

	<u>INTRODUCTORY REMARKS</u>
	<p>At the outset, the Dean Academic Affairs welcomed all the members and the Vice-Chancellor to the meeting of the Academic Council. Prof Naresh Padha, in his address sought the cooperation of the University fraternity for taking forward the academic and research of the University for further improvement of the rank of University in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF).</p> <p>The Vice-Chancellor at the outset welcomed all the members present in the house and in the introductory remarks, the Vice-Chancellor expressed his thanks to the Hon'ble Chancellor for his faith while giving an opportunity to serve as Vice-Chancellor of this prestigious Institution.</p> <p>The Vice-Chancellor also expressed his gratitude to the Hon'ble Chancellor for his continuous support and guidance to the University of Jammu.</p> <p>The Vice-Chancellor in his maiden Academic Council meeting exhorted upon the University fraternity to use all modes of technology, which enables the University to fasten its admission/registration/examination and result declaration in time. He impressed upon the Director, Centre for IT enabled Services and Management to extend all kinds of help to various wings/departments of the University so that University could come up to the expectations of its students.</p> <p>The Vice-Chancellor also exhorted that the Academic Council holds an imminent position, being the highest academic body of the University and the University is known for its academics, research and extracurricular activities.</p> <p>The Vice-Chancellor congratulated the University fraternity, faculty, officers, non-teaching employees, scholars and students for achieving the milestone of 56th position in NIRF ranking by improving its rank by 10 places and all credits goes to them. The Vice-</p> <p>All HoDs/Director, Centre for IT/Controller of Examinations, University of Jammu were requested to take further necessary action as per the resolution vide letter No. F.Acd./I/22/3867-3926 dated 22.08.2022.</p>

	<p>Chancellor urged upon that we must strive for achieving a position within the 10 top educational institutions of the country for which we must have to work hard to make this dream come true. He further appreciated the efforts of the Director, DIQA and Directorate of Internal Quality Assurance for compiling the data from the Departments for the NIRF report and urged the Departments to cooperate with DIQA office for future also.</p> <p>The Vice-Chancellor also congratulated the University Institute of Engineering & Technology (UIET), University of Jammu, Kathua for getting accredited by AICTE.</p> <p>He also expressed gratitude to Dean Academic Affairs and Prof. Renu Nanda, Convener, NEP Cell and her team, who came out with Template of "Curriculum framework for the Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) as per the National Education Policy 2020" and urged that the University must be ready with the new curriculum for the Four Year Under Graduate Programme as per NEP-2020 from the Academic Session 2022-2023 onwards. It was further stressed that the syllabus of P.G. 



To confirm the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor in having authorized the conduct of examinations of MDP 2nd Semester internally, as one time exception for the session 2021-22 only, in relaxation of Statute 47.2 (d) of the Statutes governing Choice Based Credit System for Master's Degree Programme.

NOTE:

As per clause (iv)(d) of Statute 47.2 titled 'Assessment and Examination' of the Statutes governing Choice Based Credit System for Master's Degree Programme, the examination of 2nd Semester shall be conducted externally and question papers be set and assessed by external examiners. These examinations shall be conducted by the Controller of Examinations, University of Jammu. This clause was effective from 2019. The relevant clause is reproduced below:

47.2 (iv) ASSESSMENT AND EXAMINATION:

- d) *In case of at least 50% of the total number of core courses offered in different programmes across the disciplines (i.e. courses that are offered in the 2nd Semester and for the professional courses also in the 3rd and/or 4th semester as the case may be), the assessment of the theoretical component towards the end of the semester shall be undertaken by external examiners from other Universities, who shall be appointed by the competent authority out of the approved panel. In such courses, the question papers shall be set as well as assessed by external examiners.*

These Examinations shall be conducted by the Controller of Examinations of the University.

However, in case of non-availability of external evaluator/paper setters, the Controller of Examinations may appoint the evaluator/paper setters in consultation with the Convener, Board of Studies concerned.

It is submitted that as per the directive issued to conduct MDP 2nd Semester (CBCS) externally, the Question Papers were set externally in all the disciplines. However at the time of moderation a majority of the papers (more than 75%) were declared by the conveners as 'not following the specific instructions'. At that time the paper setting was done internally and exams conducted as such. 2020 and 2021 being COVID years the process was again undertaken internally. For 2022 the MDP 2nd Semester (CBCS) was to be undertaken externally and conducted by Controller Wing. The C.A. to C.E. section already had the Question Papers (one or two sets leftover from 2019 Examination). However as per instructions solicited from Hon'ble Vice Chancellor by Controller of Examinations, those papers were not be used and fresh external panel of paper setters to be sought from Conveners for conduct of examination. As such the process got delayed and then further delayed due to strike of JUTA. Therefore an exemption for the conduct of their examination internally was sought for 2022, so that the process and the consequent result not be delayed further.

In view of the above facts and circumstances, the Vice-Chancellor, in anticipation of the approval of the Competent Bodies, authorized the conduct of examinations of MDP 2nd Semester internally, as one time exception for the session 2021-22 only, in relaxation of Statute 47.2 (d) of the Statutes governing Choice Based Credit System for Master's Degree Programme.

Accordingly, a notification to this effect was issued vide No. F.Acd./I/22/8453-8502 dated 17.10.2022 (Annexure).

NOTE:

The matter with regard to implementation of National Education Policy 2020 at Undergraduate level for Four Year Under Graduate Programme under the Choice Based Credit System in the Govt. Degree Colleges affiliated with the University of Jammu from the Academic Session 2022-2023 onwards was approved by the Academic Council at its meeting held on 18.07.2022 vide Resolution No. 3.73-2.

In order to frame the Statutes/Scheme of the Four Year Under Graduate Programme as per NEP-2020, a Committee was constituted vide order No. F.Acd./II/22/2576-2590 dated 25.07.2022. After threadbare discussions in a series of meetings held on 07.09.2022, 03.10.2022 and 18.10.2022, the Committee members unanimously resolved that the draft Statutes be recommended for the adoption w.e.f. Academic Session 2022-23 onwards.

On the aforementioned recommendations of the Committee the Vice-Chancellor, in anticipation of the approval of the Competent Bodies, authorized adoption of the Statutes Governing Four Years Under Graduate Programmes (FYUGP) as per National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 from the Academic Session 2022-23 onwards. A notification to this effect was issued vide No. F.Acd./I/22/9072-9131 dated 07.11.2022 (Annexure-I).

The Principals of various Degree Colleges affiliated to the University of Jammu requested to resolve their problems faced during the admission process in respect of Statutes and the issues and queries were discussed in a meeting of the Committee on 21.11.2022. After threadbare discussion, some modifications were made in the Statutes Governing Four Years Under Graduate Programmes (FYUGP) as per National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. Accordingly, a notification to supersession of earlier notification No. F.Acd./I/22/9072-9131 dated 07.11.2022 was issued vide No. F.Acd./I/22/10083-10142 dated 23.11.2022 (Annexure-II) and the Statutes Governing Four Years Under Graduate Programmes (FYUGP) as per National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 is placed as Annexure-III.



STATUTES GOVERNING FOUR YEARS UNDER GRADUATE PROGRAMMES (FYUGP) AS PER NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY (NEP) 2020

1. PREAMBLE

The government of India has notified National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 on July 29, 2020 based on Dr. Kasturirangan committee's report. The objective is to have holistic and multidisciplinary under-graduate education to produce employable graduates with integrated personality.

The University of Jammu in sync with the academic and administrative reforms recommended in NEP 2020 has designed a Curriculum Framework for Undergraduate Programmes in semester mode under various disciplines from the Academic Session 2022-23. The thrust of NEP under Choice based Credit System (CBCS) is on continuous learning and evaluation, interdisciplinary study and accumulation of course credits. It aims at making the academic programs student oriented, flexible, interdisciplinary and relevant to the times. The students will have ample freedom to select the electives that suit their interest, aptitude and needs. The student is provided abundant opportunity during the programme of study to accumulate credits by opting for Major Courses (MJ), Minor Courses (MI), Multidisciplinary Courses (MD), Ability Enhancement Courses (AE), Skill Enhancement Courses (SE), Value Added Courses (VA) under various disciplines. Students will choose major, minor, multidisciplinary and other courses at the time of their admission. This system aims to strengthen the academic potential of the student, as it provides flexibility in the choice of courses offered beyond the framework of the respective disciplines of study.

The following four years under graduate programmes (FYUGP) structures have been designed in the disciplines: Science, Arts and Humanities, Social and Behavioural Sciences, Commerce, Management and Computer Applications.

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- a) Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.)
 - b) Bachelor of Arts and Humanities (B.A.)
 - c) Bachelor of Social and Behavioural Sciences (B.A.)
 - d) Bachelor of Commerce (B. Com.)
 - e) Bachelor of Management (BBA)
 - f) Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA)
- (i) Students will have the option to exit after one year with a certificate, two years with award of the diploma and after three years with the award of the bachelor degree. Successful completion of the four years programme will lead to award of the bachelor degree (honours/research) in a particular subject. Continuation of the undergraduate programmes for the fourth year in colleges and offsite campuses is optional.
 - (ii) The present post-graduate programmes in subjects will be restructured into one-year master's degree programmes for honours/research degree holders and two years master's degree programmes for the three years bachelor's degree holders.

2. TITLE

These regulations shall be called "Statutes Governing Four Years Undergraduate Programmes (FYUGP) with Multiple Entry and Exit Options in the Faculties of Science, Arts and Humanities, Social and Behavioral Sciences, Commerce, Management (BBA) and Computer Applications (BCA) under National Education Policy (NEP) 2020" for the university of Jammu, colleges affiliated to university of Jammu and offsite campuses of university of Jammu with effect from the academic year 2022-23.

3. SCOPE AND APPLICATIONS

- (i) The undergraduate academic programmes governed by these statutes shall be of four years duration (Annexure-I) with multiple entry and exit options with appropriate Certifications/Diplomas/Degrees namely,
 - (a) Bachelor's Certificate in a Discipline upon the successful completion of the First Year (Two Semesters).

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- (b) **Bachelor's Diploma** in a Discipline upon the successful completion of the Second Year (Four Semesters).
- (c) **Bachelor's Degree** in a Discipline at the successful completion of the Third Year (Six Semesters).
- (d) **Bachelor's Degree (Honours/Research)** in a Discipline at the successful completion of the Four years (Eight Semesters).
- (ii) Eligibility, qualifications, admission procedure and fee structure for each programme of study shall be approved by the Academic Council, University of Jammu.
- (iii) The students who exit with certification, diploma and three years bachelor degree shall be eligible to re-enter in the programme to complete the next levels.
- (iv) Major subject in a discipline is an area in which student graduates for 3 years bachelor degree or 4 years bachelor degree with honours/research. A student has to opt minor course other than major available in the college/offsite campus from any discipline. However, student/s can swap between minor and major at the start of 3rd semester only if vacancy/s available after following procedure laid down for the purpose. The colleges/nodal departments of the university shall notify the vacancy/s which are to be filled in order of merit out of the applicants in 3rd semester.
- (v) These regulations shall apply to all undergraduate programs offered by the university of Jammu, its offsite campuses and colleges affiliated to university of Jammu with effect from the academic year 2022-23.
- (vi) These regulations shall not apply to distance education programmes, BBA (Hotel management) and BA LLB (5 years) programmes of university of Jammu.

4. DEFINITIONS

- (i) **MAJOR COURSE (MJ):** A major course as discipline specific core course is the field in which a student focuses during the course of his/her degree.
- (ii) **MINOR COURSE (MI):** A minor course can be opted from any discipline.




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- (iii) **MULTIDISCIPLINARY COURSES FROM OTHER DISCIPLINES (FOUNDATION COURSES) (MD):** A multi- disciplinary course is an option to explore disciplines of interest beyond the choices students make in major courses.
- (iv) **ABILITY ENHANCEMENT COURSES (AE):** These are generic skill courses aimed to enhance skills in communication, language, mathematical ability.
- (v) **SKILL ENHANCEMENT COURSES (SE):** Skill enhancement courses are aimed to promote skills pertaining to a particular field of study. The purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability/ self-employment.
- (vi) **VALUE ADDED COURSES (VA):** Value added interdisciplinary courses are to enhance the standard of the students beyond specified academic curriculum.
- (vii) **SUMMER INTERNSHIP:** Summer internship is a programme to develop professional ability through an appropriate training.
- (viii) **RESEARCH PROJECT/DISSERTATION:** Project work is a course involving application of knowledge in solving/ analyzing/exploring a real-life situation/difficult problems/data analysis etc.
- (ix) **CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS):** It is a flexible system of learning that focuses from teacher centric to student centric education and permits students to choose course from a wide range of courses, adopt an interdisciplinary approach in learning, make best use of the expertise of available faculty.
- (x) **PROGRAMME:** 'Programme' means a course of study and examination leading to the award of a certificate/diploma/degree in a subject.
- (xi) **COURSE:** "Course" refers to a paper having specified credits which is a component of a programme in a subject. The courses define the learning objectives and learning outcomes. A course may be designed to comprise lectures/tutorials/laboratory work/field work/outreach activities/project work/ dissertation work/ summer internship/vocational training/map work etc. or a combination of some of these.

(xii) **ACADEMIC WEEK:** "Academic Week" is a unit of five/six working days during which distribution of work is organized as six to eight contact hours on each day. Each semester shall consist of at least 15 weeks of study with 90 working days (excluding the time spent for the conduct of final examination of each semester).

(xiii) **CREDIT:** Credit is the weightage given to each course of study. It is the numerical value assigned to a course according to the relative importance of the contents and the contact hours required to teach the prescribed syllabi of the programme.

As per prescribed UGC standards: 1 credit = 15 hours of lectures

The instructional days as worked out by the UGC for one academic year are 180 days i.e. 90 days per semester.

Mechanism for Computation of Work-load:

The following mechanism shall be adopted for computation of work-load:

- (a) 1 Credit = 1 Theory period of one hour duration/week/semester;
- (b) 1 Credit = 1 Tutorial period of one hour duration/week/semester;
- (c) 1 Credit = 1 Practical period of two hours duration/week/semester;
- (d) 1 Credit = Internship of 1 week/semester.

(xiv) **DISCIPLINE:** This refers faculty viz science, arts and humanities, social and behavioral sciences, commerce, management (BBA) and computer applications (BCA).

(xv) **"UNIVERSITY"** means the University of Jammu; **OFFSITE CAMPUS** means offsite campus of University of Jammu; **COLLEGE** means college affiliated to University of Jammu.

(xvi) **NATIONAL SKILLS QUALIFICATIONS FRAMEWORK:** The national skills qualifications framework (NSQF) is a competency-based framework that organises qualifications according to a series of knowledge, skills and aptitude. The NSQF levels, graded from five to eight for four years undergraduate programmes (FYUGP), are defined in terms of learning outcomes which the learner must possess regardless of whether they are obtained through formal, non-formal or informal learning.

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General education has to be synchronized/aligned with skill and vocational education as per national skills qualifications framework. The level descriptors are given in Table 1 (Annexure II) as described in UGC guidelines on national skills qualifications framework. The curriculum should be designed in a manner that at the end of year-1, year-2 and year-3, students are able to meet the level descriptors for levels 5, 6 and 7 of NSQF, respectively.

(xvii) **DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME:** The undergraduate degree should be of either a three year or four-year duration, with multiple entry and exit options within this period. The four years bachelor's programme is the preferred option as it allows the opportunity to experience the full range of holistic and multidisciplinary education with a focus on major and minor subjects as per the student's preference. The undergraduate programmes shall extend over four academic years (eight semesters). The students can exit after the completion of one academic year (two semesters) with the certificate; diploma after the study of two academic years (four semesters) and regular bachelor degree after the completion of three academic years (six semesters). A candidate who successfully completes a three-year bachelor's degree with minimum CGPA of 7.5 and wishes to pursue the fourth year of the undergraduate programme shall be allowed to continue the programme to obtain the bachelor's degree with honours/research.

(xviii) **ACADEMIC BANK OF CREDIT (ABC):** The Academic Bank of Credit, a national-level facility, will promote the flexibility of the curriculum framework and interdisciplinary/multidisciplinary academic mobility of students across the higher education institutions (HEIs) in the country with an appropriate "credit transfer" mechanism. It is a mechanism to facilitate the students to choose their own learning path to attain a degree/ diploma/certificate, working on the principle of multiple entry and exit as well as anytime, anywhere, and any level of learning. ABC will enable the integration of multiple disciplines of higher learning leading to the desired learning outcomes including increased creativity, innovation, higher-order thinking skills and critical analysis. ABC will provide significant autonomy to the students by providing an extensive choice of courses for a programme of study, flexibility in curriculum, novel and engaging course options across a number of higher education disciplines/ institutions.

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The multiple entries and exit options for students are facilitated at the undergraduate and master's levels. It would facilitate credit accumulation through the facility created by the ABC scheme in the "Academic Bank Account" opened for students across the country to transfer and consolidate their credits by undergoing courses in any eligible HEIs. The ABC allows for credit redemption by commuting the accrued credits in the Academic Bank Account maintained in the ABC to fulfil the credits requirements for awarding certificate/diploma/degree by the authorised HEIs. Upon collecting a certificate, diploma or degree, all the credits earned till then, in respect of that Certificate or degree, shall be debited and deleted from the account concerned. HEIs offering programmes with multiple entries and exit systems need to register in the ABC to enable acceptance of multidisciplinary courses, credit transfer, and credit acceptance.

The validity of credits earned will be for a maximum period of seven years or as specified by the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC). The procedure for depositing credits earned, its shelf life, the redemption of credits would be as per UGC (Establishment and Operationalization of Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) scheme in Higher Education) Regulations, 2021.

5. ADMISSION-GENERAL

- (i) A candidate to be eligible for admission to the four-years under graduate programmes as per NEP 2020 must have passed the higher secondary part-II examination (10+2 pattern) of the Jammu and Kashmir State Board of School Education, CBSE or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto.
- (ii) No candidate who wishes to enter a course of study prescribed by the university shall be admitted to colleges, offsite campuses unless he/she has passed the qualifying examination for admission to such course as prescribed under statutes.
- (iii) A candidate shall be deemed to be student of a college/offsite campus as soon as he/she has been accepted for enrolment by the respective principal/rector/director and has paid the prescribed fee for the course. The admission shall, however, be provisional unless regularized by the university.

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Provided also that payment made in shape of fee paid by a student (which is refundable in case admission or re-admission is refused) does not automatically confirm the right of admission or continuation as a student in the college or offsite campus.

- (iv) **Production of conduct certificate on admission:** A candidate, while applying for admission to a college or offsite campus, shall submit with his/her application a certificate of his/her conduct signed by the head of the institution in which he/she was studying during the year previous to his/her joining the college or offsite campus.

For candidates applying for admission after a lapse of time following passing of higher secondary part-II examination, certificate of conduct must be signed by a gazetted officer.

- (v) The principal/rector/director shall be competent to cancel admission of a student enrolled for a programme of study if he/she remains absent continuously for a period of 20 days without permission of the principal/rector/director concerned.

- (vi) Admission in the government colleges/non-government colleges affiliated to university of Jammu shall be made directly by the admission committee of the college concerned on the basis of marks obtained by the candidate in the qualifying examination.

- Provided that non-government colleges shall follow the same admission schedule and procedure/statutes as applicable for government colleges.
- For undergraduate courses in the offsite campuses, admission shall be made by the nodal departments.

- (vii) Admission criteria, preference as well as the reservation policy shall be governed according to the guidelines issued by the Jammu & Kashmir Government.

6. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTIONS AND EXAMINATION

English shall be the medium of instruction and examination in all papers/courses except in Oriental Classical, Modern Indian Languages and Music where the medium of instruction and examination shall be the language concerned.

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7. PEDAGOGY ACROSS ALL PROGRAMMES

Effective learning requires an appropriate curriculum, an apt pedagogy, continuous formative assessment and adequate student support. The intention is to contextualise curriculum through meaningful pedagogical practices, which determine learning experiences directly influencing learning outcomes. Active, cooperative, collaborative and experiential learning pedagogies are some of the examples. The use of technology in creating a learning environment that connects learners with content, peers and instructors all through the learning process, respecting learners' pace is the need of the hour.

- a) Classroom processes must encourage rigorous thinking, reading and writing, debate, discussion, peer learning and self-learning.
- b) The emphasis is on critical thinking and challenge to current subject orthodoxy and develops innovative solutions. Curricular content must be presented in ways that invite questions, not as a body of ready knowledge to be assimilated or reproduced. Faculty should be facilitators of questioning and not authorities on expertise.
- c) Classroom pedagogy should focus on the 'how' of things, i.e. applying theory and ideas. All courses, including social sciences and humanities, should design projects and practicums to enable students to get relevant hands-on experiences.
- d) Learning must be situated in the Indian context to ensure no sense of alienation from their context, country and culture.
- e) Classroom processes must address issues of inclusion and diversity since students are likely to be from diverse cultural, linguistic, socio-economic and intellectual backgrounds.
- f) Cooperative and peer-supported activities must be part of empowering students to take charge of their own learning.
- g) Faculty will have the freedom to identify and use the pedagogical approach best suited to a particular course and student.

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- h) Pedagogies like PBL (Problem/Project Based Learning) and Service Learning be brought into practice as part of the curriculum. Experiential learning in an internship with a specified number of credits is to be made mandatory.
- i) UGC suggests implementing Blended Mode (BL) as a new mode of teaching-learning in higher education. BL is not a mere mix of online and face-to-face mode, but it refers to a well-planned combination of meaningful activities in both modes. The blend demands consideration of several factors, mainly focussing on learning outcomes and the learner-centred instructional environment.

Implementing BL requires a systematic, planned instructional process. An effective teaching-learning process in a blended environment calls for understanding and skills of using appropriate pedagogies with suitable technologies. The UGC Concept Note provides guidelines for the implementation of BL.

8. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO FOUR YEARS UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES (FYUGP)

Admission to four years undergraduate programmes (FYUGP) shall be on the basis of merit and availability of seats in a particular "Major Subject". For the selection of the major subject, preference shall be given to the candidates who have studied the concerned subject at higher secondary part-II level.

9. PAYMENT OF ADMISSION FEE

The student seeking admission to the four years under graduate programmes (FYUGP) as per NEP 2020 are required to submit the prescribed application form along with requisite fee for the:

- (i) First and second semester courses at the time of seeking admission to first semester;
- (ii) Third and fourth semester courses at the time of seeking admission to the third semester;
- (iii) Fifth and sixth semester courses at the time of seeking admission to the fifth semester;
- (iv) Seventh and eighth semester courses at the time of seeking admission to the seventh

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semester.

provided the student continues his/her studies without interruption from first semester to second semester, from third semester to fourth semester, from fifth to sixth semester and from seventh to eighth semester. If there is a gap of one or more year/s, he/she will have to fill up the prescribed application form and pay the fee at the time of seeking admission. Admission to the higher semesters shall be governed by the regulations of NEP 2020 only.

10. Academic calendar

The admission of students to FYUGP in odd and even semesters shall be as per academic calendar issued by higher education department.

- a) The Vice-Chancellor may consider grant of late admission for 10 days after the expiry of last

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date of admission on payment of late fee as prescribed by the university from time to time.

- b) Further, the additional time window for the private affiliated colleges shall be 03 days after the expiry of last date as per (a) above on payment of late fee as prescribed by the university.

Note: (i) No candidate whose result of higher secondary part-II examination has been modified after re-evaluation shall be admitted to the semester-I of four years under graduate programmes (FYUGP) as per NEP-2020 after the expiry of last date of admission.

(ii) If a candidate after having completed the prescribed course of a particular semester does not appear or fails in that examination, may be permitted to appear as a private candidate in the subsequent examination of that semester.

(iii) Number of lectures in theory, tutorial/ practical shall be counted up to the date the class is dispersed for preparatory holidays, preceding the examination.

11. ADMISSION OF STUDENTS DISQUALIFIED FOR MISCONDUCT/USING UNFAIRMEANS IN EXAMINATIONS

A candidate who has been disqualified for any specific period from the University for misconduct/using un-fair means in examinations shall not be permitted to appear in any examination before the expiry of that period. He/She will also not be permitted to join any college/institution/department at any time during the period of his/her punishment.


12. ONE PROGRAMME AT A TIME

No student shall be admitted to more than one programme at a time in the college/offsite campus, unless otherwise specified in the statutes governing four years under graduate programmes (FYUGP) as per NEP 2020.

13. ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE

No student from another board or any other examining body shall be admitted to college/offsite campus without production of a certificate of eligibility issued by the university. He/She shall apply on the prescribed form to the controller of examinations

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through the principal/rector/director for a certificate of eligibility and shall pay the prescribed fee. All such applications shall be accompanied by qualification and provisional certificates in original of the qualifying examination and migration certificate from the Board/University which he/she intends to leave. Such a candidate shall furnish details of subjects which he/she took in the Board/University from which he/she is migrating and in case a student is migrating after having joined a course in another Board/University but has not completed it and seeks admission to this University for completion of the particular course and if there is a specific provision in the Statutes of the university governing that examination allowing admission during the course, shall furnish a statement of lectures attended, from the head of the institution last attended by him/her along with reasons of migration.

Provided, however, that in case a candidate is not able to produce all the documents required to get eligibility certificate, the Vice-Chancellor on the recommendation of the principal of the college/rector/director of the offsite campus (as the case may be) may authorize the provisional admission at candidate's own risk and responsibility subject to production of some documentary evidence in original of his/her having passed the last examination on the basis of which admission is sought. An undertaking in writing, in the following form, shall in this case be obtained from the applicant duly attested by a first-class magistrate or an oath commissioner or a public notary and forwarded to the university along with the application of the student for grant of eligibility certificate:

"I _____ son/daughter of _____ R/O _____ hereby declare that I am seeking provisional admission to _____ class / semester of the _____ course in the _____ college on the understanding that my admission to the _____ semester is provisional and is subject to confirmation on the issue of certificate of eligibility by the University under rules. If for any reason, whatsoever, the University declines to issue the said certificate, my provisional admission will automatically stand cancelled".

Such provisional admission shall entitle a candidate to join the college at his/her own risk and responsibility on the condition that he/she obtains a final certificate of eligibility before the declaration of the result of the University examination to which the candidate has been

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admitted:

provided that the request for grant of provisional admission should be made to the university immediately as soon as the candidate applies to the principal of the college/ rector/director of the offsite campus for seeking admission to the university:

provided further that the conditions governing the issue of eligibility certificate shall not apply to such students who have passed an examination of the Jammu and Kashmir state board of school education/CBSE.

Note: In case original qualification certificate of the qualifying examination does not indicate the subjects studied by him/her and the information regarding the subjects is essential for determination of eligibility, the candidate shall be required to produce the marks certificates issued by the board.

OR

In case the candidate is not in a position to produce the original qualification certificate and provisional certificate, he/she shall be required to produce the marks certificate of the qualifying examination issued by the board/university. But if the marks certificate does not indicate the parentage, the candidate is required to produce some other evidence along with the marks certificate in support of his/her parentage.

14. PRODUCTION OF MIGRATION CERTIFICATE

Candidates seeking admission to colleges and offsite campuses after having been admitted as members of another board/university incorporated by law for the time being in force, shall not be registered unless their applications for registration are accompanied by a migration certificate from the previous board/university.

15. REGISTRATION RETURNS

(i) The principal and rector/director shall forward to the controller of examinations three copies of registration returns (RR) containing the name and other particulars of each student admitted or re-admitted for a particular programme in that college in Semester I, III, V and VII as the case may be, along with a soft copy within 30 days after the last date of admission, on the prescribed proforma along with the fee prescribed by the university from

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time to time.

If the name of a student is struck off from the rolls of a college or offsite campus or a student migrates to another college or offsite campus, such fact shall immediately be reported to the controller of examinations.

(ii) Supplementary Registration Returns: In case the college could not submit the enrollment of the even semester students, the college can submit the supplementary registration returns of those students in subsequent examinations as per format prescribed by the university alongwith requisite fee, if any.

16. LATE FEE SUBMISSION OF REGISTRATION RETURN

For first count of 10 days after the last date prescribed i.e. after 30 days after last date of admission with late fee of Rs.100/- per candidate be charged. For another count of 10 days delay, Rs.200/- per candidate shall be charged. Thereafter, no registration return shall be accepted and the sole responsibility for non determination of eligibility of such candidate shall lie on the part of the concerned college / offsite campus. The fee may vary as is revised and notified by the university from time to time.

17. REGISTRATION FEE

The registration fee as prescribed by the university shall be paid once only irrespective of the number of times the candidate appears at the examinations of the university either as a student or an ex-student of an affiliated college or the offsite campus or the department of the university or any recognized institution, or as a private candidate. No further fee for registration shall be charged, unless a student's name is, for any reason other than legitimate migration, struck off from the rolls of a college or the offsite campus or the department of the university or any recognized institution, in which case he/she shall pay the fee prescribed by the university to have his/her name re-entered in the register of students.

