the project. The final technical (Form-V) and fiscal report should be prepared by the PI in accordance and submitted to the office of Dean, Research Studies with a copy to Finance Branch and concerned HoD. The PI/Co-PI shall make power point presentation of the research project, before the final submission of report, in the concerned DRPMC. The PI/Co-PI must ensure that at least one research paper from out of the research project work is published/ accepted for publication in a peer reviewed journal with impact factor. Documentary evidence to this effect must accompany the final report.

Notes:

- 1. Faculty member shall be allowed to work as a PI/Co-PI only up to the age of superannuation.
- 2. In case of any pending advances and subsequent transactions under the project, the Co-PI /s will be responsible after the superannuation of PI.
- 3. The PI should stop signing all the financial documents at least six months before the due date of his/her superannuation in order to facilitate issuance of <u>No Dues</u> <u>Certificates to him/her by the university</u>.

To consider the recommendations of DAC Deptt. of Geology regarding bye-laws for starting Gold Medal for Excellence in Geology in the name of Prof. C.L Munshi.

NOTE:

The Head, Deptt. of Geology forwarded the recommendations of the DAC on the request made by Mrs. Subasha Munshi regarding institution of Gold Medal in the name of Prof. C.L Munshi. A committee was constituted to discuss the contribution of Prof. C.L Munshi Ex. HOD, Geology. The committee met on 11.07.2014 and recommended the institution of endowment in the form of Gold Medal in the name of Prof. C.L Munshi to be awarded to a candidate scoring highest marks in M.Sc (Tech.) Applied Geology with effect from the year 2017 onwards. Mrs. Munshi submitted the Bye-Laws for the proposed endowment to Head, Department of Geology.

The Head Deptt. of Geology discussed the Bye-Laws proposed by Mrs. Subasha Munshi w/o Late Prof. C.L Munshi for starting Gold Medal for Excellence in Geology in the name of Prof. C.L Munshi with the Departmental Affairs Committee of the Department of Geology. The DAC endorsed the same with some minor modifications. The Bye-Laws proposed by the DAC are as under:-

- 1. The Department of Geology will notify the candidate scoring highest marks in M.Sc.(Applied Geology) from our University in a particular Academic year.
- 2. In case there is a tie in Marks between more than one student, the student who has the best record of Extra Curricular activity/ Social Service, will be awarded the Gold Medal.
- 3. Such a Candidate will be awarded the Dr. C.L Munshi memorial Gold Medal as a tribute to Prof. C.L Munshi, an Eminent Geologist and former Head of the Department of Geology, University of Jammu.
- 4. For this purpose, an endowment fund of Rs. 15 lakhs will be deposited by his trustee (Mrs. Subasha Munshi, herein referred to as the Trustee) with the J&K Bank, University Branch.
- 5. The Gold Medal will be of 10 mgs. The expenditure incurred on its purchase will be met out of the annual interest accruing from the amount deposited with the University.

To consider the amendments in Statutes governing Master of Philosophy and Doctor of Philosophy.

NOTE:

A Committee comprising of Prof. Rajni Dhingra (Convener), Prof. Arvind Jasrotia, Prof. Satya Pal, Prof. Veena Koul and Dr. Sumita Sharma (Member Secretary) was constituted to modify the existing Statutes in light of the UGC-MSP(2016) in the month of July, 2017. The Committee after deliberations made necessary amendment in the Statutes. After that proposed amendments were placed before the Campus Deans. The amended Regulations and Statutes governing Master of Philosophy and Doctor of Philosophy are placed alongside as **Annexure**.

Hence, the amended Statutes are submitted to the Academic Council for deliberations.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE PROCEDURE OF ADMISSION TO M.Phil/Ph.D PROGRAMME

exempted category i.e. *M.Phil with entrance*

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exempted category i.e. M.Phil with entrance

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test (regular mode), UGC-CSIR JRF (National Testing Authority), NET/SET/(GATE with 80 percentile score) and Teacher fellowship holder, the number of vacancies and specializations in each Department for Ph.D will be communicated by the Head of the Department concerned to the office of Dean Research Studies for the purposes of Combined Entrance Test on or before 15th June every year.

3. Every applicant seeking admission to Ph.D Programme (except those with M.Phil from University of Jammu. JRF (qualified) or those who have qualified NET/SET/SLET/(GATE with 80 percentile score), Teacher fellowship holder and M.Phil with entrance test from other Universities (Regular mode) shall have to undergo entrance test. However, such exempted candidates as mentioned above will have to apply for the enrolment as per the notification of the Department and shall have to complete other requirements for pursuing the said course. Enrolment of such candidates may take place twice in year, once before the entrance test and once before the ensuing of second semester.

The order of preference for grant of admission to Ph.D programme shall be as under:

- M.Phil. (Freshers) i)
- ii) JRF (if the number of candidates is more than the number of seats, then the merit will be determined on the basis of the marks secured at the Master Degree level).
- iii) Master Degree with NET/SLET/SET

test (regular mode), UGC-NET (including JRF)/ UGC-CSIR-NET (including JRF) /SLET/SET/GATE and Teacher fellowship holder, the number of vacancies and specializations in each Department for Ph.D will be communicated by the Head of the Department concerned to the office of Dean Research Studies for the purpose of Combined Entrance Test as per the notified Research Calendar.(UGC- MSP- 2016 5.1).