18. REGISTER OF STUDENTS

The controller of examinations shall maintain a register of all students registered in the

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university. In this register, name of each registered student, his/her parentage, permanent address, date of birth based on the certificate of the matriculation/higher secondary or any other recognized examination passed by the candidate, the dates of admission or re-admission and/or leaving any college, every pass or failure in a university examination with his/her number, migration, any university scholarship, medal or prize won by or any punishment awarded to the student shall be recorded.

Each entry in the register of students shall be attested by an officer of the university authorized in this behalf. no one shall be admitted to any examination of the university unless he/she has been registered as a student of the university.

19. COPY OF ENTRIES IN THE REGISTER OF STUDENTS

Any registered student may, at any time, receive certified copy/copies of all the entries relating to him/her in the register of students on payment of the prescribed fee for each copy.

20. TRANSFER OF ADMISSION

Transfer of admission is permissible only in odd semesters for students of different colleges/offsite campuses of university as per regulations of FYUGP under NEP 2020.

Conditions for transfer of admission of students of other Universities:

A candidate migrating from any other University may be permitted to join odd semester of the degree programme provided he/she has passed all the subjects of previous semesters. Such candidates must satisfy all other conditions of eligibility stipulated in the regulations of the university.

- a) His/her transfer of admission shall be within the intake of the college.
- b) The courses/ programme of study prescribed/pursued by the candidate in the university from which he/she seeks migration are not materially different from the courses/programmes prescribed to be pursued in the university;

provided that such a candidate who has not qualified the semester examination with the

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subjects/combination of subjects for which he/she intends to seek admission to the next higher class of the university shall be required to qualify such subjects of the qualifying examination of the university as may be determined by the university.

- c) He/she shall fulfill the attendance requirements as per the university regulation.
- d) The candidate who is migrating from other university is eligible for overall SGPA/CGPA or Class and not for ranking.
- e) He/She shall complete the programme as per the regulations governing the maximum duration of completing the programme as per this regulation.

The marks/grades obtained/credits earned in four years under graduate programmes as per NEP 2020 examinations conducted by another university from which the candidate has migrated shall be taken into account for determining the final result (by increasing or reducing the marks/grades/credits in accordance with the maximum marks/grades/credits of the four years under graduate programmes of the university).

21. ATTENDANCE IN LIEU OF PARTICIPATION IN GAMES ETC.

Any candidate who participates in games, cultural and other co-curricular activities as defined below with the prior approval of the principal/rector/director concerned shall, for the purpose of condoning deficiency in attendance incurred by him/her on account of such participation, be treated as present on all the working days during the days of his/her absence on such account for a period of 15 working days in a semester programme subject to maximum of 30 working days in a year.

- (a) State representation in international/all India competitions organized by agencies which are recognized by the board of sports and youth welfare.
- (b) Participation in the inter-university competitions held under the auspices of a university or any other recognized institution as a member of the university team.
- (c) Participation in the inter-college competitions organized by the university as a member of the team of participating institutions.

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- (d) Participation in the N.C.C., N.S.S. and National Integration Samiti activities as a member of recognized Institutions.
- (e) Participation in the coaching camps/rehearsals prior to participation as a member of state or university team in the national/all India/ inter- university competitions.
- (f) Participation in the mountaineering/hiking/trekking/skiing/rock-climbing or other such activities organized under the auspices of the UT Government/university as a member of the institution affiliated/recognized by the university.

Note: For outstanding cases (requiring attendance waiver due to duty beyond 30 days) special permission may be sought from the Vice Chancellor / competent authority on the recommendation of the principal/rector/director concerned.

22. FOUR -YEARS UNDER GRADUATE PROGRAMMES STRUCTURE REGULATIONS

- (i) **Major Course (MJ):** Any subject in a discipline in which student wants to graduate for 3 years bachelor degree or 4 years bachelor degree with honours/research.
- (ii) **Minor Course (MI):** Any subject other than major available in the college / offsite campus from any discipline.
- (iii) **Multidisciplinary Course (MD):** Any subject/s of student's choice which is of interdisciplinary nature from faculties other than major with the condition that the subject opted for shall not be repeated in any semester
- (iv) **Ability Enhancement Course (AE):** It may be modern Indian language (MIL), English language (general), communication skill, mathematical ability. MIL includes Hindi/Dogri/Urdu/Punjabi.
- (v) **Skill Enhancement Course (SE):** The courses shall be chosen from the basket of courses from NSQF as notified by the university of Jammu. The university departments/respective board of studies can propose new courses in addition to NSQF.

- (vi) **Value Added Courses (VA) :** Four compulsory courses are:

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(a) Understanding India

(b) Environmental Science and Education

(c) Digital Technology

(d) Health and Wellness

In addition, following optional value added courses shall be offered by the college subject to the availability of faculty/infrastructure:

(a) Community Engagement

(b) National Cadet Corp (NCC)

(c) National Service Scheme (NSS)

(d) Sports

(e) Cultural

(f) Yoga Education

(vii) **Summer Internship:**

It shall be a short-term internship of duration 15 days in 5th semester for a job/professional training in a suitable organization or hands on training or activity-based course at college level in order to gain work experience. The internship shall be under a college teacher who will be designated as Internship Supervisor. After completion of summer internship students will have to produce a report related to the work carried out.

(viii) **Research project/Dissertation:**

Project work is considered a unique course involving applying knowledge in solving/ analysing/ exploring a real-life situation/ complex problem/ data analysis. Project work has the intention to provide research competencies at the undergraduate level. It enables the acquisition of special/ advanced knowledge through support study/ a project work. This course is applicable to students in 8th semester of undergraduate research program. A separate guideline shall be issued with regard to the evaluation of the Research project/Dissertation.

23. CREDIT PLAN OF THE FOUR YEARS UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME UNDER NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY (NEP 2020)

1. Major Course

Each student will study for

a) 62 Credits in Major for Three Years Graduation

b) 94 Credits in Major for Four Years Graduation (Honours)

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c) 82 Credits in Major for Four Years Graduation (Research)

Major Course can be any subject chosen from the following six disciplines

- I. Science
- II. Arts and Humanities
- III. Social and Behavioural Sciences
- IV. Commerce
- V. Management (BBA)
- VI. Computer Applications (BCA)

2. Minor Course

Each student will study

- a) 24 credits of minor course in same subject for three year graduation from 1st to 6th semester (4 credits in each semester)
- b) 32 credits of minor course in same subject for four year graduation (honours)/ (research)

3. Multidisciplinary Courses from other disciplines (Foundation Courses)

09 Credits of multidisciplinary courses of 03 credits each from 1st to 3rd semesters from disciplines other than major with the condition that the subject opted for shall not be repeated in any semester.

4. Ability Enhancement Courses

Modern Indian Languages (MIL)-Hindi/Dogri/Urdu/ Punjabi, English language (General), Communication Skills and Mathematical Ability.

09 Credits of AEC Courses of 03 Credits each from 1st to 3rd Semester.

5. Skill Enhancement Courses

06 Credits of Skill Enhancement Courses (SE) of 02 Credits each from 1st to 3rd Semester

The courses shall be chosen from the basket of courses from NSQF as notified by the university of Jammu. The university departments/ respective Board of Studies can

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propose new courses in addition to NSQF.

6. Value Added Courses

Four credits comprising of two courses (02 credits each) in 1st and 2nd semester(s) are compulsory courses.:

7. Summer Internship

Each student is required to undergo 02 credits of internship in 5th semester.

8. Research Project/Dissertation

Students pursuing Under Graduate Degree (Research) shall be required to undergo a Research Project/Dissertation of 12 credits in 8th semester.

Credit Summary:

1 Year Certificate = minimum 40 credits

2 Year Diploma = minimum 80 credits

3 Year Degree = 120 credits

4 Year Degree = 160 credits

Note: Student/s can swap between Minor and Major at the start of 3rd semester only if vacancy/s are available after following procedure laid down for the purpose. The college shall notify the vacancy/s which are to be filled in order of merit out of the applicants.

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24. NOMENCLATURE OF THE COURSES

The Course Code shall consist of 09 characters:

- First character for Undergraduate.

- The next two characters for Course Code.
- The next character for nature of course
(T=Theory cum Practical cum Tutorial, I= Summer Internship, P= Project/Dissertation).
- The next character for the semester.
- The last two characters for the course number.

25. SUBJECTS OFFERING

- (i) A candidate shall have to opt the subjects prescribed as per course framework (Annexure-III) from the academic session 2022-23 for four years under graduate programmes (FYUGP) under national education policy (NEP) 2020.
- (ii) A major course can be chosen as any subject from any discipline (Annexure-III). A minor course opted by the student shall be from any discipline subject to availability of course in the college.
- (iii) Student/s can swap between minor and major at the start of 3rd semester only if vacancy/s are

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available after following procedure laid down for the purpose. The college shall notify the vacancy/s which are to be filled in order of merit out of the applicants.


- (iv) A student has to opt multidisciplinary courses of 03 credits each from 1st to 3rd semesters from disciplines other than major with the condition that the subject opted for shall not be repeated in any semester.
- (v) A student has to opt ability enhancement courses of 03 credits each (Modern Indian Languages (MIL)-Hindi/Dogri/Urdu/Punjabi, English language (General), Communication Skills and Mathematical Ability) from 1st to 3rd semesters.
- (vi) A student has to opt skill enhancement courses of 2 credits each from 1st to 3rd Semester. The courses shall be chosen from the basket of courses from NSQF as notified by the university of Jammu or as proposed by the respective board of studies.
- (vii) A student has to study two value added courses (02 credits each) in 1st semester and two value added courses (02 credits each) in 2nd semester as compulsory courses with the condition that the value added courses opted for in 1st semester shall not be repeated in 2nd semester. In addition, there will be two optional value added courses of two credits each in 3rd and 4th semester(s) other than compulsory course in 1st and 2nd semester(s).
- (viii) Each student is required to undergo 02 credits of internship in 5th semester.
- (ix) Students pursuing under graduate degree (research) shall be required to undergo a research project/dissertation of 12 credits in 8th semester.


26. AUTHORITY FOR PRESCRIPTION OF COURSES OF STUDIES


The syllabi and courses of study for each subject shall be prescribed by the academic council on the recommendations of the respective board of studies. In case where text-books are prescribed, a candidate shall be required not only to show a thorough knowledge of text-books but also to have ability to answer questions of a similar standard set with a view to testing his/her general knowledge of the subject.


27. MODIFICATIONS TO THE REGULATIONS

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Notwithstanding the foregoing, any amendments / modifications issued or notified by the university grants commission/ higher education commission of India and its verticals such as national higher education regulatory council, general education council or the state government, from time to time, shall be deemed to have been incorporated into these regulations and shall constitute an integral part of these regulations.

28. SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

Each course shall be comprised of mid semester assessment test and end-semester examination. The responsibility of conduct and evaluation of the mid semester assessment test lies with the course coordinator. The end semester examination shall be conducted by the university and question papers shall got set by the controller of examinations except skill and value added courses. The mid semester assessment marks awarded to the students in each course shall be displayed on the notice board well in advance, at least one week before the commencement of end semester examination. The 03/04 and 02 credits paper shall have 04 and 03 units, respectively. The evaluation of the skill and value added courses will be internal. Practicals/Tutorials as applicable in a course (major/minor) are extension of the theory programme in an inbuilt (3+1) credits course i.e. 03 credits of theory and 01 credit of practical/tutorial. However, 02 credits major course of 5th semester will have only theory component. Each four credits paper will have 75 marks for theory and 25 marks for practical/tutorial. The break-up for 75 marks for theory paper shall contain 15 marks for mid semester assessment test and 60 marks for end semester examination. There will be continuous assessment of 10 marks and final examination of 15 marks for practical/tutorial component in each course.

The 03 credits paper shall be of 75 marks consisting of 60 marks for external examination and 15 marks for mid semester assessment test. All 02 credits courses shall be of 50 marks comprising 40 marks for external examination and 10 marks for mid semester assessment test.

Note: - (i) A candidate who fails in the Internal Assessment (Theory) shall be given one more chance within fifteen days from the declaration of the result of the same.

(ii) In case of failure/re-appear category the Internal Assessment earned by the candidate as a regular student shall be carried forward to the subsequent examination.

(iii) The evaluation of the skill and value added courses will be internal

Summer Internship:

Each student is required to undergo 02 credits of internship comprising 50 marks in 5th semester.

The board of studies will formulate suitable internship programme in their respective subject in way to impart practical knowledge to the students and proper assessment of the internship course.

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The designated Internship Supervisor will monitor the progress and evaluate student's internship course at the end of semester on the basis of Internship Report/Seminar presentation/Viva-voce. The evaluation of the internship course shall be internal.

Research project/Dissertation:

Students pursuing Under Graduate Degree (Research) shall be required to undergo a Research Project/Dissertation of 12 credits (300 marks) in 8th semester. The respective board of studies shall formulate the curriculum of research project / dissertation comprising of credit distribution out of 12 credits alongwith instructions regarding time bound completion of the project. A separate guideline shall be issued with regard to the evaluation of the Research project/Dissertation.

29. MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY FOR APPEARANCE IN EXAMINATION

A semester end external examination under four years under graduate programmes (FYUGP) as per NEP 2020 shall be open to the following categories of students:

(A) A regular student i.e. a student who has undergone a regular course of study in a college / offsite campus for the period specified for that course of study by having been on the rolls of the college / offsite campus immediately preceding the examination and has his/her name submitted to the controller of examinations by the concerned college / offsite campus where he/she has pursued the course for the examination and has fulfilled the following conditions to be certified by the college principal /rector/director of offsite campus concerned:

- (i) He/she has been a student of good conduct.
- (ii) He/she has attended not less than 75% of the lectures delivered including seminars, tutorials, practical's etc. in each course opted by him/her in that semester.
- (iii) He/she has secured pass marks in internal assessment in at least 75% of the papers.
- (iv) He/she has paid the prescribed fee.

(B) Students who after having undergone a regular course of study and having completed all

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
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conditions of eligibility for appearance in a course(s) in a semester examination including minimum attendance requirement and having passed in internal assessment and having either failed to pass the semester examination in that subject/paper(s) or been unable to appear in the examination in that subject/paper(s) will be eligible to appear as a private candidate in the examination by submitting his/her application on the prescribed form in online/offline mode along with prescribed fee to reach the controller of examinations within the dates fixed for the purpose.

30. PROMOTION TO NEXT SEMESTER

- (i) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-I to semester-II if he/she has secured pass marks in internal assessment in at least 75% of the papers of the semester-I.
- (ii) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-II to semester-III provided he/she has earned atleast 50% of the total credits of semesters-I as well as passed in internal assessments of at least 75% of the papers of semester-II.
- (iii) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-III to semester-IV if he/she has secured pass marks in internal assessment in at least 75% of the papers of semester-III.
- (iv) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-IV to semester-V provided he/she has earned atleast 50% of the total credits of semesters-II and 50% of the total credits of semesters-III as well as passed in internal assessments of at least 75% of the papers of semester-IV.
- (v) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-V to VI if he/she has secured pass marks in internal assessment in at least 75% of the papers of the semester-V.
- (vi) A student who does not fulfill the promotion criteria (i), (ii), (iii), (iv) and (v) above shall be declared fail in the semester concerned. However, he/she shall have the option to retain the marks in the papers in which he/she has secured pass marks.
- (vii) A student who has to reappear in a paper prescribed for semester-I to IV shall appear in the subsequent semester end examination to be held as per the dates prescribed by the university.
- (viii) Only those candidates who have successfully completed three-years bachelor's degree

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with minimum CGPA of 7.5 shall be allowed to continue fourth year of the undergraduate programme to obtain the bachelor's degree (honours/research).

- (ix) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-VII to semester-VIII if he/she has secured pass marks in internal assessment in at least 75% of the papers of the semester-VII.
- (x) Candidates who successfully complete their four years bachelor's degree with honours /research are eligible to enter the "Two Semester Master's Degree Programme".
- (xi) Candidates who successfully complete their four years bachelor's degree (research) are eligible to enter the "Doctoral (Ph.D.) Programme" in a relevant subject if he/she fulfills the criterion requirement as per NHEQF.
- (xii) A student who has to reappear in a paper(s) prescribed for semester-VI and VIII shall appear in the supplementary examination.

31. CONDONATION OF LECTURES

- (i) The concerned principal/reactor/director of the college/offsite campuses may condone shortage in attendance of student in a semester for special reasons to be recorded in writing up to 6% of the lectures delivered/practical's conducted/tutorials in each course separately.
- (ii) Any candidate, who falls short of attendance beyond condonable limits or whose shortage in attendance is not condoned by the competent authorities and wants to pursue the programme, shall be required to re-join the course along with the next batch of students of the same class to make up the deficiency by attending the required number of lectures by which he/she had fallen short. This provision shall however, be applicable only in respect of such of the candidates who have attended at least 50% classes in the said course/s. Candidates having attended less than 50% of the lectures in a particular course/s shall be considered for re-admission after depositing afresh the prescribed admission fee for the semester / course. However, such candidate/s shall appear in the examination along with the candidates of the semester, with which he/she has been re-admitted, in regular capacity,

provided in case such a student again falls short of lectures he/she shall not be allowed to seek admission to that course in any affiliated college/offsite campus in any subsequent

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year.

- (iii) A student who has been on the rolls of a college in the semester-I, II, III, IV, V, VI and VII of four years under graduate programmes and earns eligibility to join the semester-II or III or IV or V or VI or VII or VIII of the programme as the case may be, but fails to join the semester when he/she was due to join it or discontinues his/her studies for any reason whatsoever may be considered for admission to the semester concerned in a subsequent year if he/she submits application to this effect before the commencement of the semester concerned provided a seat and other facilities for the courses are available in the college concerned in the semester he/she wishes to join and the student seeks admission within a period of one year from the date he/she discontinues his/her studies.

32. SCRUTINY OF ADMISSION APPLICATIONS TO EXAMINATIONS

All applications for admission to university examinations shall be scrutinized by comparison with the register of students and the controller of examinations may refuse any application of any candidate about whom complete particulars have not been reported, and require him/her to forward through the officer who has attested his/her application for admission, a complete statement of the particulars which have not been properly reported, together with an additional registration fee prescribed by the university.

33. DATE OF SUBMISSION OF EXAMINATION FORMS TO THE UNIVERSITY

The principal of the college concerned / reactor / director of the offsite campuses shall furnish the examination forms of the enrolled students to the controller of examinations alongwith requisite fee within 21 days from the date notified by the controller of examinations.

34. EXAMINATION FEES

The students shall be required to pay examination fee as prescribed by the University from time to time.

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35. DATES OF SEMESTER END EXAMINATIONS

The semester end examinations shall be as per the dates notified in the academic calendar. However, exact dates and the centres of examination shall be notified by the controller of examinations, university of Jammu, Jammu.

36. EXEMPTION TO RE-APPEAR IN MID SEMESTER EXAMINATION/ TUTORIALS/PRACTICAL EXAMINATION ONCE QUALIFIED

A candidate who appears and passes in the mid semester examination / tutorials/practical examination of a subject but fails to qualify end semester examination in that paper shall be exempted from appearing in the mid semester examination / tutorials/practical examination of that paper subsequently and the marks obtained by him/her in the last attempt in which he/she passed in the mid semester examination / tutorials/practical examination of a subject shall be carried over. Consequently, he/she shall be required to appear in the theory part of that subject in the subsequent examination.

37. RE-APPEAR CATEGORY FOR FAILURES

A candidate who fails in four years under graduate programmes in semester-I/II/III/IV/V/VI/VII/VIII examination but has secured pass marks (separately in the mid semester examination and end semester examination) in a subject or subjects, shall be exempted from appearing in such subject(s) and shall be allowed to appear in the remaining subject(s) in a subsequent examination(s) on payment of prescribed fee on each occasion and if he/she passes in the subject(s) he/she shall be declared to have passed the examination.

provided that re-appear/failure candidates shall have to appear in the four years under graduate programmes in semester-I/II/III/IV/V/VI/VII/VIII examination (as the case may be) as per the syllabi in vogue and fulfillment of other statutory conditions.

38. SUPPLEMENTARY EXAMINATION

There shall be supplementary examination for the semester- VI and VIII only.

39. PASSING CRITERION

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The minimum Grade/Marks (%) required to pass each paper in a semester examination under FYUGP shall be 36% in each theory paper in mid semester examination and end semester examination, separately. However, to qualify for tutorials/practical's, the passing criteria is 36% marks in continuous assessment component and final examination component put together. If the candidate fails in tutorial/practical and passes in mid semester and end semester theory examination, such candidate shall reappear for tutorial/practical examination only and vice versa.

For summer internship, research project/ dissertation, passing criteria is 40% marks.

40. DETERMINATION OF GRADES

SGPA and CGPA

- (i) **SGPA:** The SGPA is the ratio of sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undergone by a student, i.e.

$$SGPA (S_i) = \Sigma(C_i \times G_i) / \Sigma C_i,$$

where C_i is the number of credits of the i th course and G_i is the grade point scored by the student in the i th course.

- (ii) **CGPA:** The CGPA is also calculated in the same manner taking into account all the courses undergone by a student over all the semesters of a programme, i.e.

$$CGPA = \Sigma(C_i \times S_i) / \Sigma C_i$$

where S_i is the SGPA of the i th semester and C_i is the total number of credits in that semester.

- (ii) The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported in the transcripts.

The declaration of result shall be based on the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) earned towards the end of each semester or the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) earned towards the completion of all the eight semesters of the Programme and the corresponding overall Letter grades. If some candidates exit at the completion of first, second or third year of the four years undergraduate programmes, with Certificate,

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Diploma, three years Degree or four years degree, respectively, then the results of successful candidates at the end of second, fourth or sixth semesters shall also be classified on the basis of the **Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)** obtained in the Two, Four or Six or Eight Semesters, respectively for award of:

- Bachelor's Certificate in Arts/Science/Commerce
- Bachelor's Diploma in Arts/Science/Commerce
- Bachelor's Degree in Arts/Science/Commerce
- Bachelor's Degree with honours/research in a discipline/subject

Grading System: Absolute grading would be used where the marks obtained are converted to grades based on pre-determined class intervals. To implement the following grading system, the colleges /campuses shall use the following UGC recommended 10-point grading system:

- (i) A student obtaining Grade F shall be considered failed and will be required to reappear in the examination as per existing rules of the university under semester system for under graduate courses.
- (ii) Grade (D) or percentage of marks (36%) is required to pass in a course, SGPA of 4 to qualify a semester and a minimum CGPA of 4 to qualify for a UG degree.

Calculation of Semester grade Point Average (i.e. SGPA is the grade point received in a particular semester by a candidate), Cumulative Grade Point Average (i.e. CGPA is the average grade points obtained in all the semesters) and the Percentage of Marks, the following formulas are used:

- i. $SGPA = \text{Credit Points} / \text{Credit}$
- ii. $CGPA = \text{Total Credit Points Earned} / \text{Total Credits of the Programme}$
- iii. $\text{Percentage of Marks} = CGPA \times 10$

The description of Grades awarded, conversion of percentage and the marks converted into Grade points in a particular course/paper can be calculated with the help of Table I and II.

Example: SGPA of a student in six semesters:

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I-7.0, II-7.2, III-6.8, IV-7.8, V-7.0, VI-7.0

$7.0+7.2+6.8+7.8+7.0+7.0 = 42.8$

$CGPA = 42.8/6 = 7.1$

Percentage = 71%

41. RE-EVALUATION OF ANSWER SCRIPTS

- (i) Re-evaluation of answer scripts of semester end examinations shall be permissible in each course of a semester examination of four years under graduate programmes as per the university statutes.
- (ii) Re-evaluation shall not be permitted in the mid semester theory papers, tutorials, practical's, skill courses, value added courses, internship, project report, dissertation.

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42. ISSUANCE OF DEGREE

A candidate who is declared to have qualified all the six/eight semesters of four years under graduate programmes shall be awarded a degree in a particular discipline under statutes.

43. ENTITLEMENT OF AWARDS OF SCHOLARSHIP/ PRIZE/MEDAL

The University Ranks, Gold-Medals, Scholarships etc., shall be awarded as per the regulations to be issued by the university lateron.

44. TRANSITORY PROVISION

Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations, the Vice-Chancellor shall, for a period of three years from the date of coming into force of these regulations, have the power to provide by order that these regulations shall be applied to any programme with such modifications as may be necessary.




45. AUTHORITY TO INTERPRET STATUTES

With a view to remove any difficulty arising out of the application and implementation of these statutes, the Vice-Chancellor shall be competent to give final interpretation of these statutes which shall be final and binding on all concerned.

46. REPEAL AND SAVINGS

The existing Regulations governing three years Bachelor Degree Programmes in the faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce shall stand repealed and replaced by the new regulations under NEP 2020. However, the above Regulations shall continue to be in force for the students who have been admitted to the course before the enforcement of these regulations.



फा.सं. यूजीएमईबी/एनएमसी/रूल्स एंड रेग्युलेशंस/2021/—राष्ट्रीय आयुर्विज्ञान आयोग अधिनियम, 2019 (2019 का 30) की धारा 24 की उप-धारा (1) के साथ पठित धारा 57 द्वारा प्रदत्त शक्तियों का इस्तेमाल करते हुए राष्ट्रीय आयुर्विज्ञान आयोग एतद्वारा निम्नलिखित विनियम बनाता है:-

1. संक्षिप्त शीर्षक और प्रारंभण - (1) ये विनियम, राष्ट्रीय आयुर्विज्ञान आयोग (अनिवार्य आवर्ती आयुर्विज्ञान इंटरनशिप) विनियमावली, 2021 कहे जाएंगे।
 - (2) ये भारत के सरकारी राजपत्र में उनके अंतिम प्रकाशन की तारीख को प्रावृत्त होंगे।
2. परिभाषाएं - इन विनियमों में, जब तक संदर्भ से अन्यथा अपेक्षित न हो, -
 - (क) "अधिनियम" से, राष्ट्रीय आयुर्विज्ञान आयोग अधिनियम, 2019 (2019 का 30) अभिप्रेत है;
 - (ख) "आयोग" से, अधिनियम की धारा 3 के अंतर्गत गठित राष्ट्रीय आयुर्विज्ञान आयोग अभिप्रेत है;
 - (ग) "पाठ्यचर्या" में अनुसूची III में विस्तार से वर्णित कारक शामिल हैं;
 - (घ) "विदेशी आयुर्विज्ञान स्नातक" का वही अर्थ होगा जो उसे राष्ट्रीय आयुर्विज्ञान आयोग (विदेशी आयुर्विज्ञान स्नातक लाइसेंसिएट) विनियमावली, 2021 के विनियम 2 के खंड (ग) में दिया गया है;
 - (ङ) "इंटरन" से, इन विनियमों के अंतर्गत अनिवार्य आवर्ती इंटरनशिप प्रशिक्षण प्राप्त कर रहा कोई आयुर्विज्ञान स्नातक अभिप्रेत है;
 - (च) "लॉग बुक" से, किसी इंटरन के कार्य-निष्पादन और उसके द्वारा किए गए कार्य के रिकार्ड, की गई शल्य क्रियाओं

NATIONAL MEDICAL COMMISSION

NOTIFICATION

New Delhi, the 18th November, 2021

No. UGMEB/NMC/Rules & Regulations/2021/ .— In exercise of the powers conferred by section 57 read with sub-section (1) of section 24 of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019 (30 of 2019), the National Medical Commission hereby makes the following regulations namely:-

1. **Short title and commencement.**— (1) These regulations may be called the National Medical Commission (Compulsory Rotating Medical Internship) Regulations, 2021.
- (2) They shall come into force on the date of their final publication in the Official Gazette of India.
2. **Definitions.**— (1) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - (a) "Act" means the National Medical Commission Act, 2019 (30 of 2019);
 - (b) "Commission" means the National Medical Commission constituted under section 3 of the Act;
 - (c) "Curriculum" includes the elements detailed in Schedule III;
 - (d) "Foreign Medical Graduate" shall have the meaning assigned to it in clause (c) of regulation 2 of the National Medical Commission (Foreign Medical Graduate Licentiate) Regulations, 2021;
 - (e) "Intern" means a medical graduate undergoing compulsory rotating internship training under these regulations;
 - (f) "Log Book" means an official document chronicling the performance of an intern and a record of the work done, procedures performed and competencies achieved by him;
 - (g) "Mentor" shall mean an appropriately qualified and trained medical teacher and senior to the trainee, who guides the trainee in all aspects of graduation, such as, education, skill enhancement, research work and ethical values;
 - (h) "Notification" means a notification published in the Official Gazette and the expression "notify" shall be construed accordingly;
 - (i) "Permanent Registration" is the registration of eligible persons with a duly recognised primary medical qualification as regulated under the provisions of Chapter VI of the Act, that provides license to an individual to independently practice modern scientific system of medicine or allopathy in India;
 - (j) "Primary Medical Qualification" means a medical graduation degree, such as, Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS) conferred in India or an equivalent qualification of any country other than India or an

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erstwhile licentiate qualification of India granted under the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (102 of 1956), which are in force as on the date of commencement of the Act that continues to be in force till the date of their expiry for all purposes, as if they had been issued or granted under the provisions of the Act or the rules or regulations made thereunder;

(k) "Schedule" means the Schedule annexed to these regulations;

(l) "University" shall have the same meaning assigned to it in clause (f) of section 2 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956) and includes a health University in India or an equivalent institution outside India that has a Medical faculty duly recognised in that country.

(2) Words and expressions used in these regulations and not defined herein but defined in the Act shall have the respective meanings assigned to them in the Act.

3. **Internship to be an integral part of undergraduate medical education.**— Without prejudice to the provisions of these regulations, compulsory rotating medical internship shall be an integral part of undergraduate medical education degree.

4. **Bar on licence to permanent registration.**— No medical graduate shall be eligible to permanent registration to practice medicine in India unless he undergoes the compulsory rotating medical internship in India as provided in Schedule II.

5. **Duration and Period of Internship.**— The overall duration of compulsory rotating medical internship shall not be less than twelve months and institutions or hospitals from where it may be undergone shall be such as specified in Schedule I and shall be completed within a period of two years from the date of qualifying credentials to pursue compulsory rotating medical internship.

6. **Quality of internship.**— No medical graduate shall be considered to have undergone compulsory rotating medical internship unless—

(a) all the essential (practical) aspects of medicine in the areas specified in the Schedule III and IV are completed during the internship; and

(b) the entire course of internship is done under active supervision of the mentor duly qualified in that respect, and the mentor has duly issued certificate in that respect, as per the proforma provided in Schedule IV

7. **Qualifications of mentor.**— No person shall be eligible either to supervise a medical intern or certify the completion of compulsory rotating medical internship, unless he possesses all the qualifications specified in Schedule IV.

8. The Dean/ Principal/ Director or any other equivalent authority shall be responsible for implementation of these Regulations.

SCHEDULE - I

[See regulation 5]

DURATION and PERIOD OF CRMI

1. Total Duration

Every candidate shall be required to undergo a compulsory rotating medical internship (CRMI) for a minimum period of twelve months, to the satisfaction of the college authorities and the University concerned after passing the final Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS) examination/ National Exit Exam for MBBS (Next), so as to be eligible for the award of the MBBS degree by the respective Universities.

2. Period for Completion

(a) The Internship shall be completed within two years of passing the final MBBS or Foreign Medical Graduate Examination (FMGE) or NExt Step-I examination, whenever in force.

(b) The minimum duration of compulsory rotating medical internship may be extended appropriately by a reasonable period on recommendation by the College or University for reasons including but not limited to:

(i) insufficient period of attendance; or

(ii) any exigency such as disasters or unforeseen circumstances in the country as notified by the Government of India or any competent authority duly authorized to do so.

(c) The duration of internship may be curtailed or temporarily suspended or even withdrawn or cancelled at any time by the institution or University according to the prevailing rules or regulations of the relevant authority, provided—

- (i) the registrant, due to any reason whatsoever, desires not to pursue CRMI; or
- (ii) the registrant is not found to have fulfilled eligibility requirements; or
- (iii) there are proven acts of indiscipline; or
- (iv) there are proven acts of professional misdemeanor or misconduct; or
- (v) any other acts or actions including those violating law of the land.
- (d). An intern shall be allowed to avail the following leaves:-
 - A. Normal Leave:
 - (i) Interns shall be permitted a maximum of fifteen days leave with prior permission, during the entire period of internship.
 - (ii) The entire period of fifteen days cannot be availed during any of the one week or two weeks postings applicable to a single department or specialty
 - B. Maternity Leave:
 - (i) Lady Interns may be permitted Maternity Leave according to prevailing rules and regulations of the Central Government or State Government, as may be applicable
 - C. Paternity Leave: Male interns may be permitted paternity leave for two weeks either in continuation or in intervals of one week each within one year of internship.
 - D. Medical Leave:
 - (i) Medical Leave shall be included within the fifteen days of normal leave.
 - (ii) Any medical leave beyond this period shall be recommended only by a duly constituted Medical Board.
 - E. The internship shall be extended if the leave of absence of any kind exceeds beyond this period:
 - (i) The period of extension shall be equivalent to the period beyond permissible fifteen days of leave.
 - (ii) The internship shall be repeated only in the department or specialty wherein the above extension is necessary.

SCHEDULE- II

(See Regulation 4)

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR COMPLETION OF CRMI

The following requirements need to be fulfilled to be eligible for CRMI.

1. Indian Medical Graduates

- (a) The applicant should have successfully completed the MBBS course of any University from a college or institution approved and recognised by the Commission and listed by the Undergraduate Medical Education Board under the provisions of section 35 of the Act.
- (b) The qualifying examination for Indian Medical Graduates shall be in accordance with the applicable rules and regulations of the Commission at the time of commencement of internship;
 - (i) The Final MBBS Examination of various Universities or institutions of India;
 - (ii) The National Exit Test (NExT) Step-1 held under sub-section (1) of section 15 of the Act whenever this examination becomes operational;
 - (iii) Any other requirement as may be regulated or notified by the Central Government or, as the case may be, the Commission.
- (c) All Indian Medical Graduates shall complete their entire period of compulsory rotating internship training (CRMI) in the institution where they have pursued and completed their Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS);
 - (i) One-year approved service in the Armed Forces Medical Services, after passing the final MBBS examination shall be considered as equivalent to the pre- registration training detailed above; and such training shall, as far as possible, be at the Base or General Hospital. The training in Community Medicine should fulfill the norms of the NMC as proposed above. However NExT step 2 will be mandatory for these candidates also.

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2. Foreign Medical Graduates

(a) All Foreign Medical Graduates, as regulated by the National Medical Commission (Foreign Medical Graduate Licentiate) Regulations, 2021, are required to undergo internship at par with Indian Medical Graduates if they desire to seek Permanent Registration to practice Medicine in India.

(i) All Foreign Medical Graduates, unless otherwise notified shall be required to undergo CRMI at par with Indian Medical Graduates after the National Exit Test Step-1 after NExT becomes operational.

(b) Indian citizens (including overseas Indian citizens) who are Foreign Medical Graduates who do not fall under the purview of the National Medical Commission (Foreign Medical Graduate Licentiate) Regulations, 2021 shall be regulated by the provisions of sub-section (3) of section 13 of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (102 of 1956) in accordance with the Advisory no MCI-203(1)(Gen)/2020- Regn./118239, dated the 2nd September, 2020 and shall be required to complete CRMI in India if they have not undergone such practical training after obtaining such qualification as may be required by the rules and regulations in force in the country granting such qualification or has not undergone any practical training in that country.

(c) Foreign Medical Graduates who require to complete a period of Internship shall do so only in medical colleges or institutions approved for providing CRMI to Indian Medical Graduates;

(i) Foreign Medical Graduates may be posted first in colleges which have been newly opened and have yet to be recognized;

(ii) May be posted to different medical colleges or institutions through a counseling or seat allocation process based on the merit;

(iii) Medical colleges or institutions may allow up to 7.5 per cent of their permitted quota of interns to accommodate internship by Foreign Medical Graduates.

(d) The college or institution and its affiliated hospitals and Community Health Centres shall be recognised by the Commission for conducting the CRMI programme

SCHEDULE- III

[See regulation 2(c)]

CURRICULUM AND SPECIALITIES OF COMPULSORY ROTATING MEDICAL INTERNSHIP (CRMI)

1. DISCIPLINE

(a). COMMUNITY MEDICINE The aim of teaching the undergraduate student in Community Medicine is to impart such knowledge and skills that may enable him to diagnose and treat common medical illnesses and recognize the importance of community involvement. He/she shall acquire competence to deal effectively with an individual and the community in the context of primary health care. This is to be achieved by hands-on experience in the District Hospital and Primary Health Centre. The details are as under: -

- (i) 12 weeks (Total): Community Medicine (compulsory residence in center)
- (ii) 3 weeks: General Medicine
- (iii) 3 weeks: General Surgery
- (iv) 3 weeks: Obstetrics and Gynecology
- (v) 3 weeks: Community Medicine

District Hospital /Community Health Centre:

A. Tasks an intern must be able to do without assistance:

1. An intern must:

- (a) Be able to diagnose common ailments and advise primary care;
- (b) Demonstrate knowledge on 'Essential drugs' and their usage;

(c) Recognize medical emergencies, resuscitate and institute initial treatment and refer to a suitable institution/ suggest to the patient an alternative health care facility if he/she wants to know about the same.

2. An intern must be familiar with all National Health Programmes (e.g. RCH, UIP, CDD, ARI, FP, ANC, Tuberculosis, Leprosy and others), as recommended by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.

3. An intern must:

- (a) Gain full expertise in immunization against infectious disease;
- (b) Participate in programmes related to prevention and control of locally prevalent endemic diseases including nutritional disorders;

- (c) Learn skills in family welfare planning procedures.

4. An intern must:

- (a) Gain capabilities to conduct programmes on health education;
- (b) Gain capabilities to use Audio visual aids;
- (c) Acquire capability of utilization of scientific information for promotion of community health.

B. An intern must have observed or preferably assisted at the following:

1. An intern should be capable of establishing linkages with other agencies as water supply, food distribution and other environmental or social agencies.
2. An intern should acquire managerial skills including delegation of duties to and monitoring the activities of paramedical staff and other health care professionals.

Taluka Hospital/ First Referral Unit/ CHC

A. An intern must be able to do without assistance:

1. An intern shall provide health education to an individual/community on:
 - (a) tuberculosis;
 - (b) small family, spacing, use of appropriate contraceptives;
 - (c) applied nutrition and care of mothers and children;
 - (d) immunization.

B. An intern must be able to do with supervision:

An intern shall attend at least one school health programme with the medical officer.

Primary Health Centre / Urban Health Centre

A. An intern must be able to do without assistance the following:

- (a) Participate in family composite health care (birth to death), inventory of events;
- (b) Participate in use of the modules on field practice for community health, e.g., safe motherhood, nutrition surveillance and rehabilitation, diarrheal disorders, etc;
- (c) Participate in and maintain documents related to immunisation and cold chain;
- (d) Acquire competence in diagnosis and management of common ailments e.g. malaria, tuberculosis, enteric fever, congestive heart failure, hepatitis, meningitis acute renal failure, etc.

B. An intern must be able to do under supervision the following:

- (a) Acquire proficiency in Family Welfare Programmes (antenatal care, normal delivery, contraception, etc.);
- (b) Undergo village attachment of at least one week duration to understand issues of community health along with exposure to village health centres, ASHA Sub-Centres;
- (c) Participate in Infectious Diseases Surveillance and Epidemic Management activities along with the medical officer.

(b). GENERAL MEDICINE

1. **Goal:-**The aim of posting of an intern in General Medicine is to impart such knowledge and skills that may enable him to diagnose and treat common medical illnesses. He/she shall acquire competence in clinical diagnosis based on history, physical examination and relevant laboratory investigations and institute appropriate line of management; this would include diseases common in tropics (parasitic, bacterial or viral infections, nutritional disorders, including dehydration and electrolyte disturbances) and various system illnesses.

2. An intern must have observed/assisted or preferably performed at the following operations/procedures:

- (a) Proctoscopy, Ophthalmoscopy/ Otoscopy, Indirect laryngoscopy;
- (b) Therapeutic procedures;
- (c) Urethral catheterization, Insertion of Ryle's Tube, Pleural, Ascitic fluid aspiration;
- (d) Cerebrospinal Fluid (CSF) aspiration, Air way tube installation;
- (e) Oxygen administration, etc.;
- (f) **Biopsy Procedures:** Liver, Kidney, Skin, Nerve, Lymph node, and muscle biopsy, Bone marrow aspiration, Biopsy of Malignant lesions on surface, nasal/nerve/skin smear for leprosy under supervision;
- (g) **Skills that an intern should be able to perform under supervision:**
 - (i) should be familiar with life-saving procedures, including use of aspirator, respirator and defibrillator, cardiac monitor, blood gas analyser;
 - (ii) should be able to advise about management and prognosis of acute & chronic illnesses like viral fever, gastroenteritis, hepatitis, pneumonias, myocardial infarction and angina, TIA and stroke, seizures, diabetes mellitus, hypertension renal and hepatic failure, thyroid disorders and hematological disorders. He should participate in counseling sessions for patients with non- communicable diseases and tuberculosis, HIV patients, etc.;
 - (iii) should be able to confirm death and demonstrate understanding of World Health Organization cause of death reporting and data quality requirements;
 - (iv) should be able to demonstrate understanding of the coordination with local and national epidemic management plans;
 - (v) should be able to demonstrate prescribing skills and demonstrate awareness of pharmaco-vigilance, antibiotics policy, prescription audit and concept of essential medicines list.

(c). PSYCHIATRY

1. **Goal:**-The aim of posting of an intern in Psychiatry is to impart such knowledge and skills that may enable him/her to diagnose and treat common psychiatric illnesses. He/she shall acquire competence for clinical diagnosis based on history, physical examination and relevant laboratory investigations and institute appropriate line of management. He/she should also be able to recognize the behavioral manifestations of systemic illnesses and differentiate them from psychiatric disorders.

2. Therapeutic-

A. An intern must have observed or preferably assisted at the following operations/procedures:

- (i) Diagnose and manage common psychiatric disorders;
- (ii) Identify and manage psychological reactions;
- (iii) Diagnose and manage behavioral disorders in medical and surgical patients;
- (iv) ECT administration;
- (v) Therapeutic counseling and follow-up.

(d). PEDIATRICS

1. Goal:

The aim of posting of an intern in Pediatrics is to impart such knowledge and skills that may enable him/her to diagnose and treat common childhood illnesses including neonatal disorders. He/she shall acquire competence for clinical diagnosis based on history, physical examination and relevant laboratory investigations and institute appropriate line of management. This would include diseases common in tropics (parasitic, bacterial or viral infections, nutritional disorders, including dehydration and electrolyte disturbances) and various system illnesses.

An intern must have observed / assisted or preferably performed the following procedures:

- (i) diagnose and manage common childhood disorders including neonatal disorders and acute emergencies, examining sick child making a record of information;

- (ii) Diagnostic techniques: blood collection (including from femoral vein and umbilical cord), drainage of abscess, collection of cerebrospinal, pleural and peritoneal fluids, suprapubic aspiration of urine;
- (iii) Techniques related to patient care: immunization, perfusion techniques, nasogastric tube insertion, feeding procedures, tuberculin testing & breast-feeding counselling;
- (iv) Use of equipments: vital monitoring, temperature monitoring, resuscitation at birth and care of children receiving intensive care;
- (v) Institute early management of common childhood disorders with special reference to paediatric dosage and oral rehydration therapy;
- (vi) Screening of new born babies and those with risk factors for any anomalies and steps for prevention in future; detect congenital abnormalities;
- (vii) Recognise growth abnormalities; recognise anomalies of psychomotor development;
- (viii) Assess nutritional and dietary status of infants and children and organize prevention, detection and follow-up of deficiency disorders both at individual and at community levels, such as:
 - protein-energy malnutrition
 - deficiencies of vitamins especially A, B, C and D;
 - Iron deficiency

2.2 Skills that an intern should be able to perform under supervision:

- (i) An intern should be familiar with life-saving procedures, including use of aspirator, respirator, cardiac monitor, blood gas analyser.
- (ii) An intern should be able to advise about management and prognosis of acute and chronic illnesses like viral fever, gastroenteritis, hepatitis, pneumonias, congenital heart diseases, seizures, renal and hepatic diseases, thyroid disorders and hematological disorders. She/he should participate in counseling sessions with parents including HIV counseling.

(c). GENERAL SURGERY

1. Goal-The aim of posting of an intern in General Surgery is to impart such knowledge and skills that may enable him to diagnose and treat common surgical ailments. He/she shall have ability to diagnose and suspect with reasonable accuracy all acute and chronic surgical illnesses.

2. Therapeutic-

A. An intern must have observed / assisted or preferably performed the following procedures:

- (i) venesection or venous access;
- (ii) tracheostomy and endotracheal intubation;
- (iii) catheterization of patients with acute retention or trocar cystostomy;
- (iv) drainage of superficial abscesses;
- (v) basic suturing of wound and wound management (including bandaging);
- (vi) biopsy of surface tumours;
- (vii) perform vasectomy.

B. Skills that an intern should be able to perform under supervision:

- (i) Advise about prognosis of acute and chronic surgical illnesses, head injury, trauma, burns and cancer. Counsel patients regarding the same;
- (ii) Advise about rehabilitation of patients after surgery and assist them for early recovery;
- (iii) Should be able to demonstrate understanding of World Health Organisation cause of death reporting and data quality requirements;
- (iv) Should be able to demonstrate understanding of the use of national and state/ local cause of death statistics.

C. An intern must have observed or preferably assisted at the following operations/procedures:

- (i) Resuscitation of critical patients;
- (ii) Basic surgical procedures for major and minor surgical illnesses;
- (iii) Wound dressings and application of splints;
- (iv) Laparoscopic/ Minimally Invasive surgery;
- (v) Lymph node biopsy.

(D). ANESTHESIOLOGY

1. **Goal:-** The aim of posting of an intern in anaesthesia is to impart such knowledge and skills that may enable him to understand principles of anaesthesia and recognize risk and complications of anaesthesia. At the end of internship, he/she should be able to perform cardio-pulmonary resuscitation correctly, including recognition of cardiac arrest.

2. THERAPEUTIC-

A. An intern must have observed or preferably assisted in:

- (i) Pre-anaesthetic checkup and prescribe pre-anaesthetic medications;
- (ii) Venepuncture and set up intravenous drip;
- (iii) Laryngoscopy and endotracheal intubation;
- (iv) Lumbar puncture, spinal anaesthesia and simple nerve blocks;
- (v) Simple general anaesthetic procedures under supervision;
- (vi) Monitor patients during anaesthesia and in the post-operative period;
- (vii) Maintain anaesthetic records;
- (viii) Perform cardio-pulmonary resuscitation correctly, including recognition of cardiac arrest.

B. Skill that an intern should be able to perform under supervision:

- (i) Counseling and advise regarding various methods of anaesthesia;
- (ii) Recognise problems associated with emergency anaesthesia;
- (iii) Recognise and assist in treating complications in the post-operative period.

C. An intern must have observed or preferably assisted at the following operations/ procedures Anaesthesia for major and minor surgical and other procedures.

(E). OBSTETRICS AND GYNAECOLOGY

1. **Goal-**The aim of posting of an intern in Obstetrics & Gynaecology is to impart such knowledge and skills that may enable him/ her to diagnose and manage antenatal and post natal follow up; manage labor and detect intra-partum emergencies; diagnose and treat common gynaecologic ailments.

2. THERAPEUTIC-

A. An intern must perform or assist in:

- (i) Diagnosis of early pregnancy and provision of ante-natal care; antenatal pelvic assessment and detection of cephalo-pelvic disproportion;
- (ii) Diagnosis of pathology of pregnancy related to:
 - abortion;
 - ectopic pregnancy;
 - tumours complicating pregnancy;
 - acute abdomen in early pregnancy;
 - hyperemesis gravidarum;
- (iii) Detection of high risk pregnancy cases and give suitable advice e.g. PIH, hydramnios, antepartum haemorrhage, multiple pregnancies, abnormal presentations and intra-uterine growth retardation;
- (iv) Induction of labor and amniotomy under supervision, Management of normal labor, detection of abnormalities, post-partum hemorrhage and repair of perineal tears,

- (v) Assist in forceps delivery;
- (vi) Detection and management of abnormalities of lactation;
- (vii) Evaluation and prescription oral contraceptives with counseling;
- (viii) Per speculum, per vaginum and per rectal examination for detection of common congenital, inflammatory, neoplastic and traumatic conditions of vulva, vagina, uterus and ovaries;
- (ix) Medico-legal examination in Gynecology and Obstetrics.

B. Skills that an intern should be able to perform under supervision:

- (i) Dilatation and curettage and fractional curettage;
- (ii) Endometrial biopsy;
- (iii) Endometrial aspiration;
- (iv) Pap smear collection;
- (v) Intra Uterine Contraceptive Device (IUCD) insertion;
- (vi) Mini-lap-ligation;
- (vii) Urethral catheterization;
- (viii) Suture removal in post-operative cases;
- (ix) Cervical punch biopsy.

C. An intern must have observed or preferably assisted at the following operations/procedures:

- (i) Major abdominal and vaginal surgery cases;
- (ii) Second trimester Medical Termination of Pregnancy (MTP) procedures e.g. Emcredyl Prostaglandin instillations, Caesarean section.

(J). ORTHOPAEDICS

1. Goal:- The aim of posting of an intern in Orthopaedics and Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation is to impart such knowledge and skills that may enable him to diagnose and treat common ailments. He/she shall have ability to diagnose and suspect presence of fracture, dislocation, actual osteomyelitis, acute poliomyelitis and common congenital deformities such as congenital talipesquinovarus (CTEV) and dislocation of hip (CDH).

2. THERAPEUTIC-

A. An intern must have observed or preferably assisted in:

- (i) Splinting (plaster slab) for the purpose of emergency splintage, definitive splintage and post-operative splintage and application of Thomas splint;
- (ii) Manual reduction of common fractures – phalangeal, metacarpal, metatarsal and Colles' fracture;
- (iii) Manual reduction of common dislocations – interphalangeal, metacarpo-phalangeal, elbow and shoulder dislocations;
- (iv) Plaster cast application for un-displaced fractures of arm, fore arm, leg and ankle;
- (v) Emergency care of a multiple injury patient;
- (vi) Transport and bed care of spinal cord injury patients.

B. Skill that an intern should be able to perform under supervision:

- (i) Advise about prognosis of poliomyelitis, cerebral palsy, CTEV and CDH;
- (ii) Advise about rehabilitation of amputees and mutilating traumatic and leprosy deformities of hand.

C. An intern must have observed or preferably assisted at the following operations:

- (i) Drainage for acute osteomyelitis;
- (ii) Sequestrectomy in chronic osteomyelitis;
- (iii) Application of external fixation;
- (iv) Internal fixation of fractures of long bones.

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(k). PHYSICAL MEDICINE AND REHABILITATION

1. **Goal:-** The aim of posting of an intern in Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation is to impart such knowledge and skills that may enable him/ her to diagnose and treat common rheumatologic, orthopedic and neurologic illnesses requiring physical treatment. He/she shall acquire competence for clinical diagnosis based on history, physical examination and relevant laboratory investigations and institute appropriate line of management.

2. THERAPEUTIC-

A. An intern must have observed or preferably assisted in:-

(i) Diagnosing and managing with competence clinical diagnosis and management based on detailed history and assessment of common disabling conditions like poliomyelitis, cerebral palsy, hemiplegia, paraplegia, amputations, etc.;

(ii) Participation as a team member in total rehabilitation including appropriate follow up of common disabling conditions;

(iii) Procedures of fabrication and repair of artificial limbs and appliances.

B. An intern must have observed or preferably assisted at the following operations/ procedures:

(i) Use of self-help devices and splints and mobility aids;

(ii) Accessibility problems and home-making for disabled;

(iii) Simple exercise therapy in common conditions like prevention of deformity in polio, stump exercise in an amputee, etc.;

(iv) Therapeutic counselling and follow-up.

(l). OTORHINOLARYNGOLOGY (ENT)-

1. **Goal:-** The aim of posting of an intern in ENT is to impart such knowledge and skills that may enable him to diagnose and treat common otorhinolaryngological conditions such as ear pain, foreign bodies and acquire ability for a comprehensive diagnosis of common Ear, Nose and Throat (ENT) diseases including emergencies and malignant neoplasms of the head and neck.

2. THERAPEUTIC

A. An intern must have observed or preferably assisted in:

(i) Ear syringing, antrum puncture and packing of the nose for epistaxis;

(ii) Nasal douching and packing of the external canal;

(iii) Removing foreign bodies from nose and ear;

(iv) Observing or assisting in various endoscopic procedures and tracheostomy.

B. Skill that an intern should be able to perform under supervision-

(i) Intern shall have participated as a team member in the diagnosis of various ENT-related diseases and be aware of National programme on prevention of deafness;

(ii) Intern shall acquire knowledge of various ENT related rehabilitative programmes.

C. An intern must have observed or preferably assisted at the following operations/ procedures:

Intern shall acquire skills in the use of head mirror, otoscope and indirect laryngoscopy and first line of management of common Ear Nose and Throat (ENT) problems.

(m). OPHTHALMOLOGY

1. **Goal:-** The aim of posting of an intern in ophthalmology is to impart such knowledge and skills that may enable him to diagnose and treat common ophthalmological conditions such as Trauma, Acute conjunctivitis, allergic conjunctivitis, xerosis, entropion, corneal ulcer, iridocyclitis, myopia, hypermetropia, cataract, glaucoma, ocular injury and sudden loss of vision.

2. THERAPEUTIC-

A. An intern must have observed or preferably assisted in:

(i) Sub-conjunctival injection;

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- (ii) Ocular bandaging;
- (iii) Removal of concretions;
- (iv) Epilation and electrolysis;
- (v) Corneal foreign body removal;
- (vi) Cauterization of corneal ulcers;
- (vii) Chalazion removal;
- (viii) Entropion correction;
- (ix) Suturing conjunctival tears;
- (x) Lids repair;
- (xi) Glaucoma surgery (assisted);
- (xii) Enucleation of eye in cadaver.

B. Skill that an intern should be able to perform under supervision:

Advise regarding methods for rehabilitation of the blind.

C. An intern must have observed or preferably assisted at the following operations/procedures:

- (i) Assessment of refractive errors and advise its correction;
- (ii) Diagnose ocular changes in common systemic disorders;
- (iii) Perform investigative procedures such as tonometry, syringing;
- (iv) direct ophthalmoscopy, subjective refraction and fluorescein staining of cornea.

(n). FORENSIC MEDICINE AND TOXICOLOGY

1. **Goal:-** The aim of posting of an intern in Forensic Medicine and Toxicology is to impart such knowledge and skills that may enable him to identify and know the basic procedures related to medico-legal cases.

If the college/ institute is deficient in autopsy facilities, MOU shall be signed with center in the same district so as to provide training to interns.

2 An intern must have observed or preferably assisted in:

- (i) Documentation and certification of trauma;
- (ii) Diagnosis and certification of death;
- (iii) Legal documentation related to emergency cases;
- (iv) Certification of medical-legal cases e.g. Age estimation, sexual assault, etc.;
- (v) Establishing communication in medico-legal cases with police, public health authorities, other concerned departments, etc.

B. An intern must have observed a medico-legal autopsy/ post-mortem.

XIII. LAB SERVICES CONSISTING OF CLINICAL PATHOLOGY, LABORATORY MEDICINE, BIOCHEMISTRY AND HEMATOLOGY SERVICES ALONG WITH BLOOD BANKING

An intern must be able to **PERFORM** without assistance and interpret the results of the following laboratory investigations:

- (i) Blood: Complete blood count including Platelet count, peripheral blood smear preparation and examination including malarial parasites;
- (ii) Urine: (Routine chemical and microscopic examination);
- (iii) Stool: (for ova/cyst and occult blood);
- (iv) Blood Banking: Blood grouping (manual), saline cross-matching;
- (v) Sputum and throat swab for Gram stain and acid-fast stain;
- (vi) Cerebrospinal Fluid (CSF) for proteins, sugar and smear;

- (vii) Performing blood sugar test by glucometer;
- (viii) Pleural and ascitic fluid for routine chemistry and microscopy;
- (ix) Draw blood by venepuncture independently and collect samples in appropriate bottles in proper order;
- (x) Correctly collect and transport samples and specimens for blood tests, culture, histopathology and cytopathology investigations;
- (xi) Fill requisition forms appropriately.

(o). CASUALTY SERVICES/ EMERGENCY MEDICINE

1. **Goal:-**The aim of posting of an intern in casualty is to impart such knowledge and skills that may enable him/her to diagnose and treat common acute surgical /medical ailments. He/she shall have ability to diagnose and suspect, with reasonable accuracy, acute surgical illnesses including emergencies, resuscitate critically injured patient and a severely burned patient, control surface bleeding and manage open wounds and monitor and institute first-line management of patients of head, spine, chest, abdominal and pelvic injury as well as acute abdomen.