3. Every applicant seeking admission to Ph.D Programme (except those with M.Phil from University of Jammu, UGC-NET (including JRF)/ UGC-CSIR-NET (including JRF) /SLET/SET/GATE, Teacher fellowship holder and M.Phil with entrance test (regular mode) from other Universities, shall have to undergo entrance test. However, such exempted candidates as mentioned above will have to apply for the enrolment as per the notification of the Dean Research Studies and shall have to complete other requirements for pursuing the said course. Enrolment of such candidates shall take place before the entrance test only.

The order of preference for grant of admission to M.Phil/Ph.D programme shall be as under:

- M.Phil. (Freshers) i) applicable for Ph.D. only
- JRF (if the number of candidates is ii) more than the number of seats, then the merit will be determined on the basis of the marks secured at the Master Degree level).

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(if the number of candidates is more than the number of seats, then the merit will be determined on the basis of the marks secured at the Master Degree level).

Note:

The candidates who have discontinued studies after their M.Phil programme and are desirous to be admitted to the Ph.D programme shall be given the last preference.

- 4. The admission for Ph.D Programme for the exempted category of students will be finalized and communicated to the office of DRS on or before June 1st every year.
- 5. (a) Each Department through DRC shall devise its independent syllabi for Combined Entrance Test which shall be made available to all the desirous eligible candidates on the day of submitting applications.
 - (b) The paper shall have the following components:
 - i. Research Aptitude Component - 50 marks
 - ii. Academic Component 50 marks

(as per Post-Graduate Syllabi of the University of Jammu)

iii) Master Degree with NET/SLET/SET/GATE/Teacher fellowship holder (if the number of candidates is more than the number of seats, then the merit will be determined on the basis of the marks secured at the Master Degree level).

Note:

The candidates who have discontinued studies after their M.Phil programme for lack of Ph D seats and are desirous to be admitted to the Ph.D programme shall be given the last preference. However the candidates admitted in same session shall be treated at par.

If the number of candidates under exempted category seats is more than 5 times the number of seats, the Department concerned, can conduct Entrance test for the exempted category seats as well. (ADDED, and it has been done on case to case basis) Separate entrance test as per *MSP 5.1*

- 4. The admission for Ph.D Programme for the exempted category students will be finalized and communicated to the office of DRS as per the notified Research Calendar.
- 5. (a) Each Department through DRC shall devise its independent syllabi for Combined Entrance Test which shall be made available to all the desirous eligible candidates on the day of submitting the applications.
 - (b) The paper shall have the following components:-
 - Research Aptitude Component
 /Methodology 50
 marks
 - ii. Academic Component 50 marks

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Research Aptitude questions shall be of descriptive nature and there shall be eight questions in this section. Every candidate shall attempt five questions out of the given eight questions. Each question shall carry 10 marks and the candidate shall answer every question in about 300 words. The section shall cover all the areas/specialization in а particular discipline as recommended by the Departmental Research Committee. The objectives of the M.Phil programme shall be to provide advanced specialized knowledge in a particular area and initiation in research. It shall also be considered as a Pre-Ph.D Degree. Its components shall be course work as well as providing advanced training in interdisciplinary studies as well as opportunity for undertaking research and where necessary) would also include a course in a research methodology. 3. Candidates for admission to the M.Phil programme shall have a Master's degree or a professional degree declared equivalent to the Master's degree by the corresponding statutory regulatory body, with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed) or an equivalent degree from a foreign educational Institution accredited by an Assessment and Accreditation Agency which is approved, recognized or authorized by an authority, established or incorporated under a law in its home country or any other statutory authority authority in the metal is the communicated by the Head of the Department concerned as per the notified research calendar.

These exempted candidates will be admitted alongwith those candidates who have cleared the Combined

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POLITICAL SCIENCE: A candidate seekina admission to the programme must have passed/appeared in the final year of bachelor degree examination with Political Science as a subject. Total 90% seats shall be open for the students who have completed graduation with Political Science as a subject. However, 05% seats shall be open to the students who have completed graduation with Social Science subject without Political Science. The remaining 05% seats shall be open to those students who have completed graduation with Non-Social Science but with Science subjects (Natural Science, Engineering, Commerce, Medicine, and other).

SOCIOLOGY: A candidate to be eligible for admission to M.A. Sociology must have passed/appeared in the qualifying examination in Sociology. A candidate who has passed the qualifying examination not with Sociology shall also be eligible for admission to M.A. Sociology provided that;

- a) A candidate who has passed/appeared in the qualifying examination not with Sociology but with any of the following subjects: namely Anthropology, Economics, Political Science, History, Psychology, Education, Social Work and Philosophy securing atleast 55% of the aggregate marks provided that a number of such candidate/s admitted to the course shall not exceed 20% of the total number of open merit seats.
- b) A candidate who has passed/appeared B.Com/ BBA/ B.Sc/B.Sc Agriculture/B.Sc Home Science/ LL.B (Professional) examination securing 60% of the aggregate marks shall also be eligible provided that a number of such candidate/s admitted to the course shall not exceed 20% of the total number of open merit seats.