2. THERAPEUTIC-

A. An intern must perform or assist in:

- (i) Identification of acute emergencies in various disciplines of medical practice;
- (ii) Management of acute anaphylactic shock;
- (iii) Management of peripheral-vascular failure and shock;
- (iv) Management of acute pulmonary edema and Left Ventricular Failure (LVF);
- (v) Emergency management of drowning, poisoning and seizure;
- (vi) Emergency management of bronchial asthma and status asthmaticus;
- (vii) Emergency management of hyperpyrexia;
- (viii) Emergency management of comatose patients regarding airways, positioning, prevention of aspiration and injuries;
- (ix) Assessment and administering emergency management of burns;
- (x) Assessing and implementing emergency management of various trauma victims;
- (xi) Identification of medico-legal cases and learn filling up of forms as well as complete other medico-legal formalities in cases of injury, poisoning, sexual offenses, intoxication and other unnatural conditions.

B. Skill that an intern should be able to perform under supervision:

- (i) Advise about prognosis of acute surgical illnesses, head injury, trauma and burns. Counsel patients regarding the same;
- (ii) Electrocardiogram(ECG);
- (iii) Routine radiographs of chest, abdomen, skull, etc.

C. An intern must have observed or preferably assisted at the following operations/ procedures:

- (i) Resuscitation of critical patients;
- (ii) documentation medico legal cases;
- (iii) management of bleeding and application of splints.

(p)DERMATOLOGY, VENEREOLOGY AND LEPROSY

Goal:-The aim of posting of an intern in Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy is to impart such knowledge and skills that may enable him to diagnose and treat common dermatological infections and leprosy. He/she shall acquire competence for clinical diagnosis based on history, physical examination and relevant laboratory investigations and institute appropriate line of management; this would include diseases common in tropics (parasitic, bacterial or viral infections, and cutaneous manifestations of systemic illnesses.

2. THERAPEUTIC-

A. At the end of Internship an intern must be able to:

- (i) Conduct proper clinical examination; elicit and interpret physical findings, and diagnose common disorders and emergencies;
- (ii) Manage common diseases recognizing the need for referral for specialized care in case of inappropriateness of therapeutic response.

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B. An intern must have observed or preferably assisted at the following procedures:

(i) Perform simple, routine investigative procedures for making bedside diagnosis, specially the examination of scraping for fungus, preparation of slit smears and staining for AFB for leprosy patient and for STD cases;

(ii) Skin biopsy for diagnostic purpose.

(q). RESPIRATORY MEDICINE-

Goal:-The aim of posting of an intern in Respiratory Medicine is to impart such knowledge and skills that may enable him/her to diagnose and treat common respiratory illnesses. He/she shall acquire competence for clinical diagnosis based on history, physical examination and relevant laboratory investigations and institute appropriate line of management.

2. THERAPEUTIC –**A. An intern must perform or assist in:**

(i) Diagnosing and managing common respiratory disorders and emergencies;

(ii) Simple, routine investigative procedures required for making bed side diagnosis, especially sputum collection, examination for etiological organism like AFB, interpretation of chest X-rays and respiratory function tests;

(iii) Interpreting and managing various blood gases and pH abnormalities in various illnesses.

B. An intern must have observed or preferably assisted at the following operations/ procedures:

(i) Laryngoscopy;

(ii) Pleural aspiration, respiratory physiotherapy, laryngeal intubation and pneumo- thoracic drainage aspiration;

(iii) Therapeutic counseling and follow up.

(r). RADIO-DIAGNOSIS

1. Goal:-The aim of posting of an intern in radio-diagnosis is to impart such knowledge and skills that may enable him/ her to understand principles of imageology and recognize risk and complications of radiologic procedures and the need for protective techniques. At the end of internship, he/she should be able to counsel and prepare patients for various radiologic procedures.

A. An intern must acquire competency in:

(i) Identifying and diagnosing acute abdominal conditions clinically and choose appropriate imaging modality for diagnosis;

(ii) Identifying and diagnosing acute traumatic conditions in bones and skull using X rays / CT Scans with emphasis on fractures and head injuries;

(iii) Recognising basic hazards and precautions in radio-diagnostic practices specially related to pregnancy;

(iv) Demonstrating awareness of the various laws like Pre-conception and Prenatal Diagnostic Techniques (Prohibition of Sex Selection) Act, 1994 (57 of 1994).

2. SPECIALTIES FOR TRAINING:

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SCHEDULE-IV

(See regulation 6 (b) and 7)

1 MENTOR- A mentor for intern shall possess postgraduate qualification in the subject concerned and shall be duly certified as a mentor for interns by Professor and Head of the Department concerned.

2 ASSESSMENT

(i) The intern shall maintain a record of work in a log book, which is to be verified and certified by the medical officer under whom he/she works.

(ii) Apart from scrutiny of the record of work, assessment and evaluation of training shall be undertaken by an objective approach using situation tests in knowledge, skills and attitude during and at the end of the training;

(a) The assessments shall predominantly test clinical/ practical skills.

(b) Feed-back mechanisms must be in place so that progress and deficiencies are conveyed to interns such that measures for correction and improvement can be instituted early and effectively.

(c) Based on the record of work and objective assessment at the end of each posting, the respective Head of the Unit and Head of the Department shall certify satisfactory completion of the posting.

(d) The Dean/Principal shall issue cumulative certificate of satisfactory completion of training at the end of internship.

(e) Interns shall have to undergo an eligibility licentiate test/NEXt step-2 whenever duly notified as a requisite to granting of Permanent Registration/ license to practice.

3 STIPEND

(a) All interns shall be paid stipend as fixed by the appropriate authority applicable to the institution/ University or State.

(b) Stipend may not be paid during any period of extension except in the case of maternity or paternity leave or medical leave, as may be recommended and approved by the Medical Board. Total stipend paid for the entire internship may be for fifty-two weeks (Twelve months) only.

4 TRAINING

(i). Internship training shall be supervised:

(a) The intern shall be entrusted with clinical responsibilities under direct supervision of a designated supervising physician or mentor in each department or supervisor who shall be a Faculty member.

(b) The supervisor shall be responsible for any ethical and legal issues related to interns being supervised by them.

(c) The restrictions of independent practice related to patient care and other services during internship are as in section 5.3(e).

(ii). Interns shall be given adequate opportunities to acquire competencies to become confident primary care physicians:

(a) The emphasis during internship shall be hands-on training applying the scientific and theoretical background gained during the undergraduate course.

(b) Based on the progress of knowledge, skill acquisition, graded responsibility for patient care should be given.

(c) Interns shall be trained to independently handle common acute emergencies and be aware of individual limitations and necessity of proper and timely referral of such cases to appropriate centres.

(iv). Interns shall be mentored to acquire effective communication and other skills that are necessary for empathetic and compassionate clinical care.

(v). Each medical college must ensure that the intern gets learning experience in the community:

(a) These shall include community and outreach activities, collaboration with rural and urban community health centers, participation in Government health programmes, etc.

(b) Internship should be increasingly scheduled to utilise clinical facilities available in District Hospital, Taluka Hospital, Community Health Centre and Primary Health Centre, in addition to Teaching Hospital.

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(c) A critical element of internship will be the acquisition of specific experiences and skill as listed in major areas:

Provided that where an intern is posted to District or Sub-Divisional Hospital for training, there shall be a committee consisting of representatives of the college/University, the State Government and the District administration, who shall regulate the training of such trainee.

(d) Provided further that, for such trainee a certificate of satisfactory completion of training shall be obtained from the relevant administrative authorities which shall be countersigned by the Principal or Dean of College.

NOTE:

The matter w.r.t. switch over the Annual Pattern to Semester System in Bachelor of Performing Arts (Vocal, Sitar Instrumental, Violin Instrumental, Tabla Instrumental and Kathak) offered in the Institute of Fine Arts (IMFA), a constituent college of the University of Jammu was deliberated in a meeting of the Board of Studies in Music held on 22.02.2021 wherein the Board of Studies prepared the Statutes/Scheme and Syllabi of the Bachelor of Performing Arts course as per Semester System. After thorough deliberations, it was resolved that:-

'The Statutes of Bachelor of Performing Arts (Vocal, Sitar Instrumental, Violin Instrumental, Tabla Instrumental and Kathak) Course be adopted under Semester System from the academic session 2023-24'.

On the afore mentioned recommendations of the Board of Studies, the Vice-Chancellor in anticipation of the approval of the Competent Bodies authorized the adoption of the Statutes governing the degree of Bachelor of Performing Arts (Vocal, Sitar Instrumental, Violin Instrumental, Tabla Instrumental and Kathak) from the Academic session 2023-24 onwards. Intake:

The number of seats in the First Semester of BPA Course shall not exceed 10 in each discipline of Vocal, Sitar, Violin, Tabla and Kathak Dance.

Medium of Instruction


English/Hindi shall be the medium of instruction and examination for BPA Course.

Eligibility and Selection Procedure

Every candidate for admission to the BPA Course must have passed the 10+2 examination of the J&K Board of School Education or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto with not less than 45% marks (40% in case of schedule caste/schedule tribe and other backward classes).

The age limit for a candidate seeking admission in IMFA First Semester BPA shall not exceed 23 years on 31st July.

A candidate seeking admission in Eight Semester BPA course shall have to appear in the audition test before the admission



committee, constituted by the Vice Chancellor every year at the time of issue of admission notification.

The aptitude test shall be as follows:

- a. Ability to sing or play any composition, like Chota Khayal, Bhajan, Lokgeet, Geet etc./knowledge of Swar, lay and ability to play simple rhythms in tabla/rhythm, expression and ability to dance on different beats.


- b. Counselling Session

While making selection, seats shall be reserved for persons belonging to the schedule caste/tribe and other backward classes (reservation) rules as adopted by the University Of Jammu. Candidate shall offer Vocal or Sitar or Violin or Tabla or Kathak (Dance) as their main subject for specialization at the time of admission only.

Languages

Candidate admitted in the First Semester of BPA shall offer language subjects i.e., General English or Hindi as taught in the Bachelor Degree Semester I and Semester II as per University.

- a. The candidate will be taught language subjects only in the First and Second semester of BPA Course and the

examination in these subjects will be held at the end of the semester along with other subjects.

- b. A student who is admitted to the 1st Semester BPA Course and has already passed two Semesters examination of the BA or B.Sc. or B.Com or B.Tech or any other equivalent Degree Course shall be exempted from offering English or Hindi.
- c. If a student does not pass the examination in any of these language subject at the end of the First and second semester, he/she will not be detained and is eligible for the promotion to the next higher semester and may take the examination again in tile subsequent semesters. However tile BPA course degree will be awarded only after the language subjects have been cleared. The examination in these subjects shall be conducted by the University of Jammu. The 1st Semester ESE of Hindi & English shall be conduct by IMFA as internal examination and 2nd Semester ESE. Exam of Hindi & English Shall be conducted by University of Jammu.


Readmission

BPA degree course students have to seek readmission after every two semesters i.e., year before the stipulated date.

Examination

The Mid Sem. Examination of each semester will be conducted in October and March of each semester of the

BPA course and the End Sem. Examination will be held in December and May.

The first, third, fifth and seventh semester End Sem. Examination shall be held by Institute of Music and Fine Arts as Home examination and Second, fourth, sixth and eighth semester, End Sem. Examination will be conducted by the University of Jammu.

Eligibility of the Examination

The university and Home examination shall be open to:-

- A. 1. A Regular candidate who has completed the prescribed 75% course of lectures/practicals in an each semester.
2. And has secured pass marks in the Mid Semester Exam (MSE) in all the subjects viz. practical and theory.
- B. A candidate who has completed the prescribed course of lectures/practicals and prescribed percentage of attendance in each semester and secured pass marks in the Mid Semester Exam but has been unable to appear in End Semester Exam or unable to pass the End Semester Exam shall be eligible to appear in the examination before appearing in the eighth semester including the semester in which he/she was either due to appear or having appeared and failed in the first instance, as the case may be.

Submission of application forms for examination

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Candidate shall submit his/her application form for the second, fourth, sixth and eighth semester examination to the controller of examinations on the prescribed form through the Principal, Institute of Music and Arts within the prescribed date and along with the prescribed fee for the examination.

Late entertainment of forms



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

Condonation of lectures

Deficiency in the number of attendance up to 5% of the lectures delivered during each semester may be condoned by the principal, Institute of Music and Fine Arts (IMFA).

Attendance in lieu of participation in co-curricular activities, games etc.

Any candidate who participates within the state or outside, a student workshop, short term training, under student exchange programme, a Gharana maestro, or attends national or international event/musical concert, organized by State Cultural Academy, Sangeet Natak Academy, or any other National Academy, or any other professional organization or assigned a 'special' project/programme or participant in Inter University sports tournaments games cultural and other co-curricular activities with the approval of Principal, Institute of Music and Fine Arts shall for the purpose of condoning deficiency on attendance incurred by him/her on account period not exceeding 15 working days in a semester.

- d. The Mid Semester examination duration for each theory and language paper will be of 1:30 hours. The Mid Semester examination duration for each practical subject i.e., viva (paper3) and stage performance (paper 4) shall be 20 to 30 minutes duration (for each student).

Elective Subject

- Vocal, Sitar, Violin, Tabla and Kathak dance are the elective subjects offered to the student as 5th subject.
- These subjects are introduced from 3rd semester to 8th semester.
- A student shall have to opt any above said one subject as elective subject for two semesters only continuously in 3rd and 4th semester.
- In 5th and 6th semester, the student has to opt any other subject as elective subject.
- In the 7th and 8th semester, the student has to opt any other subject other than elective subjects done so far.
- There will be 2 credit points for elective subject.
- No mid semester examination will be held there.
- End semester examination will be conducted by jury of examiners with concerned subject examiner (jury of examiners can be internal or can be external).
- There will be 50 marks of the elective subject.




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Home examination

- a. The ESE will be held at the end of first, third, fifth and seventh semester by IMFA internally.
- a. Students who are eligible to appear for the internal ESE will be examined for theory and practical subjects.
- b. For practical subjects, a jury with concerned subject expert, appointed by the Principal shall evaluate the ESE performances.
- c. The theory papers and the answer books will be set and checked by a committee set up by the principal Institute of Music and Fine Arts, Jammu.
- d. Any candidate who fails in any of the language paper/theory paper/practical paper in the ESE shall be placed under compartment in the language paper/theory paper/practical paper, he/she will not be detained and is eligible for the promotion to the next higher semester and may take the examination again in subsequent semesters. However the BPA course degree will be awarded only after failed subjects are cleared.

University Examination

- a. University Examination shall be held in second, fourth, sixth and eighth semesters of BPA course in all subjects of specialization.
- b. Candidates will be allowed to appear in the above examination only when they have secured 75% of


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attendance in all language, theory and practical subjects and completed prescribed class work and assignments to the satisfaction of the teacher concerned and Head of the Department.

- c. It will be compulsory to pass in each head of the examination viz., MSE and ESE in order to be declared as successful.
- d. The standard for passing for BPA course in all subjects will be minimum 40%.
- e. The examination duration for theory papers and the language papers shall be of 1:30 hour for MSE and 3 hours for ESE.
- f. The examination duration for Viva and stage performance (practical/demonstration) shall be 20 to 30 minutes for each student.

Pass Percentage

In order to secure a pass in ESE, a candidate shall be required to obtain 40% marks in each language and 40% in each viva & stage performance (practical/demonstration) test and theory paper and 40% of the total aggregate number of marks.

Provided that a candidate who fails in one paper in any End Semester Examination (ESE) of the BPA course, 1% marks shall be deemed to have passed the ESE examination, as the case may be.

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Provided further that a candidate after have been given the benefit of the statutory concession of 1% marks provided in the above clause and fails by one marks only shall be deemed to have passed the examination. Such marks shall be added in the paper while assessing the result of the candidate.


Statute Regarding Compartment

Any candidate who fails in any of the language paper/theory paper/practical paper in the ESE shall be placed under compartment in the language paper/theory paper/practical paper, he/she will not be detained and is eligible for the promotion to the next higher semester and may take the examination again in tile subsequent semesters. However tile BPA course degree will be awarded only after failed subjects are cleared.

Provided that the examination shall be completed within the time of completion of degree from the date of his/her failing in that paper in the first instance.

Provided that no candidate who passes in the supplementary examination shall be entitled to a scholarship or prize or honours.

A candidate who has failed in one theory or language paper/practical paper in any end semester examination and has passed all the remaining subjects of the said course shall be eligible to join the next higher semester of the bachelor's degree course in music provisionally, subject to the condition that he/she shall be required to pass the said course




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examination in full within the number of chances prescribed under statutes and in case, he/she fails to qualify the said semester examination and there are no further chances thus available to him/her to clear the theory or language paper/practical paper, his/her result of the higher examination shall be withheld unless he/she passes in the lower examination. If he/she fails to qualify in the paper within the permissible period of chances, he/she be declared to have failed in the examination and his or her provisional admission to the higher course and/or examination shall be treated as cancelled. If the result of higher examination is declared by mistake or oversight before he/she clears the preceding examination and there is no further chance available to him/her to pass the paper, the examination be quashed at any stage.

As soon as possible after the end of Eighth Semester (final) examination, the controller of examination shall publish a list of candidates indicating against each his/her result.

Successful candidates shall be classified as under:

- i. Those who obtain 75% or more of the aggregate number of marks shall be placed in Distinction Category.
- ii. Those who obtain 60% or more of the aggregate number of marks shall be placed in the first division.
- iii. Those who obtain 50% or more of the aggregate number of marks shall be placed in the Second division.





- iv. Those who obtain above 40% or more of the aggregate number of marks shall be declared as pass in the third division.

Each successful candidate shall be awarded a certificate stating the division in which he/she has passed and distinction obtained in the paper, if any.

- a. Each course will be assigned as specific number of specific credit point.
- b. Credit hours imply the number of studio hours assigned for studio courses per week and number of lectures prescribed for theory courses per week.
- c. The value in terms of marks of one credit point will be 25 marks. Total credit points per week are 22. Students are required to earn 16 credit points per week i.e., equivalent to 75% of credit points in each subject for eligibility
- d. In determining the credit point in terms of marks obtained by a student, the quality of assignments/projects and performances in class tests by him/her will be considered.

To consider the matter with regard to Invitation to Prof. Guido Meinhold, Professor and Chair of Exogenous Geology/Sedimentology, TU Bergakademie Freiberg, Institute of Geology, Freiberg, Germany as Visiting Professor to University of Jammu.

NOTE:

The University statutes in Chapter III (37) enlists the provision stating that "distinguished persons, having special competence in one or other of the fields of study covered by the University, may with the approval of the University Council/Syndicate, be invited by the Vice-Chancellor to function as Visiting Professors or Assistant Professors, as the case may be, in the University. These Visiting Professors or Assistant Professors can be drawn either from within India or abroad".

Prof. Guido Meinhold is a full Professor and Chair of Exogenous Geology/Sedimentology, TU Bergakademie Freiberg, Institute of Geology, Freiberg, Germany. He has been a Visiting Assistant Professor at the Department of Geology, University of Jammu, and also a PhD supervisor to one of the research scholars in the department. The research scholar was invited by Prof. Guido to Germany who worked in his laboratory for three months. To consider the matter w.r.t. introduction of International Immersion Programme/Industrial Visit (International) in the Course Curriculum of MBA (International Business) Programme.

NOTE:

International Centre for Cross Cultural Research and Human Resource Management, University of Jammu (ICCCR & HRM), proposes to introduce **International Immersion Programme/Industrial Visit (International)** in the Course Curriculum of MBA (International Business) Programme.

The prevalence of international business has increased manifold due to the liberalization of trade & investment and the development of technology. Today, almost all companies, large or small, are affected by global events and competition because most sell output to and/or secure suppliers from foreign countries and/or compete against products and services that come from abroad. MBA in International Business (MBA-IB) at University of Jammu is a postgraduate programme that is designed to equip the students/managers with the sufficient knowledge and training needed to run business in globalised world. All reputed institutions across globe and India including IIMs, Indian Institute of Foreign trade (IIFT), International Management Institute (IMI), Delhi, Management Development Institute (MDI) Gurugram, Indian Business School (ISB), Hyderabad etc. have introduced 'International Immersion Programme' in their course curriculum by including one or more of the various interventions like- class room teaching/ workshops/simulation exercises, industry visits, cultural visits/short-term programmes/student exchange programmes etc. Such programmes would broaden the vision of students, impart cultural sensitivity, enhance emotional and cultural intelligence, enhance employability besides adding USP to the MBA (International Business) programme. The prospective recruiters are also more receptive to profiles which had prior experience of dealing with international business and diversity.

The Board of Studies in International Business on its meeting held on February 13, 2020 duly approve of the introduction of the International Immersion Programme/Industrial Visit (International) (Minutes attached) in terms of the benefits that it can bring to the students as well as establishing relations with international institutions and organizations for the holistic positioning of the MBA(IB) Programme. Also, the programme shall be of 2 credits and optional for the students.

Also, under the Curriculum Reform Workshops held under RUSA-II, it has been strongly recommended to introduce this component into the curriculum considering the nomenclature and international nature of the MBA (International Business) Programme.

Initially the Department will approach national management institutions having international campuses for organizing such a Programme. A reasonable cost for the conduct of the programme shall be borne by the department and the students willing to take up the Programme. In the first phase, neighboring countries like Nepal, Bhutan, Sri Lanka, Maldives, Dubai etc shall be approached particularly in those cases where the reputed national management institutes have their campuses. Once the programme has taken shape, management institutions in developed countries shall be targeted.

It is expected that the inclusion of the International Immersion Programme to the course curriculum of the MBA (International Business) Programme would enable the students to:

1. Gain a deeper understanding of the global business issues and contexts.
2. Facilitate experiential learning and develop a global mindset.
3. Appreciate cross cultural differences, nuances, caveats and challenges while simultaneously building cross cultural synergy.
4. Develop the cross cultural competencies and skills needed to function effectively in multinational organizations.
5. Augment their cultural intelligence and help them gain a broader understanding of international business negotiations and cross border decision making.

The matter was placed before the Academic Council at its meeting held on 04.06.2020 and the Academic Council vide resolution No. 3.23.2 resolved that -

"the item was deferred."

As per the recommendations of the Departmental Affairs Committee of the ICcCR&HRM, the matter is re-submitted to the Academic Council for consideration. The minutes of the DAC is placed as Annexure.

Business like IIFT, New Delhi; IIMS; LPU, Jalandhar; MDI, Gurgaon; ISB Hyderabad etc.

Therefore, inclusion of International Immersion Programmes/ International visits would enhance the overall value for the Programme



Proposal for the introduction of MPA programme in Institute of Music and Fine Arts, University of Jammu

About IMFA

Institute of Music and fine arts was established in the year 1964 by the Academy of Art Culture and Languages as hobby classes centre of Music and Fine Arts, on popular demand IMFA was granted affiliation by Jammu University in 1974 and boost the academic level of teaching. University of Jammu took over IMFA, From the Academy of Art Culture and Languages in 2011. IMFA has trained 45 batches of Music graduates, who are serving society in various capacities as Asstt. Professors, Associate Professors, Professors in various colleges and Universities, Artists, Music Directors, Choreographers, Dance Directors and critics as well.

Even after the merger of IMFA to University of Jammu i.e., from 2011 IMFA still running only Undergraduate course whereas Universities are especially known for in-depth research & generate awareness about subjects which is only possible after PG course. It is expected from our esteemed University to start MPA course for the students of Vocal, Sitar, Violin, Tabla & Kathak Dance of IMFA & other deserving students of above said field so that equal avenues shall open for all.

As the world is pivoting towards things beyond the usual, so this learning will not only make them self sufficient in earning aspect but also it will help them shine in the crowd & give them wings to achieve the heights of their wish. They can join Music Industries as Music Directors, Music Composer, Choreographer, Dance Director & can open their own Institution to promote music. Through the introduction of MPA course in IMFA will open the doors for localities to enhance their qualifications in the respective fields viz., Vocal, Sitar, Violin, Tabla & Kathak Dance. There would be many platforms which will become accessible to the students after the completion of above said course in IMFA. As said earlier, IMFA is the

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premier Institution of our UT not only the students of UT come to pursue their graduation rather students from adjoining states are also pursuing their undergraduate course in IMFA.

Detail of the course

There shall be following course of study in the MPA Course: -

MPA course offers 2 Years i.e., 4 Semester Course in performing arts in the following discipline:

1. Hindustani Classical Vocal Music
2. Hindustani Classical Sitar Instrumental
3. Hindustani Classical Violin Instrumental
4. Hindustani Classical Tabla Instrumental
5. Indian Classical Dance Kathak

Intake Capacity

The number of seats in the 1st Semester of MPA course shall not exceed 10 in each discipline of Vocal, Sitar, Violin, Tabla & Dance.

***Bifurcation of Seats:**

1. Vocal- Number of seats- 10
2. Sitar- Number of seats- 10
3. Violin- Number of seats- 10
4. Tabla- Number of seats- 10
5. Kathak Dance- Number of seats- 10

This course will run under **self supporting scheme**. Each seat shall be payable, salaries of engaged staff for teaching and accompaniment will be drawn from the fees of the students for smooth run of the trial base initial Semesters. University is expected to contribute finances as seed money i.e., Rs. 5,00,000/- Each Department. Three persons shall be engaged, two for establishment and one for Multitasking purpose.

Engagement of contractual/permanent staff in the Department of Vocal, Sitar, Violin, Tabla & Kathak Dance shall be on Lecture basis i.e., 500/-Per Lecture subject to maximum of 2 lectures per day including conveyance allowance, further subject to a maximum of Rs. 20,000/- Per month on the terms & conditions and according to time table. The salaries shall be met out of the collection of fees from the students.

Note:- MPA course initially will commence at Music Department, IMFA, Poonch House building in evening session, till the further suitable infrastructural arrangement as building is already occupied for ongoing UG courses till 3 PM.

Eligibility & selection procedure

Every candidate for admission to MPA course must be graduate from recognised University with 45% marks (40% in case of SC/ST/OBC etc.)

A candidate seeking admission to 2 years i.e., 4 Semester MPA course in Music viz . Vocal, Sitar, Violin, Tabla & Kathak Dance shall have to appear in the Aptitude Test designed for all streams. Final selection shall be made by the admission committee constituted by the VC every year at the time of issue of admission notification. For purpose of admission, equal weightage shall be given to the percentage of marks obtained by the candidate in graduation examination & his/her performance in the aptitude test.





ITEM No.: 3.2

To consider the introduction of the proposed one year PG Diploma course in Cultural and Heritage Tourism in Jammu region in the Department of History, University of Jammu.

NOTE:

The state of tourism in the union territory of Jammu and Kashmir has always been imaged and imagined through the lens of Kashmir. This has led to a regional imbalance in the footfall of tourists, be it cultural, historical, or even eco-tourism. While the continuing Kashmir-centric discourse on tourism and the similar orientation of our policymakers has led to the creation of several stereotypic image leading to stark regional imbalance in tourism sector. Even a cursory glance at the available data is enough to bring out the fact that while Kashmir has remained the prime destination for tourists of all hues, Jammu, on the other hand, has turned into a tourist destination of marginal concern and has never been considered as an independent tourist destination. The only sector which receives an appreciable footfall of tourists is the religious tourism. The available data shows that in the current year Kashmir has received several Lakhs of tourists out of which 95% were leisure tourism of different kinds and only 2% were religious tourists. In the case of the Jammu region the situation is diametrically opposite as out of the total number of the tourists in this region 98% were religious tourists and only 2 % were leisure tourists. Even in terms of the varieties of tourist destination, the region of Jammu falls far shorts of its counterpart. This unargued focus on Kashmir at the cost of marginalizing the tremendous touristic potential of Jammu has no academic justification. The history and culture of the Jammu region might not have been as well recorded as the Kashmir region, yet the archeological remains on the grounds and rich content of oral tradition, the unparalleled trajectories of historical and cultural developments in the region have been no less fascinating than Kashmir. The occurrence of the reference to this region in the Vedic literature, the archeological finds of Indus valley cultures, the site of huge Buddhist monastery at Ambaran, and the temple complex of Krimchi and Babor are some of the evidences of this fact. Even in terms of topography, the region encompasses an entire range of geographical features ranging from sub-tropical plain areato the temperate mountain zone which can easily be developed for Eco-tourism. Famous in history as the land of Duggars, this region also has the potential to offer various elements of cultural tourism. We have the folk dances such as Bhagatain, Gitlu, Hirna, Karak, Phummani, the various folk songs of Jammu such as Karak (a ballad), Bakh, Gawatri, Karkan (a ballad) Baran (a ballad), etc., its theatre, which is also called as 'Tamachra' the operatic folk theatre of Duggar, which are the unique cultural attributes of the region. Thus all taken together, the region has immense tourism potential not only because of its unmatched, often untouched, beauty but also for its rich cultural heritage, architecture, unique cuisines, and historical developments.

To bring out the potential for Cultural, Heritage and eco-tourism of the Jammu region, both in the domain of academic discourse and in the realm of policy formulation, it is proposed that a Diploma course, with the title of Cultural and Heritage tourism, may please be introduced. While at the level of pedagogy, it may play an effective role in dissolving the regional boundaries and the greater integration of the region with the nation, at a functional level it would bring out the potential of the region to develop different types of tourist destinations, mainly the cultural -Heritage and eco-tourism. It also has the potential to open up a new

window for resources, both investments, and generation, leading to employment generation as well as the socio-economic development of the local populace at large.

The courses under this would be designed to impart to students skills, based upon aspects of historical and cultural knowledge, that would be of practical use to them for a variety of career options. The course is expected to enhance student's ability to understand and appreciate the rich cultural and material heritage of India in general and that of the Jammu region in particular. While the courses will build a deep respect for places of interest, at the same time will also make the student aware of the institutional and technical processes involving conservation, maintenance, and knowledge dissemination of heritage in its widest sense.

After completing this course students would be oriented to examine how heritage objects may be sustained and developed to grow the local and national economy and how culture and heritage be situated in the context of marketing and tourism.

MBA with specialization in HR, Banking & Finance, Marketing and Operations is gradually fading and sectoral MBA with specialisation in International Business, Tourism & Hospitality, Aviation, Big Data Analytics, Communications & Branding, Digital Marketing, Energy Management, Family Business & Entrepreneurship, Healthcare or Hospital Management, Logistics & Supply Chain Management, Retail Management, Rural Management, Sports Management, Telecom Management etc. are up surging fast in developed and developing nations across the globe. Graduates with sectoral MBA specialisation find remunerative jobs in Asia Pacific regions, Brazil, USA etc. Recruiters today also look for candidates who have a fundamental understanding of the business inside out and integrate smoothly into a fragile institutional framework in the current business scenario. Such programmes also align with the Atmanirbhar Bharat Campaign of the Government of India to provide job-oriented courses and skill development in business & its allied areas for employment, empowerment and area development.

1. A valid CAT / AIMA-MAT/CMAT score,
2. A Bachelor's Degree (10+2+3 pattern) with at least 50% marks or equivalent CGPA in any discipline from a recognized Indian University or any other equivalent examination with 50% marks and
3. Group discussion and personal interview

Beyond the above-mentioned eligibility admission criteria for sectoral MBA Programmes, the Institutional Management Entrance Test/University Entrance Test is also being conducted by several Universities. The main purpose of conducting such admission entrance examinations/tests is to judge the student's ability, sharpness, knowledge etc. who could not apply and appear in CAT/MAT/CMAT due to several socio-economic and personal reasons.

It has also been observed through past years' admissions data, that it is mostly students from urban areas who are aware of this programme and seek admission to same. Also, to tap the unexplored potential among the youth in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir and to fulfil the objectives envisaged in the NEP, it becomes imperative to create awareness and promote this programme in such areas so that quality education reaches all the corners of UT of Jammu and Kashmir and even outside the area.

JUET provides equal opportunity and access to quality education through its widespread entrance centres viz. Jammu, Kathua, Udhampur, Kishtwar, Baderwah, Rajouri, Poonch and Srinagar.

The inclusion of additional admission eligibility criteria viz. Institutional Management Entrance Test and JUET for admission to the MBA (International Business) Programme would facilitate students across the entire region to have access, knowledge and opportunity to become a part of this specialized/sectoral Programme and explore career options in the domain.

The MBA (International Business) Programme offers various experiential learning interventions like placement preparation workshops, personality development workshops, business plan competitions, field visits to national and local industries, interactions with industry and academia experts at both national as well as international levels, case-study methodology in teaching, business simulations, virtual and in-person internships etc. Collaborations with bodies like AIMA, JKEDI, CII etc. also facilitate in broadening the knowledge horizon for the students who are part of this programme. Therefore, admission to this Programme through Institutional Management Entrance Test and JUET would enable the students in these areas also to have an access to this kind of learning which can enhance their scope for employability as well as entrepreneurial intent.

In a DAC meeting held in the office of Director, ICCCR & HRM, University of Jammu on November 15, 2022 (The minutes are placed as Annexure), it was unanimously decided:

1. First preference for admission to MBA(International Business) be given to students with CAT/MAT/CMAT scores and 50% in graduation.
2. Second preference for admission to MBA (International Business) Programme be given to students who score 50% marks in Institutional Management Entrance Test and 50% in graduation.
3. If seats still remain vacant, opportunity shall be provided to eligible students who have opted for this Programme under JUET.

To consider the matter w.r.t. revival of Gandhian Studies Centre in the University of Jammu, Jammu.

NOTE:

The Gandhian Studies Centre was established as an independent Centre by the UGC in the University of Jammu in 2005. This Centre functioned as an independent Centre till March 2012 and was funded by the UGC. Thereafter the University of Jammu started the process of merger of the Gandhian Study Centre with the Department of Political Science and it was finally merged with the Department of Political Science in 2015. It is pertinent to mention that this Centre was established by the UGC in Project mode and it stopped functioning as the UGC stopped its funding after 31.03.2012. Meaning thereby that the University merged this Centre with the Department of Political Science when it was already dysfunctional.

Now the University of Jammu wants to revive Gandhian Studies Centre as an independent entity on the premises of the University. Keeping in view, the relevance of Gandhi's ideas in contemporary India. His ideas like non-violence, democratic world order, Peace, Sustainable development etc have become more relevant in the contemporary era. Therefore, it is proposed that an item may be placed in the Academic Council for its revival and the University Grant Commission, New Delhi may be approached for grant.

Hence, the matter is submitted for consideration.

ITEM No.: 3.5

To consider the request for introducing five year integrated B.Com LLB course at Udhampur Campus, University of Jammu with the objective to provide in-depth knowledge of the concepts, values and development of the Indian legal system and key areas of business law and to help the graduates building their self-confidence, knowledge, and skills that will provide added benefit to them.

NOTE:

LLB is considered to be one of the most prestigious degrees which offer numerous career options in both public and private sectors. When this discipline is integrated with a commerce background with B.Com, the dual degree course offers career options ranging from litigate lawyer, judge, legal consultants, legal advisors, and legal managers to PO managers. B.Com LLB is an integrated undergraduate programme of five years focused on the study of commerce along with the in-depth study of law & legislature. The programme is designed meticulously by industry experts and renowned academicians that prepare students for the business world with expertise in corporate law and regulatory affairs. While pursuing B.Com LLB programme students develop fundamental concepts of subjects like Marketing Management, Organizational Behaviour, Cost & Management Accounting, Environmental Law, Corporate Law, and Jurisprudence. This program aims to impart valuable insights in the business functions like Finance, International Business, Marketing, Human Resource Management, and understanding of corporate laws in the fields of Investment Banking, Corporate Governance, Insurance, Mergers and Acquisitions. The significant thing about B.Com LLB Course is that it creates ample opportunities for its aspirants. According to the area of interest and career objective, students can easily switch their roles. Case studies, guest lectures, and industrial visits included in the program impart valuable insights into the functioning of corporate law in the business world. The course provides the aspirants an opportunity to furnish themselves with the knowledge of our legal system established within the constitutional framework and its working. One not only enhances their skill on the aspects of governance and policies but also well equips them with various managerial aspects. The course aims at imparting legal education as well as various aspects related to commerce. It benefits the students by making them understand how central and state governments function and how legislations are enacted and enforced along with its working. It enhances the managerial as well as advocacy skill of the professionals taking the course.

B.Com LLB is a 5 year integrated law program focusing on both the legal as well as the commerce and business subjects. It helps students get a good knowledge of legal matters in business and candidates need to clear all the papers in eight years which is the maximum duration to complete this law course. As part of an integrated B.Com LLB course, aspirants are taught various topics by means of classroom teaching, case studies and moot courts. B.Com LLB syllabus is focused on various components of law in an economic context. This program aims to accomplish this goal by combining economic sciences knowledge, including accounts, finance, economics, and law. After completing this course students will get both degree B.Com and LLB.

The five year B.Com LLB integrated course will primarily be focussing on following objectives:

1. To provide comprehensive knowledge of Law to the students and acquaint them with the Indian legal system.
2. To acquaint the students with the specialized fields of legal profession.
3. To equip them with the required knowledge and skills so that they may become successful professionals.
4. To provide, highly competent legal professionals to the society and the industry.
5. To provide exposure to the students to the wide ranging legal affairs that would help them shape their understanding of the same with clarity and strengthen their roots.
6. To be the perigee of legal education which further facilitate the students to have strong foundations of legal knowledge.

In Udhampur district and adjoining areas there are many educational institutions which are offering B.Com degree course. Presently, two governments and one private college are offering B.Com degree program. Neither government nor private institute is offer 5 year integrated B.Com LLB program in the entire Udhampur district and its adjoining areas. For this reason, Udhampur Campus has initiated the plan to incorporate this program in Udhampur District of Jammu and Kashmir UT. Besides this, Udhampur Campus has also conducted a survey within its operational area and found out that the students are very kin and interested in this degree. This indicates that there is a chance to enhance the dimensions of Udhampur Campus by introducing this integrated course in the Campus.

Hence, the matter is submitted for the consideration of the Academic Council.

ITEM No.: 3.6

To consider the proposal regarding the start of Four-Year Integrated Course in B.Pharm (Bachelor of Pharmacy) at Udhampur Campus, University of Jammu with the objective to train the students about various drugs and their formulations and to maintain a standardised quality of people's health and living.

NOTE:

The Healthcare sector is an important sector that prevents diseases and thereby promotes good health. Thus, it has a great impact on the lives of people. Being one of the pillars of the health care system, Pharmacy is influencing the life-standards of society. It is a growing industry that is full of career opportunities and the incessant expansion of this industry has made it one of the best career paths for the youth today. The discipline of Pharmacy has been in existence for a long time and is a sun shine sector. As the world is still passing through a calamitous pandemic, the pharmacists are continuously struggling to combat it. Likewise, there are innumerable areas in which extensive research keeps going on. This allows candidates and even companies to come up with trailblazing experiments and inventions. Consequently, more and more students think of pursuing a career in this field. This in turn increases the demand for careers in Pharmacy.

Further, the pharmaceutical market is one of the few sectors that have shown double-digit Compounded Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) in the last few years. To meet the demand of the ever-expanding Indian pharmaceutical market, All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) last year increased the diploma, undergraduate and postgraduate admission seats in pharmacy institutes across the country. Also, the class 12 science stream students who wish to join the healthcare sector and want to look for career option apart from being a medical professional can pursue a career in pharmacy. Therefore, realising the importance of this course, Udhampur Campus is all set to work for the betterment of the youth, society, local community etc. in its best possible way by introducing B. Pharm degree course in its Campus premises. The main goal of this course will be to train the students about various drugs and their formulations and to maintain a standardised quality of people's health and living.

The Four-year Integrated Course in B.Pharm will primarily be focusing on following objectives:

- To produce Pharmacy graduates with strong fundamental concepts and high technical competence in pharmaceutical sciences and technology.



10. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

No candidate shall be eligible for admission to the first year of B.Pharm course until he /she has :-

- (i) attained or shall attain the age of 17 years on 31 December of the year of his / her admission to the Course.
- (ii) passed the Higher Secondary Part-II examination (10+2 pattern) of the J & K State Board of School Education or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto with English, Physics, Chemistry and one of the following subjects taken together.
 - a) Mathematics
 - b) Biology
 - c) Computer Science
 - d) Bio-technology

Or

- (iii) has passed any other qualification approved by the Pharmacy Council of India as equivalent to any of the above examinations.
- (iv) direct admission to semester of B Pharm course shall be open to a candidate who has passed Diploma Pharmacy examination of J&K Government Examining Board or of any other State, subject to the condition that the candidate fulfils the requirements of Pharmacy Council of India.

11. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

11.1 The admission to the first year B. Pharmacy course shall be made on the basis of:

- (i) Merit of the candidates in the Common Entrance Test conducted by Board of Professional Entrance Examination or any competent Authority constituted/ notified by the UT Govt for the purpose
- (ii) Medical fitness of the candidate for which the selected candidates will furnish a medical certificate to the Principal of the College from a Medical Officer to the effect that the candidate is fit for undergoing the Degree course in Pharmacy.
- (iii) On payment of admission, course fee and other College fee as prescribed by a competent authority.

11.2 Direct admission to 3rd Semester may be permitted on the following considerations:-

(i) Merit of the candidate in the Part II of Diploma Pharmacy examination to be determined by the selection committee constituted by the University for the Purpose or by BOPEE.

(ii) Fulfillment of conditions lay down under statute 2.1 (ii and iii).

11.3 The number of seats for which direct admission to 3rd semester shall be made will be governed by :-

(i) The number of vacancies arising in 3rd semester consequent to discontinuation of studies by candidates admitted to the 1st semester of the course previously or vacancies carried forward due to insufficient number of admission made to first semester of the batch.

(ii) The University may also permit additional intake to the extent of 10% of approved seats of the course at the time of direct admission to 3rd semester or such additional intake as prescribed by PCI. This shall be over and above the approved intake capacity.

(iii) Migration of a student from a Pharmacy institution affiliated to a recognized Indian University may be permitted in 3rd semester of B Pharm course provided that the curriculum of the course studied by the applicant candidate during I & II semester conforms to the scheme of the course of the Pharmacy Council of India. Not more 2 such students may be accommodated during an academic session.

Admission to 1st semester of the course shall be made on the dates announced by the Board of Professional Entrance Examination or the UT Government. However, Vice Chancellor, on the recommendation of the Principal of the College may permit late admission of a candidate on payment of prescribed late fee within 30 days of classification.

12. DURATION OF THE COURSE

- i. Every student shall undergo a period of certified study of four years (3 years in case of Lateral Entry students) from the date of commencement of studies to the completion of final (VIII) semester examination as per the curricula and syllabi of Pharmacy Council of India as prescribed from time to time. Each semester of the course shall be 20 weeks (100 teaching days) duration.

- ii. For students failing to complete the course within the stipulated time, the maximum period permissible for completion of the course shall be double the actual duration of the program and the students have to pass within the stipulated period.
- iii. Candidate who seeks re-admission to the program after break of study for a period extending of not for more than 2 years, may be permitted to do so by the university on payment of condonation fee.

13. COURSE OF STUDY

The course of study for B. Pharm shall include the subjects, number of hours in a week devoted to each subject for its teaching in theory, practical and tutorial as may be prescribed by the Pharmacy Council of India from time to time.

14. INTAKE CAPACITY

Number of admissions in B. Pharm course shall be as prescribed by the Pharmacy Council of India.

To consider request of In-Charge Head, Faculty of Earth Science/ Geography Department, Bhadarwah Campus for bifurcation of self-financing fee of M.A./ M.Sc. in Geography in Faculty of Earth Sciences, Institute of Mountain Environment, Bhadarwah Campus into two equal installments for students to be admitted in upcoming academic session 2022-23.

NOTE:

The Faculty of Earth Science, Institute of Mountain Environment have been sanctioned/allotted 10 seats for M.A./ M.Sc. in Geography on the basis of self finance since 2016. Since the amount of self finance is Rs 1,15,000, sometimes in some cases it becomes difficult for candidates to pay it in one go and creates hurdles in their admission despite falling in Merit. Hence it is requested that the same amount may kindly be bifurcated in two installments. This will also help in filling the seats as many candidates as per experience in Bhadarwah Campus do not seek admission due to financial constraints and have been pleading for fee payment in installments.

This matter has been discussed with Hon'ble Vice Chancellor during his recent visit to Bhadarwah Campus, and is being submitted for discussion and approval of the Academic Council.

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ITEM No.: 3.8

To approve the conduct of elective courses by the resource persons from the industry.

NOTE:

This is to submit that both MCA and M.Tech.(CS) are professional courses primarily oriented towards building the productive career in software industry and research. In order to meet the challenges of fast developments in software industry and to adapt to rapid changes in software or hardware technologies, it is essential to balance the academia industry ecosystem which will help provide excellent avenues for learning and understanding the industry requirements for the students of the Department through interactive sessions organized with the industrial experts/resource persons.

Therefore, in an effort to make programmes of MCA and M/Tech.(CS) programmes more dynamic and vibrant, to reduce the gap between academia and industry, and to provide opportunities to the students to get abreast with the latest trends and technologies along with hand on experience, it is proposed that resource person(s) from IT industry be associated in the teaching of the course curriculum to make the academic programmes more practical and skill oriented.

Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor has also been emphasizing the close collaborations between industry and HEI from time to time at different forums of the University. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor has also stressed the need to balance academia industry ecosystem which will open excellent opportunities/avenues for learning and understanding the industry requirements for the students of the Department. This shall help meet the challenges of fast developments in software industry and to adapt to rapid changes in software or hardware technologies. The same is also a mandatory requirement as per UGC-NEP 2020 programme.

It is also pertinent to mention here that the University of Jammu has signed three MoUs with NIELIT, J&K, M/s Sedulity Solutions & Technologies, New Delhi, and M/s Advance Tech, Chandigarh for taking up initiatives for the in the domains of Cloud computing, cyber security, IOT etc.

In background of above, a detailed discussion was held in Departmental Affairs Committee (DAC) in the department on 14th November, 2022 at 11.30 A.M. The matter was deliberated threadbare and it was unanimously recommended that industry experts be associated to take up some selected elective courses in MCA and M.Tech(CS) in the latest fields like cloud computing, IOT, Cyber Security. The members unanimously agreed that such initiatives will help increase the viability, the credibility, productivity and shall also provide exposure to students in understanding the industrial requirements.

Hence, it is proposed that some selected elective courses identified by DAC be offered in MCA and M.Tech(CS) programmes be allowed to be taken up by experts from the industry. Initially, the courses to be taken by industry shall be a maximum of one in a semester, not exceeding three courses in one complete batch (two years) of each programme. These courses shall be delivered in Hybrid/blended teaching mode with at least two physical visits by the resource person from the industry with each visit preferably of at least one week duration. Further, a teacher from the department shall remain associated with the industrial resource person

for the said course for proper scheduling, liaisoning with the students, and conduct of examination scheme etc. Rest of the requirements like course credits, examination scheme etc for the elective course identified to be taken up with the association of the industry shall remain the same as already approved by BOS from time to time. It is further proposed that the department may also be allowed to make a payment of Rs.30,000/- for the entire course or Rs.1000 per lecture, whichever is less, as per the norms, in addition to TA as per actual, and stay as required to the visiting experts/resource person.

Hence, the matter is submitted for consideration.

ITEM No.: 3.9

To consider the scheme of giving relevant credits in Achievement categories (NCC/NSS/Cultural/Sports/Bharat Scouts & Guides) in each course of the relevant Semester to the students of Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) under NEP-2020 for the Academic Session 2022 onwards

NOTE:

To give fillip to the co-curricular activities, the University of Jammu has mooted the proposal to give relevant credits to those students of the Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP), who shall participate in any of the co-curricular activities and the credits shall be displayed on the marks-sheets of such students. This proposal has been mooted on the analogy of the University of Delhi and keeping in view the lack of interest shown by the students of J&K over the years in taking part in such activities.

(1) The students of the four year under-graduate programme, who fulfill the following conditions mentioned in the sub-clause (2) shall be given relevant credit in each foundation course of the relevant semester as indicated in clause (3), subject to their fulfillment of other requirements of internal assessment.

(2) Students, who participate

- (i) in Inter College Tournament organized by the University or are selected from different colleges for coaching camps organized by the Directorate of Sports and Physical Education, University of Jammu to represent University or represent J&K in National Championships/ Tournaments organized by a recognized Sport Federation/Association or represent India in recognized International Championship/Tournament, or
- (ii) in Parade Training conducted by NCC Unit/College every week or participate in State Level and National Level Camps (all Stages) organized by the NCC, or
- (iii) in NSS activities at the college level, and take part in any outreach programmes/camps organized by the NSS, or
- (iv) in Bharat Scouts and Guides or
- (v) in cultural activities at the college level, represent the college at cultural festivals after due selection by the Principal/Head, or represent the college or the University at the State or National level after due selection through recognized bodies,

may be given a credit of a maximum 8 marks in each foundation course in the relevant Semester.

(3) Each College shall set up a Committee consisting of at least five teachers and chaired by the Principal to formulate guidelines and policies to monitor the performance/hours spent/outcomes of such students as indicated in sub-clause (2) above, in consultation with the teachers in charge of NCC/NSS/Cultural activities/physical education. The Committee shall determine the individual credit of marks (ranging from 0-8 marks) to be allotted to such students who are eligible under sub-clauses (1) and (2) above.

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The University also proposes that the credits of Achievement Categories in each semester shall be displayed on the marks-sheets of the students of Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) for the Academic Session 2022 onwards, who shall participate in any of the above activities.

Further, any candidate, who participates in games, cultural and other co-curricular activities with the approval of the Principal concerned shall for the purpose of condoning deficiency in attendances incurred by him on account of such participation shall be treated as present on all the working days during the days of his absence on such account for a period not exceeding 30 working days in an academic session.

The same is submitted for kind consideration of the Academic Council.

To consider the revised Statutes / Regulations governing Jammu University Entrance Test (JUET-2022) for Admission to various Master Degree, Bachelor Degree and PG Diploma Programmes of study in the Teaching Departments of the University of Jammu, Jammu, its Offsite Campuses and Affiliated Colleges for the Academic Session 2022-23 and onwards.

The JUET Sub-Committee consisting of the following members was authorized by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor to review the Statutes / Regulations governing Jammu University Entrance Test (JUET-2022) for Admission to various Master Degree, Bachelor Degree and PG Diploma Programmes of study in the Teaching Departments of the University of Jammu, Jammu/ Offsite Campuses/ Affiliated Colleges.

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
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ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY OF JAMMU

UNIVERSITY PROFILE

Recognized as one of the premier institutions of the country, the University of Jammu, accredited as 'A+' Grade University by National Assessment and Accreditation Council of India (NAAC), ranked 56th in University category under NIRF-2022. University of Jammu has also been granted autonomy by the UGC and in terms of this graded autonomy it is Category I University. It came into existence in 1969 vide Kashmir and Jammu Universities Act 1969 following bifurcation of the erstwhile University of Jammu and Kashmir by an ordinance promulgated by the Governor on September 5, 1969 and was subsequently adopted as an Act of the State Legislature.

Honble Lieutenant Governor of the Union Territory of J&K is the Chancellor of the University. Apart from its main campus, old campus in Jammu, the University has eleven offsite campuses, out of which seven campuses located at Bhaderwah, Kathua, Kishtwar, Poonch, Ramnagar, Reasi and Udhampur are functional. Teaching-learning and research are being carried out by 38 departments and one hundred sixty three affiliated Govt. / Non Govt. colleges, awarding degrees in more than fifty programmes at the postgraduate and undergraduate level.

The main campus is at Bahu Wall Rakh with an area of 118.78 acres, houses the Teaching Departments, Centres, Administration Block, Examination Wing, College Development Council, Department of Students Welfare, Directorate of Distance Education, Dhanwantri Library, Computer Centre, Health Centre,

Guest House, Post Office, J&K Bank, Book Shop, Gymnasium, Hostels, Cafeteria and Canteens, Residential Quarters and many other facilities. The second campus of the University (the old campus), located at a distance of 4 km from the main campus, is spread over 10.5 acres and currently houses a hostel for boys and residential quarters for teaching and non-teaching employees. The University is truly treading the path of growth which is reflected in the developments over the past more than fifty years.

Introduction of new courses and self financing programmes, establishment of new campuses, increase in the number of affiliated colleges, use of information Communication Technology (ICT), impetus to research, collaborations and infrastructural developments are the initiatives taken in the recent years.

CENTRAL FACILITIES

Central Library

The Central Library of the University, the 'Dhanwantri Library' is housed in a three storied building constructed over an area of 60,000 sq.ft. It has a rich collection of books, journals and periodicals, manuscripts, dissertations, thesis etc. which cater to the varied academic and research needs of the users. The library has large reading halls and compact stack areas with open access. About 750 students can be accommodated in the reading area of the library. Most of the functions of the library have been computerized. RFID technology is being used for security purpose. For efficient and easy retrieval of bibliographic information from the vast collection of the Library,

OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue Service) has efficiently been placed in the Dhanwantri Library for the readers. Access of EDUSAT is provided to the students, research scholars and faculty members.

Health Centre

A First Aid Centre was initially established in the premises of the boys' hostels of the University managed by a part-time medical assistant. Later, the First Aid Centre was upgraded to a full fledged Health Centre to provide medical aid benefits to the University community and the dependents of the University employees.

Following Facilities and Services are provided at the Health centre:

The Health Centre has grown manifold over the years. The facilities provided are as follows:

OPD level treatment (8 am to 8 pm); Emergency Service ; Dental Facility; Physiotherapy; Ultrasound (weekly); ECG Facility; Clinical Laboratory; Ambulance service; Immunization Camps with DHS and other organizations; Awareness camps on AIDS and Population Control in collaboration with Departmental of Lifelong Learning; Treatment of sports personnel during Sports Meets and regular physical check up of sports students; Regular check up of children of Pre School located in the Department of Home Science; Medical Aid for retired University staff and their family.

Apart from this, the Health Centre also looks after sanitation and cleanliness in and around the campus, canteens, hostels and undertakes disposal of garbage in collaboration with the Municipality of Jammu. The

Health Centre also provides for reimbursement Facility during Hospitalization of employees. Different Lab. tests are also conducted.

Hostels

The University of Jammu provides hostel facility to its students and scholars. There are three girls hostels located on the main campus and five boys hostels, one of which is located in the old campus and the other four in the new campus. The allotment to the hostels is done by Provost Hostels on the basis of merit, to those students who reside beyond 40 km (for girls) and 45 kms (for boys) away from the University Campus.

The National Service Scheme

The National Service Scheme was started to establish a meaningful linkage between the campus and the community. The NSS was started in the University of Jammu in the year 1981. The University of Jammu gives substantial credit to NSS Volunteers for seeking admission in the various post graduate courses of the University of Jammu on the basis of their performance as an NSS volunteer. In recent past, NSS in the University of Jammu has made tremendous strides in the field of social work, community extension reach out

and personality development.

Based on the successful conduct of activities by NSS in the University of Jammu, the allocated strength of NSS volunteers has been increased by the Ministry of Sports and Youth Affairs, Government of India to 16400. The University organizes regular workshops and programmes for the NSS volunteers.

Students Welfare

The office of the Dean Students Welfare, established in 1972, is responsible for planning, organizing and conducting students welfare programmes including cultural and literary activities, festivals, extension and special lectures etc. It monitors the facilities for organizing various academic and cultural/literary activities, working of the canteens, kiosks for various student services like photocopying, stationery, book shop etc. in the campus. It is also responsible for maintaining discipline and law & order.

General Zorawar Singh Auditorium Complex (GZSAC)

The General Zorawar Singh Auditorium Complex is mega infrastructure facility of the University established in 2007. The Auditorium showcases the rich, diverse and pluralistic traditions and heritage of Ladakh, Jammu and Kashmir and is a step towards meeting the needs and aspirations of the students and the people of the region. The Complex houses an auditorium, a museum and an art-gallery. The auditorium is named after General Zorawar Singh, a Dogra soldier, famous for his military expeditions. The Museum is named after Shiekh Noor-Ud-Din Noorani, a great sufi and propagator of Rishi cult in Kashmir and the Art gallery is named after Rinchen Bzangpo, a scholar and propagator of Buddhism in Ladakh and the

founder of Gompas, famous for their architecture and design.

The Auditorium has a seating capacity of around 1400 and can be divided into two with the help of a state-of-art hydraulic stage and sliding-folding partition to create a mini auditorium with a seating capacity of 400. The Complex also has a brainstorming room, a reading room cum library, an exhibition hall, a souvenir shop, a green room etc.

The major collection of the Gallery is of contemporary paintings. These paintings have been received from the artists who participated in the "All India Contemporary Artists Camp" at Patnitop (Jammu) in October 2004, organized by the University of Jammu. The other collection is of black and white photographs, sketches and painting which have been donated by renowned artists and art historians like Prof. S.D.S Charak, Sh. Safi Sahni and Sh. Sarabjeet Singh. The Art Gallery also houses some beautiful wooden sculptures, which were carved in the special "Wood Carving Camp" organized by the University of Jammu in 2005 and attended by renowned sculptors from all over the country.

The Shiekh Noor-Ud-Din Noorani museum housed in the ground floor of the complex has a collection of artifacts covering the history of our State through various ages. The interesting displays in the museum include the remains of Krimchi Temple and a replica of Burzahom pit. Through this unique combination of an art gallery, a museum and an auditorium, the University seeks to create a holistic academic ambience, where students have exposure to visual arts, performing arts and culture not just for career building but enriching their existing faculties and bringing forth new ones.

The Auditorium is being utilized for holding

conferences, seminars, award functions, concerts by the various departments of the University, affiliated colleges, educational institutions, social organizations, etc.