POLITICAL SCIENCE: A candidate seeking admission in M.A Programme must have passed/appeared in the final year of Bachelor Degree examination with Political Science as a subject or B.A. Honours Political Science. Other than this, nobody is eligible for Admission in M.A Political Science.

SOCIOLOGY: A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed / appeared in the qualifying examination in Sociology. A candidate who has passed the qualifying examination not with Sociology shall also be eligible for admission to M.A. Sociology provided that;

- a) A candidate who has passed /appeared the qualifying examination not with Sociology but with any of the Social Science subject securing atleast 55% of the aggregate marks provided that a number of such candidate/s admitted to the course shall be 20% of the total number of open merit seats.
- b) A candidate who has passed / appeared B.Com/ B.B.A./ B.Sc./ B.Sc. Agriculture/ B.Sc. Home Science/L.L.B (Professional) Examination securing 60% of the aggregate marks shall also be eligible provided that a number of such candidate/s admitted to the course shall be 20% of the total number of open merit seats.

To consider the adoption of the Admission Policy as recommended by the JUET-2019 Sub-Committee and endorsed by the JUET-21019 Core Committee for admission to various academic programmes for the session 2019-20.

NOTE:

Based on the Guiding Principles which were followed for effecting Admissions to the various Programmes of the University of Jammu in the Academic Session 2018-19, the JUET-2019 Sub-Committee proposed the following Admission Policy for JUET-2019 which was further endorsed by the JUET-2019 Core Committee headed by the Vice-Chancellor:

<u>ADMISSION POLICY/General Guidelines for Admissions after the declaration of JUET Result:</u>

- i) Any candidate who has not appeared in JUET is not eligible for Admission.
- ii) Any candidate who has not filled in the Online Application after the declaration of the result of JUET is not eligible for Admission.
- iii) Any candidate who has not applied for Self Finance Seat at the time of the filling up of the Online Application alongwith the requisite fee is not eligible for admission under the Self Finance Seat. The mode of filling of Self-Finance seats be dealt as per Statute 9 governing admission to Master Degree, Bachelor Degree (LL.B (3/ 5 years), B.Lib.I.Sc. & B.P.Ed), Diploma Programmes of study in the Teaching Departments of the University of Jammu, Jammu/Offsite Campuses/ Affiliated Colleges.
- iv) Any candidate who has not submitted the requisite Reserved Category Certificate as required during the notified dates of Admission shall not be considered for admission under that category. As such, any candidate submitting an Under Process Certificate has not to be considered for admission.
- v) Any candidate who has not submitted his/her certificates for admission in any Achievement Category within the prescribed time is not eligible for admission in that Achievement Category.
- vi) Any candidate who is higher in merit than the ones who have been admitted and could not seek admission/ attend counselling for one or the other reason, he/she may be admitted against the vacant seat/s, if otherwise eligible. <u>The merit / inter-se-merit in such cases be adhered to and all the</u> <u>eligible candidates irrespective of filing an Appeal be given an opportunity</u> for admission in order of merit.
- vii) The seats in the reserved categories, if still remain unfilled, even after exhausting the complete list in that particular category, the same may be converted into Open/General Category seats and be offered to the candidates in order of merit. (As per Statute 6 (B)- Explanation (iii) of Admission Brochure, JUET-2019).
- viii) The Supernumerary Seat/s cannot be converted into the Open/ General Category seats even if they remain vacant.

- ix) In the event of no candidate being available in the 1st Preference and after the list of the candidates in the 1st Preference is completely exhausted in a particular programme/course, it is only then that the candidates who are seeking admission in the 2nd preference be considered strictly in order of merit and if otherwise eligible.
- x) <u>Department</u>, where seats are allotted in the 2nd Preference, the concerned <u>Head/Director of the Department will furnish a Certificate in the Office of</u> the Dean Academic Affairs, stating that the entire list of the applicants desirous of admission in that Department in the 1st Preference has been exhausted and, therefore, the eligible candidates now in order of merit in the 2nd Preference, are being considered.

xi) The candidates who are admitted after the commencement of the Class work of the 1st Semester shall have to makeup for the lectures / practicals etc. on their own.

xii) After the completion of the entire admission process if the seats are still vacant then the Departments/Nodal Departments will do the Counselling and ensure that all Admission related matters of the Departments/Offsite Campuses/ Affiliated Colleges with respect to those students who have appeared in JUET; have already filled in the Online Application Form; have already submitted all the Documents as required in time and who were because of one or the other reason not able to present themselves / seek admission on the date/s as prescribed/ notified by the University/ respective Departments and who were/are in merit and are otherwise eligible are addressed <u>subject to the availability of seat/s</u> as per the schedule Notified by the University. <u>No admission shall be made thereafter under any circumstances.</u>