Brigadier Rajinder Singh Auditorium (BRSA)

The Brigadier Rajinder Singh Auditorium has a seating capacity of 320. It has two green rooms and is centrally air conditioned with sophisticated sound system.

Sports Facilities

Apart from offering B.P.Ed. and M.P.Ed. programme, the Directorate of Sports and Physical Education organises various Sports Competition/Tournaments, Hiking/Trekking and Mountaineering expeditions for the students of the affiliated colleges and University departments. The Sports Infrastructure on the Main Campus includes a Cricket Ground with net facility, Football Ground, Basketball/ Handball/Kho-Kho/Volley Ball/Lawn Tennis Courts, Athletic Track(400mts.), University Fitness Centre etc. The university also has a Gymnasium Hall which has been recently named as P.V.Sindu Gymnasium Hall.

Placement Cell

Placement Cell, University of Jammu was established in 2009. The Cell in its short span of establishment has undertaken a number of initiatives for increasing placement opportunities to the students. Students of various Departments and campuses have been placed in various organizations. The Cell organizes interactions with corporate as well as consultants so as to increase the employability of the students.

Directorate of Distance Education (DDE)

The Directorate of Distance Education is located in the Main Campus of the University. Various programmes

offered by the Directorate include B.A., B.Com, M.A. (English), M.A. (Hindi), M.A. (Urdu), M.A. (Sociology), M.A. (Dogri), M.Com., M.A. Economics and M.A. Pol. Science and PGDBM. Admissions to these programmes are made separately by the Directorate. Admission to BA, B.Com Programme is made in the month of July and admission to Post Graduate Programmes is made in the month of August. Information regarding the DDE programmes is available on the website www.distanceeducationju.in

Affiliated Colleges

There are 163 permanently / temporarily affiliated colleges of University of Jammu, spread across various districts of Jammu region. The College Development Council, University of Jammu serves as an academic guide to the Colleges and advises the University on all matters relating to development of affiliated colleges. Some of the PG Courses under JUET are being offered in the affiliated Colleges.

Directorate of Internal Quality Assurance (DIQA)

One of the emerging challenges faced by any higher educational institution is the development, application and maintenance of quality benchmarks in all its key performance areas. To institutionalise the process of quality sustenance and enhancement, the Directorate of Internal Quality Assurance (DIQA) established in the University in 2003 (formerly Centre for Quality Assurance) is a nodal agency for ushering in the era of total quality management by working out intervention strategies to enhance the quality in the institution in totality. The Directorate is also responsible for assessment, accreditation and rankings. University of Jammu has been awarded "A+" Grade in the cycle III of accreditation and assessment done by the National

Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). The University has also been ranked 56th by the Ministry of Human Resource & Development (MHRD) National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) in 2022, thus figuring in the top 100 Institutions for five consecutive years.

Choice Based Credit System

Pursuant to the University Council Resolution No. 74.14 of the Council Meeting held on the 12th April 2013, the University introduced Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). Under CBCS, all programmes of study are defined in terms of their credit requirements.

Each programme shall have a list of approved Core Courses & Elective courses which shall be offered in different semesters as per programme requirements. In addition to the core courses and elective courses, a student shall be required to opt for one/more course/ courses of his/her choice as open course/courses from any other programme. Thus, the total credits shall be distributed over four categories : Post graduate Semester Core Courses (PSCC), Post-graduate Semester Elective Courses (PSEC), Post-graduate Semester Open Courses (PSOC) and SWAYAM-MOOC Courses.

Open and MOOC courses shall provide an opportunity to the student to develop broad interdisciplinary knowledge base or to specialize significantly in an area outside the parent discipline. They may include elective and/or core courses from other disciplines or shall be specially designed courses for the students from other programmes/departments within the same or different faculties.

However, CBCS is applicable to Post Graduate Degree Programmes (and not in diploma

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programmes) being offered in the main campus, affiliated Colleges and Offsite Campuses through regular mode. Further, CBCS is not be applicable to LLB 3 years, LLB 5 years, B.Lib.I.Sc and M.Lib.I.Sc.

SWAYAM (Study Web of Active Learning by Young and Aspiring Minds)

To widen the access to higher education and to promote use of ICT in Teaching Learning, Massive Online Open Courses (MOOCs) have emerged as viable model for imparting conventional and online education. Indian version of MOOC has been launched on an indigenous platform known as SWAYAM (Study Web of Active Learning by Young and Aspiring Minds) which has been initiated by Government of India to achieve the three cardinal principles of Education Policy- Access, Equity and Quality. The Academic Council and the University Council of the University of Jammu have approved the adoption of the MOOCs through SWAYAM.

From the academic session 2020-21, UGC SWAYAM courses have been made mandatory at both UG and PG Levels. PG students are required to earn a minimum of 4 Credits from SWAYAM courses and UG students are required to earn minimum 2 Credits from SWAYAM. These courses are being offered by the faculty from the prestigious institutions of the country. These will add value to the degrees being obtained by the students and make them more employable. Each Department has a Departmental SWAYAM Coordinator who shall help the students in selection of courses and hand hold them throughout their course. The facilities of the Department like Computers, internet and libraries will be made available to the students for enrolment.

STANDING INSTRUCTIONS FOR SWAYAM IMPLEMENTATION

(The following Information / Instructions must be followed strictly by all concerned)

1. MOOCs through SWAYAM platform is mandatory for all students enrolled for a Bachelor's or Master's Degree programme in the University of Jammu or its affiliated colleges, w.e.f. Academic Session 2020-21 onwards.
2. A minimum of one course of 4-Credit has to be earned, subject to the maximum of 10% of total credits for the completion of degree by all regular students of PG/UG stream from the SWAYAM platform depending upon the availability of courses as notified by UGC generally on predefined dates, 1st June or 1st November every year.
3. Courses must be identified by all Departments duly approved by Departmental Affairs Committee (DAC) or by Swayam Academic Cell (SAC) as the case be, latest by the 25th of June for June notified courses and similarly by 25th of November for November notified courses by UGC, and must be sent to the DEAN ACADEMIC AFFAIRS within a weeks' time from date of commencement of 3rd semester.
4. Departmental Affairs Committee (DAC) / Swayam Academic Cell (SAC) must be empowered for the

selection of MOOCs by Convenor, BOS /Dean of the concerned faculty.

5. Department Swayam Coordinator (DSC) and College Swayam Coordinator (CSC) must brief the students of 1st semester within the first week of commencement of the first semester, preferably during induction programme, about SWAYAM and its related issues, for every newly admitted batch, as a regular feature.
6. Preferably for earning the required 4 credits, a single course must be selected from SWAYAM Platform. However, final combination of earning 4 credits shall be left to the DSC and the students, which must be completed on or before 3rd/5th/9th Semesters as the case may be.
7. The DCS of the concerned Department must brief the students during the Induction Program, all the issues associated with SWAYAM MOOCs (As given in the booklet).
8. The student can select courses either from technical (NPTEL) and non-technical (UGC) MOOCs from SWAYAM Portal (www.swayam.gov.in)
9. In case the credits are not specified for a given MOOC, the DSC or CSC must ensure a minimum of 12 weeks (72 hrs) course to qualify for the 4-credit course.
10. MOOCs will be treated as Open Elective Course in lieu of open elective course of 3rd semester course offered by University.
11. The student must complete the SWAYAM course successfully before the commencement of the final semester of a stream or discipline.

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12. Students can select the MOOC course of their choice from a pool of courses selected by the Departments or Colleges, of any stream or any other course of their choice with prior information to Departmental SWAYAM Coordinator(DSC) or College SWAYAM Coordinator (CSC) and it shall be the duty of the Departmental SWAYAM Coordinator(DSC) or College SWAYAM Coordinator (CSC) to forward these selected new courses through the Convener, BOS, under information to Dean Academic Affairs.
13. Departments/ Colleges must ensure that all logistic support whatever is required by the student, must be supplemented/extended.
14. Student ideally should not select self-paced MOOCs, and the courses selected must be different from one offered in the course curriculum of semesters in order to avoid duplication.
15. The student must fill an undertaking form, as given in the brochure, and submit the same after duly filled form to their respective Departments/ Colleges for future reviews and record purposes.
16. Students must follow the schedule of the host institution in completing the course successfully and for all doubts must contact the Course Coordinator or the Departmental/ College SWAYAM Coordinator(DSC/CSC).
17. Any issue or problem related to SWAYAM must be brought to the notice of the University SWAYAM Coordinator, immediately, through the DSC and Head, without fail, so that it can be addressed in time.
18. The student must keep a note of and also supply

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- the information such as registration date/ enrolment id, email-id, phone, name, semester etc. to their DSC/CSC.
19. SWAYAM Examination fees (if any), or any other fee prescribed shall be borne by the students only.
20. The Examination fee once paid shall not be refundable.
21. Since there is no re-examination system therefore, candidate has to re-opt in the next cycle/ session if he/she is unable to complete the SWAYAM MOOCs successfully for whatsoever reason.
22. The concerned may note that all University/ Departmental Examinations must be rescheduled or readjusted if needed, to avoid any clash with SWAYAM Examination schedule, to avoid hardships to the students.
23. The student must submit a valid course completion certificate as a proof (Photocopy/ print copy) to their respective DSC/CSC before the beginning of the final semester, failing which their degree will be withheld.
24. A bi-annual data collection of information regarding SWAYAM enrolment, as per prescribed format available on University Website on lipre-proposed fixed dates, preferably 5th October and 5th March, every year for the sessions of June and November, respectively must be done. This responsibility of sending soft copy information as per prescribed format shall lie with the Department/College SWAYAM Coordinator to the Directorate of Internal Quality Assurance (DIOA) to the email-id: iqac_ju@yahoo.com with copy

25. All records of MOOCs related information must be preserved for two years from date of passing out by the student from the department or college as the case be.

Note : The Instructions of the MOOC Courses are subject to revise from time to time.

Open Choice Courses Offered in 4th Semester:

The students of 4th Semester have to undergo / opt for Open Course offered in the 4th Semester by the various Teaching Departments of the University of Jammu / Offsite Campuses / PG Colleges. The Open Choice Courses are offered to the students of Master Degree Under CBCS in the 4th Semester only. The allotment of the Open Choice Course in 4th Semesters is made on the basis of the merit of 1st & 2nd Semesters and the preferences/ choice of the Applicant's given in the application form, as the case may be. In case of a tie, the admission shall be made on the basis of the Under Graduate result. For details of Open Choice Courses offered by the various Teaching Departments of the University in 4th Semester refer Page No. 14. The Allotment of courses shall be done by the Office of the Dean Academic Affairs. Students of 4th Semester can only opt Open Courses other than those offered by the Parent Department.

IMPORTANT EXPLANATIONS:

- Admission to various Offsite Campuses of the University of Jammu: 50% of the total number of seats in any programme/ subject offered in all off-site Campuses shall be reserved for the candidates who are the pass-out of the respective District College and, only, in the event of no such candidate being available for these seats, the same be filled up by the students of other areas. In the case of Baderwah, this would mean that the students of Colleges belonging to the erstwhile district of Doda and for Poonch Campus, students of Colleges from both the districts of Poonch and Rajouri will be considered.**
- i) In case only one seat is available under category 9(a), 9(b) or category 10(a), 10(b) the same shall be filled on the basis of comparative merit of all the candidates under category 9(a) and 9(b), or category 10(a) and 10(b) put together, as the case may be.
 - ii) For determining the number of seats under any reserved category mentioned at Statute 5, fraction of less than one-half shall be ignored and fraction of one half and more shall be treated as one. The benefit of fraction shall be given to each category separately even if it means an overall marginal increase in seats in any course of study.
 - iii) In case any of the seats remain vacant in a reserved category (which are convertible) for want of eligible candidates, the same will be offered to the candidates of non-reserved i.e. open merit group.
- Only such candidates shall be eligible for consideration under reserved categories in accordance to Statute 5 who have not already availed of this concession for admission to any programme of study in a Teaching Department of the University in any preceding session.
 - Selection of candidates against reserved seats Statute 5 shall be made on the basis of comparative merit in the respective categories, except achievement categories.
 - To be a beneficiary of reservation, the candidate must be a permanent resident/domicile of J&K UT, except when applying under categories 9(a), 9(b) i.e. Sports/Cultural & Literary activities and 10(a), 10(b) i.e. N.C.C./National Service Scheme/ Bharat Scouts & Guides activities, for which he/she must have passed the qualifying examination from the University of Jammu or from any recognized University within the Jammu Province.
 - For selection under achievement category, inter-se-merit shall be determined in accordance to Statute 13B.

ADMISSION TO THE VARIOUS PROGRAMMES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF JAMMU, MAIN CAMPUS/ OFFSITE CAMPUSES AND AFFILIATED CENTRES FOR THE ACADEMIC SESSION 2022-23 SHALL BE MADE ON THE BASIS OF ACADEMIC MERIT AND JAMMU UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE TEST (JUET) SCORE.

1. The Entrance Test (JUET) shall be held for admission in the following subjects:
 - a) **Post Graduate (PG) PROGRAMMES:** Buddhist Studies, Dogri, English, Hindi, Punjabi, Sanskrit, Urdu, Arabic, Kashmiri (Kashmir Campus only), Journalism & Media Studies, Commerce (M.Com), Education (M.A), Education (M.Ed), Physical Education (B.P.Ed), Physical Education (M.P.Ed), LL.B Professional (3 Years), Biotechnology, Microbiology, Biochemistry, Environmental Sciences, Botany, Zoology, Sericulture (Poonch Campus only), Human Genetics, MCA (Computer Science & IT), M.Sc -IT (Kashmir Campus only), Statistics, Mathematics, Chemistry, Geography, Home Science, Applied Geology, Remote Sensing & GIS, Physics, Electronics, History, Economics, Library Sciences (B.Lib./Sc), Library Sciences (M.Lib./Sc), Rural Development, Political Science, Sociology, Psychology & Philosophy, B.C.A Data Sciences.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING JAMMU UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE TEST (JUET-2022)

1. Admission to a programme of study in a Teaching Department of the University of Jammu, Main Campus/ Offsite Campuses and Affiliated Colleges shall be made on the basis of the academic merit in their qualifying examinations and JUET Score by the Admission Committee of the Department concerned. The Admission Committee shall consist of members as given in Annexure I (A).
 - a. Applications for Admission shall be submitted online as per the dates specified in the Admission Notification.
 - b. The Schedule and other details of admission for the programmes namely MBA, MBA (H&T), MBA (IB), M.Sc Biotechnology (except NRI/Industrial Sponsored Seats), M.Tech (Computer Science) shall be notified by the concerned Department separately after approval of the Dean Academic Affairs.
2. Admission to various Offsite Campuses of the University of Jammu: 50% of the total number of seats in any programme/ subject offered in all off-site Campuses shall be reserved for the candidates who are the pass-out of the respective District College and, only, in the event of no such candidate being available for these seats, the same be filled up by the students of other areas. In the case of Bhandarwah, this would mean that the students of Colleges belonging to the erstwhile district of Doda and for Poonch Campus, students of Colleges from both the districts of Poonch and Rajouri will be considered.
 - i) Candidates will be required to apply online exclusively through the University website. Once the JUET Entrance application form is submitted online, the candidates are required to pay the requisite fee in online mode only, through UPI/ Net Banking/ Debit/ Credit Card etc., the process for the online application will be completed after the successful payment.
 - ii) NOTE: An application shall be rejected if the payment is not received and in such cases admit card shall not be issued.

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- xi) The applicant has to furnish a declaration to the effect that the inputs furnished by him/her are true, complete and correct to the best of his/her knowledge and they are required to be supported by the original documents / testimonials as and when required/demanded. His/her candidature /admission will be summarily rejected/ terminated if any false/incorrect information is found/detected at any stage. Therefore, it is mandatory for the applicant to tick the Check Box about this Declaration at the end of the Application Form, before saving and uploading the application.
4. **ADMISSION POLICY / GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION FOR THE ACADEMIC SESSION 2022-23.**
- i) The candidate who has not filled in the Online Application is not eligible for Admission.
- ii) The candidate who has not applied for Self Finance Seat at the time of the filling up of the Online Application along with the requisite fee is not eligible for admissions under the Self Finance Seat. The mode of filling of Self-Finance seats be dealt as per Statute 9 Governing Admissions to Master Degree, Bachelor Degree (LL.B (3/ 5 years), B.L.B, L.Sc., B.P.Ed., B.A. (English FYUP), B.Com Honrs, BBA (HM) and Diploma Programmes of study in the Teaching Departments of the University of Jammu, Jammu/Offsite Campuses/Affiliated Colleges.
- iii) The candidate shall have the option to exercise multiple choices, as per eligibility, for getting admission in a Course/Programme of Study at the time of filling up of online Admission Form.
- iv) The candidate who has not uploaded the requisite Reserved / Achievement Category Certificate as required during the notified dates of Admission shall not be considered for admission under that category. As such, any candidate submitting an Under Process Certificate has not to be considered for admission.
- v) The candidate who has not uploaded his/her certificates online for admission in any Achievement Category within the prescribed time is not eligible for admission in that Achievement Category.
- vi) The eligible candidate who is higher in merit than the ones who have been admitted and could not seek admission/ attend counselling for one or the other reason, he/she may be admitted against the vacant seats, if otherwise eligible. The merit/ inter-se merit in such cases will be adhered to and all the eligible candidates shall be given an opportunity for admission in order of merit.
- vii) The seats in the Reserved Categories, (at S.No. 2 to 8 and 1% of S.No. 9a), (Statute 5), if remain unfilled, even after exhausting the complete list in that particular category/ies, the same may be converted into Open/General Category seats and be offered to the candidates in order of merit.
- viii) The reserved seats (3% of S.No. 9a, 2% of 9b and seats at S.No 10 to 15) cannot be converted into the Open/ General Category seats even if they remain vacant.
- ix) In the event of no candidate being available in the 1st Preference and after the list of the candidates in the 1st Preference is completely exhausted in a particular programme/course, it is only then that the candidates who are seeking admission in the 2nd preference be considered strictly in order of merit and if otherwise eligible.
- x) Department, where seats are allotted in the 2nd Preference, the concerned Head/Director of the Department will furnish a Certificate in the Office of the Dean Academic Affairs, stating that the entire list of the applicants desirous of admission in that Department in the 1st Preference has been exhausted and, therefore, the eligible candidates now in order of merit in the 2nd Preference, are being considered.
- xi) The candidates who are admitted after the commencement of the Class work of the 1st Semester shall have to make up for the lectures/ practicals etc. on their own.
- xii) In case, the seats are still vacant at any stage before the closure of the admission process, then the Departments/ Nodal Departments will do the Counselling and ensure that all Admission related matters of the Departments/Onsite Campuses/ Affiliated Colleges with respect to those students who have filled Online Admission Application have already submitted all the Documents as required in time and who were because of one or the other reason not able to present themselves / seek admission on the dates as prescribed/ notified by the University/ respective Departments and who were/are in

merit and are otherwise eligible are addressed subject to the availability of seats/s as per the schedule notified by the University. No admission shall be made thereafter under any circumstances.

5. ACHIEVEMENT CATEGORY

Eligibility for admission under the categories of Sports/ Cultural & Literary activities/ NCC/ NSS/ Bharat Scouts & Guides shall be based on outstanding performance displayed during:

- i) In case of admission to PG Courses (except M.Ed./M.P.Ed./M.Lib.I.Sc.), on the basis of three year tenure of B.A/B.Sc/B.Com/B.B.A/B.C.A of 10+2 +3 pattern (Honours or General) of the qualifying degree when he/she has remained a regular student on the rolls of a College/Institution at the under-graduate level;
- ii) In case of admission to M.Ed./M.P.Ed./M.Lib.I.Sc Course, on the basis of B.Ed./B.P.Ed./B.Lib.I.Sc which is qualifying Degree;
- iii) In case of admission to the undergraduate courses of BA .LLB (5 yrs)/BCA/BBA(HM)/B.Com (honours) Course, performance shall be determined on the basis of last two years of qualifying degree i.e. class 11th and 12th or a program recognized as equivalent thereto subject to the conditions laid down in the relevant statutes.

- a) The candidates need to enclose the following certificates /documents alongwith the achievement category certificates in order for

consideration of the claim under achievement category.

- a. Date of Birth Certificate,
- b. Copy of the Domicile Certificate, if applicable
- c. Copies of marks sheets of qualifying examinations.
- b) All the Applicants Seeking Admission under Achievement Category (Sports / Cultural & Literary Activities/ NCC/ NSS/ Bharat Scouts & Guides) are required to upload a single PDF File, containing all the achievement certificates, for evaluation on the official website for admissions. A separate achievement certificate/s uploaded in addition to this single PDF file shall not be considered for evaluation.

3. NO DOCUMENT SHALL BE ENTERTAINED BY THE DEPARTMENT AFTER THE PRESCRIBED LAST DATE AS NOTIFIED BY THE UNIVERSITY.

6. WARNING

- a. Mere filing of online admission form doesn't ensure admission to a programme of study in the University. Each candidate shall ensure that he/she fulfills the Eligibility Criteria and that the particulars furnished in the Admission Notification are complete and correct in all respects. In case, it is detected at any stage that a candidate does not fulfill the eligibility criteria and/or has furnished incorrect information or suppressed any material information, his/her candidature will be cancelled and if already admitted, shall be liable to forfeit the benefits accrued there from, besides rustication from the University.

- b. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it comes to notice later that he/she has indulged in ragging, admission may be refused or he/she shall be expelled from the educational institution. However, if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given opportunity of hearing and if his/her explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him / her from the institution.

7. APPEAL

In case a candidate, who has filed his/her online Admission form in time, paid the requisite fee, **has any grievance and feels that the Statutes governing admission have not been adhered to,** he/she may make an appeal to the Appellate Committee as notified on the Online Form prescribed for the purpose and remit the requisite fee latest by the prescribed date, or any other date notified for the purpose. Such an appeal shall be considered by the Appellate Committee. It shall be obligatory for the appellant to appear in person before the Appellate Committee, if called upon to do so. The decision of the Appellate Committee shall be final and binding on such Applicant. Appeal form can be downloaded from the online website for admissions. The same shall be deposited in the concerned Department/Modal Department for redressal.

8. FIRST PREFERENCE

A Programme of study in the University where eligibility for admission is on the basis of having passed in final examination of B.A/B.Sc/B.Com/ B.B.A/ B.C.A etc of the University of Jammu or any other University whose Degree is recognized as equivalent to the Degree of University of Jammu with not less than 60% of marks in the qualifying examination; would mean a Degree Programme of Three Years duration after 12 years of School Education under 10+2+3 pattern while in case of Under Graduate Courses, the candidate must have passed 10+2

pattern from any recognized school within the Jammu Province. Permanent residents living within the territorial jurisdiction of the University of Jammu shall also be considered under first preference.

The seats in the first preference, in case the candidate is not permanent resident of the territorial jurisdiction of the University of Jammu and having 60% or more marks in the respective qualifying examination, shall not exceed 10% of total intake capacity of the dept.

9. SECOND PREFERENCE

Notwithstanding anything contained in Regulation/ Instruction above, a candidate who has passed M.A./M.Sc./M.Com/ LL.B etc examination from the University after having passed B.A./B.Sc./B.Com examination shall also be eligible for admission under second preference category:

a) A programme where the minimum eligibility condition is passed in final examination of Three Year Degree (General) Course after 12 years of schooling

b) A Masters Degree Programme in an allied subject, if otherwise permissible under Statutes/Regulations of the University. However, admission of a candidate who has already pursued two Master Degree Programmes or Ph.D/M.Phil Programme is not eligible to seek admission on whole time basis. However in case of Under Graduate courses, if the candidate has passed 10+2 examination from any recognized

school not falling in the Jammu Province the candidate shall be considered under second preference.

10. UNDERTAKING ON AFFIDAVIT

Candidates seeking admission shall submit an affidavit duly attested by a Magistrate/ Oath Commissioner/Notary as per specimen given in Annexure-II of the Admission Brochure.





ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:-

Departmental Library: The library maintained by the Department is computerized and contains more than 4300 book titles. Besides, 21 National and 90 International journals, magazines and newspapers are also subscribed.

Multimedia classrooms and internet facility: The Department has an Internet facility-cum-computer lab for the students, scholars and faculty members. The Seminar room is equipped with Dish, LED Monitor and internet facility with good backup. The class rooms are also equipped with facilities for online teaching.

Botanical Garden and Cactus Garden: The Department has sprawling and unique Botanical and Cactus Gardens spread over an area of more than 8

acres. These are abode to a number of plant species from various categories like RET, medicinal and aromatic plants, succulents etc. including diverse angiosperms, gymnosperms, pteridophytes and bryophytes. Some rare, endemic and medicinally important plants are also conserved in the garden. Glass house, green house and two mushroom houses are additional assets in this repository. The Botanical Garden is internationally recognized by BGCI (Botanic Gardens Conservation International).

The Department has sprawling and unique Botanical and Cactus Gardens spread over an area of more than 8 acres. These are abode to a number of plant species from various categories like RET, medicinal and aromatic plants, succulents etc. including diverse angiosperms, gymnosperms, pteridophytes and bryophytes. Some rare, endemic and medicinally important plants are also conserved in the garden. Glass house, green house and two mushroom houses are additional assets in this repository. The Botanical Garden is internationally recognized by BGCI (Botanic Gardens Conservation International).

Herbarium and Museum: A spacious Herbarium-cum-Museum building is also located in the Botanical Garden premises of the Department. Herein more than 14,500 identified specimens are being maintained. Of these, 13,896 are angiosperms, 64 gymnosperms, 236 pteridophytes, 419 bryophytes, 610 lichens and 100 wild mushrooms collected from UTs of J&K and Ladakh. This Herbarium has been recognized internationally and added to Index Herbariorum in

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2020 of New York Botanical Garden (NYBG).

Instrumentation lab: The Department has a modernized central instrumentation facility with equipments like High Performance Liquid Chromatography, Atomic Absorption Spectrophotometer, Rotaevaporator, UV-vis Spectrophotometer, Thermal Cyclers (gradient and RT PCR), Refrigerated High Speed Ultracentrifuges, Fluorescence Microscope, Deep Freezers (-20°C and -80°C), Microwave Ovens, Precision Electronic Balances, pH-meter, Digital Gel Dryer, Microtome, Stereozoom and Compound Microscopes.

Botanical Tour for studying plant diversity: The Department regularly organizes long and short botanical tours for studying diverse plant species in their native habitats within and outside the UT.

Placements: The Department has produced many scientists, academicians and officers of national repute appointed in various National Research Institutes, Universities, Colleges, Indian Administrative Services, Indian Forest Services and Kashmir Administrative Services etc. During the last and the current years, students from the Department have joined Kashmir Administrative Services, one each as Bank Associate in SBI and J&K Banks, Assistant Professor in Cluster University of Jammu, Assistant Conservator of Forests, two students as Sub-inspectors and five as Panchayat Accounts Assistants, one each as Assistant Plant Protection Officer and Technical Assistant Grade III in Food Corporation of India. In addition, several students have also cleared NET.

Research Grants: Recently, Department has been promoted to DRS-SAP II after completion of DRS-SAP-I by UGC and an amount of Rs. 85.5 lacs has been sanctioned for the implementation of the project. Besides, the faculty of the Department is continuously funded by National academic and research organizations such as UGC, DST, MoEF, DBT, GBPIHED, CSIR etc. through various sponsored projects. Many collaborative projects funded by NMHS are also in operation. Through these projects, Department has received a grant of about Rs. 172 Lacs over the last five years. Research conducted in last six years has resulted in more than 250 research papers published in journals of international and national repute. Three (two edited and one text books) are also to Department's credit.

Potential Areas of Placement: Students of this Department can be placed in Research Institutes and Higher Education Departments of the UT of J&K and Centre. Usually they get appointed as Assistant Professor in Universities and Colleges and as Lecturers in Higher Secondary Schools. Indian Administrative Services, Indian Forest Services and Kashmir Administrative Services are the other important areas where students of the Department can be placed. Still others include, bank and accounts officers, in Food corporation of India and so on. Besides this, the trained students of the Department can create employment for others by getting involved in cultivation and propagation of medicinal and aromatic plants for industrial purpose, and train the masses in mushroom cultivation.

Students based activities: Conferences, Seminars and Workshops at the national and state level are organized in the Department wherein students and research scholars get a chance to interact with the scientists and academicians of repute, and present their research work. Several webinars, one to several day workshops and seminar are also conducted on online and offline platforms and in hybrid mode. Many awareness camps, plantation and cleanliness drives are held from time to time. Additionally, some important days such as Himalayan Day, World Philately Day, Rakhi Festival, Earth Day, tree talks, flower festivals, Freshers day, Teachers day, World Fungus day, Cultural festivals etc. are celebrated by organizing expert lectures, exhibitions and various competitions. At the same time, students are made aware of various societal matters such as internet security, car safety, obesity, oral and other health issues.

1. Computer Centre and Library:-

The department has its own computer lab and a well established library with more than 3000 books and journals in order to cater the needs of M.Sc. students and research scholars.

Today Genetic counselors are the important part of all the medical departments including Oncology, Cardiology, Psychiatry etc. and are playing a pivotal role in the management and treatment of diseases. Post graduation in Human genetics can also opt for careers in Pharmaceutical, Diagnostic and Biotechnology companies.

Progression and Placement of students/alumni: The passed out students of Human Genetics have been placed in different

reputed research institutes in India as well abroad. A number of students have opted for careers in pharmaceutical and diagnostic multinational companies. Students from the department have qualified the CSIR-NET, GATE and SET fellowships at state and national level. 

The Departmental library contains more than six thousand books for PG and research level. The Department has separate computer lab with Internet facility and the whole Department is equipped with Wi-Fi service.



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STATUTES GOVERNING ADMISSION TO MASTER DEGREE, BACHELOR DEGREE AND DIPLOMA PROGRAMMES OF STUDY IN THE TEACHING DEPARTMENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF JAMMU, JAMMU/ OFFSITE CAMPUSES/ AFFILIATED COLLEGES

1. Eligibility:

General: A candidate to be eligible for admission to the Master Degree and PG Diploma programmes in the University, must have passed in the final Semester / year of the qualifying Bachelor's degree examination of 10+2+3 pattern (Honours or General) in Arts, Science, Home Science, Commerce or Business Administration or an examination qualifying for a professional degree of not less than 3 years duration or any other examination recognised as equivalent thereof, from a recognised university / institution with at least 40% of the aggregate marks (36% for the Scheduled Caste / Tribe candidates) or as specified. For Bachelor's Degree, a candidate must have passed Hr. Sec. Part-II Examination (10+2 pattern) or an examination recognised as equivalent thereto with not less than 45% marks (40% for SC/ST) or as specified.

Candidates who have passed degree course of two years duration under 10+2+2 or 10+1+3 pattern and thereafter have passed bridge course of one year duration comprising Part-III of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com three years (General) course of the University of Jammu or any other recognised University shall also be eligible subject to the aggregate qualifying marks. A candidate who has passed M.A./M.Sc./M.Com. examination from the University after having

passed B.A./ B.Sc./ B.Com. Examination under the old pattern of 10+2+2 or 10+1+3 shall also be eligible for admission under second preference category to:

- (a) a course where the minimum eligibility condition is pass in Three Year Degree (General) Course after 12 years of schooling.
- (b) a Master Degree Course in an allied subject, if otherwise permissible under Statutes/Regulations of the University.

Candidates who are not permanent residents of the territorial jurisdiction of the University of Jammu, but have passed B.A/ B.Sc/ B.Com/ BBA/ BCA (General or Honours examination) with not less than 60% marks from a University other than the University of Jammu shall also be considered for admission subject to the condition that the number of seats under this category shall not exceed 10% of the intake capacity available in the programme of study.

Notwithstanding anything contained in Statute 1, a candidate appearing in the final year of the qualifying examinations immediately preceding the Academic Session & expecting to fulfill the Statutory requirement of at least 40% of the aggregate marks in the Bachelor's Degree (36% in the case of candidates belonging to SC/ST)

can also appear in the written objective type Jammu University Entrance Test (JUET).

2. Submission of Application Form:

Applications for admission to various programmes of study in the Teaching Departments of the University/ Offsite Campuses/Affiliated Colleges shall be submitted online as per the dates specified in admission notification.

Admission to the following programmes shall be made through a separate Entrance Test to be notified by the concerned Department separately after approval from the Dean Academic Affairs.

- I. MBA
- II. MBA (H&T)
- III. MBA (IB)
- IV. M.Sc Biotechnology (Except NRI/Self Sponsored seats)
- V. M.Tech (Computer Science)
- VI. LLM

General:

After the declaration of the result of qualifying degree the applicant shall have to apply online through the University website or as notified in the Admission Notification. Final Admission to a programme of study in a teaching Department of

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the University/ Offsite Campuses/ Affiliated Colleges shall be finalized by the Admission Committee of the concerned PG Department / Nodal Departments of the University with the approval of the Dean of concerned Faculty and the Dean Academic Affairs. The Admission Committee shall consist of members as given in Annexure I(A)

NOTE: For admission to Offsite Campuses / Affiliated Colleges the admission shall be made by the Nodal Departments.

4. Seats: Number and Distribution

The number of seats in a programme of study in the Teaching Departments of the University shall be determined before the commencement of the academic session by the Dean of the Faculty and Head of the Department concerned in consultation with members of the teaching staff of the Department and with the approval of the Dean Academic Affairs and wherever necessary, of the Vice-Chancellor/Syndicate/University Council. The number of seats so determined shall be communicated by the Head of the Department concerned to the Dean Academic Affairs before commencement of admission process.

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6. Open Merit Seats :

Fifty-Seven percent (57%) of total number of seats available in a course of study as determined according to Statute 4, shall be filled up on the basis of open merit in accordance with the criteria given in Statute 13.

After selection of candidates is made on the basis of open merit, the remaining seats, notwithstanding anything contrary contained in any law/ S.O / regulation in force in the UT, the seats under the Reserved Categories shall be filled as per Statutes and seats under Achievement Categories shall be filled up in accordance with the criteria given at Statute 12.

NOTES :

(i) Admission to the various U.G. / P.G. Courses shall be made under Children of Defense Service Personnel / Para-military Forces and State Police Personnel as per the preference given as under:

- 1) Children of Defense Personnel (Inter-Se-Priority among the gallantry shall be followed as Annexure V);
- 2) Wards of Para-military forces.
- 3) Wards of Police Personnel.

(ii) All the benchmark disabilities as mentioned in the Gazette of India be considered for reservation for the Category "Candidates With Disabilities". A disability of 40% and more is eligible for admission under category (11). Certificate shall

be considered only if it is issued by the Head of the Department of the concerned Medical Fraternity or that of a Government Medical College/District Hospital. The Vice-Chancellor, if he so desires, may seek advice in the matter, from a Committee to be appointed by him on the recommendations of the Dean Academic Affairs.

(iii) Candidates with Benchmark Disabilities as defined in the Gazette of India shall be exempted from payment of all the fee including charges for supervision and amanuensis.

(iv) For Single Girl Child, copy of the Ration Card and an Affidavit duly sworn in before the First Class Magistrate be submitted on account of proof.

(v) Admission under Economically Weaker Section (EWSs) of society, are only for those who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribe, Socially and Economically Backward Classes etc. The reservation would be in addition to the existing reservation and subject to a maximum of 10% of the prescribed in-take capacity in each programme/ Course. These seats (EWSs) shall not be convertible i.e. if the seat/s under this category remains vacant in any programme, it shall not be converted to Open or any other category. The definition of economically weaker sections shall be such as may be notified by the Union Territory from time to time on the basis of family income and other indicators of economic disadvantage. (Refer Annexure -VII)

Explanation:

i) In case only one seat is available under category 9(a), 9(b) or category 10(a), 10(b) the same shall be filled on the basis of comparative merit of all the candidates under category 9(a) and 9(b), or category 10 (a) and 10 (b) put together, as the case may be.

ii) For determining the number of seats under any reserved category mentioned at Statute 5, fraction of less than one-half shall be ignored and fraction of one half and more shall be treated as one. The benefit of fraction shall be given to each category separately even if it means an overall marginal increase in seats in any course of study.

iii) In case any of the seats remain vacant in a reserved category (which are convertible) for want of eligible candidates, the same will be offered to the candidates of non-reserved i.e. open merit group.

- Only such candidates shall be eligible for consideration under reserved categories in accordance to Statute 5 who have not already availed of this concession for admission to any programme of study in a Teaching Department of the University in any preceding session.

- Selection of candidates against reserved seats Statute 5 shall be made on the basis of comparative merit in the respective categories, except achievement categories.

- To be a beneficiary of reservation, the candidate must be a permanent resident/domicile of J&K UT, except when applying under categories 9(a), 9(b) i.e. Sports/Cultural & Literary activities and 10(a), 10(b) i.e. N.C.C./National Service Scheme/ Bharat Scouts & Guides activities, for which he/she must have passed the qualifying examination from the University of Jammu or from any recognized University within the Jammu Province.
- For selection under achievement category, inter-se-merit shall be determined in accordance to statute 13(B).

7. Left Over Seats :

Under no circumstances, the seats lying vacant in the Departments on the last prescribed date for completion of admission as notified will be filled up by the Head of the Department /Admission Committee unless the candidate fails immediately next in merit to the last admitted candidate. If some seats still remain vacant, these will be referred to the Appellate Committee for consideration.

8. Appellate Committee:

In case a candidate has any specific grievance regarding deviation from Statutes governing admission, he/she may appeal to the Appellate Committee through Head of the concerned Department, on the prescribed form along with the requisite fee by the date notified for the

purpose. Such an appeal along with the observation of the Head of the Department, shall be considered by the Appellate Committee whose decision in the matter shall be final and binding. It shall be obligatory for the appellant to appear in person before the Committee if called upon to do so. The Appellate Committee shall consist of members as given in Annexure I (B).

(A) Should there be any need to augment the resources of the university for maintaining, developing and improving the standards of instruction in any programme of study or for starting a new programme of study in a teaching department of the University, the Vice Chancellor on the recommendation of the admission committee of the department concerned and the Dean Academic Affairs, may sanction self-finance seats for such programme of study additionally to meet societal obligations. The number of such seats may not ordinarily exceed 15% of the seats determined for the programmes as per Statute 4. These seats shall be supernumerary and thus, shall not count towards determining the quantum of reservation specified at Statute 5 for the various categories. The admission committee shall make admission on the basis of merit determined as per Statute, subject to fulfillment of eligibility conditions for such supernumerary seats. Permanent residents of territorial jurisdiction of the University of Jammu /those having passed the

qualifying examination from the University of Jammu, shall have priority in admission over the rest against these seats. The admission shall be granted after remittance of amount of fee (refer Annexure- IV) prescribed from time to time along with other fees/charges for the course by the candidates to the University. The payment made against the self-finance seat shall be refunded as per Statute 24.

(B) In addition to the Self Financing seats, the Department of Environmental Sciences has eight (8) seats in M.Sc. course exclusively meant for the candidates who are sponsored by Govt. Departments/ Autonomous Bodies/ Industry/ Recognised NGOs (as per UGC norms). Such candidates besides fulfilling all the conditions of eligibility prescribed for the course must have at least one year of permanent service in the sponsoring organisation, except in case of NGOs wherein they must have rendered at least one year of continuous voluntary service after having passed the qualifying degree examination. Admission shall be granted in order of merit, on the production of relevant documents/certificates from the sponsor after remittance of sponsorship amount (refer Annexure IV), prescribed from time to time along with other fees/charges for the programme by the candidates to the university. The vacant sponsored seats, if any, may be converted to Self Financing seats subject to the fulfillment of conditions mentioned in Statute.

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(C) Subject to fulfillment of the eligibility criteria and other conditions prescribed for a programme of study by the candidates, seven (7) and four (4) seats respectively in B.Lib.I.Sc. and M.Lib.I.Sc. programme, will be filled up by nominees / deputees of the State Govt. and the University of Jammu who are permanent employees of these organizations. Similarly, in LL.B. (3 Year Professional) and Diploma in Business Management, two (2) seats each, will be filled up by permanent employees of the University.

Explanation

Permanent employees of the University to be deputed for the programmes (referred at C above), shall be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor for which he may seek advice of a Committee comprising Registrar and senior faculty members of the University.

10. ASSESSMENT IN ACHIEVEMENT CATEGORIES:

(A) Credit for achievement in Sports, Cultural/Literary Activities/N.C.C./NSS/Bharat Scouts & Guides activities, i.e. reserved categories (9) and (10) at Statute 5 shall be given to a candidate seeking admission under these reserved categories as per Statute 12 below, subject to the following conditions.

i) Credit shall accrue only for those events / activities which the candidate has participated during the three (3) years tenure of the qualifying degree when he/she has remained a

regular student on the rolls of a College / Institution at the under-graduate level; in case of admission to M.Ed./M.P.Ed/M.Lib.I.Sc Course, on the basis of B.Ed./B.P.Ed/B.Lib.I.Sc which is qualifying Degree; and in case of admission to BA, LLB (5 years)/BCA/BBBA(HM) Course, on the basis of last two years of qualifying degree/ Diploma i.e. class 11th and 12th. Extra time spent for the qualifying degree and achievement during that period in the above activities will not fetch any credit and thus, shall not count in determining comparative merit of the candidates.

(ii) Credit for being active in the field of Sports to a candidate shall be given only for those games/sports* which the University recognizes/participates at various levels.

* See Annexure VI-A & VI-B.

(iii) A candidate applying for consideration under the reserved categories mentioned above must accumulate an achievement score of at least 12 points/marks for three years of qualifying degree, 08 points/marks in case of 2 years of qualifying degree and 04 points/marks in case of 1 year of qualifying degree in the respective fields.

(iv) Only such candidates shall be considered for admission under the reserved category (9) i.e. Sports/Cultural & Literary activities, who have not attained the age of 25 years on September 1 of the year in which the admission is being

sought as per requirement of the Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi. However, in case of BA, LLB (5 years)/BCA/BBBA, B.Com. Course, the maximum age limit for consideration in Achievement Categories would be same as specified in statutes for General Category candidates.

(v) The Department/School where a candidate is applying under achievement categories Sports/Cultural and N.C.C./National Services Scheme/ Bharat Scouts and Guides has been a regular student during the 3/2/1 year tenure of the qualifying degree/diploma, should maintain a record of participation and performance by the candidates in these activities to be signed by Teacher in charge of the activity and the Principal concerned. One counterfoil of the record is retained in the College and the other being sent to Sports/Cultural and N.C.C./N.S.S. wing of the university every quarter of the year so that claims of the candidates, if need be, could be verified.

(vi)a. Under the cultural/literary activities category, the first preference shall be given to the candidate who has passed his/her qualifying degree from the University of Jammu and has been awarded at least a certificate of merit in a competition organized by University of Jammu such as Display your Talent; the second preference shall be given to the state subject candidate who has passed qualifying degree from the university other than University of Jammu and has participated/awarded prizes in Zonal/National

Competition organized by AIU and the third preference shall be given to the non-state subject candidate who have qualified from a University other than the University of Jammu and has participated / awarded prizes in Zonal / National Competitions organized by AIU. In case of candidates having passed 10+2, the first preference shall be given to the candidate who has passed his/her qualifying diploma from the schools falling under province of Jammu; the second preference shall be given to the candidate having passed qualifying diploma from the schools outside the province of Jammu but possesses Domicile and the third preference shall be given to the candidate who does not possess as Domicile and has qualified from a school outside the province of Jammu.

vi.b.) Under the sports category, the first preference shall be given to the candidate who has passed his/her qualifying degree from University of Jammu and has represented the University of Jammu in an Inter-University North Zone competition recognized by A.I.U./B.C.C.I., PROVIDED that if for unavoidable reason(s) the University cancels the participation of its duly selected team for such a competition, the player selected shall be deemed to have represented the University. The second preference shall be given to the domicile candidate who has passed qualifying degree from the university other than University of Jammu and has represented the concerned University in an Inter-University North

Zone competition recognized by A.I.U./B.C.C.I. and the third preference shall be given to the non-state subject candidate who has qualified from a University other than the University of Jammu and has represented the University in an Inter-University North Zone competition recognized by A.I.U./B.C.C.I. In case of candidates having passed 10+2, the first preference shall be given to the candidate who has passed his/her qualifying diploma from the schools falling under province of Jammu; the second preference shall be given to the candidate who possess domicile and has passed qualifying diploma from the schools outside the province of Jammu and the third preference shall be given to the candidate who does not possess domicile and has qualified from a school outside the province of Jammu.

vi.c.) Under NSS/Bharat Scouts and Guides/NCC first preference shall be given to the candidates who have qualified degree from University of Jammu and have participated in the activities organized by University of Jammu. The second preference shall be given to the state subject holders who have passed qualifying degree from the university other than University of Jammu, subject to participation in RD/Pre RD/National Integration Camp and the third preference shall be given to non domicile candidate who have passed qualifying degree from the University other than the University of Jammu, subject to the participation in RD/Pre RD/National

Integration Camp. In case of candidates having passed 10+2, the first preference shall be given to the candidate who has passed his/her qualifying diploma from the schools falling under province of Jammu; the second preference shall be given to the candidate who process domicile certificate and has passed qualifying diploma from the schools outside the province of Jammu and the third preference shall be given to the candidate who does not process domicile and has qualified from a school outside the province of Jammu.

(vii) The candidate seeking admission under achievement category shall have to furnish an affidavit (Annexure II) at the time of admission to the effect that he/she shall continue to take part in respective achievement category for which the candidate has taken the benefit of admission till he or she is otherwise eligible for participation; failing which, his/her admission shall be liable to be cancelled. For this purpose, he/she has to secure a certificate from the concerned office for seeking admission in the subsequent year/years.


(B) The marks/points for achievement in Sports/Cultural and Literary, and N.C.C. / National Services Scheme/ Bharat Scouts and Guides fields shall be calculated by a Committee to be constituted by the Vice-Chancellor in consultation with the Dean Academic Affairs, whose decision in the matter shall be final and binding on the candidates.

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Separate marks/points for achievement in each event/activity mentioned in the Schedule given hereinafter, shall be awarded on the basis of relevant certificate(s) submitted by a candidate applying under the reserved categories (9) (sub-categories (a) Sports, (b) Cultural and Literary activities) and (10) (sub-categories (a) N.C.C., (b) National Services Scheme(NSS)/ Bharat Scouts and Guides). Achievement in an event/activity participated in more than once, shall also be awarded separately. All these achievements, however, MUST pertain only to the 3/2/1 year tenure of the qualifying degree/diploma spent as a regular student. Also, each relevant certificate shall be evaluated ONLY for the event/activity for which it has been issued, (See Statute 12).

11. ELIGIBILITY FOR ONGOING UG / PG PROGRAMMES:

Notwithstanding anything in the preceding clauses, eligibility conditions prescribed for various programmes of study shall be as under:

A) MASTER DEGREE PROGRAMME IN SCIENCES, LIFE SCIENCES & MATHEMATICAL SCIENCES.

For admission to Master's degree programme of study, a candidate to be eligible, must have passed in the final year of Bachelor Degree Examination securing requisite percentage of aggregate marks (specified at Statute 1). However, the specific conditions for admission to various programmes are as under:

1. **Chemistry:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in final year of bachelor degree examination in science with chemistry as one of the core subjects in all the three years.
2. **Geography:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in final year of bachelor degree examination with Geography as one of the core subjects in all the three years.
3. **Home Science:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the final year of B.Sc. (Home Science) or B.A. (with Home Science as one subject) or B.Sc. (Medical) under 10 + 2 + 3 pattern. However, first preference shall be given to candidates qualifying B.Sc. (Home Science) and second preference shall be to those having B.A. (with Home Science as one subject). Only in case, seats fall vacant in above categories, they shall be offered to candidates having qualified Bachelor's degree in Medical Stream.
4. **Physics:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in final year of bachelor degree examination in science with Physics as one of the core subjects in all the three years.
5. **Electronics:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in final year of bachelor degree examination in Science with Electronics or Physics as one of the core subjects in all the three years of the B.Sc Degree
6. **Applied Geology:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the final year of B.Sc examination with Geology as one of the Core / elective subjects.
7. **Mathematics:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in final year of Bachelor Degree Examination with Mathematics as one of the core subjects in all the three years.
8. **Statistics:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in final year of Bachelor Degree Examination with Statistics / Mathematics as one of the core subjects in all the three years. However, the candidates with statistics as a subject will be considered under first preference and thereafter candidates with Mathematics subject would be considered under second preference.
9. **Information Technology:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the final year of bachelor degree examination in any stream.
10. **Computer Science and IT (MCA):** A candidate seeking admission to MCA programme must have passed in the final year of bachelor degree examination in any stream/discipline having passed Mathematics as one of the subjects at

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- 10+2 level with at least 50% of the aggregate marks (45% for the candidates belonging to SC/ST). However, Candidate who has not studied Computer Science subjects at UG level and/or has not passed with mathematics paper at 10+2 level, is also eligible to apply. Such Candidates need to enroll and compulsorily pass the Bridge Course PSCSATB100 of four credits in addition to the passing regular semester / courses given in the syllabus during Semester-I, in order to get eligible for admission to Semester-III of MCA-2 years programme. This course will be of qualifying nature only, needs to be completed and passed in first year of MCA to become eligible for subsequent Semester-III, and will not be included in the total credits earned by the student against MCA final degree. The bridge course exam will be conducted twice a year.
11. **Environmental Sciences:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the final year of Bachelor Degree examination in Science, Forestry, Agriculture, Pharmacy, Medicine, Veterinary Science, Engineering / Technology and must have biology / Environmental Sciences as one of the elective subjects at 10+2 Level.
 12. **Botany:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in final year of Bachelor Degree Examination with Botany as one of the core subjects in all the three years.
 13. **Zoology:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in final year of Bachelor Degree Examination with Zoology as

- one of the core subjects in all the three years.
14. **Sericulture:** A Candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the final year of Bachelor's degree examination with Sericulture as one of the elective subjects. However, if seats remain vacant, candidates with Botany or Zoology, as one of the subjects, shall also be considered.

SELF FINANCE PROGRAMMES :

15. **Biotechnology (Self Sponsored Seats):** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have Bachelor's Degree under 10+2+3 pattern of education in Physical, Biological, Agricultural, Veterinary and Fishery Sciences, Pharmacy, Engineering / Technology, 4 years B.Sc (Physician Assistant Course) OR Medicine (MBBS) OR B.D.S or DNS with at least 55% marks. The admission to 3 (NR/Industry) seats is made on the basis of Jammu University Entrance Test (JUET) and submission of a sponsorship letter from NR/Industry.
16. **Microbiology:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have Bachelor's Degree (B.Sc.) under 10+2+3 pattern of education in Medical Stream/ Microbiology/ Biotechnology/ Agriculture/ Veterinary Science/ Botany/ Chemistry/ Biochemistry/ B.Pharm/ MBBS / Physiotherapy or B.D.S with 55% marks.
17. **Biochemistry:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have Bachelor's Degree (B.Sc) under 10+2+3 pattern of education in Medical Stream/ Microbiology/ Biotechnology/ Agriculture/ Veterinary Science/ Botany/

- Chemistry/ Biochemistry/ B.Pharm/ MBBS/ Physiotherapy or BDS with 55% marks.
18. **Human Genetics:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the final year of Bachelor degree examination in Biological Sciences, Pharmacy, Agriculture, Veterinary Sciences, Fishery Sciences, Medicine (M.B.B.S), Physiotherapy or B.D.S. with minimum 55% marks.
 19. **Remote Sensing and GIS:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have Bachelor Degree in Science/ B.C.A/ Engineering/ Agriculture & Forestry and Bachelors Degree in Arts with Geography as one of the subjects from any recognized Indian University with not less than 50% marks.
 - B) **MASTER DEGREE PROGRAMME IN ARTS, SOCIAL SCIENCES, EDUCATION, LAW.**
 1. **Dogri:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the final year of Bachelor Degree Examination in any stream but the preference will be given to candidates as per following criteria: (Studied Dogri at UG Level / Honours in Dogri / Studied any Language at UG Level Any other stream).
 2. **English:** For admission to the programme, first preference will be given to the candidates who have passed BA (Honours) in English or with English Literature as the main, elective, or additional subject irrespective of whether the examination passed is in Arts, Science or Commerce stream for at least 4 Semesters. A candidate who has passed in the qualifying

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examination without English Literature subject shall also be considered subject to the availability of seats, if any, provided he/she has scored a minimum of 60% in the qualifying examination.

3. **Hindi:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in final year of bachelor degree examination with Hindi as Core subject or honours in Hindi language.

4. **Sanskrit:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in final year of bachelor degree examination with Sanskrit as one of the Core subjects or Honours in Sanskrit from any UGC recognized University / Institution is also eligible.

5. **Urdu:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed final year of bachelor degree examination with Urdu, Persian or Arabic as Core Course/ subject or with honours examination in any of the above said languages.

6. **Buddhist Studies:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the final year/semester with 45% of aggregate marks (40% in case of SC/ST candidates) of Bachelor Degree Examination in Arts. The Candidates with Bachelor Degree other than Arts with not less than 60% marks are also eligible. In addition to the existing seats, admission will also be open to 10 foreign students, fulfilling the eligibility condition and other legal requirements.

7. **Punjabi:** A candidate seeking admission to the

programme must have passed in the final year of Bachelor degree examination with Punjabi as a Core Course/ subject or with Honours (Gyani) in Punjabi or Bachelor Degree in any discipline / subject with 60% or more marks is also eligible.

8. **Kashmiri:** A candidate to be eligible for admission to the Masters Degree in Kashmiri must have passed the qualifying Bachelor Degree examination of 10+2+3 pattern (Honours or General) in any stream from a statutory University/Institution with atleast 40% of the aggregate marks (36% for the SC/ST candidates).

9. **Journalism & Mass Communication:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed Bachelor Degree examination in any discipline from the University of Jammu or any other university recognised by the University of Jammu or any other qualification recognised as equivalent thereto with not less than 40% marks for General Category and 36% for SC/ST Categories.

10. **History:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the final year of bachelor degree examination. Preference will be given as: (i) History Honours; (ii) History as one of the subjects at Under Graduate level/ elective or additional; (iii) Allied / Social Sciences as one of the subject at Under Graduate level not less than 55% marks in the subject).

11. **Political Science:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the final year of bachelor degree examination

with Political Science as a Core Course/ Subject or BA Honours in Political Science.

12. **Economics:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the final year of bachelor degree examination with Economics as core subject 10% of the intake capacity of the Programme available to the following students: (i) Those who have passed B.A with Economics from other than University of Jammu with not less than 60% marks (ii) Those who have passed BBA/ B.Com from University of Jammu/other than University of Jammu.) Combined merit list will be prepared for the students falling under this category.

13. **Sociology:** A candidate to be eligible for admission to M.A Sociology must have passed in the qualifying examination with sociology as one of core subjects. A candidate who has passed in BA (other than sociology as core subject) / B.Com / BBA/ BSc/ B.Sc Agriculture / LL.B Professional examination securing minimum of 60% of the aggregate marks shall be eligible under second preference.

14. **Psychology:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the final year of Bachelor Degree examination with Honours in Psychology or Psychology as one of the Core subjects.

15. **Rural Development:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the final year of Bachelor Degree examination with any of these subjects i.e. Sociology, Economics, Political Science, History, Social

Work, Psychology, Philosophy, Home Science, Education, Commerce, Management.

16. **Philosophy:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed Bachelor Degree examination in any stream with Philosophy as Core/Elective subject.
17. **Education (M.A.):** A candidate seeking admission must have passed in the final year of bachelor degree examination with Education as one of the core courses.
18. **Education (M.Ed.):** A candidate seeking admission to M.Ed programme must have passed B.Ed with minimum 50% marks.
19. **M.P.Ed (Master of Physical Education):** A candidate who has passed the following examination shall be eligible for the M.P.Ed programme: (i) Bachelor's in Physical Education (B.P.Ed.) or equivalent with atleast 50% marks. OR (ii) Bachelor's of Science (B.Sc.) in Health and Physical Education with atleast 50% marks. OR (iii) Bachelor's in Physical Education (B.P.Ed.) or equivalent with atleast 50% marks and atleast three years of teaching experience (for deputed in service candidates) The persons with disabilities are not eligible for admission to the programme. The candidates qualifying the written exam test prescribed by the University shall have to further appear in the Canadian Test to be conducted by the Directorate of the Physical Education, University of Jammu.
20. **B.P.Ed (Bachelor of Physical Education):** A candidate who has passed the following examination shall be eligible for the B.P.Ed

programme. (i) Bachelor's degree in any discipline with 50% marks and having at least participation in the Inter-College/Inter-Zonal/ District/ School competition in sports and games as recognized by the AU/IOASGFI/Govt. of India. OR (ii) Bachelor's degree in Physical Education with 45% marks OR (iii) Bachelor's degree in any discipline with 45% marks and studied physical education as compulsory/ elective subject. OR (iv) Bachelor's degree with 45% marks and having participated in National/Inter University / State competitions or secured 1st, 2nd or 3rd position in Inter College / Inter-Zonal/ District/ School competition in sports and games as recognized by the AU/IOASGFI/Govt. of India. OR (v) Bachelor's Degree with participation in International competitions or secured 1st, 2nd or 3rd position in National/Inter-University competition in sports and games as recognized by respective federations/ AU/ IOASGFI/Govt. of India. OR (vi) Graduation Degree with 45% and at least three years of teaching experience (for deputed in service candidates i.e., trained physical education teachers/coaches). The persons with disabilities are not eligible for admission to the programme. The candidates qualifying the written exam test prescribed by the University shall have to further appear in the Canadian Test to be conducted by the Department of the Physical Education, University of Jammu. The number of candidates to be invited for appearing in the Canadian Test shall not exceed three (3) times the number of seats available in the

Directorate. The selection for admission shall be made on the basis of Composite Merit out of those qualifying the Canadian Test.

21. **LAW (LL.B - 3 YEARS):** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the final year of bachelor degree examination in any stream with 45% of aggregate marks (40% in case of SC/ST candidates).
 22. **B.Lib.L.Sc (Bachelor Degree in Library and Information Science):** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the final year of Bachelor degree examination in any stream.
 23. **M.Lib.L.Sc (Master Degree in Library and Information Science):** A candidate seeking admission to M.Lib.L.Sc Course must have passed in B.Lib.L.Sc Examination with 50% of aggregate marks (45% in case of SC/ST Candidate).
 24. **Commerce:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the final year of qualifying B.Com (Hons./ B.Com (Gen.) under 10+2+3 pattern of University of Jammu. 10% of the total number of intake capacity will be available to the students other than B.Com who have secured not less than 60% marks.
- C) PG DIPLOMA PROGRAMMES**
1. **Post-graduate Diploma in Business Management (PGDBM):** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the final year of bachelor degree examination in any stream.

- 2. Post-graduate Diploma in Human Rights & Duties Education:** A candidate shall be eligible to seek admission to the programme if he/she has passed: (a) Bachelor's Degree examination under 10+2+3 in any discipline of the University of Jammu or an examination of any other University recognized as equivalent thereto with at least 40% marks in the aggregate for open and other Reserved category seats and 35% marks for SC/ST category. (b) Provided that, Army/CPO/Police Officers having Bachelor's Degree of old 10+2+2 or 10+1+3 pattern shall be eligible for admission without having passed bridge course of one year duration.) The total number of seats for the Post-Graduate Diploma Course shall be 15; out of which 08 seats shall be open and one seat each reserved for SC and ST Categories, remaining 5 seats shall be exclusively reserved for persons belonging to the Army/Police/Para Military Forces/ media/ NGO's dealing with Human Rights and shall be non-convertible in nature.
- 3. Post-graduate Diploma in Computer Applications (PGDCA):** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the final year of Bachelor Degree examination in any stream.
- 4. Post-graduate Diploma in Bioinformatics:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have Graduation in any branch of Science.
- 5. Post Graduate Diploma In Composite Culture Management (PGD-CCM):** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the Final Year of Bachelor's Degree Examination in any stream.
- 6. Post Graduate Diploma in Yoga:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the Final Year of Bachelor's Degree Examination in any stream.
- 7. Post Graduate Diploma in Museology:** A candidate seeking admission to the programme must have passed in the Final Year of Bachelor's Degree Examination in any stream.
- D) FOUR YEAR UNDER GRADUATE PROGRAMMES (FYUGP under NEP-2020)**
- 1. B.Com (FYUGP):** B.Com. (FYUGP) Course shall be open to a candidate who has passed in the Higher Secondary School Part-II examination (10+2 Pattern) of the Jammu and Kashmir State Board of School Education or an examination recognised as equivalent thereto, with atleast 40% marks. Preference would be given to the candidates who have passed in the subject of Commerce at Higher Secondary Part II Level.
- 2. B.A. English (FYUGP):** B.A. English programme shall be open to a candidate who has secured 50% (45% for SC/ST candidates) in Higher Secondary School Part-II Examination (10+2 pattern) of the Jammu and Kashmir Board of School Education or an examination recognized as equivalent thereof.
- 3. B.C.A. Data Science (FYUGP):** B.C.A (Data Science) programme shall be open to a candidate who has passed in the Higher Secondary School Part-II examination (10+2 Pattern) of the Jammu and Kashmir Board of School Education or an examination recognized as equivalent thereof.
- 4. B.A. LL.B. (5 Years):** B.A. LL.B. 5 years course shall be open to a candidate who has passed in the Higher Secondary Part-II Examination (10+2 pattern) or equivalent examination in any discipline of J&K Board of School Education or an examination recognised as equivalent thereto, with not less than 45% marks (40% in case of SC/ST).
- 5. BBA (Hotel Management):** A candidate who has secured 50% (45% for SC/ST candidates) in Higher Secondary School Part-II Examination (10+2 pattern) of the Jammu and Kashmir Board of School Education or an examination recognized as equivalent thereof.
- 6. B.A. B.Ed Integrated (FYUGP) :** B.A. B.Ed programme shall be open to a candidate who has passed in the Higher Secondary School Part-II examination (10+2 pattern) of the Jammu and Kashmir State Board of School Education or an examination recognised as equivalent thereto, with atleast 50% marks (45% for SC/ST).

6. Having secured recognition as approved Music/Drama Artist of Akashvani (Primary Service)/ Doordarshan Kendra as certified/ countersigned by the Director Radio Kashmir Jammu/ Doordarshan Kendra, Jammu. 4

13. MERIT DETERMINATION:

Admission to PG / PG Diploma / UG Programmes of the University of Jammu/ Onsite Campuses/ Affiliated Colleges shall be made on the basis of the Academic Merit of the qualifying examinations and JUET Score of the eligible candidates. Inter-se-merit of a candidate seeking admission of a programme of study in a teaching department, shall be determined by the concerned admission committee and where necessary, in consultation with the committee constituted to assess achievement in reserved categories of Sports/ Cultural & Literary, and N.C.C. / N.S.S./Bharat Scouts & Guides activities.

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(A) **ACADEMIC MERIT** : The criteria to determine Academic Merit shall be as follows:

The Academic Merit of the candidate shall be calculated on the basis of total marks obtained in all the semesters in BA/ B.Sc/ B.Com/ BBA/ BCA etc. course examination, (Semester I to Semester VI put together (General, 10+2+3 pattern) and for Under Graduate Programmes on the basis of the total marks obtained in 10+2 examination.

EXPLANATION:

a) Merit of a candidate who has passed B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./B.B.A./B.C.A./Honours & General course examination (General, 10+2+3 pattern) from any other University and 10+2 examination for UG Programmes, shall also be calculated in the manner prescribed above.

b) The tie between candidates seeking admission shall be resolved by reference to the aggregate marks in first Degree i.e. B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./BBA/BCA etc examination & if the tie still persists, to their marks in the Semester VI / Final year of the Qualifying Examination & if the tie still persists, then to their higher marks in Semester V / Part II of the said Examination. Higher marks in the said examination shall determine priority in Admission.

c) Merit of the candidate who has passed class 12th under 10+2 pattern from any recognized board.

d) The tie between candidates seeking admission under (c) shall be resolved by

reference to the aggregate marks in class X.

SELECTION CRITERIA FOR ACHIEVEMENT CATEGORIES.

Merit of the candidates applying under reserved categories of Sports/Cultural & Literary, and NCC/NSS/Bharat Scouts and Guides activities as specified at Statute 6 shall be determined on the basis of composite score:

(i) marks/points awarded to such a candidate for these activities, plus

(ii) one-fourth (1/4) of the Composite Merit.

The composite score thus calculated, shall form the basis of admission.

PROVIDED that the candidate seeking admission has not been admitted to any programme of study in the University in an earlier session under the aforesaid reserved categories.

PROVIDED also, that where candidates have obtained equal composite score, the tie shall be resolved by reference to their achievement merit in the respective activity determined as per Statute. Higher achievement merit shall determine priority in admission.

ORDER OF ADMISSION:

Subject to fulfilment of eligibility criteria and other conditions prescribed for a course of study, admission in a teaching department of the University shall first be given to a candidate who;

(A)

(i) has passed in the qualifying examination from the University of Jammu.

OR

(ii) is a permanent resident/domicile of the territorial jurisdiction of the University of Jammu but has passed in the qualifying examination or an equivalent examination from a University other than the University of Jammu; **OR**

(iii) is an employee of the Central or a State Government or a Public Undertaking or any other organisation recognised for the purpose by the Syndicate, posted within the territorial jurisdiction of the University or son/daughter/spouse of such an employee;

OR

(iv) is not permanent resident/domicile of the territorial jurisdiction of the University of Jammu, but has passed/appeared in B.A./ B.Sc./ B.Com./ B.B.A/ B.C.A.(General or Honours examination, 10+2+3 pattern) with not less than 60% marks from a University other than the University of Jammu, subject to the condition that the number of seats under this category shall not exceed 10% of the intake capacity of the programme.

(B)

After making admission of students falling under Statute 14(A), if seats in any course of study remain vacant, these seats shall be open to such other candidates who have passed in the qualifying examination from any recognised University/Board of School Education provided they have applied in time and are otherwise eligible.

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NOTE:

(i) In view of rampant reports of fake certificates and fake Universities, the University reserves the right of screening applicants seeking admission who have obtained their qualifying degrees from Universities other than the University of Jammu/ Board of School Education, and evaluating their competence before considering them for admission in a manner as would be notified by the Office of the Dean Academic Affairs from time to time.

ii. In pursuance of the decision taken by the Standing Committee of the Academic Council at its meeting held on 5th September 2005 vide Notification No.F.Acd/V/128/05/6368-6517 dated 05/10/2005 and Academic Council at its meeting held on 11/09/2013 vide Notification No.F.Acd/111/13/9362-9521 dated 22/10/2013, any course run by Study Centres/franchises of any University in the Country except IGNOU and Maulana Azad national Urdu University (MANUU), is not recognised.

iii. No course will be run, for the session, in the University of Jammu/ Offsite Campuses if the number of students admitted is less than 5 (five). For non Government affiliated Colleges/ Institutions, no course will be allowed to run for the session, if the number of

students are less than 20 or less than 50% of the sanctioned intake of the College/Course (whichever is lower).

15. Unless otherwise provided for in these Statutes, a person after having passed/appeared in the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./B.A./B.C.A. (General Examination, 10+2+3 pattern) or an examination recognised equivalent thereto, seeks admission for the first time to a Post-Graduate programme or a Diploma Course in a department of study of the University shall be given preference over a person who has already undergone any Post-Graduate Course or LL.B. (Professional 3 Years)/ B.A.L.L.B (5 Years) programme in any University.

NOTE: This Statute shall also be applicable to other P.G. Departments where the admission is done through a separate Entrance test.

EXPLANATION:

i) Such of the candidates who have pursued LL.B. (Professional) or a Post-Graduate programme for not more than first two semesters or one academic year in a teaching department of this or any other University, or have not passed any Post-Graduate examination as a private candidate, shall be treated at par with students seeking admission to a Post-Graduate programme/LL.B. (Professional) in the University for the first time

(ii) PROVIDED that admission under such a parity shall be considered only once i.e. in the session immediately following the first admission.

(iii) Persons having pursued one year Diploma

Programme in a teaching department of any University or have obtained B.Lb./Sc. or B.Ed. degree shall be treated at par with the students who are seeking admission to LL.B. (Professional)/a Post-Graduate Programme in the University for the first time.

16. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Statutes, a student who having fallen short of attendance for reasons beyond his/her control becomes ineligible to appear in the University examination shall be considered for fresh admission in the next consecutive year in the same programme of study in which he/she fell short of lectures in the preceding year along with those who apply for admission to a programme of study in the University for the first time. This concession shall be available to a candidate only once.

PROVIDED that he/she figures in the merit list and also, that conduct of such a candidate during his/her previous stay in the department has been to the entire satisfaction of the Head of the Department concerned;

17. The University may, subject to fulfillment of eligibility conditions, consider the admission of one candidate in each programme belonging to Kashmiri migrant families, in the order of merit, not exceeding one in a particular programme, provided that such a candidate produces documentary evidence of belonging to a family registered as Kashmiri migrant subject to production of the said Certificate from the Relief Commissioner. Such admission may be

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authorised by the Dean Academic Affairs against a seat which shall be over and above in a programme of study in the department.

- (ii) The University may, subject to fulfilment of eligibility conditions consider the admission of one candidate in each programme belonging to the wards of permanent employees of the University of Jammu (Teaching/ Non-Teaching), in order of merit, not exceeding one in a particular programme in each subject at the main campus. Such admission may be authorised by the Dean Academic Affairs against a seat which shall be over and above in a programme of study in the Department subject to the production of a certificate to this effect to be issued by the Registrar.

- (iii) The University may, subject to fulfilment of eligibility conditions consider the admission of single girl child in each programme, in order of merit, not exceeding one in a particular programme, provided that such a candidate produces documentary evidence and an affidavit duly sworn in before the First Class Magistrate for being single girl child. Such admission may be authorized by the Dean Academic Affairs against a seat which shall be over and above in a programme of study in the Department.

- (iv) The University may, subject to fulfilment of eligibility conditions consider the admission under the Economically Weaker Section (EWS) of society, are only for those who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribe, Socially and Economically

Backward Classes etc. The reservation would be in addition to the existing reservation and subject to a maximum of 10% of the prescribed in-take capacity in each programme/ Course. These seats (EWSs) shall not be convertible i.e. if the seats under this category remains vacant in any programme, it shall not be converted to Open or any other category. The definition of economically weaker sections shall be such as may be notified by the State /UT from time to time on the basis of family income and other indicators of economic disadvantage.

Any person in employment or self employment or engaged in a business or profession, is not eligible for admission to any whole time programme i.e. a programme conducted during the day time, in the University teaching departments. Such a person may, however, be considered for admission, PROVIDED that:

- (i) if in employment, he/she will produce a certificate from his/her employer that the employer has no objection to his/her pursuing a whole time programme in the University, and that the employee is on authorised leave for the purpose of study in the University;
- (ii) if self employed or engaged in a business or a profession, he/she will give a written undertaking to devote his/her whole time for studies as a student during the period he/she remains on rolls of the University teaching department and he/she shall not engage in any business or profession or a vocation during this period or engage in any activity which is likely to

interfere with his/her studies in the University. Such cases will be examined by the Admission Committee which will make appropriate recommendations to the Dean Academic Affairs.

EXPLANATION:

All programmes shall be treated as whole time programmes of study, except if provided otherwise.

CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION:

19. Each candidate who is granted admission shall not take up any employment or engage in any business or profession so long as he/she is on the rolls of the University. Any student who takes up an employment or engages in business or profession in violation of the Statutes, his/her name shall be struck off from the rolls of the teaching department of the University.

20. The Admission Committee concerned, with the approval of the Dean Academic Affairs, shall have the authority to refuse or cancel admission of a candidate/student who:

- (i) either fails to produce the requisite certificate in original within the time prescribed or provides information in his/her application form which is found incorrect or produces a certificate which is not genuine.
- (ii) in the opinion of the Admission Committee, has taken up employment or a vocation which is likely to interfere with his/her studies in the University.
- (iii) fails to pay the fees and deposits including Hostel fees and deposits, within the time

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prescribed by the Warden of the Hostel concerned.

(iv) Includes in anti national activities /ragging.

21. The Head of the Department shall be competent to cancel admission of a student enrolled for a programme of study in the department if the student remains absent without permission of the Head of the Department concerned for a period of 15 days continuously and/or attend less than 50% of the total lectures delivered in the Semester concerned.

PROVIDED that before cancellation of admission, the concerned Head of the Department will provide an opportunity to such a candidate to explain within 07 days why action be not taken against him/her.

22. NOTIFICATION :

Names of the candidates selected for admission shall be declared from time to time. The candidates shall be required to keep in touch to the University website for day to day notifications and comply with the instructions given in all respects failing which their selection shall be cancelled and no complaint will be entertained in this regard.

23. ADMISSION FEE AND OTHER CHARGES

payable by each student selected for admission to a programme of study shall be such as may be prescribed from time to time.

Provided that if a student having been admitted to a programme in a teaching department and having deposited the required fees is selected subsequently in the same session, in any other

24. REFUND OF FEE : If a student having been admitted to a programme discontinues, deduction of fee deposited shall be as under :

(b) The last date of admission shall be the date of admission as permitted to the appellants in the meeting of the Appellate Committee.

department of the University, shall be allowed transfer of fee deposited by him/her, by the Admission Committee.

CONTINUED ENROLMENT:

25. A regular student who after having passed all the prescribed courses of I and II or III Semester examinations of Master Degree discontinues his/her study for good and sufficient reasons to the satisfaction of the Head of the Department concerned, may be considered for admission to III or IV Semester of the course, as the case may be.

PROVIDED that not more than one year has elapsed after his/her having passed the II or III Semester examination in the concerned programme of study. Such a break shall be allowed only once during a programme of study.

PROVIDED further that such a student will have to opt courses which are prescribed for the session to which admission is being sought unless it leads to repetition of any course(s) of the Programme of study.

26. If as a result of re-evaluation, a candidate passes in the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./BBA/BCA Part-III/Semester VI examination / class 12* under 10+2 examination and has already appeared in JUET examination he/she shall be considered for admission in a Teaching Department only if seat/s is/are available and the merit of such a candidate is higher than that of the candidate who is at the top of the waiting list of the concerned teaching department. Provided further that no admission shall be made in the teaching department of the University after 07 days of the meeting of the

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Appellate Committee. The attendance of a candidate who is granted admission under the statute shall be counted from the date of his/her admission.

PERIOD OF STAY:

27. No student can remain on rolls in the teaching departments of the University exceeding the period indicated against each, if he/she has pursued more than one programme of study

EXPLANATION:

- (i) Stay in the University would mean stay in all teaching departments of the University put together,
- (ii) 4/5/6/7/8 years would include the period required for completion of the programme in which admission is sought.
- (iii) Admission of a candidate who has already pursued two Master Degree Programmes OR Ph.D./M.Phil Programme is / are not eligible to seek admission to another PG/Diploma Programme.

INTERPRETATION OF STATUTES

28. There shall be a Committee consisting of the following members to interpret these Statutes

whose decision shall be final and binding:-

(i) Dean Academic Affairs (Chairman / Chairperson)

ii) Deans of Faculties of Arts, Social Sciences, Education, Business Studies, Mathematical Sciences, Law, Science and Life Sciences.

iii) Registrar

iv) Asstt./Dy. Registrar, Academic Affairs (Secretary).

Majority of the members shall form the quorum.

STUDENT AID FUND

29. The University has also adopted a scheme called Student-Aid Fund under which Financial Assistance is extended to poor and needy students belonging to low income group families as per regulations.

PERMISSION FOR PRACTICALS TO PRIVATE CANDIDATES:

30. A Science Department may accord permission to members of the Laboratory Staff of the University, and such Teachers who hold at least 5 years of teaching experience in a school recognized by the J&K government, to perform the required number of practicals to earn eligibility for appearing in the Master's Degree Examination as a Private Candidate. Required teaching experience certificate issued/ endorsed by the Director, School Education, Jammu will have to be enclosed with the application form.

This permission may be granted to one candidate each year on the basis of merit. This facility will not encroach upon the number of

seats meant for open merit category. If any seat falls vacant after the last date of admission, that may also be used for granting similar permission to the other beneficiaries in the above category and the Scientific Staff of the Indian Institute of Integrative Medicine, Jammu (erstwhile Regional Research Laboratory, Jammu) in accordance with the Statute provided that such a permission shall not be granted after one week of the close of admission.

NOTE: All admitted students have to submit an online undertaking at the start of the session every year to the effect that he/she shall not indulge in any ragging activity and shall abide all University rule and regulations at www.antiragging.in

- i) One nominee of Dean Academic Affairs who shall act as Chairman of the Committee.
- ii) Two Heads of Departments/ University Professors.

Evaluators from each reserved category to be nominated by the DAA in consultation with NSS Coordinator/Dean Students Welfare/Director Sports/NCC. The Committee shall have the power to co-opt any other member/s to assist it

The University Grants Commission (Credit Framework for Online Learning Courses through Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds) Regulations, 2016, stands approved by the University Council vide Resolution No. 84.16 and 86.26 (Annexure-I & II). The University has continuously striven to improve the acceptance of SWAYAM MOOCs by making it an integral part of its CBCS scheme, whereby at present the student is allowed to attain 4 credits of his Master's Degree Program from SWAYAM MOOCs from 1st to 3rd Semester and submit the same to the University through the parent Department. The University has already approved the adoption and credit transfer in this regard and the marksheets/grade sheets will now reflect the marks achieved by the students of PG, which will be added to formulate their final grade or CGPA. The University has also published a SWAYAM Handbook as a guideline for students and Faculty and created a Link on the University website where all information regarding SWAYAM MOOCs is posted.

In this direction the University of Jammu needs to adopt the University Grants Commission (Credit Framework for Online Courses through Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds) Regulations, 2021. Most of the Regulations have already been integrated into the CBCS only 4.7 (pg 4 of the Regulations is placed as Annexure-III) needs to be incorporated.

UNIVERSITY GRANTS COMMISSION

NOTIFICATION

New Delhi, the 25th March, 2021

No. F. 1-100/2016(MOOCs/e-content).- In exercise of powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 26 read with clause (j) of section 12 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956) and in supersession of the UGC (Credit Framework for Online Learning Courses through SWAYAM) Regulations, 2016, except as respects things done or omitted to be done before such supersession, the University Grants Commission hereby makes the following regulations, namely:-

1. **Short title and commencement.**- (1) These regulations may be called the University Grants Commission (Credit Framework for Online Learning Courses through Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds) Regulations, 2021.

(2) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the official Gazette.

2. **Application.**- These regulations shall apply to,-

(a) all universities established or incorporated by or under a Central Act, Provincial Act or State Act as referred to under clause (f) of section 2 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956, institution or college recognised by or affiliated to such universities and an institution deemed to be university under section 3 of the said Act.

(b) the transfer of credits of such students who are enrolled in any higher education institution in India.

3. **Definitions.**- (1) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,-

(a) "academic council" means the academic council of the university or institution deemed to be a university or the academic body of the institution or college duly empowered to take decision regarding the academic matters including the decision regarding permitting online learning credit courses through Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds (SWAYAM);

(b) "academic session" means the duration of twelve months commencing either in the month of January or in the month of July, as the case may be, of every calendar year;

(c) "Act" means the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956);

(d) "course" means a paper which is taught for at least one semester as a part of a subject;

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- (e) "course-coordinator" means a faculty member and subject matter expert belonging to an higher education institution, identified and entrusted with the task of developing and delivering SWAYAM Course in a given subject by a National Coordinator;
 - (f) "credit" means the unit award gained as a learning outcome by a student by study efforts required to acquire the specified level of learning in respect of that unit and study effort for one credit means time required by a student to understand the contents equivalent to fifteen hours classroom teaching;
 - (g) "credit course" means a course which follows an academic curriculum and for which credit transfer is permissible under these regulations;
 - (h) "four quadrant approach" means the e-learning system that has the following components, namely:-
 - (i) Quadrant-I, which shall be an e-Tutorial containing video and audio content in an organised form, animations, simulations, virtual labs;
 - (ii) Quadrant-II, which shall be an e-Content containing e-Books or glossary, case study, frequently asked questions transcriptions of video lectures and any other study materials;
 - (iii) Quadrant-III, which shall be a discussion forum, for discussion of doubts, opinions and comments with course-coordinators and others;
 - (iv) Quadrant-IV, which shall be a self-assessment process that shall contain multiple choice questions, problems, quizzes, assignments and solutions;
 - (i) "higher education institution" means a university established or incorporated by or under a Central Act, Provincial Act or State Act as referred to under clause (f) of section 2 of the Act, institution or college recognised by or affiliated to such university and an institution deemed to be a university under section 3 of the Act which is offering programmes through conventional mode or through open and distance learning mode or through online mode, in the area of higher education or research therein;
 - (j) "Host Institution" means the higher education institution duly recognised or approved by the regulating authority, to which the course-coordinator offering the course belongs;
 - (k) "Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs)" mean such online courses which are developed as per the pedagogy following the four quadrant approach;
 - (l) "National Coordinator" means a National level agency or institution designated as such by the Central Government, for the purpose of coordinating the production of the online courses and for overseeing their quality and delivery in a designated discipline or level of learning;
 - (m) "parent institution" means the higher education institution where the student is enrolled;
 - (n) "proctored examination" means the examination conducted under the supervision of approved person or technology enabled proctoring which ensures the identity of the test taker and the integrity of the test taking environment, either in pen-paper mode or in computer based testing mode or in full-fledged online mode, as may be permissible;
 - (o) "programme" includes a diploma, undergraduate or postgraduate degree programme;
 - (p) "SWAYAM Board" means the board constituted by the Government of India in the Ministry of Education to oversee Massive Open Online Courses, SWAYAM and SWAYAM Prabha programmes;
 - (q) "SWAYAM guidelines" means the guidelines for developing online courses for SWAYAM programmes issued on the 1st June, 2017 by the Government of India in the *erstwhile* Ministry of Human Resource Development and as amended from time to time;
 - (r) "SWAYAM platform" means an Information Technology platform developed and made functional by the Government of India in the Ministry of Education, for the purpose of offering online learning courses.
- (2) Words and expressions used herein and not defined in these regulations but defined in the Act, shall have the same meanings as respectively, assigned to them in the Act.

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4. **SWAYAM based online credit courses.**— (1) The schedule of the SWAYAM based online credit courses shall be aligned with the conventional education semester commencing in the month of January and July of every year.

(2) The SWAYAM based online credit courses shall be developed, delivered and assessed only by the course-coordinator.

(3) The course and course-coordinator shall be identified by the National Coordinator in accordance with the SWAYAM guidelines with the prior approval of the SWAYAM Board.

(4) The course-coordinator shall offer the SWAYAM based online credit courses through the Host Institution which shall issue the certificate with grades after the end term proctored examination for credit transfer.

(5) The list of SWAYAM based online credit courses for the ensuing semester shall be notified on the SWAYAM platform before the 1st November for the January semester and before the 1st June for the July semester, every year.

(6) All higher education institutions shall within four weeks from the date of notification of the SWAYAM based online credit courses under sub-regulation (5) shall consider through their competent authority the online learning courses which may be offered through the SWAYAM platform; and keeping in view their academic requirements shall decide upon the courses which they shall permit for credit transfer.

(7) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-regulations (6), the higher education institution may allow only up to forty per cent. of the total courses, being offered in a particular programme in a semester, through the online credit course, through the SWAYAM platform.

(8) The academic council may expedite the process of transfer of credit earned by the student at their parent institution.

(9) The academic council may allow the Dean (Academics) or Chairman, Board of Studies, to approve the online credit courses of SWAYAM platform for credit transfer on the recommendation of the Head of the Department.

(10) For proper and smooth conduct of the online learning of credit course offered on SWAYAM platform, the parent institution shall ensure that the physical infrastructures viz, computer facilities, library, etc, essential for pursuing such courses are made available for free and in adequate measure.

(11) The parent institution shall designate a faculty member as a facilitator to guide the students from registration till completion of the credit course.

5. **Evaluation and certification of credit-based MOOCs.**— (1) The Host Institution and the course-coordinator shall be responsible for evaluating the student registered for the credit-based MOOCs offered on SWAYAM platform.

(2) The final evaluation of a course shall be based on internal assessment and semester end examination and the internal assessment (with a maximum of thirty per cent. marks) based on instruments such as discussion forums, quizzes, assignments, sessional examinations and the complete evaluation scheme of a course shall be announced at the time of launch of the course.

(3) Online semester end examination shall be the preferred mode provided that the course-coordinator shall be authorised to decide on the mode of conducting the final examination, either through online mode or pen and paper mode and this shall be announced in the overview of the course at the time of offering of the course.

(4) The term end proctored examination for all the SWAYAM based credit courses shall be conducted either by the SWAYAM Board or by any other agency authorised by the Government of India in the Ministry of Education, across the country.

(5) After conduct of the examination and completion of evaluation, the course-coordinator, through the Host Institution, shall award marks or grades, as per the evaluation scheme announced.

(6) A certificate regarding successful completion of the SWAYAM based credit course shall be signed by the National Coordinator and authorised signatory of the Host Institution and shall be made available on

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SWAYAM platform within four weeks from the date of declaration of the semester end examination result.

(7) The parent institution shall incorporate the marks or grades obtained by the student in the marks sheet that counts for final award of the degree or diploma by the university or Institution deemed to be a university.

6. **Credit Mobility of SWAYAM based Courses.-** (1) The parent institution shall give the equivalent credit weightage to the student for the credits earned *vide* online learning credit courses through SWAYAM platform, in the credit plan of the programme.

(2) No university shall refuse any student for credit mobility of courses earned through SWAYAM platform.

7. **Amendments in rules and regulations for seamless integration through SWAYAM based online courses.-** Every higher education institution shall within four weeks from the date of publication of these regulations in the Official Gazette make the necessary amendments, as may be required, in their statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations to adopt and incorporate the provisions of these regulations for seamless integration through SWAYAM based online courses.
